Priyanka Chopra Named Ambassador of Global Skin-care Campaign to Celebrate Diversity

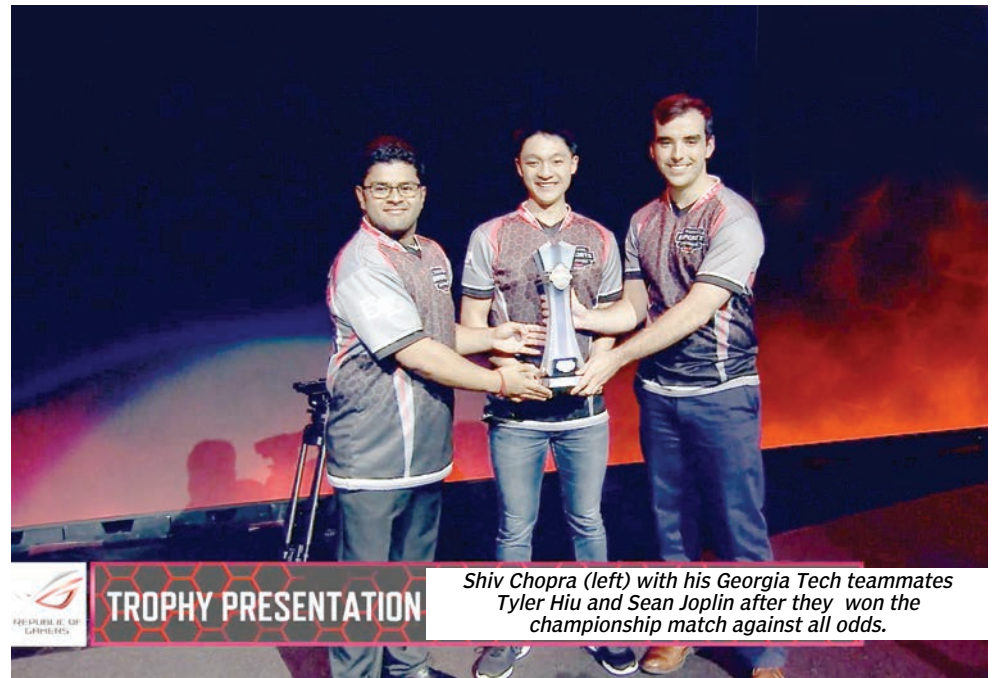

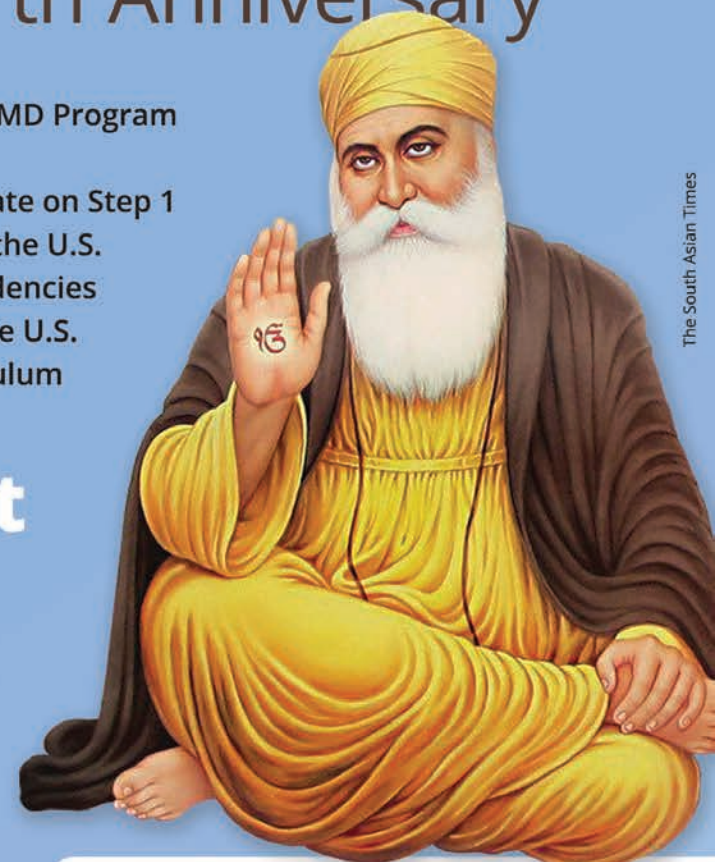

Indian American Researches at UC San Diego Receive Helmsley Charitable Trust Grants to Study Crohn's Disease

SAN DIEGO, CA (TIP): Two Indian American researches at University of California San Diego got \$3.5 Million in new grants from The Leona M. and Harry B. Helmsley Charitable Trust to Study Crohn's Disease. Helmsley's goal is to find a cure for Crohn's disease, a long-term pursuit in parallel with improving patients' lives today.

Dr. Pradipta Ghosh and Soumita Das will aim to improve surgical outcomes and therapeutics for Crohn's disease patients.

The \$3.5 million grant will allow Ghosh, professor and director of the Center for Network Medicine at UC San Diego School of Medicine, and Das, assistant professor, chief scientific officer and director of HUMANOID Center of Research Excellence at UC San Diego School of Medicine to assemble a transdisciplinary team of cellular, molecular and stem-cell biologists along with computer science engineers, pathologists and gastroenterologists. Together, they will build and validate a stem cell-based "gut-in-a-dish" model of Crohn's disease, as a "Phase 0" human

model before clinical trials.

The stem cells will be derived from intestinal biopsies of patients with the disease and used to reverse-engineer the

gut lining. The model will encompass the microbes, immune cells and other complex cell types found in the gut.

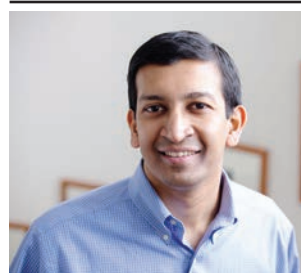

Ms. Maloney, who spearheaded efforts to have the US Postal Service issue the first Diwali Stamp, urged members of the Indian American community to reach out to the Congress members and friends across the nation to co-sponsor the legislation to honor Gandhi with the Congressional medal.

"We are working to get the Senate sponsor. We must pass it this year and honor his leadership and his gift to the world," she said, adding that "we should all work together and have a day of National Service in this special year for Gandhi and to remember him, she said.

"There is not enough that we can do to remember and say thank you to Gandhi for his life's work, for his gift of non-violent ways of handling problems." Gandhi brought independence to India with non-violence and recognizing his contributions to values in America, Ms. Maloney said she introduced the bill last year to give him the greatest honor that can be bestowed by the US Congress on an

individual.

The medal will "honor his leadership" and his gift to the world of inspiring with his principle of non-violence, Maloney echoed. Others who spoke on the occasion included Consul General Sandeep Chakraborty and Samani Malay Pragyaaji and Samani Neeti Pragyaaji of Jain Vishwa Bharati of North America.

Consul General Sandeep Chakraborty said Gandhi himself was deeply influenced by the work and principle of civil disobedience of American poet and philosopher Henry David Thoreau, emulating it in his life.

"Gandhi was deeply influenced by Thoreau and it shows in his life and work. Our freedom fighters were also deeply influenced by the American independence movement and the Constitution," he said.

Maloney added that India and the US, the world's largest democracy and the oldest democracy respectively, have several commonalities, share the same values and have been allies across the spectrum.

Paying homage to the memory and teachings of Lord Mahavir, she said she was not aware that one of Mahavir's most important messages is 'Live and let live.' "This slogan is one of the most famous quotes in America."

Time to work on a
Comprehensive
Immigration Reform

President Trump on May 16 announced a proposal on immigration which speaks about a shift from lottery system to a merit-based system. It is just a part of the immigration system which President Trump has touched upon. The need of the hour is to take the bull of immigration by the horn and fix it forever and for good.

Immigration is an important national issue that has been hanging fire for many years now. Ever since the days of President George W. Bush and through the two-term presidency of Barack Obama, a number of efforts were initiated to have a comprehensive immigration reform bill, but all failed. In any attempt to fix the broken immigration system, the welfare of the more than 11 million undocumented immigrants has to be kept in mind. It is a question of giving due dignity to people who have sweated it out to support their families back home and have given ungrudgingly to America their unflinching loyalty.

We have 11 million people who are here, who are undocumented, who have 5 million citizen-children, and almost 2 million "Dreamers" [undocumented immigrants who arrived in the United States as children] who know no other country but this one."

I recall a certain Mayor of a city in California State had said: "A temporary status, second-class citizenship, cannot and will not be a comprehensive immigration policy". "Is there an alternative? The deportation of 11 million people? No country in the world has ever deported 11 million people, and this great country certainly won't be the first."

Speaking about the economic incentives for the immigration reform, Mayor Villaraigosa had said, "There's a \$1.5 trillion economic impact, according to the Center for American Progress. The Dreamers alone, it's estimated, will have a \$329 billion impact over a 10-year period. And the reason is this: You're bringing these people from out of the dark and into the light. What happens when you do that? You encourage them to get an education, you encourage them to improve their job skills. They're encouraged to seek better jobs. They contribute more to our Social Security system".

While President Trump's proposal to reward merit is praiseworthy, it is equally important to not forget that family reunion is an emotive and important issue, and great thing to do, in the best of American values and traditions.

Also, H-1B visas need to be expanded, and we need to make sure that we have a program that makes sense in the agricultural sector.

Hope, President Trump will give the issue a cool thought and expedite a comprehensive Immigration reform which will bring to America greater prosperity and security.

America-China trade deals will be
settled by trade wars not trade talks

The imposition of the second leg of tariffs by President Trump on the \$200 billion Chinese imports coming into the USA, and the break in US-China trade talks should have been expected. We know from history that disputes between the leader and its challenger are never settled by talks, they are settled by wars. In this case, it will eventually be the trade wars that will settle the terms not deals. President Trump started this war and China is going to fight it. Therefore, the upcoming 25 percent tariffs on the remaining almost \$300 billion Chinese exports to the USA would be the natural next fight in this war.

The successful conclusion of a trade deal that both America and China could accept is extremely unlikely. There is a great conflict in the goals of the two countries for the trade agreement to come to an amicable settlement. Any America-China trade agreement would be a zero-sum game. Both President Trump and President Xi of China are working to win this game to make their respective countries great again. While Trump is looking to bring back America's greatness that has been sliding since the 1970s, Xi is working to revive China to its greatness that had slowly but steadily declined since the 1820s.

In this case, winning and losing are mutually exclusive. President Trump became U.S. president to win for America. Therefore, it would require China to lose, which China will never do willingly. Furthermore, China cannot lose because it will interfere with the "Dream of China" goal that was accepted officially by the Communist Party of China (CPC) and has been sold to the nation since 1978. President Xi's term as president was extended indefinitely by the Party for the purpose of achieving this goal.

A trade agreement with the USA would have amounted to China willingly giving up the more than \$500 billion in an annual trade surplus that it is enjoying from trading with America. This lack of incoming cash would require China to abandon the dream and stop working to attain the global hegemony that it has promised to its people and worked to achieve for a few decades now. The Chinese call this plan the "Great Trilogy of the 21st Century". The third, the final, leg of this trilogy is to be achieved by the end of the 21st century. So far, China is on track to do it. In fact, it is slightly ahead of its schedule. Accepting the Trump trade deal would have set it off the course. It would have resulted in China giving up projects such as the One Belt, One Road initiative and the humungous South China Sea base. They all need huge sums of money.

"From the American perspective, all the trade surpluses that China has enjoyed have not just resulted in America's diminished economic prowess and manufacturing capabilities, they have also funded China's projects with the sole aim to reduce America's supremacy and threaten its hegemony so as to replace China as the sole superpower of the world", says the author.

The trade deal with America would have also forced China to reduce exports to the USA and increase imports from it that would have idled a large number of the Chinese who had been migrating from the Chinese countryside to the developing urban cities as per the Chinese "Xiao Kang Society" goal. This would have caused political disturbances that President Xi or the Communist Party of China (CPC) could not handle.

The agreement with the USA, as has been targeted by President Trump, is to neutralize the trade surplus that is currently heavily in favor of China. To make situation worse, it would have become a model for other countries, especially those in Europe and Asia, to follow for settling their trade policies with China because China enjoys a trade surplus with almost all major countries in the world.

There have been many strategic implications of the China's trade policy which is a major source of resources necessary to diffuse America's influence around the world and to challenge America's global leadership. Cash from the trade surplus has been providing for China's ambitious military expansions, space odysseys, control of world-wide water and land routes, and global domination projects that have enabled it to encircle the universe. Its One-Belt, One-Road initiative has resulted in it effectively taking over the world's militarily strategic points such as Pakistan's Gwadar Port, Maldives, Sri Lanka's Hambantota Port, Africa's Djibouti military base, Ecuador's crude oil, and Argentina-based satellite tracking station. China had been working on this grand scheme since 1978.

From the American perspective, all the trade surpluses that China has enjoyed have not just resulted in America's diminished economic prowess and manufacturing capabilities, they have also funded China's projects with the sole aim to reduce America's supremacy and threaten its hegemony so as to replace China as the sole superpower of the world. It is producing ships at the rate of one every three weeks. President Trump knows that these threats will have to be dealt by America, better done sooner than later when they become even larger and more difficult to handle and expensive to manage.

It is the confidence, courage and determination of President Trump that he took on this chronic problem that has plagued America for the last more than thirty years and would have posed an existential threat to America as a nation had it not been faced. Additionally, he has very smartly prepared the American national economy to be able to handle this shock of rejecting an unfavorable trade

deal with China. It will also enable the USA to force fair trade rules on China by a policy that would deal with China as it has dealt with America so far.

The current demand and supply economics, and the global situation where America is the only large economy that is growing tell us that the effect of these tariffs will be annulled. While the whole world is set up to produce, America is the country with the highest demand. The short-term hardships that Americans may face are possible, but essential to assure America's long-term supremacy. Somehow, these tariffs will be shared by all parties in the China import transaction, i.e., China the exporter, American businesses that import it from China, retailers and consumers who decide to buy Chinese products, very much in the order preceding.

The chance of any recession or long-term detrimental effect of this trade dispute with China is minuscule. There is nothing that we import from China which American industry and workforce cannot handle. President Trump had already been working on this. All we need is some time to restructure our economy that is growing at the rate of 3.2 percent and has resulted in an unemployment at a fifty-year low rate of 3.6 percent. We are currently best able to handle the shock of this shift. For the future, domestically offsetting imports of goods and services exported to us by China will result in an economic boom that will cause an increase in the use of technology and artificial intelligence in manufacturing that will make these products and services cheaper further in America, in fact, at a price lower than the prices at which the Chinese provide them to us currently.

The biggest benefit for America of this restructuring will be more strategic than economic. It will make America more powerful. Almost the whole world knows that a world led by America will be better than the one led by China. America's strength is essential for the peace and prosperity of the whole world.

We should understand that transformations like the one America has undertaken to wrinkle out its trade deals at this time are not easy. We are undoing what has been happening for the last thirty years. In transformations like this, at least, in the early stages, it is common for things to get worse before they get better. President Trump has planned this transformation very adroitly. Consequently, the pain due to this change will be low. We have to just stay tight.

India's growing religious divide: BJP's anti-religious minorities agenda

As the election season is winding down and the nation is anxiously looking forward to the results, one cannot escape but witnessing India's slide towards complete polarization based on the politics of religion. Prime Minister Modi's ascension to power has resulted in growing Hindu intolerance of Christianity and Islam. Radical elements within his party are pushing an agenda to marginalize these two groups whom they consider 'foreign' and would like to see them disappear!

