Ukraine and Russia Closer to Ending War as Understanding Reached in Four Areas: Erdogan

NEW YORK (TIP): A March 25 Newsweek report has quoted the Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan as saying that Ukraine and Russia have reached an understanding on four of the six main topics of disagreement, including NATO, partial disarmament, collective security and Russian language, bringing the two warring countries a step closer to resolving the conflict.

Ragip Soylu, Turkey bureau chief of Middle East Eye, reported the news in a tweet on Friday. However, there is still no agreement on Crimea and Donbas, two eastern areas of Ukraine that Russia sees as its own territory. In 2014, Russian troops annexed Crimea before claiming it as Russian land.

Yogi was sworn in along with 52 ministers, including Keshav Prasad Maurya and Brijesh Pathak as Deputy CMs, all hand-picked by Modi and Shah keeping in mind regional and caste equations and giving representation to all sections.

The Yogi 2.0 council has 16 Cabinet ministers, 14 ministers of state with independent charge and 20 ministers of state. There are 31 new faces in the government. Twenty-four ministers from the first term have been dropped.

UNITED NATIONS (TIP): Speaking at a United Nations Security Council (UNSC) meeting on cooperation between the United Nations and the League of Arab States (LAS), Foreign Secretary Harsh Shringla said India and the Arab world share a "civilizational relationship", as he welcomed the normalization of relations between countries in the region and reiterated India's support for a two-state (i.e., Palestine and Israel) solution. Officials said the Foreign Secretary's visit to the United Nations to attend the meeting was an indicator of the close relations India shares with the United Arab Emirates, given that the session about the U.N. cooperation with the League of Arab Nations is a "signature event" of the UAE's presidency this month at the Security Council.

Birbhum killings

CULTURE OF VIOLENCE THE BANE OF BENGAL POLITICS

Turf wars and bloodshed are synonymous with West Bengal politics, particularly during the election season, with successive governments often fanning the flames rather than dousing them. The killing of eight persons, including two children, in Birbhum district - apparently in retaliation for the murder of a Trinamool Congress (TMC) panchayat leader - adds another tragic chapter to this never-ending saga of violence. The Calcutta High Court has ordered a CBI investigation into the gruesome incident, even as Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee - in the damage-control mode - got a TMC block president arrested and pulled up the local police for not acting in time. The Birbhum horror has provided the BJP, the state's main

Opposition party, ample ammunition to target the ruling TMC. Even though the TMC has promised to cooperate with the CBI, the fierce inter-party rivalry and Centre-state tussle seen in recent years do not bode well for a free and fair probe.

The Left, during its decades-long rule in Bengal, banked on violence and coercion to force its rivals into submission. It was Birbhum that had witnessed the lynching of 11 laborers in July 2000 during Jyoti Basu's tenure, while more than 20 lives were lost in clashes during the 2008 panchayat polls. The Mamata-led TMC has inherited this unenviable legacy of repression. With the BJP gaining ground in Bengal on the back of its strong performance in the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, the two parties

have frequently locked horns, right from the top brass to the grassroots-level workers. Last year's Assembly elections were also marred by bloodshed, with four voters falling to bullets fired by Central security personnel.

The onus is on all stakeholders to discourage the culture of violence that is not only a blot on Bengal but is also impeding the state's progress. It needs political will to rein in the cadres and uphold the rule of law. With warring parties relying on muscle power to silence their detractors, it would be a Herculean task to weed out the criminal elements and help Bengal turn over a new leaf.

India holds its own: Justified in resisting US pressure over Russia

Singling out India among the Quad members, US President Joe Biden has said that New Delhi has been 'somewhat shaky' in acting against Russia over the invasion of Ukraine. There is nothing 'shaky' about safeguarding national interests - and that is exactly what India has been doing, holding its own amid relentless pressure from the US and its allies. The country's 'independent foreign policy' has won praise from an unexpected quarter - Pakistan - but it is obvious that America is not happy with New Delhi's assertion of strategic autonomy. India's decision to import Russian oil at discounted rates to meet its urgent needs has also riled the US, again unreasonably.

India's diplomatic tightrope walk

underlines a pragmatic response in view of its time-tested relationship with Russia. The enduring strength of the bilateral ties was witnessed during an in-person summit meeting between PM Modi and President Putin in December last year, when the two nations signed a pact on military cooperation for a 10-year period. What heightened the summit's significance was its timing: it was held in the golden jubilee year of the historic Indo-Soviet Treaty of Peace, Friendship and Cooperation, which had stood India in good stead during the 1971 Bangladesh liberation war.

Russia continues to be the topmost arms supplier to India, even though its share in the total imports has dropped from 69 per cent to 46 per cent over the past half a decade, according to a report

released recently by the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute. Wedged between China and Pakistan, both dodgy neighbors, India cannot afford to compromise on its defense preparedness. It's here that old ally Russia has been playing a critical role with its unstinting military-technical support. The threat of US sanctions did not stop India and Russia from going ahead with the S-400 missile deal. With America having a finger in virtually every multilateral pie - be it Quad, AUKUS or the prospective alliance with Pakistan, Uzbekistan and Afghanistan - New Delhi is adopting a wise course by keeping its options open and not abandoning its time-tested ally.

AFTER SHOOTING, COMMUNITY RALLIES AGAINST ILLEGAL AIRBNB

BAYSIDE, NY (TIP): After a shooting outside a Bayside house on Saturday, March 19th that left one person injured and sent stray bullets into the surrounding community, piercing cars and a nearby child's car seat, residents, community leaders and elected officials rallied to call on Airbnb to permanently ban listings at this address, and for the city to issue a vacate order on the home.

For the last two years, the property, located at 208-16 38th Avenue, Bayside, has been in the early stages of foreclosure and occupied by squatters who have illegally rented it out through Airbnb. Residents report that the illegal rentals have given rise to a constant barrage of late-night parties causing excessive noise, litter, as well as harassment and confrontations with area residents. Concerns culminated this past weekend when a partygoer was shot in the torso. The victim is in stable condition, but no arrests have been made. As the investigation continues, the community is calling for the city to finally put an end to the neighborhood nightmare. Elected officials wrote letters to the Department of Buildings calling for a vacate order, and to Airbnb calling for the company to permanently ban listings at this address.

NYS Senator John Liu said, "We are calling on the city to stop giving our community the run around and issue a vacate order on this property before anyone else gets hurt. We also call on Airbnb to stop illegally allowing this property to be listed on their website. Two years is too long for our community to have one home

hold an entire block hostage. These are not just simple quality of life issues, but serious public safety hazards that need to be addressed immediately."

Community leaders called on the city to redouble its efforts so it can gain access and properly inspect the home.

Liu said, "There are several problems at this location that are preventing a satisfying resolution for our community. From Airbnb allowing its illegal rental to the squatters taking advantage of the situation. At the end of the day, the city needs to be the one to step up and recognize the dangers here as reason enough to vacate the premises and keep our community safe."

U.S. Rep. Grace Meng said, "This recent shooting in Bayside has shaken our community and has made me deeply concerned about public safety in the area. Airbnb needs to immediately step up and permanently stop this vacant property from being listed on its website. Allowing it to continuously be posted is unacceptable. Neighborhood residents must not have their safety put at risk and their quality of life disrupted. This problem must be addressed at once, and my colleagues and I stand shoulder to shoulder with the community as we push Airbnb for answers."


Assemblyman Edward Braunstein said, "The pattern of disregard and disrespect shown by the individuals squatting at the single-family residence on 38th Avenue escalated to violence last week when illegal Airbnb guests brazenly opened fire on the surrounding streets, putting neighbors in danger and their nerves on edge.



Senator John Liu said, "We are calling on the city to stop giving our community the run around and issue a vacate order on this property before anyone else gets hurt. We also call on Airbnb to stop illegally allowing this property to be listed on their website."

For the last two years, an absentee property owner has emboldened these squatters to not only illegally list this property on Airbnb, but openly advertise rooms for rent within the single-family home. Enough is enough. Several times in the past, my office has worked with residents to get Airbnb listings at the property shut down, only for it to appear again under another account. While authorities continue their investigation to apprehend the individuals responsible for the shooting, Airbnb must permanently ban listings at this location. As we plan next courses of action, I will continue close collaboration with fellow elected officials, the Mayor's Office, the 111th Precinct, City agencies and local residents. We must use every tool at our disposal to address this serious matter once and for all."

INDIAN AMERICAN MAN APOLOGIZES FOR THREAT TO HARYANA CM


Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar received threats from US based Sandeep

NEW YORK (TIP): US-based Sandeep, alias Mipa Bangru of Narar village, apologized through a video message for using abusive language and threat to the CM and Haryana Police. Sandeep and his family was booked under sedition charges and IT Act.

In today's video, he also accused the police of harassing his family by detaining them. "I apologize to the CM and the Haryana Government for my words, which I had said under the influence of liquor," said Sandeep in the video message. "I am ready to be hanged if my family is found involved in my mistake. Their phone calls can be checked and they did not have any involvement in it. My family members have been detained by the police," he added.

Maqsood Ahmed, SP, denied the allegations of detaining any family members. "We had registered a case under Sections 124A, 294, 506, 120B of the IPC and IT Act against Sandeep and his four family members as the former's video went viral on the social media in which he was using obscene remarks against the police and the CM. Investigation is on and the police did not detain any family members," said SP Ahmed.

"We are in correspondence with the authorities concerned for the revocation of passport and to deport him from the US," he said.

Indian-origin student's boyfriend charged with her murder in London

LONDON (TIP): A 22-year-old Tunisian man who was arrested earlier has been charged with the murder of Indian-origin student Sabita Thanwani and appeared in custody at Highbury Corner Magistrates' Court in London on Tuesday. Maher Maaroufe, who the police said had been in a relationship with the student, was hunted down by Scotland Yard after the discovery of Thanwani's body in her student accommodation in Clerkenwell area of London on Saturday.

He was arrested on suspicion of the 19-year-old psychology student's murder and assault on Sunday. A post-mortem examination carried out at Whittington Hospital in London on Monday gave the cause of Thanwani's death as sharp force trauma to the neck, the Metropolitan Police said.

"Detectives investigating the death of Sabita Thanwani in Clerkenwell have charged a man with murder. Maher Maaroufe, 22, of no fixed address, has also been charged with assaulting an emergency worker," the Met Police said in a statement.

"Detectives from the Met's Specialist Crime Command are investigating and

continue to provide support to Sabita's family," the statement added.

Thanwani, a British national, was found with serious injuries to her neck at Arbour House student flats in Clerkenwell area of London and pronounced dead at the scene on Saturday. On Monday, her family paid tribute to their "beautiful and irreplaceable angel" whose life was cut

"tragically short".

The family said: "Sabita was the most caring and loving person we have ever known. She inspired us every day of her precious 19 years of life. Her mission was to help everyone.

"She was studying psychology at City University to make this happen. Her whole life was ahead of her, a life where her radiant smile and incredible heart could only spread warmth and kindness."

Over the weekend, the Met Police had issued an urgent manhunt for Maaroufe, who had reportedly been with Thanwani on Friday.

"Maaroufe had been in a relationship with Sabita but he was not a student. He is a Tunisian national of no fixed address," Detective Chief Inspector Linda, who is leading the investigation, had said in her appeal.

A spokesperson for City, University of London said it was working closely with Unite Students, which runs the student accommodation where the body was found. "As a university, we will do everything we can to support our students and staff and we will continue to fully support the police with their investigation," a university spokesperson said.


INDO- CANADIAN GANGSTERS A HEADACHE FOR PUNJAB POLICE

AMRITSAR / TORONTO (TIP): Canada-based gangster Lakhbir Singh Landa has around 20 criminal cases, including murder, attempt to murder, firing and NDPS Act, registered against him.

He originally hails from Harike in Tarn Taran district. Despite the fact that he was facing a number of criminal cases, he managed to escape to foreign shores a couple of years ago, thereby raising a question mark on the intelligence.

The Punjab Police have started procedure for his extradition and opening of red corner circular against him. A senior police official said gangsters, including Landa, who had escaped to foreign shores had become a headache for the Punjab Police. They have been running an extortion racket in association with their accomplices. As they contact each other through social media it is not easy to nail them.

Though Tarn Taran police had registered only one FIR, there has been several complaints against him in which he extorted huge amounts while threatening traders, colonizers, doctors, hospital owners and other rich people in the region as ransom.