Although Indian constitution guarantees the freedom of religion to all its citizens, the political dogma of RSS (Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh), the parent organization of BJP, enunciated by its erstwhile leader and theoretician M S Golwalkar is still mostly the guideline for many of its loyal adherents. In fact, he argued in the book 'Our Nationhood Defined' that as long as the Muslims and the Christians failed to abandon their own religion and culture they cannot but be only foreigners in this country and if they stayed here without losing their "separate existence" they might be treated as "enemies", at best as "idiots". His arguments tilt more favorably towards treating all Christians as "hostiles" who are agents of International movement for the spread of Christianity.

It is important to note that RSS gurus have been inculcating the idea of bigotry and hate to the mindset of many generations for the last 95 years. It is no surprise then that Modi's rise to power has now led to an explosion of anti-Christian attitudes and fiery speeches creating an environment conducive to even physical attacks on Christian Institutions and its leaders. Prejudice against the minorities, especially Christians and Muslims, are a growing trend in the Indian society and for the BJP, it means electoral gains and seats of power! They couldn't care less about the political instability, whether it wreaks havoc across the country or the negative impact it may have on the economic health of the nation.

According to news reports in the National Review magazine, during the 2017 Christmas season alone, there were 23 incidents. Most dramatic was the arrest of 30 priests and seminarians singing Christmas carols in Madhya Pradesh state. They were accused of violating the State's anti-conversion law, which has been on the books since 2013. Similar legislation is in force in seven other states. Eight priests who came to the carolers' aid were physically assaulted, and their vehicles were set on fire. Police officers reportedly stood by without intervening. That scenario is all too common. By some accounts, hundreds of anti-Christian incidents have occurred in the past year.

government," said Cardinal Baselios Cleemis of Thiruvananthapuram, former President of the Catholic Bishop's Conference of India (CBCI). He added that "the country is being divided on the basis of religious belief" which he labeled a threat to the "democratic credentials of our country." The United States Commission on International Religious Freedom (USCIRF) recently released an annual report and its key findings include the observation by the Supreme Court of "deteriorating conditions for religious freedom in some states in 2018, stating that "certain state governments were not only not doing anything to stop violence against religious minorities, and in extreme cases, impunity was being granted to criminals engaging in violence.

The report also highlights Prime Minister Narendra Modi's silence on these issues, saying he "seldom made statements decrying mob violence," and noting that "certain members of his political party have affiliations with Hind extremist groups and used inflammatory language about religious minorities publicly." The report notes that in 2018, Minister of State at the Ministry of Home Affairs Hansraj Ahir told Parliament that 111 people were killed, and 2,384 people were wounded in 822 communal clashes in 2017. By contrast, in 2016, 86 people were killed, and 2,321 were injured in 703 clashes, the report offers, later adding that independent organizations that monitor hate crimes found that 2018 saw more than 90 religion-based hate crimes that resulted in 30 deaths and many more injuries.

There is also a secret war being waged against Christian NGOs (Non-Governmental Organization) that are engaged in welfare work for the very poor in rural India. By throwing out the 'Compassion International USA' that housed and educated 145,000 destitute

children and shutting down of the work of the 'Caritas International' that works with 360 NGOs across India that boasted about a force of 25,000 volunteers are good examples of Government's authoritarian agenda that works in concert with whims of the Hindutva militants to marginalize the Christian Community and remove them from being a visible and positive force from the public's eye.

In Modi's India, Christian Institutions are being strangled by denial of FCRA's, freezing of the bank accounts, unending investigations, frequent auditing and harassment of principals who are in charge. These moves appear to be consistent with the Hindutva philosophy that the Modi government has embraced to advance the saffron agenda that challenges the very idea of India as a multi-cultural and pluralistic society. It should also be noted that Christianity came to India in A.D. 52, long before Ireland or England have embraced that religion. To judge the Indianness of its nationals only through the prism of one's faith is not only just unfair but preposterous!

While the BJP Government is hard at work restricting Christian NGOs from receiving funds from abroad, no such limitations are placed on the Sangh Parivar organizations that collect millions of dollars from western democracies. Another report from USCIRF states that "while the Indian Government continues to use the FCRA to limit foreign funding for some NGOs, Hindutva supported organizations have never come under the scrutiny of FCRA. With the amendment championed by the Modi government, the foreign-based radical Hindu organizations will be able to send funds to India, without restriction, to support hate campaigns. Under the revised definition of FCRA, so long as the foreign company's ownership of an Indian entity is within the foreign investment limits

prescribed by the Government for that sector, the company will be treated as "Indian" for the purpose of FCRA."

It is also common knowledge that Christian church leaders from the United States have a harder time obtaining visas to visit their fellow faithful in India or attend a conference while no such restrictions are placed on Indians based on religious affiliations. It is hypocritical for India to deny a religious conference visa to an American citizen while shedding crocodile tears for a reduction in the number of available H1B visas that could take jobs away from American citizens. The recent cancellation and court-ordered restoration of OCI card of an Indian American Christian who was accused of proselytizing while working as a physician volunteer in India during summer months have sent shock waves to the community. It once again shows the wanton disregard for fairness and due process by the bureaucrats who are so eager to please the current policy makers!

Meanwhile, India's 180 million Muslims are affected as well by mob violence on suspicion of having eaten beef or slaughtered a cow, animals sacred to Hinduism nationwide. The recent election campaign by all parties show the reluctance of the leadership across the board to overtly court Muslims or seek their votes in public forums. Modi's rule also emboldened Hindu extremist elements to translate their religiously ordained contempt and hatred for Dalits into systematic violence against that community as well often lynching them on suspicions of transporting cows for slaughter. According to a report in the New York Times, Indian courts have consistently acquitted most perpetrators of massacres of Dalits. Conviction rates in violent crimes against Dalits and indigenous tribes are a mere 28.3 percent and 16.4 % compared with 40.2 percent in general criminal cases.

India has a religion problem, and it should be given careful attention by policymakers in Washington as it can have long term repercussions towards the future. It appears that the sectarian line-up of political conflict is going to dominate the political landscape of India as long as BJP retains power. History has taught us that if the salience of the State is undefendable, regionalism or tribalism may become rampant and weaken a nation-state. Religious oppression is a clear sign of instability for any nation, and as the US is eyeing India as a strategic partner against the rising threat of China, an increasing level of communal tensions or sectarian conflicts in the sub-continent may not bode well for that relationship.

On the same day, Deputy Ruler of Dubai Sheikh Maktoum bin Mohammed, 35, married Sheikha Mariam bint Butti Al Maktoum and Sheikh Ahmed bin Mohammed, chairman of the Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum Knowledge Foundation, 32, married Sheikha Midya bint Dalmouj Al Maktoum.

The brothers, who share the same mother, Sheikha Hind bint Maktoum bin Juma, signed an official marriage contract on Wednesday.

A wedding ceremony is expected to follow, local media reports said. — PTI

Nationwide curfew lifted in Lanka, 60 linked to riots held

COLOMBO (TIP): According to Sri Lankan authorities they have arrested 60 persons linked to communal riots as a nationwide curfew was lifted on Wednesday in the island nation, which witnessed Sinhalese mob attacks on Muslim-owned shops and businesses in the aftermath of the deadly Easter blasts.

The government imposed the island-wide curfew on Monday after the violence against the Muslim community, who account for 10 per cent of the country's population. The curfew was briefly lifted on May 14 before being reimposed for a second straight night following reports of fresh violence in some parts of the country. — PTI

Pakistan to bifurcate Punjab to create new South Punjab province: Qureshi

LAHORE (TIP): The Pakistan government is going ahead with its plan to create the new South Punjab province by bifurcating Punjab and would move a Bill in the National Assembly, Foreign Minister Shah Mehmood Qureshi announced on May 16.

Punjab is Pakistan's second largest province by area after Balochistan. It is also the most populated province and politically influential. In the run-up to the 2018 general election, the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party led by Imran Khan had promised to bifurcate Punjab province to form South Punjab.

The South Punjab province will comprise Multan, Bahawalpur and Dera Ghazi Khan districts, Qureshi told reporters in Multan, Punjab.

The Punjab Assembly seats will be reduced to 251 from the current 371 while 120 seats have been proposed for the South Punjab Assembly in the Bill.

Qureshi said that certain constitutional amendments have to be passed for the formation of the new South Punjab province.

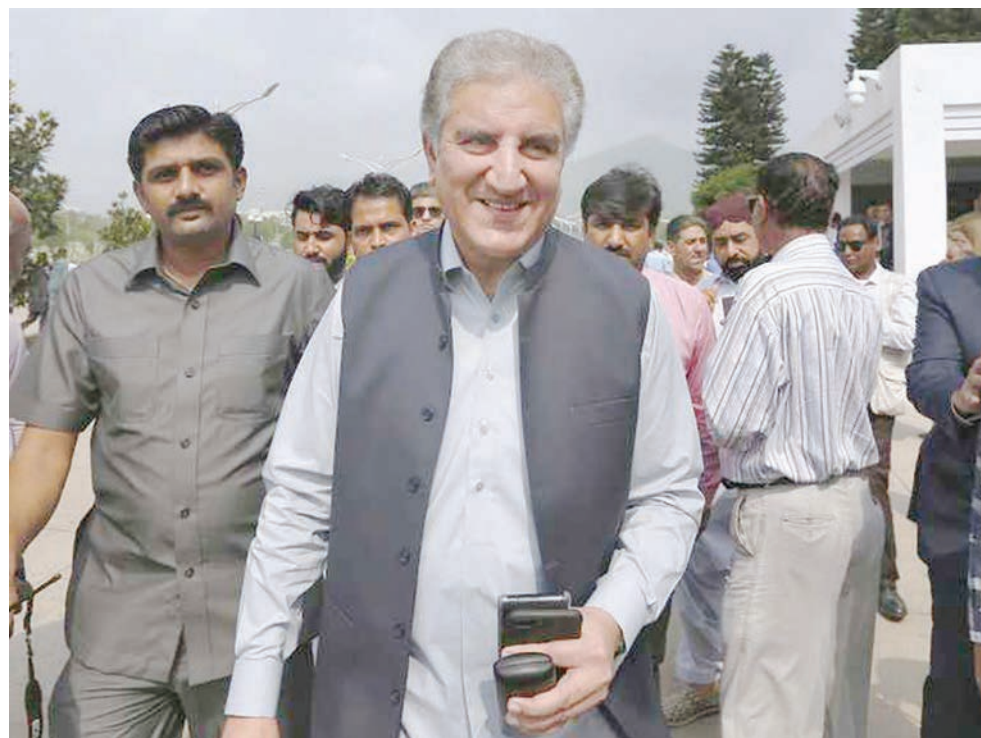
The region will turn into a province when amendments to Articles 59, 51, 1, 106, 158 and 218 of the Constitution are passed.

"The word 'South Punjab' in the first paragraph of Article 1 will be inducted, and the territories that will be part of South Punjab have been named in the proposed Bill," he was quoted as saying by the Express Tribune.

"The province will come into being through Article 51, it calls for the separate formation of the assembly. South Punjab will also get representation in the Senate," he said.

On Monday, PTI lawmaker Sami-ul-Hassan Gillani tabled the Constitution (Amendment) Bill 2019 before Parliament, calling for the creation of a separate South Punjab province, Geo News reported.

The planned South Punjab province



will be the sixth province of Pakistan after Balochistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Punjab, Sindh and Gilgit Baltistan.

Qureshi, a senior leader of the ruling PTI, said that the National Assembly Speaker will formulate a special committee for consent on the Bill.

"We require co-operation of different parties for a two-thirds majority, said Qureshi. Qureshi said that he had held a meeting with Pakistan Peoples Party's (PPP) leadership. "I request them to support us as it is in our joint interest and also a part of the PTI manifesto."

"We believe it strengthens a federation, and have decided to hold political dialogue with like-minded political parties," he said.

Qureshi also requested the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) to support the Bill. "I am hopeful they will review their attitude over it," he said.

The National Assembly, Pakistan's

lower house, has a total 342 seats, which means the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf needs 228 votes to get its way.

The PTI has 157 lawmakers. The Pakistan Muslim League-N has 84 members and the Pakistan Peoples Party has 54 lawmakers in Parliament. There are four independents.

To get the South Punjab Bill approved, the PTI would only need the support of the PPP, if the PML-N opts to stay out of the vote count, Geo News reported.

The PPP support will also be needed in the Senate where the party has an upper hand, the report said.

Meanwhile, PML-N secretary general Ahsan Iqbal said Qureshi was fooling people on the name of South Punjab.

Iqbal said the PML-N had already presented a Bill in the National Assembly for the formation of the South Punjab and Bahawalpur provinces. But the Bill was opposed by the PTI then, he said. — PTI

Oppn party in Nepal warns of strong protest over Media Council Bill

KATHMANDU (TIP): The main Opposition party in Nepal warned of a strong protest if the federal government went ahead with the discussion in Parliament on the controversial Media Council Bill that aims to curtail press freedom by imposing strict penalty on media outlets. Nepal on May 16 proposed the new media Bill aimed at imposing a hefty fine of up to Rs 1 million on media outlets found guilty of damaging anyone's reputation, raising alarm among journalists who say the government seeks to punish the press in the name of regulation.

The new Media Council Bill aims to replace the existing Press Council Act and will have more authority to issue hefty fines and give the government more say in the hiring and firing of the council members. A meeting of the

Nepali Congress parliamentary party chaired by the party chief and former prime minister Sher Bahadur Deuba on Wednesday decided that they would protest on streets if the government forwarded the discussion in the Parliament. Similarly, the party also demanded that the government put on hold discussions on National Human Rights Commission Bill and National Defence Council Bill as they are also objectionable. "All three bills are against the spirit of the Nepalese Constitution. The government should withdraw them," party chief Bal Krishna Khand told media after the meeting.

It also proposes punishment for violating the code of conduct which includes suspension of press pass of media persons and downgrading of the classification of print media outlets. PTI

Sudan army ruler says talks with protesters suspended

KHARTOUM (TIP): Sudan's army ruler General Abdel Fattah al-Burhan said that talks with protesters over installing civil rule have been suspended for 72 hours, in a statement broadcast live on state television May 16.

"We decided to suspend the negotiations over civil rule for 72 hours to help prepare an atmosphere for completing the deal," Burhan said, demanding that protesters dismantle roadblocks in Khartoum, open bridges connecting the capital and other regions and "stop provoking security forces". Army generals and protest leaders had been expected to finalise the make-up of a new ruling body to govern Sudan for three years, the thorniest issue in installing civilian rule. — AFP

US Interfaith Coalition Writes to Pakistani Ambassador to curb religious freedom violations

WASHINGTON (TIP): The Hindu American Foundation (HAF), in conjunction with the International Religious Freedom Roundtable, sent a letter earlier this month to Ambassador Asad Majeed Khan, who represents the Islamic Republic of Pakistan to the United States.

The diverse coalition of scholars, interfaith activists, and organizations wrote to the Ambassador in hopes of engaging him in a constructive dialogue on recent and ongoing religious freedom violations faced by minorities, including Hindus, Sikhs, Christians, Shia and Ahmadiyya Muslims.

Jay Kansara, HAF Director of Government Relations, who spearheaded the effort, said, "We look forward to engaging in a dialogue with Pakistan's new envoy in Washington. We see this as a great opportunity for all stakeholders to proactively discuss ways to enhance religious freedom for Pakistani citizens of all backgrounds."

The letter reads in part:

"We approach you in a good-faith effort as members of American civil society to build upon the recent visit to Pakistan by Ambassador Sam Brownback, representing the United States for International Religious Freedom. After his brief trip to Islamabad, where he had the opportunity to meet with Foreign Minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi, other prominent government officials, and leaders of civil society, Ambassador Brownback expressed with great optimism that Pakistan has "a desire to change" in order to be removed from the United States' Countries of Particular Concern (CPC) list.