His name also figured during the interrogation of gangster Daya Singh, aka Preet Sekhon, who was nabbed in a joint operation by Amritsar rural police and Organized Crime Control Unit (OCCU) in July last year.

He along with his aide Jarmanjit Singh, alias Nikka Khaduria, of Chamba Khurd village in Tarn Taran, was nabbed in Chamiari village of Ajnala. The police seized five country-made

pistols, double barrel rifle and three mobile phones and a car from them. They also arrested Gurlal Singh of Kamalpur village in Tarn Taran for sheltering him.

During his probe, it was found that Preet Sekhon at the behest of Landa had extorted amounts to the tune of several crores from at least 25 persons which were deposited in a foreign bank account of an international-level Hawala operator.

Ironically, victims prefer not to lodge a complaint fearing for their lives, police sources said.

Landa's name was also figured as a key conspirator in the killing of two Akali workers in Patti last year. Immediate after the incident, Tarn Taran police wrote to the Central Government for issuing red corner circular against him.

Gulneet Singh Khuranna, SSP, Tarn Taran, said they had urged our higher officials for taking up the matter with the Central Government for speeding up the process of opening red corner circular against him for his extradition. Besides Landa, the police have also received a complaint against another fugitive gangster, Arsh Dhalla, for demanding ransom, he said.

Indian American Punjab-born Shree Saini is 1st runner-up at Miss World pageant

SAN JUAN, PUERTO RICO (TIP): Indian American Shree Saini was crowned the first runner-up at the Miss World 2021 beauty pageant held in San Juan, Puerto Rico on Thursday, March 17. The coveted Miss World title was won by Karolina Bielawsk.

The Indian-American, who represented the United States, has shared a heartfelt note on overcoming facial burns and heart defect. She said that her triumph could encourage and inspire people to defeat their daily challenges.

Shree Saini, 26, added that she was representing not just herself but also "333 million Americans, billions of Indian immigrants" at the global event.

Hailing from Ludhiana in Punjab, her family moved to the US when she was just 5 years old. By 12, she had a permanent pacemaker implanted after she was diagnosed with a rare heart condition. INDIAN AMERICAN ORGANIZATION ECOSIKH PLANTS 400 SACRED FORESTS AS PART OF CLIMATE ACTION

WASHINGTON, D.C. (TIP): A US-based Sikh organization has announced the planting of 400 forests in India and other parts of the world as part of its climate action. According to the announcement made on the occasion of Sikh Environment Day (SED), EcoSikh said it has planted a forest of 1150 trees in Ireland and of 500 trees in Derbyshire, the United Kingdom.

In addition, a forest of 250 trees was planted in Surrey, Canada. EcoSikh, based out of Washington DC, has collaborated with local governments and gurdwaras in its projects. This campaign started in 2019 when Sikhs celebrated his 550th birth-anniversary, EcoSikh said in a statement on Saturday. "The Sacred Forest project has become a community-based initiative and many hundreds have joined this massive grass roots campaign all across the globe.

This is a solid step to mitigate the effects of climate change and the good news is that all trees planted are surviving in these thriving forests," said Rajwant Singh, EcoSikh (USA), the founder and global president.

He said over the last 36 months, EcoSikh has planted forests in many states across India including, Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Delhi, Maharashtra, Gujarat and in Jammu. Each forest has 550 trees of native species.

These forests are planted following the Japanese Miyawaki methodology and are tagged on Google maps all across Punjab and India, he said. Every year hundreds of Sikh institutions and Gurdwaras all across the world celebrate SED by taking step to reduce carbon footprints and to save water and energy.

EcoSikh released a tool kit for the community to take action on SED which includes organic langar, nature walk, switching to LED bulbs and solar panels.

She was previously professor of economics and chairperson of the Centre for Economic Studies and Planning, School of Social Sciences, Jawaharlal Nehru University. She is also a member of the UN's high-level Advisory Board on Economic and Social Affairs.

UN chief Guterres on Friday, March 18, announced the establishment of the Advisory Board on Effective Multilateralism to be co-chaired by former Liberian president and Nobel Laureate Ellen Johnson Sirleaf and former Swedish prime minister Stefan Lofven.

Ghosh has been named to the 12-member board, which will be supported in its work by the Centre for Policy Research of the United Nations University in close coordination with the Executive Office of the Secretary-General.

In January last year, Ghosh was appointed by Guterres, along with 19 other thinkers and personalities from around the world, to a high-level advisory board to provide recommendations for the UN Secretary-General to respond to current and future socio-economic challenges in the post-Covid world.

NYIC Applauds Council Member Hanif's Introduction of Resolution Demanding Health Insurance Coverage for Undocumented Immigrants

THE IMMIGRATION COMMITTEE CHAIR BRINGS UP COUNCIL RESOLUTION CALLING ON THE STATE LEGISLATURE TO PASS A880A/S1572A

NEW YORK, NY (TIP): On March 23, Council Member Shahana Hanif, alongside Council Members Francisco Moya, Shaun Abreu, Linda Lee, and Lynn Schulman, introduced a resolution calling on the New York State legislature to pass A880A/S1572A also known as the Coverage For All Act. If passed, this legislation would allocate \$345 million to create a quality and affordable healthcare plan for the nearly 150,000 low-income undocumented New Yorkers. Modeled off of similar plans in California, Minnesota, and Illinois, this plan would save the state \$19 million and potentially hundreds of lives every year. With dozens of cosponsors on both the Assembly and Senate versions of the legislation, the Council's resolution adds pressure on Albany to take action on the needs of working-class immigrants before the looming budget deadline.

"Council Members Shahana Hanif, Shaun Abreu, Linda Lee, Francisco Moya, and Lynn Schulman's resolution comes at a crucial moment in our coalition's battle for healthcare justice for New York's immigrant communities," said Murad Awawdeh,

Executive Director, New York Immigration Coalition. "Each of these leaders embodies the incredible diversity of our city and understand the terrible costs that blocking healthcare coverage can cause. We thank the NYC Council for standing up not only for the immigrant New Yorkers in their districts but across the state. We call on Governor Kathy Hochul and the state legislature to listen to these leaders and include Coverage for All in the state budget."