In recent weeks, however, the conditions of religious minorities have continued to deteriorate. While we were initially encouraged by the exoneration of Asia Bibi, a Christian woman, and Dr. Abdul Shakoor, an Ahmadi Muslim, on false blasphemy charges, we are deeply concerned by the recent reports of abductions and forced conversions of dozens of young Hindu and Christian girls."

In March of this year, another high-profile case involving the abduction and forced conversion of two Hindu girls, Reena (14 years old) and Raveena (16 years old), from their homes in Sindh province, became international news. Despite assurances from Prime Minister Imran Khan of a thorough investigation to curb the abductions of young Hindu girls and the existence of laws prohibiting the marriage of minors, a court validated the conversion and subsequent underage marriages of the two girls.

Committees Call on White House and DOJ to Stop Withholding Documents on Obamacare

WASHINGTON (TIP): Five House Committees sent letters May 14 to the White House and the Department of Justice demanding documents in response to a request made more than a month ago regarding the Trump Administration's sudden decision to reverse its legal position in court and assert that the entire Affordable Care Act (ACA), popularly known as Obamacare, should be held unconstitutional.

The letters were signed by Committee on Oversight and Reform Chairman Elijah E. Cummings, Committee on Energy and Commerce Chairman Frank Pallone, Jr., Committee on Ways and Means Chairman Richard E. Neal, Committee on Education and Labor Chairman Robert C. "Bobby" Scott, and Committee on the Judiciary Chairman Jerrold Nadler.

"This action could deprive millions of Americans of health insurance coverage, including 133 million people with pre-existing conditions," the Chairmen wrote. "Given the grave consequences that would result if the Trump Administration's legal position were to



prevail, it is Congress' responsibility as an independent and co-equal branch of government to understand how this decision was made. If the President and his Administration truly stand by their decision to seek to eliminate health insurance coverage for millions of Americans, it is unclear why the White

House would cover up its role in this unprecedented and disastrous reversal."

According to a release by House Committee on Oversight and Reform, to date, the White House has failed to respond in any way to the previous request for documents. The Department of Justice sent an acknowledgement stating that it would respond promptly to the request, but it subsequently produced no further information.

Instead, on May 1, 2019, the Department of Justice filed a 50-page brief in the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit elaborating on the Administration's new-and flawed-legal position.

In the letters, the Committees demanded a complete response to their previous request, as well as a transcribed interview of Russ Vought, the Acting Director of Office of Management and Budget, by May 24, 2019, and the testimony of relevant Department of Justice officials. The Committees also warned that if they do not receive a response by this date, they will consider alternative means to obtaining compliance.

US Navy Chief Concludes India Visit, Expands Partnership

NEW DELHI / WASHINGTON (TIP): Chief of US Naval Operations Admiral John Richardson concluded his three-day visit to India, May 14.

During the visit, Richardson met with Chief of the Naval Staff of the Indian Navy Adm. Sunil Lanba and other senior military, diplomatic and national security officials of India.

The two heads of navy discussed the strategic importance of growing the two navies' partnership and the need to focus on information sharing and exchange. They also discussed their shared view on a multilateral approach in maintaining maritime domain awareness in the Indo-Pacific region.

"This visit provided a critical opportunity to strengthen the partnership between the Indian Navy and the U.S. Navy," said Richardson. "Nothing beats the chance to meet in person. I'm grateful for the friendship and vision of Admiral Sunil Lanba, who is nearing the end of a very impactful term as Chief of the Indian Navy. He has been a strong advocate for a closer partnership between our two navies, and we've made significant progress. Our mutual commitment and shared vision for a free and open Indo-Pacific enables even more opportunities for the future. We took the opportunity during the visit to discuss specific steps that will set the stage for further cooperation between our two navies."

Richardson also met with the U.S. Ambassador to India Kenneth Juster and discussed how to further strengthen relations between the two countries and navies. The visit included a wreath laying at the National War Memorial and a guard of honor arrival ceremony.

China's Huawei, 70 affiliates placed on US trade blacklist

WASHINGTON (TIP): The Trump administration hit Chinese telecoms giant Huawei with severe sanctions on Wednesday, adding another incendiary element to the US-China trade dispute just as Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin said he would visit China soon for more talks.

The Commerce Department said it was adding Huawei Technologies Co Ltd and 70 affiliates to its "Entity List" - a move that bans the company from acquiring components and technology from US firms without government approval.

Commerce Secretary Wilbur Ross said in a statement that President Donald Trump backed the decision to "prevent American technology from being used by foreign owned entities in ways that potentially undermine US national security or foreign policy interests."

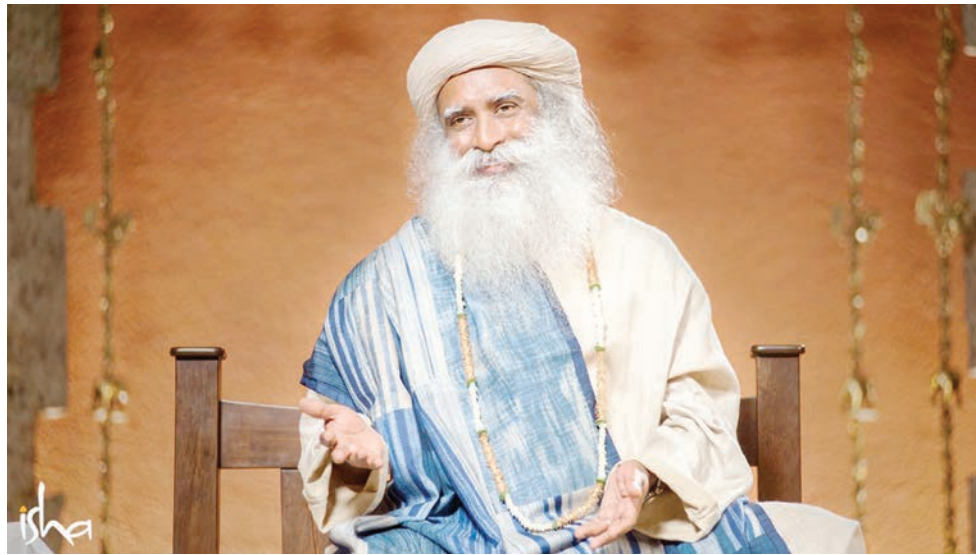

Most restrictive anti-abortion Bill ever signed into law

WASHINGTON (TIP): Alabama Governor Kay Ivey has signed into law the most restrictive abortion Bill in the US, which passes a near total ban on pregnancy terminations, even in cases of rape, and could punish doctors who perform them with life imprisonment.

"Today, I signed into law the Alabama Human Life Protection Act, a bill that was approved by overwhelming majorities in both chambers of the Legislature," CNN quoted Ivey, a Republican, as saying in a statement on Wednesday, May 15.

"To the bill's many supporters, this legislation stands as a powerful testament to Alabamians' deeply held belief that every life is precious and that every life is a sacred gift from God." The Alabama Senate passed the bill 25-6 late Tuesday night. The law only allows exceptions "to avoid a serious health risk to the unborn child's mother", for ectopic pregnancy and if the "unborn child has a lethal anomaly". Democrats re-introduced an amendment to exempt rape and incest victims, but the motion failed on an 11-21 vote. Ivey noted in her Wednesday night statement that the new law may be unenforceable due to the Supreme Court's Roe v. Wade decision that legalized abortion in all 50 states. *(Read full story on www.theindianpanorama.com)*

US orders non-emergency embassy staff to leave Iraq, citing threat to US Citizens from Terrorist groups

WASHINGTON (TIP): The US on Wednesday, May 15, ordered all non-emergency staff to leave its embassy in Baghdad and consulate in Arbil, as tension escalates between the United States and Iraq's neighbor Iran, prompting Kremlin concern.

Washington has ramped up pressure on Tehran in recent days, accusing Iran of planning unspecified "imminent" attacks in the region, and bolstering the American military presence in the Gulf.

A State Department advisory announcing the partial embassy closures warned of numerous "terrorist and insurgent groups" active in Iraq, including "anti-US sectarian militias" who could "threaten US citizens and Western companies throughout Iraq." The US last year shut its consulate in the protest-hit southern Iraqi city of Basra, blaming "indirect fire" by Iran-backed forces.

Tensions have sharply escalated between arch-rivals Washington and Tehran since US President Donald Trump withdrew last May from the 2015 international Iran nuclear deal which removed sanctions in exchange for curbs on Iran's nuclear program. *(Read full story on www.theindianpanorama.com)*

BJP, TMC, CONGRESS KEEP POLL BODY BUSY OVER BENGAL

NEW DELHI (TIP): Complaints from and about West Bengal have kept the Election Commission of India (ECI) busy this poll season. Between February 4 and April 16, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) submitted 40 representations to the ECI, flagging concerns over various polling aspects in the state, while the ruling Trinamool Congress (TMC) submitted four and the Congress 15.

Most of BJP's complaints pertained to requests for transfer of state officials who, the party felt, were not being impartial in carrying out their duties against voter suppression, attacks against BJP workers, and over chief minister Mamata Banerjee's alleged violation of the model code of conduct.

The TMC has lodged roughly four complaints, all against the BJP. The latest was on the vandalism of a bust of Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar in a Kolkata college, following a roadshow by BJP president Amit Shah on Tuesday. It has, however, lodged many complaints with the state election office against BJP's alleged malpractices.

A Congress functionary said while leaders in the All India Congress Committee had gone to the ECI on five instances to complain of poll violence in West Bengal, the party's Bengal unit had approached the state chief electoral officer (CEO) over 15 times.

Rajya Sabha MP Pradip Bhattacharya said state unit leaders had approached the CEO on several poll-related violence complaints. "We complained about the threat and intimidation that voters are facing in and around Malda area, where those going to meetings of other parties are harassed and their houses burned. We asked the poll officers to send central forces, but nothing came of it," said Bhattacharya.

Following complaints from both the BJP and the TMC that accused each other of orchestrating Tuesday's violence, the poll watchdog cut short campaigning in Bengal for the May 19 polling. Campaigning ended on Thursday at 10 pm instead of Friday 5 pm (where it will end in the other states that go to polls on Sunday).

According to a person aware of developments, two of BJP's main demands that were met included the removal of Rajiv Kumar and increasing deployment of central forces in the state.

On Wednesday, the ECI relieved Kumar from the post of additional director general of the CID in the state, and ordered him to report for duty at the home ministry in Delhi. Though he was removed following Tuesday's violence during Shah's roadshow, the party had submitted a representation seeking his removal on April 1.

The BJP had approached the EC on February 4 with a representation to invoke its rights under Article 324 of the Constitution to ensure that all parties get a level playing field and polls are held freely. The BJP complained that the Bengal administration was not giving permission for political rallies on land that was "historically and conventionally" used for such purposes, harassment of workers and denial or delay in landing of choppers.

The party cited specific instances of the choppers of BJP president Shah, Uttar Pradesh chief minister Yogi Adityanath and union minister Rajnath Singh being given permission to land only hours before their rallies. *Source: HT*

Nyay will refuel engine of economy emptied by Modi: Rahul Gandhi

KUSHINAGAR (TIP): Accusing Prime Minister Narendra Modi of taking "fuel out of the engine of the country's economy," Congress president Rahul Gandhi Thursday said if voted to power, his party will refuel it through the proposed 'Nyay' scheme.

Addressing an election rally here, the Congress chief said that the experts he consulted before proposing the 'Nyay' scheme in the party manifesto had told him it was necessary for restoring the purchasing power of the people "hit by demonetisation and GST".

The party's proposed minimum income guarantee scheme, Nyuntan Aay Yojana (Nyay) assures up to Rs 72,000 a year or Rs 6,000 a month income to 20 per cent of India's poorest families if it wins the Lok Sabha polls.

"Narendra Modi has taken the fuel out of the engine of the country's economy. He puts in the key but it does not start the engine. Nyay scheme is the diesel for the engine of economy," Gandhi said, adding it will provide jobs to lakhs of youth with the opening of factories and shops.

"We want to return what Narendra Modi has snatched from you all," he told the gathering.

He claimed that all those having monthly income of less than Rs 12,000 will benefit from the scheme and the money will go directly in the bank accounts of the beneficiaries.

"Rs 72,000 will go in the bank accounts of five crore women as they spend wisely," the Congress chief said.

Reiterating his charge that PM Modi "benefitted select industrialists and capitalist", Gandhi alleged the money meant for insurance of farmers was given to the 15 to 20 industrialists.

On the promises made in Congress manifesto, he said farmers had suggested that they be told in advance how much funds will be allocated for them at the beginning of every financial year and the party has accepted it.

More they abuse, the more people love me: PM Narendra Modi



Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday said that the love of the people towards him increases with the abuses hurled at him, claiming that the opposition alliance in Uttar Pradesh is now sensing defeat.

"All the mahamilawatis including the Samajwadi Party (SP) and the Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) are in low spirits today seeing their impending defeat in the Lok Sabha elections," Narendra Modi said in an election rally in Chandauli.

"As the dose of the rivals' abuses increases, the people are increasing their dose of trust and love too," Narendra Modi said at another meeting in Mirzapur.

Narendra Modi also addressed a meeting in Mau, where he blamed Mamata Banerjee's Trinamool Congress for the violence during BJP president Amit Shah's roadshow in Kolkata on Tuesday.

CONG NOT AVERSE TO PM FROM REGIONAL PARTY: AZAD

NEW DELHI (TIP): The Congress is not averse to supporting any regional party leader for the Prime Minister's post even if it emerges as the single largest party, Congress leader Ghulam Nabi Azad said on Thursday. "My party high command has already made it clear that the Congress is not averse to making a prime minister from any regional party," Azad told reporters here.

He was asked if the Congress will be ready to support any regional party leader for the PM's post even if it emerges as the largest party in a hung Parliament.

Speaking in the same vein in Patna on Wednesday, Azad had said the Congress will not make it an issue if the PM's post is not offered to it. The Congress leader said that it would be better if the opposition parties arrived at a consensus on the Congress leader's name to lead the government after the election results were announced on May 23.

"However, it does not mean that the Congress would not allow leaders of any other constituents to become the PM, in case the Congress is not offered the chance," Azad said the Bihar Pradesh Congress Committee headquarters on Wednesday.

Azad's remarks assume significance as the Congress has been asserting that it would be the fulcrum of any non-NDA government, which was seen as its claim for the PM's post and had led some major regional parties to maintain a distance from it.

"It will be good if there is a consensus on Congress leader's name for heading the government at the Centre after the LS poll results are out but we are not going to make it an issue that we (Congress) will not let any other (leader) to become the PM, if it is not offered to us," Azad had said in Patna, in an apparent mellowing of Congress's stand.

The Leader of Opposition in Rajya Sabha had said the sole objective of the Congress is to stop the NDA from forming the government at the Centre and installing a non-NDA government. Both, PM Narendra Modi and BJP chief Amit Shah have criticised the Opposition for not naming prime ministerial candidate.

After backlash on 'Godse a patriot' remark, Pragya Thakur apologises to BJP

BHOPAL (TIP): Pragya Thakur, who provoked national outrage by calling Mahatma Gandhi's assassin Nathuram Godse a patriot, has apologised for her comments, the BJP's Madhya Pradesh unit said after a barrage of criticism from political parties across the board.

"She has apologized for her statement. She said she had said it by mistake." Rajneesh Agrawal, a BJP spokesperson in Madhya Pradesh said. Another BJP leader added that the BJP's state president Rakesh Singh had also called up Thakur and ticked her off.

The Congress had called her patriot remark an "insult to the country" and demanded an apology from Prime Minister Narendra Modi and BJP boss Amit Shah. "India's soul is under attack from the successors of Nathuram Godse, the BJP ruling dispensation," said Congress spokesperson Randeep Singh Surjewala.

Digvijaya Singh, the former Madhya Pradesh chief minister who was pitted against Pragya Thakur for the Bhopal seat,



said glorifying Nathuram Godse wasn't patriotism either. "It is sedition," he said on Pragya Thakur's controversial statement.

Pragya Thakur, responding to a question on actor-turned-politician Kamal Haasan's remark that Godse was the first extremist in independent India and a Hindu, had retorted: "Nathuram Godse was a 'deshbhakt' (patriot), is a 'deshbhakt' and people consider him as a 'deshbhakt'."

The BJP candidate from Bhopal was speaking to the media after a roadshow in

Agar-Malwa, 185 km east of Bhopal on Thursday when she had made these comments.

Pragya Thakur, who prefers to be addressed as Sadhvi and wears a saffron robe, went on to add that people who call him (Godse) a terrorist should introspect and predicted that such people would be given a fitting reply in the elections.

Nathuram Godse, a right-wing activist, had assassinated Mahatma Gandhi on January 30, 1948. Eight men were convicted in the murder trial inside Red Fort by a special court, constituted by an order of the central government. Godse and co-conspirator Narayan Apte were hanged for the murder of the Father of the Nation on November 15, 1949.

The BJP had rushed into damage control mode and promptly condemned her statement.

"We condemn it. She should apologise publicly for this statement," BJP's GVL Narasimha Rao said in a statement to ANI.

Mayawati, Akhilesh accuse Modi of selling 'false dreams'

VARANASI (TIP): In yet another personal attack on the PM, BSP chief Mayawati today said how can one expect Narendra Modi to respect women when he cannot do so for his wife.

Addressing an election rally here along with Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav and RLD's Ajit Singh, Mayawati targeted Modi and BJP president Amit Shah, saying the "government of guru and chela (disciple)" would be ousted from power on May 23, the day results of Lok Sabha poll would be announced.

The BSP again alleged that women in the BJP were scared of their husbands meeting the PM fearing they might also "abandon their wives".

"With polling drawing to end, Modi now remembers women and talks about giving them respect....How can one expect Modi, who cannot respect his wife, to do so for mothers and sisters," Mayawati said.

She alleged Modi is also "troubling" West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee.

In a press statement earlier this week, Mayawati had said, "I have come to know that in BJP, women leaders get scared when they see their husbands going near PM Modi. They fear that like Modi they might also abandon their wives."

"Under such circumstances, I request all women of the country not to vote for such a person. This will also be their real respect to



the deserted wife of Modiji," she had said.

Addressing the rally in Varanasi, the BSP chief also questioned the prime minister on his caste. She claimed Modi has "lost his sleep" after it became clear that the BSP-SP-RLD grand-alliance was winning.

Varanasi, where Modi is pitted against alliance candidate Shalini Yadav, goes to the polls in the seventh and last phase on May 19.

Addressing the rally, Samajwadi Party president Akhilesh Yadav said after May 23, the country would get a new PM. He accused

Modi of selling "false dreams" to the people and then "betraying" them.

He said the BJP and Modi had promised to transform Varanasi into Kyoto (city of Japan), but failed. Modi was also unable to clean the river Ganga, Yadav alleged. He also criticised the BJP government in the state over encounter killings of history-sheeters.

RLD chief Ajit Singh alleged Modi had failed to provide jobs to youths and bulldozed institutions such as the CBI and the RBI.

'Rahul Gandhi is a cannon and I am AK-47': Sidhu

BILASPUR (TIP): Congress leader Navjot Singh Sidhu said Prime Minister Narendra Modi came as "Ganga's son" in 2014 but will go as an "agent in Rafale" after the ongoing elections.

"I want to ask Narendra Modi whether he took brokerage in Rafale deal or not. He can debate with Sidhu anywhere in the country. Rahul ji is a big thing. He is a cannon and I am AK-47," Sidhu said while addressing an election rally here.

"I challenge Narendra Modi to debate on 'Na khaunga na khane dunga' (neither I will do corruption nor will let anyone commit it). If I lose, I will quit politics forever. I want to say that Narendra Modi came in 2014 as the son of Ganga and he will go in 2019 as an agent in Rafale," he added.

Himachal Pradesh, where four Lok Sabha seats are at stake will go to polls on May 19. The counting of votes will take place on May 23.

My wife never lies, says Sidhu; Punjab CM clarifies

Punjab Cabinet Minister Navjot Singh Sidhu on Thursday defended his wife's remarks blaming the state Congress leadership for denying her a ticket from Amritsar.

Reacting to his colleague's assertion, Chief Minister Amarinder Singh sought to clarify that Sidhu's wife was offered either Amritsar or Bathinda seat, "but she refused to contest on either of the seat."

"My wife has that much strength and moral authority that she will never lie.



This is my answer," Sidhu told reporters when asked about his wife's allegations that she was denied party ticket from Amritsar at the instance of Chief Minister Amarinder Singh and party's Punjab affairs in-charge Asha Kumari.

Navjot Kaur, a former Bharatiya Janata Party legislator from Amritsar (East), on May 14 blamed the Chief Minister for denying her a Lok Sabha ticket either from Chandigarh or Amritsar.

She said Sidhu would not campaign for his party in his home state as the Chief Minister has told him not to do so. Hours after his wife's claim, Sidhu said at an election rally in Bathinda in the presence of Congress General Secretary Priyanka Gandhi and Amarinder Singh that he would be returning to Punjab on May 17 to deliver a "knockout punch" to the Badals.

Amid reports that the Minister's health was not allowing him to campaign, his wife also blamed Asha Kumari for not allowing Sidhu to campaign in Punjab.

Rahul again tweets 'Modilie', Oxford says not in our dictionary



NEW DELHI (TIP): Congress president Rahul Gandhi on Thursday fired yet another salvo at Prime Minister Narendra Modi accusing him of speaking lies, and claimed even a website now "catalogues the best 'Modilies'".

Gandhi tweeted that "Modilies" is a new word that has become popular worldwide.

"Now there's even a website that catalogues the best Modilies!" the Congress president said on Twitter, along with a link to the website "Modi Lies: The Most Accurate List of PM Modi's Many Lies," he said.

On Wednesday, he had lampooned the prime minister saying "Modilie" is a new word in dictionary and had tweeted a screenshot of a photo-shopped page of an English dictionary explaining the meaning of the word.

Oxford Dictionaries, however, replied to Gandhi's tweet saying the word does not exist in its dictionaries and the the image shown is a "fake".

The BJP used the tweet of Oxford Dictionaries to take a dig at its rival. "Slapped," tweeted BJP IT cell head Amit Malviya. Gandhi has been accusing Modi of speaking "lies" on various issues, including on the Rafale jet deal. In the fabricated page tweeted on Wednesday, "Modilie" was described as a "mass noun". It listed three meanings and examples of the usage of the word.

Oxford Dictionaries on its Twitter handle said, "We can confirm that the image showing the entry 'Modilie' is fake and does not exist in any of our Oxford Dictionaries."

Probe in Bofors payoff case to continue: CBI

NEW DELHI (TIP): The CBI today announced that its probe into the Bofors case pertaining to the alleged Rs 64-crore kickbacks in the purchase of the Swedish artillery guns would continue.

In a statement, the agency said, "In view of certain revelations made by one Michael Hershman, the CBI sought the permission of the trial court to conduct further investigation in the Bofors case."

It said, on May 8, the court had observed that "when independent right and power is available with the CBI" to further investigate the matter on their own and if in their wisdom, it was necessary to do so then, "why still such application is being filed in the court".

"After obtaining legal opinion, the CBI filed an application on May 16 in the court stating that for conducting further investigation under Section 173(8) of the CrPC, permission of the court is not mandatorily required and an intimation to the court in this regard will suffice," the statement read, which went on to add: "The probe in the Bofors case will continue".

The CBI's response came after it withdrew from a Delhi court its application to seek permission to further probe the politically sensitive Rs 64-crore Bofors payoff case.

Two Indians die while climbing Mt Kanchenjunga

KATHMANDU (TIP): Two Indian climbers died on Mount Kanchenjunga while descending from the summit of the world's third highest mountain, the expedition company said on Thursday.

Pasang Sherpa, Director at the Peak Promotion Nepal, the company, told Xinhua news agency that the Indian climbers collapsed at an altitude of 8,400 meters.

"Indian national Biplab Baidya and Kuntal Karna died of altitude sickness while descending from the summit," Sherpa said.

Their bodies will be airlifted to Kathmandu probably on Friday, he said. A total of 23 people were in the expedition team when they left for the summit on April 6.

Meanwhile, a national from Chile, Rodrigo Vivanco, has gone missing in Mount Kanchenjunga since Wednesday evening.

"We have mobilized a team to rescue Rodrigo who has gone missing above Camp IV on the descent after he reportedly made it to the summit," he said.

Hundreds of foreign climbers attempt to scale high Himalayan peaks during the popular spring climbing season in the Himalayan country that begins in March and ends in May.

India signs pact to check online terror

NEW DELHI (TIP): India was among the signatories to the 'Christchurch Call to Action', a pact between largely liberal democracies and most global social media companies to make Internet immune to abuse by terrorists and violent extremists.

The action plan to keep extremist content away from the Internet was announced in Paris by French President Emmanuel Macron and New Zealand PM Jacinda Ardren.

India, Indonesia, Jordan and Japan were the Asian countries in the 16-nation pact with tech firms that promised to review algorithms and processes amplifying or attracting users to extremist violent content.

Keanu Reeves will be back as the remorseful assassin John Wick. He has teamed up with Berry for another mission.

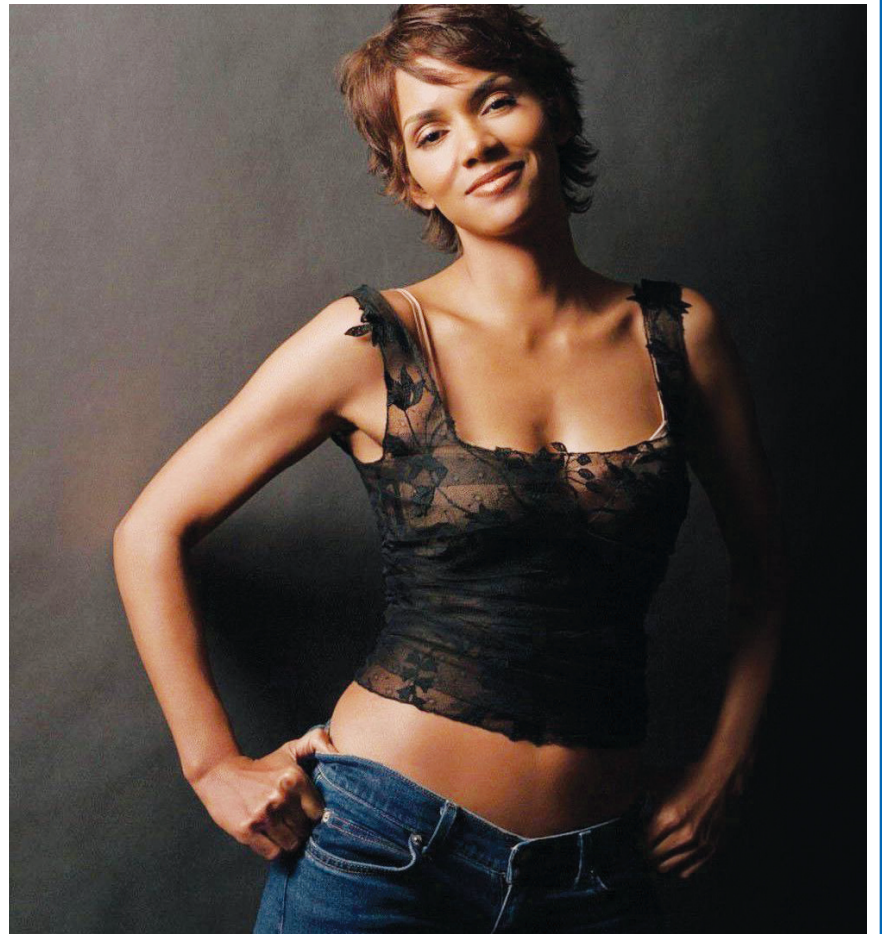

The judge, however, did not grant the singer's requests for more freedom and adjustments to the conservatorship.

100-year-old mystery of Egyptian desert glass solved

MELBOURNE (TIP): Glass found in the Egyptian desert was created by a meteorite impact rather than atmospheric airburst, say scientists, unravelling a nearly 100-year-old mystery.

The findings, published in the journal *Geology*, have implications for understanding the threat posed by asteroids.

Researchers from Curtin University in Australia examined tiny grains of the mineral zircon in samples of Libyan desert glass, which formed 29 million years ago and is found over several thousand square kilometres in western Egypt.

Nearly pure silica, the canary yellow glass was famously used to make a scarab that is part of King Tut's Pectoral.

Lead author Aaron Cavosie, from Curtin University, said zircons in the glass preserved evidence of the former presence of a high-pressure mineral named reidite, which only forms during a meteorite impact.

"It has been a topic of ongoing debate as to whether the glass formed during meteorite impact, or during an airburst, which happens when asteroids called Near Earth Objects explode and deposit energy in the Earth's atmosphere," Cavosie said.

"Both meteorite impacts and airbursts can cause melting, however, only meteorite impacts create shock waves that form high-pressure minerals, so finding evidence of former reidite confirms it was created as the result of a meteorite impact," he said.

Cavosie said the idea that the glass

may have formed during a large atmospheric airburst gained popularity after a dramatic airburst over Russia in 2013, which caused extensive property damage and injury to humans but did not cause surface materials to melt.

"Previous models suggested that Libyan desert glass represented a large, 100-megatonnes (Mt) class airburst, but our results show this is not the case," Cavosie said.

"Meteorite impacts are catastrophic events, but they are not common. Airbursts happen more frequently, but we now know not to expect a Libyan desert glass-forming event in the near future, which is cause for some comfort," he said. PTI

Eiffel Tower celebrates 130th birthday

PARIS (TIP): The Eiffel Tower has celebrated its 130th birthday in Paris, with the city marking the anniversary with a light show at the famed monument.

Built for the 1889 World's Fair, the tower - which soars to 324 metres in height and weighs 7,300 tonnes - still attracts nearly seven million visitors every year.

Despite calls for its demolition in the years after the exhibition, it soon became the most iconic feature on the Paris skyline and is France's most visited monument.

"The Eiffel Tower is a must," said Laurie, a tourist from Canada.

Christophe Girard, overseeing cultural affairs at Paris's city hall said the recent fire at Notre-Dame Cathedral - which destroyed its spire and most of its roof - had awakened people to "the importance of our heritage", and that it "can disappear or be damaged".

The tower was the tallest structure in the world for 41 years until the construction of the Chrysler Building in New York in 1930.

Austrian MP's approve headscarf ban in primary schools

VIENNA (TIP): Austrian MPs on May 15 approved a law aimed at banning the headscarf in primary schools, a measure proposed by the ruling right-wing government.

So as to avoid charges that the law discriminates against Muslims, the text refers to any "ideologically or religiously influenced clothing which is associated with the covering of the head".

The government says the patka head covering worn by Sikh boys or the Jewish kippa would not be affected.

However, representatives of both parts of the governing coalition, the centre-right People's Party (OeVP) and the far-right Freedom Party (FPÖ), have made it clear that the law is targeted at the Islamic headscarf.

FPÖ education spokesman Wendelin Moelzer said the law was "a signal against political Islam" while OeVP MP Rudolf Taschner said the measure was necessary to free girls

from "subjugation".

Austria's official Muslim community organisation IGGOe has previously condemned the proposals as "shameless" and a "diversionary tactic".

The IGGOe says that in any case only a "miniscule number" of girls would be affected.