"The Coverage For All plan will improve health outcomes for millions of immigrants and save our state millions every year. This is not only morally sound legislation, it's smart public policy," said Council Member Shahana Hanif. "For nearly two years during the COVID-19 pandemic, thousands of low-income undocumented workers have been essential to our state without just compensation. The historic Excluded Workers Fund kept many from losing everything, but it's legislation like the Coverage For All plan that will fundamentally transform the lives of thousands of working families. I'm proud to introduce this resolution alongside my Council colleagues and make it clear that this Council knows immigrant rights are human rights."

"Two years into this pandemic, a quarter-million immigrant New Yorkers are still uninsured despite being disproportionately impacted by the pandemic's health and financial tolls," said Comptroller Brad Lander. Rye Ophthalmologist Ameet Goyal Sentenced to 96 Months in Prison for Seven-Year Healthcare Fraud Scheme and Covid-19 Loan Fraud

NEW YORK (TIP): Damian Williams, the United States Attorney for the Southern District of New York, announced March 3, 2022 that AMEET GOYAL, M.D., ("GOYAL") an ophthalmologist in Rye, New York, was sentenced to 96 months in prison for orchestrating a seven-year healthcare fraud scheme by falsely billing for millions of dollars of upcoded procedures, and also for fraudulently obtaining two Government-guaranteed loans intended to help small businesses during the COVID-19 pandemic while he was facing charges on pretrial release for the healthcare fraud scheme. In imposing the sentence today, U.S. District Judge Cathy Seibel noted, "Fraud doesn't fully capture how blatant this was and how unjustified this was... This was not about need, it was about greed." GOYAL previously pled guilty to all charges in a six-count superseding Indictment before Judge Seibel on September 13, 2021.

subsequent doctors to evaluate their care. He sent patients who could not pay the upcoded bills to a collection agency, decimating their credit. He pressured other doctors to join the scheme and threatened to retaliate against their livelihood and careers. Even after being arrested for this scheme, GOYAL committed a breathtaking new fraud and stole \$637,200 from the Paycheck Protection Program in the early days of a devastating pandemic. For his crimes, GOYAL will serve a substantial sentence in prison."

According to the allegations contained in the Indictment, court filings, and statements made during court proceedings:

At all relevant times, GOYAL owned and operated the ophthalmology practice Ameet Goyal M.D. P.C., doing business as Rye Eye Associates, with offices in Rye, Mt. Kisco, and Wappingers Falls, New York, and Greenwich, Connecticut (the "Practice"). Between 2010 and 2017, GOYAL engaged in widespread healthcare fraud by consistently "upcoding" simpler, lower-paying surgical procedures and examinations as complex, higher-paying major operations in fraudulent billings submitted to Medicare, private insurance companies, and patients.

As a result, GOYAL fraudulently obtained at least \$3.6 million in payments for procedures he did not perform. GOYAL failed to obtain proper and, at times, any consent for the uncoded procedures he falsely claimed to have performed. As part of the scheme, GOYAL routinely falsified patient medical records, authoring fictitious templated operative reports that matched the complex operation he billed rather than the different minor procedure he actually performed.

Is Victory for Ukraine Worth Risking Nuclear War?

"THE UKRAINIAN WAR, NOW A MONTH OLD, HAS DEMONSTRATED THE UTILITY OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS. PUTIN'S CREDIBLE THREAT TO USE THEM HAS CAUSED THE U.S. AND NATO TO FLATLY REFUSE KYIV'S REQUEST TO PUT A NO-FLY ZONE OVER UKRAINE. AND AS RUSSIA'S THREAT TO USE NUCLEAR WEAPONS HAS DETERRED NATO FROM INTERVENING ON UKRAINE'S SIDE IN THIS WAR, OTHER NATIONS WILL NOT MISS THE MESSAGE: POSSESSION OF NUKE CAN DETER EVEN THE GREATEST NUCLEAR POWERS. THE LONGER THIS WAR GOES ON, THE GREATER THE SUFFERING AND LOSSES ON ALL SIDES. THOUSANDS OF UKRAINIAN SOLDIERS AND CIVILIANS ARE ALREADY DEAD, WITH 10 MILLION UPROOTED FROM THEIR HOMES, A THIRD OF THAT NUMBER HAVING FLED INTO NEIGHBORING STATES OF EASTERN EUROPE. THE LONGER THE WAR GOES ON, THE GREATER THE LIKELIHOOD PUTIN RESORTS TO INDISCRIMINATE BOMBING AND SHELLING TO KILL OFF THE RESISTANCE, AND THE GREATER THE POSSIBILITY THAT THE WAR EXPANDS INTO NATO EUROPE."

The question remains: "When did the relationship between Russia and Ukraine become a matter of such vital interest to the U.S. that we would risk war, possible nuclear war, with Russia over it? How did we get here?"

During the 70 years that the Soviet Union existed, Ukraine was an integral part of the nation.

Yet this geographic and political reality posed no threat to the United States. A Russia and a Ukraine, both inside the USSR, was an accepted reality that was seen as no threat for the seven decades that they were united. Yet, today, because of a month-old war between Russia and Ukraine, over who shall control Crimea, the Donbas and the Black and Azov Sea coasts of Ukraine, America seems closer to a nuclear war than at any time since the Cuban missile crisis of 1962.

Why? Time to step back and reflect on what is at stake.

Exactly what threat does Russia's invasion of Ukraine present to us that is so grave we would consider military action that could lead to World War III and Russia's use of battlefield nuclear weapons against us?

Russian President Vladimir Putin has repeatedly hinted at the use of such weapons, should NATO intervene in the Ukraine war and Russia face defeat, or in the event of an "existential" threat to the Russian nation.

We hear from our moral elites that morality commands us to intervene to save the Ukrainian people from the ravages of a war that has already taken thousands of Ukrainian lives.

But what would be the justification for U.S. military intervention in Ukraine, absent a congressional authorization or declaration of war? Consider. The year the Liberal Hour arrived in America with the New Deal, 1933, a newly inaugurated Franklin D. Roosevelt formally recognized Joseph Stalin's murderous regime as the legitimate government of a Russia-led USSR.

FDR met personally with Soviet Foreign Minister Maxim Litvinov even as the Holodomor, the forced starvation of Ukrainian peasants and small farmers, the kulaks and their families, was far advanced.