Opposition MPs almost all voted against the measure, with some accusing the government of focusing on garnering positive headlines rather than child welfare.

The government admits that the law is likely to be challenged at Austria's constitutional court, either on grounds of religious discrimination or because similar legislation affecting schools is normally passed with a two-thirds majority of MPs.

The OeVP and FPÖ formed a coalition in late 2017 after elections in which both parties took a tough anti-immigration stance and warned of the dangers of so-called "parallel societies". — AFP

Australia's ex-PM Bob Hawke dies at 89

SYDNEY (TIP): Bob Hawke, a transformative and charismatic left-wing lawmaker with a "larrikin" streak who served as Australian Prime Minister from 1983 to 1991, died on Thursday aged 89, his family said.

"Today we lost Bob Hawke, a great Australian - many would say the greatest Australian of the post-war era," his wife and former biographer Blanche d'Alpuget said in a statement.

While others may have struggled to dismiss a reputation for boisterous, if well-meaning, behaviour, silver-haired Hawke said it helped him win favour with working-class voters.

PM Scott Morrison hailed Hawke's ability to speak to all Australians. "Bob Hawke was a great Australian who led and served our country with passion, courage, and an intellectual horsepower that made our country stronger," he said on social media. Hawke's death comes ahead of a Saturday general election, with his opposition Labor party is narrowly ahead in the polls. — Reuters

Saudi-led coalition pounds capital Sanaa

SANAA (TIP) : The Saudi-led military coalition in Yemen carried out several air strikes on the Houthi-held capital Sanaa on May 16 after the Iranian-aligned movement claimed responsibility for drone attacks on Saudi oil installations.

The Sanaa strikes targeted nine military sites in and around the city, residents said.

Rubble filled a populated street lined by mud-brick houses, a journalist on the scene said. A crowd of men lifted the body of a woman, wrapped in a white shroud, into an ambulance.

Houthi-run Masirah TV channel quoted the Houthi health ministry as saying six civilians, including four children, had been killed and 52 wounded, including two Russian women working in the health sector. A coalition spokesman did not immediately respond to the media's request for comment. — Reuters

Prince Harry wins damages over photos of home

LONDON (TIP): Britain's Prince Harry on May 16 settled for "substantial damages" and an apology from a news agency that hovered over his home in a helicopter, taking photos directly into his living room and bedroom earlier this year. Lawyers for the Duke of Sussex told the UK High Court that the photographs showed the Oxfordshire home's interior and "very seriously undermined" his safety. The images, which were taken in January and published in UK newspapers and online, showed the living area, dining area and "directly into the bedroom". PTI

EVEN IN YOUNG LOVE, MONEY MATTERS FOR YOUR WELL-BEING

Researchers set out to see how financial socialization from three different sources affects life outcomes and well-being in young adults. The three sources they looked at were parents, romantic partners, and the young adults themselves.

The findings show that young adults' own financial behaviors, unsurprisingly, had the most impact on their well-being. In second place were the financial behaviors of their romantic partners, while financial expectations of parents—who undoubtedly have the earliest financial influence on their lives—seemed to have the least impact.

“Financial socialization means how do individuals—in this case, young adults—learn about finances? How do they learn how to save, how to budget, how to responsibly borrow, basically anything about finances,” says Melissa Curran, lead author of the study.

“The fact that young adults are perceiving that what their romantic partner does, financially, impacts them is really interesting, especially because most of them are not married and not cohabitating,” says Curran, associate professor in the University of Arizona's John & Doris Norton School of Family and Consumer Sciences.

“They're young in relationships, which really goes to say that even in these non-marital, non-cohabitating relationships, the person who you are with matters. Their finances matter for your relationship outcomes and well-being.”

YOUNG PEOPLE AND MONEY

The researchers' findings are part of the ongoing APLUS Life Success research project, which began collecting data from first-year University of Arizona students in 2008 and continues to follow them into adulthood to explore how they achieve stability and happiness.

The new study is based on responses from the third wave of data collection from 504 participants, with an average age of 24, who self-identified as being in a committed romantic relationship.



Most of those young adults—61.5 percent—were unmarried and not living with their partners. Thirty percent were unmarried but cohabitating, and 18.5 percent were living together and married.

While a number of factors contribute to young adults' life outcomes and well-being, the APLUS researchers are especially interested in finances.

“In the United States, you do better when you do have some modicum of money,” says Curran, who is research director for the Norton School's Take Charge America Institute. “You don't need millions and millions of dollars, but having no money is very stressful. Having access to money to do things like pay your bills and have a savings account for emergency borrowing purposes makes your life a lot easier.”

Study participants were surveyed about their parents' financial expectations of them, asked to rate on a five-point scale how much they agreed with statements like: “My parents think I should track my monthly expenses,” or, “My parents think that I should pay credit card balances in full each month.”

Participants also rated how often they themselves engage in a number of different financial activities, such as paying bills on time, contributing to a

retirement account, or saving each month for the future. They also were asked how often they think their romantic partners engage in those behaviors.

In addition, participants responded to a series of questions designed to measure their life outcomes and well-being. The questions assessed participants' perceptions of their own physical health, overall well-being, life satisfaction, romantic relationship satisfaction, and romantic relationship commitment, as well as their subjective and objective financial knowledge.

Subjective financial knowledge was measured through a question asking them to rate their understanding of personal finance and money management, while objective knowledge was measured through 15 true-or-false financial knowledge questions.

Researchers found that the individuals' own financial behaviors were associated with all outcomes measured, except relationship satisfaction and commitment. Individuals' perceptions of their romantic partners' financial behaviors were associated with their relationship satisfaction and commitment, as well as their overall well-being and life satisfaction.

Chicken Burritos

Ingredients

- Chicken - 300 gms, cooked, shredded, skinless, boneless
- Sweet corn kernels - 150 gms, boiled, drained
- Black beans (or red kidney beans) - 150 gms, rinsed, boiled, drained
- Tomatoes - 150 gms, finely chopped
- Flour tortillas - 4
- Green chillies - 2 to 3, chopped
- Jalapenos - 1 tblsp, chopped
- Red chilli flakes as per taste
- Garam masala powder - 2 tsp
- Black pepper powder as per taste
- Salt as per taste
- Coriander leaves - handful, chopped
- Cheese - 100 gms, grated

Optional ingredients

- Sour cream lettuce - handful, shredded
- Tomatoes - 1/2 cup, chopped

Method

- In a large bowl, combine the corn, black beans, tomatoes, green chillies, coriander leaves and jalapenos.
- Add the cooked chicken and mix well.
- Add the red chilli flakes, garam masala powder, black pepper powder, salt and toss gently.
- Warm the tortillas and place them on a flat surface.
- Divide the chicken mixture equally among the 4 tortillas.
- Sprinkle some cheese on top.
- If desired, add some sour cream, lettuce and chopped tomatoes.
- Fold from the sides and roll tightly.
- Heat a nonstick pan over medium flame.
- Place the burritos on the pan and warm them up for 3 to 5 minutes, turning gently once or twice.
- Serve.

Opposites not only attract, also make good decisions together: Study

Two people with divergent attitudes can together make satisfactory decisions, in spite of their opposite personalities, a recent study suggests.

Consumers routinely make joint decisions with others - which restaurant to eat in, what movie to watch, or where to go on vacation. Researchers from Boston College, Georgia Tech, and Washington State University wanted to see if people with opposite attitudes could come to satisfactory decisions together.

The studies found that when paired with a selfish partner, it is better to behave altruistically rather than selfishly. Similarly, when paired with an altruistic partner, it is better to behave selfishly to achieve the desired outcome, according to the findings, reported recently in the *Journal of Consumer Psychology*. In both scenarios, the paired respondents were able to come to decisions that best reflected their individual preferences, or what both partners personally liked - if they took the opposite attitude as that of their partner, said



Hristina Nikolova, lead author of the study.

“When you see that your partner is acting selfishly, it is better to let it go and act altruistically instead; let them make the decision because this will ultimately ensure a better outcome for you than if you act selfishly too,” Nikolova explained. According to the researchers, in the joint decision-

making of an altruistic and selfish consumer, the selfish partner would willingly express his/her desired preference, while the altruistic partner will likely accept these suggestions. Since consumers' preferences are more similar than they recognise, an altruistic individual will likely get an option that he/she somewhat prefers even when a selfish partner drives the decision. Thus, regardless of who drives the decision, both partners are likely to reach a joint decision that is relatively preferred by both of them.

According to Nikolova, conventional wisdom suggests that standing one's ground is associated with positive outcomes. But that's not necessarily the case.

“In the context of joint choices, however, we find that two selfish heads do worse than one altruistic and one selfish head; two selfish consumers jointly choose options that neither of them prefers. This happens because both partners are likely to be rigidly self-oriented when negotiating with others,” she said.

TRY OUT THESE HEALTHY SUBSTITUTES FOR BUTTER

Butter is a dairy product that people can make from churned milk or cream. However, for people who cannot or choose not to consume butter, there are many alternatives.

Olive oil

People use olive oil in many Mediterranean recipes. For any recipes that require cooking on the stove top, a person can often swap butter for olive oil when sautéing vegetables and meat. It is best to use a little less olive oil compared with butter for this purpose.

Olive oil is not always a good substitute for baking, however. Many baked goods require the fat to remain a solid or return to a solid as they cool. However, people can make some baked goods, such as pancakes, with olive oil.

The main type of fat in olive oil is monounsaturated fat, which may have some health benefits that the saturated fat in butter does not have.

Research from 2014 found that consuming olive oil regularly could reduce the risk of cardiovascular disease and mortality in individuals at high cardiovascular risk.

Other benefits of monounsaturated fat include lowering cholesterol and improving blood sugar control.

However, like butter, olive oil is a calorie-dense food. For this reason, people should consume it in moderation.

Ghee

Ghee is a clarified butter with a distinctive nutty taste and aroma. Like coconut oil, a person can replace butter with ghee at a 1-to-1 ratio in cooking and baking.

However, in some recipes, a person



may need to alter the amount of ghee, as it contains more moisture than butter. Ghee works best as a butter substitute in baked goods that require cooking at higher temperatures.

Greek yogurt

Greek yogurt is a high-protein substitute for butter suitable for use in many baking recipes. It may add some tanginess to the recipe.

A person should look for full-fat yogurt to help keep baked goods moist. Nonfat yogurt may result in a drier, more crumbly finished product.

Avocado

Avocado is a nutritious alternative to butter. Not only can adding avocado increase the overall nutritional value of a meal or baked good, but it can also substitute butter's saturated fat for monounsaturated fat.

Pumpkin purée

With plenty of vitamin A and other

nutrients, pumpkin purée can replace butter in most recipes. However, pumpkin purée is more watery than some of the other options on this list, so a person should use about three-quarters of the amount they would use for butter.

Mashed bananas

Similar to pumpkin purée, bananas add nutrients and increase the overall nutritional content of the food without the added fat.

However, bananas may add sweetness and a distinct flavor to some recipes.

Applesauce

Applesauce is a popular substitute for both butter and oil in baking. Like many other substitutes, it can cut calories and increase the nutritional content of many recipes.

When using applesauce as a butter substitute, a person can reduce other sweeteners in the recipe because applesauce adds natural sweetness.



ANTIBIOTIC USE CAN UP NERVE DAMAGE RISK

A common class of antibiotics—used to treat respiratory and urinary tract infections—may increase a patient's risk of suffering a serious and potentially permanent form of nerve damage by almost 50 per cent.

Scientists from the University of Dundee in the UK looked at a database of 1.3 million adults issued one or more prescriptions of fluoroquinolone or amoxicillin-clavulanate antibiotics with no diagnosis of peripheral neuropathy at the outset of treatment.

Peripheral neuropathy has long been recognised as a potential side effect of fluoroquinolone antibiotics—that are commonly used to treat a variety of illnesses such as respiratory and urinary tract infections.

The study, published in the journal *JAMA Neurology*, found that current use of systemic fluoroquinolone antibiotics appeared to increase the risk of peripheral neuropathy by 47 per cent, causing an additional 2.4 cases per 10,000 patients per year of treatment.

A person prescribed with amoxicillin-clavulanate were not significantly more likely to experience peripheral neuropathy.

The risk was higher for men and rose with age and with the length of fluoroquinolone treatment. A peripheral neuropathy diagnosis remained more likely to be diagnosed for up to six months after the fluoroquinolone prescription.

Older men, the group most likely to experience the condition after taking a 28-day course of fluoroquinolones, were said to have a one in 34,000 chance of doing so.

While the absolute risk of a peripheral neuropathy diagnosis remained low, the findings should still be considered as one of the different potential side effects before prescribing antibiotics, researchers said.

"The safety of fluoroquinolone antibiotics has received a lot of attention regarding their potential to cause long-term side effects in some people," said Daniel Morales, from the University of Dundee.

"One of these is peripheral neuropathy where nerves, most commonly affecting the lower limbs, can be affected, leading to numbness, pain, or problems with balance," Morales said in a statement.

"Fluoroquinolones are effective antibiotics but health care professionals should recognise that peripheral neuropathy may rarely occur following fluoroquinolone therapy," he said.

"We observed that treatment with fluoroquinolones could increase the risk of peripheral neuropathy by around 50 per cent and that this risk may last for up to six months following treatment," he said.

Eating disorders linked to long-term depression risk for mothers

Any kind of eating disorder and body image concerns before or during pregnancy can be associated with long-term depression risk for mothers, recent findings suggest.

"We found that women who have had an eating disorder at any point before childbirth, even if it was years earlier in adolescence, were more likely to experience depressive symptoms during pregnancy and up to 18 years after the birth of their child," said the study's lead author Francesca Solmi.

According to the researchers, this finding suggests that many people with eating disorders might not fully recover since we know that eating disorders and depression often happen at the same time.

Previous studies had suggested that depressive symptoms among mothers with eating disorders might improve after the perinatal period, but those studies didn't have such a long follow-up time to confirm that the increased risk of depressive symptoms does, in fact, persist for women who have had an eating disorder.



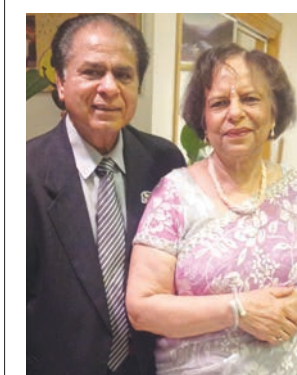
The research team found that women who had ever had anorexia nervosa or bulimia nervosa experienced more depressive symptoms over an 18-year follow-up than those who had never had an eating disorder.

"Depressive symptoms in mothers have been shown to be associated with a number of negative outcomes for their children, such as emotional and

behavioural problems. It is therefore important, to identify and treat eating disorders early, as these could be one potential cause of the depressive symptoms. We should also identify pregnant women with an eating disorder so that they can be provided with mental health support. This could benefit both mother and child in the long run," Solmi explained.

FACEBOOK TIGHTENS RULES AROUND LIVE STREAMING

Following the New Zealand mosque attack which was streamed live on Facebook, the social networking giant has tightened the rules that apply specifically to the Live camera feature on its platform.

As part of its updated policies, anyone who violates Facebook's most serious policies would be restricted from using Live for set periods of time - for example 30 days, starting on their first offence.

"We will now apply a 'one strike' policy to Live in connection with a broader range of offences. For instance, someone who shares a link to a statement from a terrorist group with no context will now be immediately blocked from using Live for a set period of time," Guy Rosen, Vice President, Integrity at Facebook, wrote in a blog post on Tuesday.

After the New Zealand attacks at two mosques in Christchurch city that claimed 51 lives in March, Facebook claimed it removed 1.5 million videos of the C attacks within the first 24 hours itself. It also said it blocked 1.2 million of them at upload, meaning they would not have been seen by users.

The original 17-minute video of the attack was viewed 4,000 times before it was removed from the platform.

UBER ADDS 'QUIET MODE' IN LUXURY SERVICE UPGRADE

For people who don't prefer chatty drivers, global ride-sharing major Uber is rolling-out "quiet mode" on its luxury services.

It's the first upgrade to the ride-hail giant's premium services to take place in several years, The Verge reported on Tuesday.

Under the upgrade, Uber would also allow its Premium riders to request help with their luggage and specify their preferred temperature while booking the ride.

They can also ask for extra time before getting into the car without incurring late pickup fees, and will be able to speak directly to a customer service representative if something goes wrong, the report said.

More region and rollout specifications of the feature remain unclear as of now.

Uber Black and Uber Black SUV are the company's premium car services that place riders in high-end vehicles.

Originally founded as a luxury car service that could be booked through a smartphone app, Uber later introduced low-cost options like Uber Pool.

The company launched its services in India with Uber Black in 2013 and then the premium UberX in 2014. It currently operates in 31 cities in India.



SUPERFAST DATA PROCESSING USING LIGHT PULSES CREATED

The invention uses magnets to record computer data which consume virtually zero energy, solving the dilemma of how to create faster data processing speeds without the accompanying high energy costs.

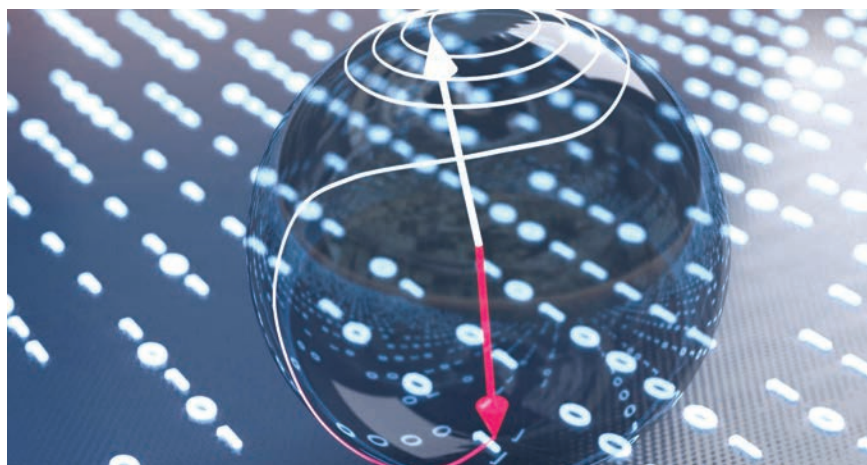
Today's data centre servers consume between 2 to 5% of global electricity consumption, producing heat which in turn requires more power to cool the servers.

The problem is so acute that Microsoft has even submerged hundreds of its data centre services in the ocean in an effort to keep them cool and cut costs.

Most data are encoded as binary information (0 or 1 respectively) through the orientation of tiny magnets, called spins, in magnetic hard-drives. The magnetic read/write head is used to set or retrieve information using electrical currents which dissipate huge amounts of energy.

Now an international team publishing in Nature has solved the problem by replacing electricity with extremely short pulses of light -- the duration of one trillionth of a second -- concentrated by special antennas on top of a magnet.

This new method is superfast but so



energy efficient that the temperature of the magnet does not increase at all.

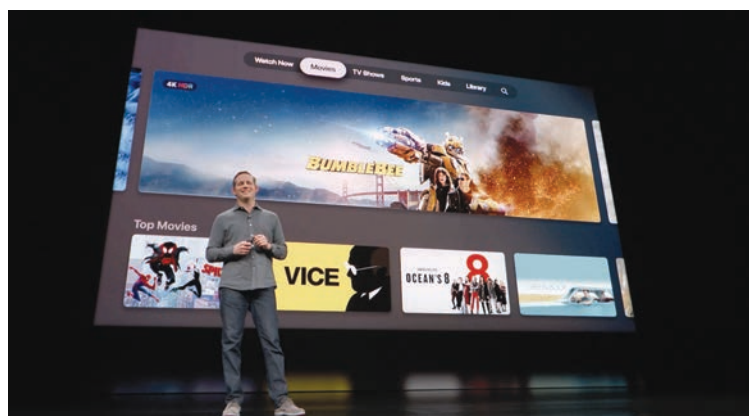
The team includes Dr Rostislav Mikhaylovskiy, formerly at Radboud University and now Lancaster University, Stefan Schlauderer, Dr Christoph Lange and Professor Rupert Huber from Regensburg University, Professor Alexey Kimel from Radboud University and Professor Anatoly Zvezdin from the Russian Academy of Sciences. They demonstrated this new method by pulsing a magnet with

ultrashort light bursts (the duration of a millionth of a second) at frequencies in the far infrared, the so called terahertz spectral range.

However, even the strongest existing sources of the terahertz light did not provide strong enough pulses to switch the orientation of a magnet to date.

The breakthrough was achieved by utilizing the efficient interaction mechanism of coupling between spins and terahertz electric field, which was discovered by the same team.

Apple's TV app reaching 100 countries



Apple has started rolling out its TV app in over 100 countries that includes India, which would run across devices, including iPhones, iPads, Apple TVs and all of the Samsung smart TVs that are part of its 2019 line-up.

Along with India, US, Canada, Nepal, select African as well as Middle Eastern countries are also getting Apple's TV app.

"With the free iOS 12.3 and tvOS 12.3 software update, customers around the world can now subscribe to Apple TV channels within the Apple TV app - paying for only the ones they want - and watch on demand directly in the app," the company wrote in a blog-post on Monday.

With its Family Sharing feature, the Apple TV app allows up to six members to share subscriptions to Apple TV channels using their Apple ID and password. "Subscribers can watch and download shows and movies both online and offline, making the Apple TV app the first and only place where HBO subscribers can download movies and shows such as 'Game of Thrones' for offline viewing," the post added.

The app features dedicated sections of editorially handpicked content for kids of all ages as well as a Sports section.

The Apple TV app would be made available for MacBook users later this year. "Also starting today (Monday), users worldwide can enjoy personalised recommendations of shows and movies from more than 150 video apps and streaming services and over 100,000 iTunes movies and TV shows, including the largest collection of 4K HDR titles available to browse, buy or rent - all within the new Apple TV app," the post noted.

WHATSAPP URGES USERS TO UPGRADE APP AFTER REPORT OF SPYWARE ATTACK

Facebook's WhatsApp on Tuesday urged users to upgrade to the latest version of its popular messaging app following a report that users could be vulnerable to having malicious spyware installed on phones without their knowledge.

"WhatsApp encourages people to upgrade to the latest version of our app, as well as keep their mobile operating system up to date, to protect against potential targeted exploits designed to compromise information stored on mobile devices," a spokesman said.

"We are constantly working alongside industry partners to provide the latest security enhancements to help protect our users."

The Financial Times reported that a vulnerability in WhatsApp allowed attackers to inject spyware on phones by ringing up targets using the app's phone call function. It said the spyware was developed by Israeli cyber surveillance company NSO Group.

Asked about the report, NSO said its technology is licensed to authorised government agencies "for the sole purpose of fighting crime and terror", and that it does not operate the system itself.



China has a \$3.65 trillion war chest to counter US tariffs

BEIJING (TIP): US President Donald Trump's call for the Federal Reserve to mirror its Chinese counterpart misses the mark because Beijing's main defense against trade-war fallout will come from the finance ministry, not the central bank.

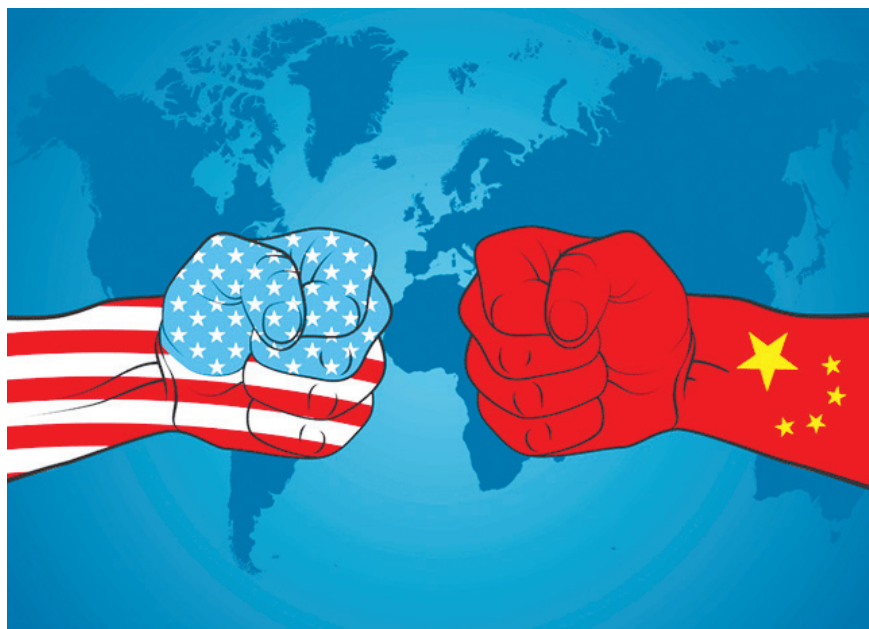
If tariffs begin to really hurt China's growth this year, there's plenty of direct fiscal firepower left to stoke the economy, before the People's Bank of China would have to cut interest rates. Data released Wednesday showed an across-the-board slowdown in April.

Central and local authorities in China have at least 25.1 trillion yuan (\$3.65 trillion) unspent in their budgets this year, according to data compiled by Bloomberg using official budget plans. That's two trillion yuan more than the ammunition China had in the same period last year -- and about equivalent to the entire annual output of Germany.

"Chinese leaders will be able to better utilize different kinds of policy tools than their U.S. counterparts if the trade war persists, and that's where China's confidence comes from," said Serena Zhou, an economist at Mizuho Securities Asia Ltd in Hong Kong. "From monetary policy and fiscal policy to the dominant role of the state-owned enterprises, China's control on the economy is obviously stronger than the U.S.," she said.

Indeed, PBOC Governor Yi Gang has spent the last year saying he wants to avoid a "flood" of stimulus, pushing back against expectations of benchmark interest-rate cuts as he seeks to curb market bubbles and keep a lid on debt growth. That said, economists from Morgan Stanley and China International Capital Corporation to Macquarie Securities expect further cuts to the proportion of deposits banks are forced to lock away, as authorities look to keep the credit taps flowing.

The authorities have ramped up fiscal expenditure earlier this year than they usually do, with the most obvious front-loading coming in infrastructure-related



areas such as transportation and environmental protection.

Even so, more than two thirds of the total "augmented" budget -- the general public budget, the government fund budget and special government bonds together -- remains unused.

Of course, merely increasing this year's spending isn't the limit of fiscal action if the trade war blows out and impacts economic growth significantly. Officials can support growth by selling more debt via local government financing vehicles and policy banks, though that begins to run counter to the goal of cleaning up debt.

"China may step up its pro-growth policies if the U.S. imposes additional tariffs on \$300 billion worth of Chinese goods" and the preferable policy options include expansionary fiscal policy, such as tax and fee cuts, according to CICC economists.

A severe growth slowdown is likely to produce a "whatever it takes" moment for China's policy makers. Otherwise, the Communist Party faces failure to meet its long-term growth target, just in time for its centenary in 2021.

For its part, the PBOC has also appeared to be leaning toward an easing bias since this month as trade tensions escalate.

Compared to the room for more fiscal stimulus, the PBOC has less space to maneuver and will likely stick to the "targeted approach" for now. Universal cuts to reserve-requirement ratios and interest rates are however on the table if the economy faces greater challenges, said Wang Yifeng, chief analyst of banking at Everbright Securities Co in Beijing.

The central bank has appeared to be more accommodative in open market operations since early May, adding liquidity to stabilize market sentiment. Monetary policy officials also sought to ease investors by saying it has ample policy room and tools to deal with any uncertainties.

"We can't quantify the impact of the trade war on corporate sentiment, so the real influence may be larger" than what economist estimates suggest, which reinforces the case for more pro-growth policies, Hong-Kong-based Morgan Stanley economist Robin Xing said.

DARWIN GROUP EYES SEAT IN JET AIRWAYS' COCKPIT

MUMBAI (TIP): Top management of lesser-known Darwin Group, which was one of the unsolicited bidders for Jet Airways, today met officials of SBI Caps to discuss its proposal.

The Group has offered Rs 14,000-crore deal to the lenders for acquiring the grounded airline, its CEO Rahul Ganpule said.

Darwin Platform Group of Companies claims it has investments across various sectors, including oil and gas, hospitality and realty, among others. Ganpule said the company had submitted its bid on May 8.

"They (SBI Caps) had called us. We wanted to understand the liability and assets of Jet Airways," he told reporters after the meeting.

The consortium of SBI-led seven lenders, which owns 51% in the airline, has offered to sell up to 75% stake in the airline, which stopped flying around mid last month. The ailing carrier owes over Rs 8,000 crore to the lenders.

SBI Caps had early last month invited expressions of interest between April 8 and 12, on behalf of the lenders to sell their stake in the carrier.

It received one solicited bid from the airline's investment partner Etihad Airways, besides two unsolicited on May 10, which was the last date of submission of financial bids.

The bids were examined by the lenders on May 13 and they found Etihad's bid conditional. Ganpule said though the Group had done due diligence before submitting the financial bid, it wanted some more financial details that were not publicly available.

Exports dip to 4-month low, trade gap at 5-month high

NEW DELHI (TIP): India's export growth slid to a four-month low of 0.64% in April as shipments of engineering goods, gems and jewellery, leather and other products declined, widening the trade deficit to a five-month high, data released on Wednesday showed.

Imports increased by 4.5%, the highest growth in the past six months as crude oil and gold shipments shot up in the month.

Merchandise exports stood at \$26 billion in April while imports at \$41.4 billion, leading to a trade gap of \$15.33 billion, the widest deficit since November 2018, the trade data showed.

The country's merchandise exports were down because of the negative growth in key sectors such as engineering, gems and jewellery, leather, carpet, plastic, marine products, rice and coffee during the month under review. Previously, exports had recorded a low growth rate of 0.34 per cent in December 2018.

Oil imports grew by 9.26% to \$11.38 billion and non-oil imports expanded by 2.78%. Gold imports rose by 54% to \$3.97 billion in April.

IndiGo plans budget business class seats to lure Europe-Asia fliers

Low-cost airlines, the pioneers of brief discomfort at bargain prices, have struggled to master long-haul flights. Now one of the world's most successful budget carriers is considering cut-price business class seats as a way into the Europe-Asia market.

India's IndiGo, which currently flies as far as Istanbul, is mapping out an ambitious long-distance network. The airline aims to start one-stop trips further into Europe within six months, Chief Executive Officer Ronojoy Dutta said in an interview in New Delhi last week.

IndiGo has captured almost half the Indian market in just over a decade by offering cheap, punctual flights -- and charging extra for almost anything else. Dutta's long-haul plans are forcing a product overhaul to help passengers endure longer flights and he's considering everything from extra snacks to a brand-new business class.

"Once you get to six, seven, eight hours, the body gets tired, people need to use the washrooms more, people need to eat more frequently, all of those things change," Dutta said. "We have to redesign our product. Is it more pitch, is it more food, is it more hot towels, is it a business class?"

Patchy Legacy

Success could upend a long-haul market between Asia and Europe that's long been the preserve of full-service carriers



from Singapore Airlines Ltd. and British Airways to Emirates Airline and Cathay Pacific Airways. While IndiGo has become Asia's largest low-cost carrier by market value, other no-frills rivals that have tried to go long-haul have left a hit-and-miss legacy.