Walter Duranty, the New York Times reporter in Moscow, won a Pulitzer for covering up that crime of the century with its estimated 4 million dead. The question remains: When did the relationship between Russia and Ukraine become a matter of such vital interest to the U.S. that we would risk war, possible nuclear war, with Russia over it?

How did we get here?

We got here by exploiting our Cold War victory as an opportunity to move NATO, our Cold War alliance, into a dozen countries in Central and Eastern Europe, up to the borders of Russia. Then, we started to bring Ukraine into NATO, the constituent republic of the old Soviet Union with the longest and deepest history with Mother Russia.

Thus, while Putin started this war, the U.S. set the table for it.

We pushed our military alliance, NATO, set up in 1949 to contain and, if necessary, fight Russia, 1,000 miles to the east, right into Russia's face.

In the 1930s, when Britain's Lady Astor was asked if she knew where Hitler was born, she answered: "Versailles." At the Paris Peace Conference of 1919, which produced the Versailles Treaty, millions of Germanic peoples and the lands they had inhabited were severed from German rule and distributed to half a dozen nations across Europe.

When we get back on our feet, we will take back all that we have lost, said Gen. Hans von Seeckt of the German General Staff.

We hear warnings that if Russia uses chemical weapons in Ukraine, NATO will react militarily. But if no NATO ally is attacked, why would NATO respond to a Russian attack on Ukraine? Though outlawed today,

chemical weapons were used by all the major participants in World War I, including the Americans.

As for atomic weapons, only Americans have used them.

And while we did not introduce the bombing of cities - the British and Germans did that - we did perfect the carpet-bombing of cities like Cologne, Hamburg, Berlin, Dresden and Tokyo.

The Ukrainian war, now a month old, has demonstrated the utility of nuclear weapons. Putin's credible threat to use them has caused the U.S. and NATO to flatly refuse Kyiv's request to put a no-fly zone over Ukraine. And as Russia's threat to use nuclear weapons has deterred NATO from intervening on Ukraine's side in this war, other nations will not miss the message: Possession of nukes can deter even the greatest nuclear powers.


The longer this war goes on, the greater the suffering and losses on all sides. Thousands of Ukrainian soldiers and civilians are already dead, with 10 million uprooted from their homes, a third of that number having fled into neighboring states of Eastern Europe.

The longer the war goes on, the greater the likelihood Putin resorts to indiscriminate bombing and shelling to kill off the resistance, and the greater the possibility that the war expands into NATO Europe.

Meanwhile, in the secure American homeland, 5,000 miles from Kyiv, there is no shortage of foreign policy scholars beating the drums for a "victory" over Putin's Russia and willing to fight to achieve that victory - right down to the last Ukrainian.

Opposition, Agitation, Rebellion and Change

AAP WOULD HAVE TO, AND MUST REMEMBER THE PEOPLE'S TEMPERAMENT PERTAINING TO 'OPPOSITION, AGITATION, REBELLION AND CHANGE'.

There has come about an upheaval in the echelons of power, in the strategically significant border-State of Punjab, which has been relegated to a dilapidated condition. In this context, it is noteworthy that many a stalwart veteran political bigwigs have been reduced to a shambles, having tasted crushing defeat in the recent elections. Amongst those who tasted bitter fruit are Prakash Singh Badal (five-time CM) Sukhbir Singh Badal (Supremo o Akali Dal) 'Raja' Amarinder Singh (former CM) Charanjit Singh Channi (CM for a couple of months) Navjot Singh Sidhu (State-Congress Chief) and Jasvir Singh Garhi (BSP State-President) while Ashwani Sharma (BJP State-boss) has emerged victorious. Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has been given a resounding mandate by the populace. Leaders have lost the contest and Punjab has won the battle. Has Punjab actually won, in reality?

Polling results for 117 seats in Punjab Assembly were declared on March 10. The State has 2.14 crore voters. In 2017, 70% voters had exercised their right to political franchise. This year, 71.95% people voted. Punjab was, apparently, dejected this time, as compared to 2017. A staggering number of 1,10,308 voters opted to accept 'notes', in exchange for votes.

AAP won a thumping 92 seats, BSP got 1, BJP 2, 1 Independent candidate won, Congress 18 and SAD was saddened at having bagged just 3 seats. Others including Leftist-parties, Kisan Morcha and sundry outfits failed miserably while not even opening their accounts. Could it be presumed that the overwhelming success of one party is a victory for AAP and the demolition of all other parties is a vote of disappointment against Congress and SAD? There was noticeable widespread public protestation, anger and a rebellious wave to effect massive change, by bringing about the downfall of 'the establishment'. All of these sentiments assumed the form of a volcanic eruption, which outpoured rivers of lava. Delhi CM Arvind Kejriwal and his Dy. CM Manish Sisodia visit Hanuman Mandir and then tell their party-cadre that "this is the biggest Inquilaab" (revolution). Is it, truly, a "revolution"?

The percentage of votes was as follows : AAP 42, SAD 18.38, BJP 1.77, CPI 0.05, CPM 0.06, CPML 0.03, Congress 22.98, NOTA votes (none of the above) totaled 0.71, RSP 0.01. The maximum % of 42.01 was claimed by AAP which had received only 23.7% in 2017. Congress got 22.98 as against 38.5 in 2017. SAD recorded a fall from 25.2 to 18.38. BJP registered 1.77 compared to 1.5 last time. Out of 69 seats

in Malwa-belt, AAP captured 66. In this region, there was a strong presence of Kisan protestors and a huge dejection against the previous governance by various parties or alliances. The farming community became a catalyst for Punjab's empowerment and for giving power to AAP. Whether 'Dera-following' or caste-politicking or religious machinations, nothing at all could succeed obstruct the wave of massive awareness amongst the people.

AAP reaped a rich harvest, on account of strong public resentment against the traditional parties, everywhere including the latter's bastions. AAP's slogan of "One Chance" resonated extremely well with the masses and their hearts were touched. Then, there were additional enticements like the National Coordinator's poll-promises, which included Rupees 1000/-, 300 free units and 24-hour uninterrupted supply of electricity. It was an emotionally charged election.