Discount carrier Norwegian Air Shuttle ASA, which launched services on intercontinental routes, has been weighed down by losses after a rapid expansion. AirAsia X Bhd., the Malaysian long-haul, low-cost airline, opted to focus on Asia after on-off services to London, although it still flies to a Honolulu, via a stop in Osaka. Both airlines offer premium seats with extra legroom, meals and in-flight entertainment.

Scout, the budget unit of Singapore Airlines, offers long-haul flights to Athens and Berlin. Its "Scoutbiz" class on Boeing Co. 787 Dreamliner jets provides leather seats, more legroom, additional carry-on bags, welcome drinks and one additional alcoholic beverage. Business-class flyers on Scout are also able to charge their mobile gadgets on board, and can stream movies on their own devices.

It's not clear what IndiGo's business class would potentially offer or how much it might cost. The airline must meet other challenges too: Fuel is typically among an airline's biggest expenses and IndiGo faces rising oil prices as it considers setting up a long-distance network.

IndiGo wants to operate one-stop flights to cities like London from New Delhi, while flying non-stop to countries like China, Vietnam, Myanmar and Russia. It's in talks with Airbus SE to buy a yet-to-be-released longer version of the European planemaker's newest narrow-body jet. The airline is preparing to place a "large" order, Dutta said.

Indian American Cardiologist Sentenced to Three Years in Prison for Unlawful Distribution of Opioids

NEVADA (TIP): Dr. Devendra I. Patel, aka Devendrakumar I. Patel, a northern Nevada cardiologist was sentenced May 8 to three years and one month in federal prison for prescribing highly addictive pain pills Oxycodone and Hydrocodone at a high rate to his patients without a medical purpose.

Patel, 60, of Elko, pleaded guilty in November 2018, to distribution of controlled substances, and was indicted by a grand jury in December 2017. His DEA license was suspended upon his arrest in December 2017. He owned and operated Northeastern Nevada Cardiology. In addition to the prison term, U.S. District Judge Larry R. Hicks sentenced Patel to three years of supervised release and ordered him to pay a \$500,000 fine. Patel was ordered to self-surrender to begin serving his sentence on August 6, 2019.

Between September 2015 and February 2016, he prescribed Oxycodone and Hydrocodone to patients without a legitimate medical purpose and outside the usual course of professional practice. His prescribing practices allowed him to see a high volume of patients and easily prescribe opioids, while not addressing any legitimate medical concerns of his patients.

Indian American Doctor Sentenced to Prison for health care fraud

ALBUQUERQUE (TIP): Pawankumar Jain, 66, a former physician, was sentenced May 9 in federal court in Las Cruces, N.M., to 108 months in prison and three years of supervised release for unlawfully dispensing controlled substances and health care fraud. U.S. Attorney John C. Anderson, Special Agent in Charge Kyle W. Williamson of the DEA's El Paso Division, and Special Agent in Charge James C. Langenberg of the FBI's Albuquerque Division announced the sentence. Jain previously entered guilty pleas on Feb. 11, 2016, to one count of unlawfully dispensing a controlled substance and one count of health care fraud. In his plea agreement, Jain admitted that he previously was licensed to practice medicine in the State of New Mexico and was registered with the DEA to prescribe controlled substances, including pain medication. Jain admitted that for several years he operated a high-volume "pain management" practice in Las Cruces, and frequently performed only " cursory" examinations of his patients before prescribing narcotics to them without documenting any therapeutic benefit for those drugs in his records.

Indian Origin Stepmother from Queens Convicted of Killing Nine-year Old Girl

QUEENS, NY (TIP): Acting Queens District Attorney John M. Ryan announced May 11 that a jury has convicted a Richmond Hill, Queens, woman of Indian origin of murder in the August 2016 strangulation death of her nine-year-old stepdaughter who was left in her care.

Acting District Attorney Ryan said, "This is a horrifying case of a defenseless nine-year-old child, who was to be cared for by her stepmother but was instead strangled to death by her. Her actions are truly incomprehensible and deserve the maximum punishment allowed under the law."

The District Attorney's office identified the defendant as Shamdai Arjun, 55, of 112th Street, in the Richmond Hill section of Queens. The defendant was convicted May 11 of second-degree murder by a jury that deliberated for less than one hour before Queens Supreme Court Justice Kenneth C. Holder. Justice Holder indicated that he would sentence Arjun on June 3, 2019, at which time, she faces up to 25 years to life in prison.

Acting District Attorney Ryan said that, according to trial testimony, at approximately 5:30 p.m. on Friday, August 19, 2016, Arjun was observed by an eyewitness leaving the above-mentioned address along with her ex-

husband Raymond Narayan, and her two grandchildren ages 3 and 5 and was asked about the nine-year-old victim's whereabouts. The defendant informed the eyewitness that the child Ashdeep Kaur was in the bathroom and was waiting for her father to pick her up. The eyewitness, who observed that the bathroom light had been on since at least 3:00 p.m., called the victim's father and

was instructed to break through the bathroom door, at which time she observed the deceased victim in the bathtub.

A report filed by the Medical Examiner's Office determined that the cause of death was manual strangulation.

Indian origin doctor turned babysitter Pallavi Macharla sentenced to life for death of six-month-old

BURLINGTON, NJ (TIP): Middlesex District Attorney Marian Ryan and Burlington Chief of Police Michael Kent have announced that Pallavi Macharla, 44, of Burlington, was found guilty May 13 of second-degree murder by a Middlesex Superior Court Jury in connection with the March 2014 death of six-month-old Ridhima Dhekane who died while in the defendant's care.

Judge Kenneth Fishman sentenced her to life with the possibility of parole. Macharla had earned a medical degree in India before immigrating to the United States.

"On the morning of March 27, 2014, the day after she turned six months old, the victim was dropped off at the defendant's home, a perfectly healthy infant, and by the afternoon she was unresponsive and had sustained serious injuries," said District Attorney Ryan. "The victim's family trusted Ms. Macharla to protect and care for their child. In part that trust was due to the defendant's background as a trained medical professional. However, at about 2:40 p.m., when the baby became unresponsive while in the defendant's care, Ms. Macharla called the victim's mother instead of dialing 911."

"The loss of any child is tragic," said Burlington Chief of Police Michael

Kent. "To lose an innocent and defenseless child in such a violent and senseless manner is devastating. I extend my deepest condolences to the victim's family. No guilty verdict can ever bring their loved one back, but I hope they will find some comfort in knowing the defendant will now be held accountable."

On March 27, 2014, the day after her six-month birthday, the victim was left in the care of a neighbor, Pallavi Macharla, who regularly provided childcare for the baby. At approximately 2:40 p.m., Macharla called the baby's mother to say Ridhima was not responsive.

Ridhima's mother raced to Macharla's home and saw Macharla performing mouth-to-mouth respirations on her daughter who was limp and non-responsive. The mother immediately called 911. The defendant reported that the baby became unresponsive after vomiting following a feeding. First responders who arrived at the residence on Baron Park Lane in Burlington found the baby unresponsive and pulseless. The child was transported by ambulance to Lahey Hospital and then to Boston Children's Hospital.

The victim never regained consciousness. Diagnostic tests and

studies were performed, which revealed that the baby was suffering from haemorrhaging on the brain and behind the retinas. The victim was also found to have multiple fractures to her spine which were dated to have been inflicted on March 27, 2014. The medical team found that the injuries were consistent with Abusive Head Trauma and that any attempts at surgical intervention would have been futile due to the severity of the bleeding and swelling on the victim's brain.

During subsequent interviews, authorities learned that the defendant had made past statements describing the victim as fussy and in need of constant attention. This led investigators to believe that the motivation for the shaking injuries and blunt force trauma occurred as a result of the defendant's frustration with her.

Following an autopsy overseen by Chief Medical Examiner Dr. Henry Nields, the cause of death was ruled blunt force trauma and shaking injuries of head and the manner of death was homicide.

Macharla was directly indicted by a Middlesex Superior Court Grand Jury and arraigned on March 27, 2015, exactly one year after she caused the victim's injuries. (Source: DOJ)

CHAR DHAM YATRA



Char Dham conveys the presence of four sacred abodes. But it has a great significance in Hindu religion. Char Dham originally used to refer to a pilgrimage circuit encompassing four holiest sites which were located at four directions of India - Badrinath, Puri, Rameshwaram and Dwarka. They were established by Adi Shankaracharya in the 8th century AD. A relatively smaller circuit of Hindu pilgrimage is formed by the four hallowed places of Indian Himalayas, which are also known as Chota Char Dham. 'Chota' means small in Hindi. Alternately called Char Dham of Himalayas or Char Dham of Uttarakhand, the revered group possesses four sacred sites - Badrinath, Kedarnath, Gangotri and Yamotri.

There are three major sects in Hinduism - Shaivism, Vaishnavism and Shaktism. The Char Dham of India consists of three Vishnava locations (Dwarka, Badrinath and Puri) and one Shaiva (Rameshwaram).

Hindu pilgrimage circuit of Indian Himalayas represents all the primary cults by having two Shakta sites (Yamunotri and Gangotri), one Vaishnava site (Badrinath) and one Shaiva site (Kedarnath). Adi Shankaracharya, who has been credited with the creation of the four holiest abodes in India, is believed to have attained freedom from his bodily form in Kedarnath.

Four pious spots of Garhwal Himalayas find mention in many great Hindu texts such as Vedas and Puranas and assume a very important position in Hindu religion.

The temples of Chota Char Dham are located in the Garhwal region of Uttarakhand. Yamunotri and Gangotri are located in Uttarkashi district, Kedarnath is in Rudraprayag district and Badrinath is in Chamoli district.

Land of Uttarakhand is also known as Dev Bhumi (Land of Gods) because of the various tales of divine beings finding its permanent home in the ever flowing rivers, river confluences, shrines, rocks, caves and, most importantly, in people's faith.

Going to the four sacred places would take you through the most picturesque landscape involving dense mountain forests, meadows, large valleys, waterfalls, rivers, river confluences and flowers. With plentiful of nature's presence in every nook and corner of Uttarakhand, pilgrimage in Himalayas becomes more rejuvenating and spiritually uplifting.

Badrinath

Badrinath Temple is one of the holiest Hindu shrines in India. It is situated in the hill town of Badrinath in the Chamoli district of Uttarakhand state. Along the river Alaknanda, the temple is essentially a Lord Vishnu shrine. Also known by the names Badri Vishal and Badrinarayan, it is one of the Char Dham sites and the one amongst 108 Divya Desams. This has contributed to the fact that Badrinath is vital with reference to travel and tourism.

The gates of the temple are open only for a period of six months, due to extreme weather conditions in Himalayas. There are a number of hot water pools here namely Tapt Kund, Narad Kund etc. These pools are filled with hot steaming water in the winter months also and are considered to possess medicinal properties. Many people even perform the last rites of the departed souls at Brahm Kapal.

It is a flat platform on the banks of river Alaknanda. Sheshnetra and Chandrapaduka are other rock boulders present along the river, which are believed to have footprints of Shesh Nag and Lord Vishnu. Another important temple here is the Mata Murti Temple. These temples are also considered as evidences of the rich historical past of Badrinath. Referring the mythological facts, it is believed that Lord Vishnu was practicing penance at this place.

In order to save him from the harmful rays of the sun, his divine consort Lakshmi took the form of a Badri plant and provided shade to him. Pleased by her fervor and devotion, the

Lord told her that this place would be famous by her name. Hence, it came to be known as Badrinath. Splashed by Alaknanda, the divine site serves as an ideal location to experience the eternal bliss associated with spirituality.

Kedarnath

Kedarnath is a sacred town situated in the state of Uttarakhand of India. It can even be called as one of the remotest Char Dham sites as it is located amidst the snow-capped mountains of Himalayas, near the river Mandakini. Nestled in the Rudraprayag district, the main attractions here is the Kedarnath Temple, which is a popular Hindu shrine and pilgrimage, attracting devotees from all over the world. The travel and tourism scope here is strengthened by factors like natural beauty and religious zest.

The Kedarnath Temple is dedicated to Lord Shiva and is deemed to have been built by Adi Sankaracharya. The glory of the temple can be attributed to the fact that it is one of the twelve jyotirlingas (Lord Shiva shrines), present in the country. The temple remains open only for a period of six months, due to heavy snowfall in the winter months. Testing the fervor and dedication of the pilgrims, the temple is not directly reachable by road.

The only way being, a 14 km trek path from Gaurikund. The present temple stands adjacent to the initial temple built by the Pandavas. According to historical data, Pandavas after winning the battle of Mahabharata, felt guilty of killing their own brothers. They came here in search of Lord Shiva, who kept hiding himself. Finally Bhima, the strongest Pandava brother recognized him. Lord Shiva, who was disguised as a bull, escaped leaving behind his hind part.

This led to the construction of the temple here. The present Kedarnath Temple has been built by huge slabs of gray stones, standing undeterred with all its glory and majesty. The divine peace and tranquility of the place leaves the devotees completely mesmerized. The haunting environment and secluded surroundings compel all the visitors to feel the inner connection with the Almighty. Thus, Kedarnath is considered a must visit place amongst pilgrims, before leaving this world.

Gangotri

One of the four sites amongst the holiest places, Char Dham in India, is Gangotri. This sacred city is located in the northern part of the state of Uttarakhand. It is known as the source of River Ganges and also the seat of Goddess Ganga. Ducked amidst the sprawling Garhwal hills, Gangotri is an ideal location for

all those who wish to take a dip into the oceans of divinity, as well as those have a thirst for adventure. This makes Gangotri an ideal spot in terms of travel and tourism.

Gangotri also has a strong historical past and bears the eternal feel of antiquity. According to mythological records, King Bhagirath did penance here, after which, as per Lord Shiva's wishes, River Ganges came down on earth. However, to save the earth from the fierce force of the river, Lord Shiva held her in his locks. Thus, river Ganges is also known as Bhagirathi here. Moreover, it is also believed that Pandavas came down to this place to perform Deva Yajna.

As a result, Gangotri is a significant place from religion point of view. Hundreds of devotees throng the place every year in order to unleash the secrets of spirituality. Some of the main attractions of Gangotri include Gangotri Temple, which was built by Gurkha monarch Amar Singh Thapa, around 3000 years back. Another pilgrim site here is Jalamagna Shivalinga, which is a natural rock Shivalinga submerged in the river.

It is deemed to be the place where Lord Shiva held Ganga in his locks. This Shivalinga is only visible in winter months. Other worth visiting places in the vicinity are Gaumukh (source of Ganges), Gaumukh Glacier and Nandanvan. Drifting towards the adventurous aspect of Gangotri, it offers a number of sports for fun lovers such as river rafting, trekking etc. Thus, to enjoy the natural beauty and religious fervor at its best, Gangotri is a must visit place for all.

Yamunotri

Perched amidst sprawling Garhwal Hills, Yamunotri is another revered pilgrim spots in

the state of Uttarakhand. It is one of the Char Dham in India and holds great religious importance. Yamunotri is the source of sacred river Yamuna and also the abode of goddess Yamuna. It is famous for its thermal springs, glaciers and scenic locales. In effect, it is one of the must visit places from travel and tourism point of view.

According to Hindu mythology, this hilly spot was once the abode of an ancient sage by the name, Asit Muni. Owing to its legendary significance, thousands of devotees visit this silent yet hustling-bustling pilgrimage place. There are a many worth visiting places here, one of the most important being the Yamunotri temple. This temple was built by Maharani Gularia of Jaipur in the 19th century. The shrine is dedicated to goddess Yamuna.

She resides here in the form of a silver idol adorned with garlands. It is believed that a holy dip in the sacred water of river Yamunotri here relieves everyone from a painful death. This is because she is the sister of Yama, the God of Death. As a result, pilgrims visit the place in order to seek the blessings of Yamuna and save themselves from the agony of death. Apart from this there is Surya Kund which is known for its thermal springs.

The temperature of the water here is approximately 190 degree Fahrenheit. Also, there are a number of hot water pools here, which are used to cook rice and potato as Prasad (holy offerings to God). Divya Shilla is a rock pillar here, which is worshipped by the devotees before entering the Yamunotri temple. Other tourist places near Yamunotri are Janaki Chatti, Hanuman Chatti and Saptrishi Kund.

An escape to serenity is what describes a place like Mukutmanipur — the second biggest earthen dam of India flawlessly.

Mukutmanipur is a village in Bankura district of West Bengal. A weekend in these beautiful places is full of ultimate relaxation. Nature's bounty grips you as you would find yourself surrounded by the hills, lush green forests and crystal clear lagoons.

With hills and forests surrounding a huge water body that changes its color in different seasons, Mukutmanipur is the right place for those who are looking for some adventure along with absolute relaxation. Nestling at the confluence of two beautiful rivers - Kumari and Kansavati, Mukutmanipur is located in Bankura district of West Bengal. This wonderful destination is also a favorite picnic spot, attracting hoards of picnic crowds. This serene place is also famous for housing the second largest water barrage across India that canalizes Kumari and Kansavati Rivers into the 3 districts of West Bengal – Midnapore (West), Purulia and Bankura to facilitate irrigation of 8,000 square kilometers during the scorching summer.

Kangsabati Dam

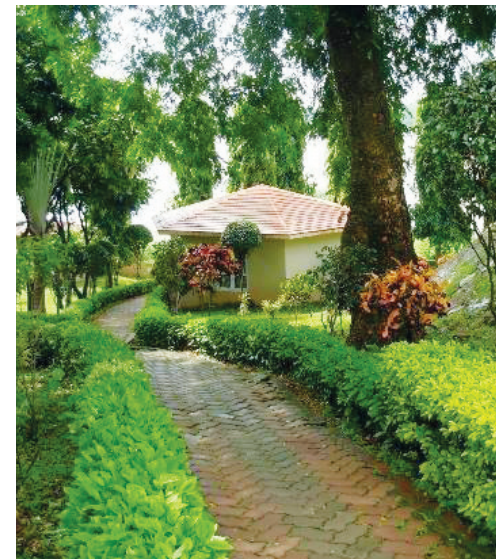
Kangsabati dam was built along 11 km to grant irrigation facilities to the arable land of 8,000 sq. km, covering Purulia, Bankura, Paschim Medinipur and some parts of upper Hooghly. This is the main attraction among Mukutmanipur sightseeing places. This Mukutmanipur dam, known as the second largest earthen dam in India, was constructed under the administration of Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy, the then Bengal's Chief Minister. The Kangsabati Dam has become a picnic spot, frequented by people for leisure. In the monsoon, from July to September, Mukutmanipur sports a different look altogether. When the reservoir is full and the Kangsabati spills its gorge the rhythmic music of water will leave you spellbound. It is a different feel visiting Mukutmanipur in the winter.

Sonajhuri Nature Park

The view of Mukutmanipur in the evening when its close to sunset, merged with the entire backdrop is breathtaking. The road by the dam can be driven on and is a smooth ride, a very romantic one at that. The sky takes on shades of orange during sunrise and sunset, the colour that gives you hope that the sun will set only to rise again.

Ambikanagar Temple

Maa Ambika is an incarnation of Goddess Durga. Goddess Durga is worshipped as Maa Ambika in Ambikanagar village (near about 5 km from Mukutmanipur) of Bankura district. It is known that Maa Ambika is being worshipped here for last 700 years. This village is situated at the mating place of Kanshai and Kumari Rivers. Ambika temple is located at the banks. Maa Ambika is now worshipped daily. Worship continuous from 9 am to 10am and also from 7pm to 9 pm. Maa Ambika is considered to be a very much 'alive' goddess by local inhabitants. 'Khichudi' is cooked on a day of first week during monsoons. Many tourists get chance to taste this 'Khichudi bhog'. 700 years ago, one Sri Khargeswar Singh selected this spot on his holy voyage from Rajasthan. He founded his dynasty here. Later he got the dream orders of Maa Ambika. Maa Ambika emerged from within the soil and is worshipped there. Later the temple is created by assembling stones. The temple later went through many renovations. Ambikanagar is the nomenclature coined to erstwhile



Pareshnath Shiv Mandir

A hillock near Musafirana view point this is the abode of the Shiva deity named Pareshnath in Mukutmanipur. It is of a very ancient origin. Every year in the month of January a mela is organized by the local folk which attracts pilgrims and tourist from nearby districts. On the day of Makar Sankranti the tribals of Bankura and Purulia celebrate the Tusu festival in the month of Poush. Tusu fair is also held on the bank of Pareshnath Hill.

Bonpukuria Deer Park

Bankupuria deer park is situated in the middle of the Mukutmanipur dam. Take a boat ride to reach the other side of the dam. From there you can either walk or hire a motor rickshaw to cover the distance of 2 km. There are around 40 deers present in the park. The lush green environment adds to the natural beauty of the place. One can also find eagles and species of different birds in the forest. A visit to the Bankupuria Deer Park is a perfect outing for the family. It is advisable to carry binoculars to the park as it becomes easier to spot birds. The boat ride is an added feature to the place. Photographs too can be taken inside the park.

Trump Jr agrees to testify in Senate in Russia probe



Trump Jr. has agreed to testify before the Senate Intelligence Committee investigating Russian election meddling

WASHINGTON (TIP): President Donald Trump's son Donald Jr has agreed to testify before the Senate Intelligence Committee investigating Russian election meddling, according to media reports. The agreement resolved a looming fight between the Congress and the White House after Donald Jr was subpoenaed by the Republican-led committee last week.

According to reports, he had initially agreed to testify behind closed doors and then backed out for unclear reasons.

But President Trump is battling any cooperation with Congress in the Russia meddling investigation, claiming that he has already been "totally exonerated" of collusion and obstruction of justice by Special Counsel Robert Mueller's report completed in late March.

The Senate panel has interviewed Donald Jr once before and is believed to be seeking clarification on his knowledge of contacts between the 2016 Trump presidential campaign and Russians. Some Democrats suspect he

may have lied about what he and his father knew of a June 2016 meeting in Trump Tower with a Russian lawyer offering dirt on Hillary Clinton, as well as other connections between the two sides. Seeking to complete their own report on Russian election interference, Senate Intelligence Committee Chairman Richard Burr risked the wrath of the White House and his Republican party by issuing a subpoena for Donald Jr. (Read full story on www.theindianpanorama.com)

President Donald Trump announces new points-based green card system

Far from a comprehensive immigration reform, President Donald Trump on Thursday, May 16, announced a proposal that will include significant changes to the way green cards are allocated, by dramatically reducing the number of family-based green cards and moving towards a points-based ("merit-based") system that will reward, among other factors, education, skills and English language proficiency. The plan, which the President outlined at a Rose Garden gathering, with senior administration officials and influential Hill Republicans in attendance, sought to boost border security and tighten asylum procedures.

Mr. Trump's new plan, details of which had already been reported widely in the U.S. media before the announcement, will dramatically increase the number of green cards that are given through the skills route versus the family-based route. However, the overall number of green cards, just over 1.1 million in 2017, will remain the same.

Currently about 12% of those receiving green cards entered the U.S. based on skill-based visas (such as the H1B), while some 66% are family-based green cards. The new proposal will increase skills-based green cards to 57%. Points will be awarded to applicants based on their education, work experience, age (more points for younger workers), English language ability etc. New immigrants will have to show that they can financially support themselves and will need to pass a civics exam.

Mr Trump also announced that there would be a new "Build America" visa - details of which were not provided on Thursday. His Rose Garden speech made references to foreign workers displacing low income Americans' jobs and highly valuable graduates leaving America to start companies in their own countries because they could not get a visa in America.

People given Green Cards on humanitarian and diversity grounds will now only constitute 10% of all Green Card recipients, according to a handout given to the press at the end of the Rose Garden event. Currently, the diversity lottery offers 50,000 green cards to under-represented groups each year.

The proposals, if they eventually turn into law, are likely to have a significant impact on Indians who interact with the U.S. immigration system. A large majority (over 70%) of H1B visas, for skilled workers, went to Indians in fiscal year 2018. Many of these are eventually converted to green cards. Indian residents

getting green cards have been in the range of 57,000-62,000 in the 2015-2017 period.

However, it is far from clear that a shift towards a points-based system will make the prospects of Indian skilled migrants wanting to settle in the U.S. easier, as bringing family members over, especially elderly parents, may get more complicated. Mr Trump said that spouses and children will be prioritized under the new system.

"If Trump's plan became law, millions of U.S. citizens and permanent residents-including those who first arrived as H-1B workers-would no longer be able live in America with their parents and children," Doug Rand, who worked on immigration in the Obama White House and now runs a firm that helps immigrants get green cards, told The Hindu.

"But this has no chance of becoming law-it's just a cynical PR move that pays lip service to high-skill immigration even as the Trump administration is systematically dismantling high-skill immigration with every tool at its disposal," Mr Rand said. The Trump administration has made regulation around legal immigration more stringent, such as by seeking to clamp down on work-permits for spouses of migrants.

The second part of the White House proposal seeks to reduce illegal migration to the U.S. by building "physical barriers" in sections of the southern border with Mexico. It will also make it harder for individuals to claim asylum (which is a right under U.S. and international law). It will create a border security trust fund, which is funded by fees collected at the border, Mr Trump said.

The White House immigration plan was designed, as per reports, by Mr Trump's son-in-law and advisor Jared Kushner and Stephen Miller, senior advisor to Mr Trump, who is considered a right-wing immigration hardliner.

The proposal seeks to bring Republicans together around the immigration debate that will be a focus in the 2020 Presidential elections. However it is by no means a given that it appeals to the Republicans. Mr Kushner and Mr Miller lobbied Congressional Republicans earlier this week and reportedly failed to get strong support.

It is even less certain that Democrats will support the bill. Based on details currently available, the proposal also does not appear to address concerns the Democrats have with current asylum laws. It also remains silent on how to deal with the status of millions of "dreamers", individuals who were brought into the U.S. illegally as minors.

"The idea that for every immigrant they help, they 'hurt one, all of that is no good," the New York Times

quoted Senate Minority Leader Chuck Schumer as saying.

"Don't come up with a plan that Stephen Miller rubber stamps and say, 'Now pass it.' It's not going to happen," Mr Schumer said.

"I don't think it's designed to get Democratic support as much as it is to unify the Republican Party around border security, a negotiating position," Senate Judiciary Committee chairman Lindsey Graham, a Trump ally, said. Mr Graham released his own immigration proposal earlier on Wednesday.

New York City Mayor Bill de Blasio enters 2020 Presidential race

The official announcement was made via a YouTube video branded with the campaign slogan "Working People First." In it, the 58-year-old de Blasio took a direct aim at the president saying, "Donald Trump must be stopped. I've beaten him before, and I will do it again."

With a skeleton staff and a relatively small amount of campaign cash, de Blasio is planning campaign stops in Iowa and South Carolina that will start Friday and end Sunday. De Blasio is scheduled to appear with First Lady Chirlane McCray on Good Morning America on Thursday morning and make the presidential announcement on the show before heading to Iowa and South Carolina.

Early polling numbers show that the mayor has a lot of work to do on the campaign trail. And New York City voters don't approve of the idea of a presidential run; 76 percent said they didn't want him to run, according to an April Quinnipiac poll. Despite the data and warnings from allies, de Blasio has argued he has a message that resonates with voters, and he reminds people he was an underdog in the Democratic primary for mayor in 2013.

Trump took to tweet to share his thoughts on de Blasio's announcement.

NEW DELHI (TIP): Former South Africa cricketer Jonty Rhodes has revealed the main difference in captaincy styles of former skipper Mahendra Singh Dhoni and current captain Virat Kohli. Rhodes opined that Dhoni controls the mental aspect of the game brilliantly while Kohli on the other hand, likes to force the issue and 'impose his stamp on the game'.

"Dhoni's example was of setting incredible standards on fitness and control mindset point of view. So there are different styles of leadership. Kohli's style is to take things by the scruff of the neck and he likes to impose his stamp on the game," Rhodes was quoted as saying by India Today.

Recently, skipper Virat Kohli was full of praise for Dhoni and also revealed what make his indispensable to the Indian team. Dhoni has been an integral part of the Indian team since his debut in 2004. After leading India to a T20 World Cup, Champions Trophy and a 50-over World Cup, Dhoni has earned the reputation of being an astute thinker of the game.

"What can I say about him. My career started under him and few have seen him from so close over the last few years as I have. There's one thing about MS that's far more important than anything else - and there's a lot to him - for him,



the team is always above everything else. It's always about the team, no matter what. To top it, look at the experience he brings to the squad and we're richer with it. Some of his dismissals behind the stumps, just recently too (in IPL), were match-changing," said Kohli in an interview to Times of India.

The two Indian stalwarts enjoyed contrasting fortunes in the recently concluded Indian Premier League (IPL). While Dhoni fired Chennai

Super Kings into the final, which they lost to Mumbai Indians by just one run, Kohli on the other hand saw his team crash out of the league stage once again.

Kohli and Dhoni will now join forces for the upcoming ICC World Cup 2019, where India will look to clinch their third crown in England and Wales. The showpiece event begins on May 30 while India play their first match against South Africa on June 5.



Dhoni eyes Chennai clean-out after losing IPL final

HYDERABAD (TIP): Chennai Super Kings skipper M.S. Dhoni suggested his ageing side needs a shake-up after they lost a nail-biting Indian Premier League final to arch rivals Mumbai Indians.

The thriller saw Mumbai edge out Chennai on Sunday after Australian Shane Watson was run out going for an unlikely second run in the final over to end a blistering 59-ball innings at 80.

Chennai then needed two runs off the last ball to overtake Mumbai's 149-8. But Sri Lanka paceman Lasith Malinga trapped Shardul Thakur lbw to claim a record fourth title for Mumbai.

"We need to go back and reflect as to how we reached the finals. I don't think it was one of those years where we played really good cricket and we got into the finals," said Dhoni.

"After the World Cup, once we come back, that's the time we get to the drawing board and see what can be done to fill the gaps.

"Nothing against the bowlers, but batting could have been better," said Dhoni, whose team has won three IPL titles from eight finals.

None of Chennai's batsmen made it to the top-10 scorers list in this year's IPL, India's cash-rich domestic Twenty20 showpiece tournament.

Dhoni — 37 but still a key member of India's World Cup squad — was Chennai's best with 416 runs, including three fifties.

"Playing against Steffi in the final, who was World No.1 and had not lost in a long time, I had nothing to lose but after I won, people expected me to win every event I played in," explained Arantxa. That win over Steffi Graf in French Open made her a trailblazer as she also became the first Spanish woman to win a Grand Slam. "That victory, in a way, changed how people pursued women's tennis because up until then, it was it was mostly perceived as a men's sport in Spain," she added.

Considered to be one of the most decorated Olympians in Spanish history winning four medals (two silver, two bronze), she also was the first Spanish player to simultaneously be ranked as the world's No. 1 player in both singles and doubles during career.

Summing up her career, Arantxa said she was happy to have played in the era that she did. "People always remember winners, I won four singles grand slams but ended up losing the final at Grand Slams eight times," admitted the 'Barcelona Bumblebee'.

On the 2019 Roland Garros, she said Simona Halep will be one of the favourites to win the women's title. "Rafa will of course be the favourite but then Djokovic is also doing well and then we have Federer making a comeback, so it's going to be a very interesting contest," said the former Roland Garros champion of the men's field.