After the victory-laps are over, AAP shall have no ordinary, common promises to keep but would have a very special agenda to adhere to, in order to retain the faith and trust of voters who installed AAP at the pinnacle of power. AAP would not benefit from breaching this faith and betraying such trust especially when the Party has promised revolutionary measures for the good of Punjab. Special emphasis would have to be given to the extinction of the era of traditional fashion or trend of lineage-nepotism, as promised by AAP. The general message is that the public wants change in various spheres and desire public-welfare schemes to be implemented. People want to visualize government as public servants and not as monarchs or dictators.

The political texture had been entangled since long, whereby one privileged and affluent and powerful

segment was ruling the roost. 'Once upon a time' there used to be governance which was respected by the nomenclature of 'Divine Kingship', which was rejected by the people. Then came the era of Principalities, which also vanished. Finally, the era of democratic rule by majority votes came into effect but which was hijacked and misused by aristocrats, affluent ones and the 'high and the mighty'. The devastatingly excruciating results of such selfish machinations, by vested interests, are verily visible.

In 4 States of India, where polls were conducted, continuity and status-quo was maintained in Goa, Manipur, Uttarakhand and Uttar Pradesh. The winds of change were experienced in Punjab, where people were exasperated on account of rising rate of unemployment, rampant menace of drugs-influx, unresolved cases of repeated incidents of desecration of Guru Granth Sahib Ji, prevalent massive corruption, mal-administration and mafia-rule.

People in Punjab are becoming poorer. Farmers are giving up the non-profitable occupation of agriculture and are opting for labor-oriented vocations or they are migrating to other States. The farmers are pained to see their children flying abroad, in search of earning a livelihood. They are unable to envision the fulfillment of their aspirations, in Punjab, whose total annihilation they are pained to see. They are awaiting the manifestation of a miracle-ofsorts, to uplift Punjab out of the doldrums. Their foremost hopes rest on the politicians. For this sole reason, the people used their voting-prowess to ignite the 'vacuum-cleaner', instead of merely wielding the 'broom'. This gave a clean-sweep to AAP, thereby awarding Kejriwal-Mann-combine an unimaginable mandate. Similar power

had been given, earlier, to SAD-BJP-alliance, which miserably failed to deliver, despite having 93 seats, that's 1 more than the seats gained by AAP on its own. SAD-BJP bigwigs lost their reputation and image. People's Power of Peaceful Protest was well demonstrated in the electoral arena and the betrayers were uprooted.

The public rewarded those who were part of the successful year-long strenuous Kisan-Morcha, on the borders of Delhi, which had forced the Central government to revoke the 'Three Black-Laws'. Those who appeared to be corrupt and double gamers were rejected outright, by the people. The politicians get votes by giving wind to communalism, fanning sentiments pertaining to religious bias. Would such intentions and policies of politicians change in Punjab? The people have given their verdict by bringing forward candidates with a clean image, who are expected to work on an agenda of growth, development, progress, to uplift the masses. People have favored the Delhi-model and would like to see it replicated in Punjab.

After Round One, what next for Bhagwant Mann & team?

It has been a mixed start- more cautious and less controversial- for new Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann and his AAP government. The new government has gone through the initial Constitutional and ritualistic formalities by following the parliamentary and conventional practices.

Swearing in of the Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann at Khatkar Kalan, the native village of Shaheed-e-Azam Bhagat Singh, was perhaps the first and the only deviation from the existing practice of holding the solemn ceremony mostly at Raj Bhavan or rarely at a public place, like a stadium.

Rest of the Constitutional mandates, including swearing in of members of the Council of Ministers, oath taking by members of new Vidhan Sabha, election of Speaker, and subsequently the opening session of the Legislature where Vote on Account and Interim Budget for first three months of the new financial year were all gone through by the laid down procedures.

Another deviation, if at all, was to defer debate on the Governor's address till the next session of the Assembly. The reason given was shortage of time as well as to give time to nearly 80 per cent members making their debut in legislative politics to go through the address and come prepared for debate on it after a break.

The next session will, in all probability, be held in June to pass the full budget for 2022-2023. The new Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema needs to sit with the senior functionaries of his department and other heads to decide allocations in consonance with the promises the ruling party has made to the electors of Punjab.

In between, members will meet by the end of the month to complete the formality of electing five new members of Rajya Sabha. The process of nomination has already been completed.

It is the filling of Rajya Sabha seats that has evoked criticism of the Opposition parties. The criticism, unanimous and vociferous, veered around naming of "outsiders" as representatives of the State in the Upper House of Parliament. Called the House of "Elders", Rajya Sabha members from Punjab have traditionally been senior members of major political parties,

especially of Congress, Shiromani Akali Dal, and Bharatiya Janata Party.

This time, AAP, with a landslide mandate, has chosen faces that are mostly new to Parliamentary politics. Two businessmen, two political strategists and a cricketer will now represent the State in the House of "Elders".

These nominations bring to focus the role representatives of Punjab had been playing in both the Houses of Parliament - Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha.

Punjab has the distinction of sending several top political leaders, including Inder Kumar Gujral (who rose to be the Prime Minister of the country), besides several Union Ministers holding important portfolios like Defense, Home and Agriculture. These personal accolades apart, the State has generally remained without Statesmen leaders like Kapur Singh who remained steady and firm on demands and issues of the State.

While Inder Kumar Gujral is credited with waiving a part of the debt the State incurred in its fight against terrorism, other major demands, including autonomy to States, for which Punjab witnessed long spells of agitations, both peaceful and armed, were generally swept under the carpet.

Over the years, or to be precise after Independence, the State has lost control not only of its new capital

Chandigarh (that it built after losing Lahore to Pakistan), but also control on its river waters, power projects like Bhakra and Beas dams and institutes like Panjab University, Punjab Engineering College and the Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and Research.

Going by the record of both Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha, the pitch for these long-standing demands appears to have been lost. Compromises, generally for power, were made and to fight Centre for backing out of its commitments, including transfer of Chandigarh to Punjab in mid 80s, none of its representatives, both in Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha, ever made a sincerely noticeable effort. Even the sacrifice of Darshan Singh Pheruman in support of these demands was ignored.

No doubt Punjab is an agricultural State, but it does not mean that it does not need industry for its overall economic development. When militancy was at its peak, several incentives, including industrialization, were promised. But none of these promises, including development of Sri Goindwal Sahib, as an industrial hub in the border belt were kept. Instead, the State witnessed a flight of industry to neighboring hilly States of Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand in general. Even at that time, the pitch of the protest raised by Punjab MPs was so frivolous as to be audible elsewhere.

No one will support outsiders to represent the State in Parliament. The million-rupee question is "Are our political parties and their bigwigs acting at the behest of the State or are just appeasing a section of their loyalists at the cost of the State?"

Answers may generate an animated debate about the practices followed in the past viz a viz recent action of the first-time ruling group. Whatever be the outcome, the State needs a government that works for finding solutions to its vexed and long-standing demands besides attending to its conjugal problems.

Opposition, Agitation, Rebellion and Change

Aam Aadmi Party has members drawn from various spheres and there are many who give precedence to power, over and above working for public-good. They speak their own language and have their own opinions. Although the people of Punjab are not in any kind of a hurry, but they are, certainly, emotional and have the capability of analyzing those whom they have selected and elected. People shall judge the new government on the parameters of concrete policies, programs, performance, deliverance of results and they would not be content with living on mere minor concessions. The Central government is constantly maneuvering to destabilize the structure of 'State-autonomous' sphere of functioning'. What would be the stance of AAP, on this point? What would be the policy of AAP, on the issue of Punjab's river-waters? What would be the approach and attitude of AAP, towards

mitigating the sufferings of the unemployed youth, thereby ameliorating their condition? What would be the views and measures of AAP, regarding the farming community?

For AAP and for CM Bhagwant Mann, the major thrust areas are : presenting a budget whereby public-welfare schemes are offered; decision-making, implementation and functioning, free from the shackles of Central domination; providing an honest and transparent governance; taking effective action on sentimental-issues; giving priority to growth and development projects; working towards having a clean Punjab. These would be some of the major and primary tasks and challenges, for CM and his cabinet and for his party-cadre. Punjab is under severely exorbitant fiscal debts. Taliban cancel girls' higher education despite assurance

KABUL (TIP): In a surprise decision, the hardline leadership of Afghanistan's new rulers has decided against opening educational institutions to girls beyond Grade six, a Taliban official said on March 23 on the first day of Afghanistan's new school year.

The latest setback for girls' education is certain to receive widespread condemnation from the international community that has been urging the Taliban leaders to open schools and give women their right to public space.

Words don't match actions

Taliban statements are often different from their actions. No one should believe Taliban have stopped blocking girls from secondary education until evidence shows that to be the case.—Heather Barr, Human Rights Watch

The unexpected decision came late on Tuesday as Afghanistan's education ministry prepared for the New Year opening of school, which was expected to herald the return of girls to school. A statement by the ministry earlier in the week urged "all students" to come to school.

However, the decision to postpone a return of girls going to school in higher levels appeared to be a concession to the rural and deeply tribal backbone of the hardline Taliban movement, that in many parts of the countryside are reluctant to send their daughters to school.



Girls have been banned from school beyond Grade six in most of the country since the Taliban returned to power in mid-August. In the capital, Kabul private schools and universities have operated uninterrupted.

The religiously driven Taliban administration fears going forward with enrolling girls beyond Grade 6 could erode their base, said Waheedullah Hashmi, external relations and donor representative with the Taliban-led administration. "The leadership hasn't

decided when or how they will allow girls to return to school," Hashmi said. While he accepted that urban centres are mostly supportive of girls' education, much of rural Afghanistan is opposed, particularly in tribal Pashtun regions.

In some rural areas a brother will disown a brother in the city if he finds out that he is letting his daughters go to school," said Hashmi, who said the Taliban leadership was trying to decide how to open education for girls beyond Grade 6 countrywide.—AP

FIRE TRIGGERS BLASTS AT PAKISTAN MILITARY DEPOT

LAHORE (TIP): A series of powerful explosions rocked the border city of Sialkot after a fire was triggered by short circuit at a military depot on March 22. The incident created panic amongst the people, sparking rumours that the key army installation had been targeted by terrorists.

The accidental fire broke out in an ammunition shed near Sialkot garrison, about 100-km away from Punjab province's capital, Lahore.

Pakistan Army's media wing, the Inter Services Public Relations (ISPR), in statement said, "Due to short circuiting, an accidental fire broke out in an ammunition shed near Sialkot Garrison. No loss of life. Effective and timely response contained the damages and fire has been extinguished." The Pakistan Army did not share any further details regarding the incident.

According to reports, the explosions rocked the city at 6 am. Fire brigade and Rescue 1122 reached the spot and doused the fire after several hours.

When asked about damages, a spokesperson for the Rescue 1122 said that only the military was authorised to speak on the matter.—(PTI)

Pakistan PM Imran Khan praises India's 'independent foreign policy'

ISLAMABAD (TIP): Prime Minister Imran Khan on March 22 lauded India for following an "independent foreign policy", saying it imported crude oil from Russia despite American sanctions. Khan, a fierce critic of the ruling NDA government led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, spoke highly of the Indian foreign policy.

In his address to a public rally in the Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa province, he told his supporters that he would like to praise the neighbouring country India as it was having an "independent foreign policy". Khan said that India, which is a part of Quad, has imported oil from Russia despite American sanctions.

The prime minister said that his foreign policy would also favour the people of Pakistan.

"I haven't bowed before anyone and will not let my nation bow either," said Khan, who is rallying public support ahead of a no-confidence vote against him in Parliament.

Breaking from the tradition of not openly discussing complicated matters relating to foreign relations in public rallies, Khan mentioned that he had said "absolutely not" to the EU envoys



seeking Pakistan's support against Russia in the Russia-Ukraine conflict because "they broke protocol by making the request".

He said that Pakistan would have gained nothing by complying with the EU's request.

"We became part of America's war against terror in Afghanistan and lost 80,000 people and USD 100 billion," he said.

It is for the second time he spoke against a statement by the EU and other Western countries asking Pakistan earlier this month to condemn the Russian intervention in Ukraine.

In his previous address, Khan had also asked the EU if it would make a similar demand to India. (PTI)

NO-TRUST MOTION AGAINST PAK PM KHAN ADJOURNED

ISLAMABAD (TIP): Pakistan National Assembly's crucial session on a no-trust motion against embattled Prime Minister Imran Khan was adjourned on March 25 without tabling of the resolution, amid vociferous protests from opposition lawmakers.

National Assembly Speaker Asad Qaiser said that the session was adjourned till 4pm on March 28 due to the demise of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf lawmaker Khayal Zaman on February 14.

According to Pakistan's Parliamentary conventions, the first sitting after the death of a lawmaker is limited to the prayers for the departed soul and tributes from fellow lawmakers. Several prominent opposition members, were in Parliament House on Friday to participate in the much-anticipated session.—(PTI)

SRI LANKA DEPLOYS MILITARY AT FUEL STATIONS AMIDST SHORTAGE



COLOMBO (TIP): Army personnel were deployed at all fuel stations run by Sri Lanka's state-owned Ceylon Petroleum Corporation on March 22 amidst a shortage that led to long queues of consumers.

Military spokesman Nilantha Premaratna said that military personnel were deployed to monitor the distribution of fuel at the filling stations and maintain law and order among the consumers, reports Xinhua news agency.

He said two military men were deployed at every fuel station as people had to stand in queues for as long as several hours.

Three people died with one person killed in recent days while standing in the fuel queues in different parts of the country, leading to a tense situation in several areas.

The government has assured that fuel would be distributed sufficiently and the required stocks were now arriving without disruption in the country.

Sri Lanka is facing a fuel shortage due to a foreign exchange crisis which the government says is being resolved by seeking economic relief from friendly nations. IANS

Canadian Politics: Bobby Singh in race for Conservative leadership

BRAMPTON (TIP): Born and brought up in Scarborough, Bobby Singh, has joined the Conservative leadership race. He comes from an immigrant Punjabi family and is one of nine candidates so far in the run.

Canada's Conservatives will have their new leader elected by Saturday, September 10. In choosing its third leader in five years, Conservative Party of Canada members have a tough decision to make as the party has not done well in the federal elections in the recent past. Though it looks a battle of wits featuring Mr Pierre Poilievre, Mr Jean Charest, Mr Patrick Brown, and Ms Leslyn Lewis, others who have entered the race so far include Mr. Roman Baber, Mr. Joseph Bourgault, Mr. Scott Aitchison, Mr. Marc Dalton, and Mr. Bobby Singh.

Prospective candidates will have until April 19 to apply to enter the leadership election. The candidates will provide a total entry fee of \$200,000, in addition to a compliance deposit of \$100,000 which is refundable after the election is concluded.

Only those members who are enrolled on or before June 3 shall be eligible to

vote. The last election in 2020 took little longer as it was conducted by postal ballot because of the Corona pandemic.

Bobby Singh had unsuccessfully contested election to the House of Commons in 2019 from Scarborough Rouge Park. He was also in the run for the party leadership in 2020 before retiring from the contest in favor of another candidate Peter MacKay.

Early this week, Jagmeet Singh, who became the first non-white immigrant to head a national party - NDP - was in news after signing an agreement with the Prime Minister Justin Trudeau that keeps the minority Liberal government in office till completion of its full term in 2025.

Bobby Singh jumped in the fray even before the NDP-Liberal agreement was signed. At one stage there were speculations that once the Conservatives have a new leader, it may challenge the minority Liberal government to force yet another federal election. Now after the NDP-Liberal agreement, speculations of an early federal poll have more or less disappeared.

The Conservative leadership election has been necessitated after Erin O Toole, elected in 2020, was forced to quit early

this year.

"The son of immigrants, I am a proud Canadian of the Punjabi Sikh community and have lived my entire life in the district of Scarborough, specifically 30 years as a resident in Scarborough Rouge Park. I have watched this community mature and transition, from being a predominantly English-Canadian community to now representing multiple minority groups accounting for over 56% of the population with South Asians serving as the largest visible minority," Bobby Singh had stated before contesting the 2019 federal elections.

He claims to be a successful entrepreneur - business professional with nearly two decades of experience in launching start-up businesses. He says he has also worked within financial, retail, government, and consumer packaged goods industries advising stakeholders within customer service, finance, and strategy capacities.

In 2016 he expressed interest to run as a candidate in the Ontario Scarborough Rouge River provincial by-election. Subsequently, in 2017 he sought appointment to Toronto City Council.

He holds a Bachelor of Arts and

Science degrees in Finance-Economics and Psychology from the University of Toronto, a Master of Business Administration degree from the Schulich School of Business, York University, and a Master of Public Policy Administration and Law degree and Graduate Diploma in Justice Administration from the School of Public Policy, York University.

Pierre Poilievre declared himself a candidate for Canadian Prime Ministership even before the election process for Conservative leadership was announced. He had tweeted:

9 Dalits, 20 OBCs: Yogi Cabinet caste matrix shows BJP's eyes set on 2024

The BJP, which traditionally had Brahmins and Thakurs as its core vote base, has gone to great lengths to woo the Dalits, in addition to the Bhumihars and Jats in the crucial state elections, seen by many as a semi-final before the high-stakes 2024 general election

NEW DELHI (TIP)

The Bharatiya Janta Party has returned to power in Uttar Pradesh for a second straight term in a historic election victory. Yogi Adityanath, too, has returned to office for a second consecutive term - a first in 37 years.

The BJP, which traditionally had Brahmins and Thakurs as its core vote base, has gone to great lengths to woo the Dalits, in addition to the Bhumihars and Jats in the crucial state elections, seen by many as a semi-final before the high-stakes 2024 general election.

As Yogi Adityanath took the oath of office on March 25, 52 leaders were sworn in as ministers at a ceremony that was reportedly attended by 85,000 people, including senior politicians. Of them, 18 have been given Cabinet berths and 14 are Ministers of State with independent charges and 20 are junior ministers. The party has carefully distributed the positions among leaders who represent the backward classes, who are Muslims and who are from the Sikh community.

To break down Yogi Adityanath's Cabinet on the basis of castes, 21, including the chief minister, come from upper castes, 20 are from the Other Backward Classes (OBCs), and nine are Dalits, while there is one minister each from the Muslim, Sikh and Punjabi communities. In addition, Yadavs have also been given prominence in representation.

THE UPPER CASTES

Yogi Adityanath's Cabinet 2.0 has 21 ministers from the upper castes; seven are Brahmins, three are Vaishyas and eight, including the chief minister, represent the Thakurs. The Cabinet also has one Kayastha and two Bhumihar ministers. Of the seven Brahmin ministers, three are in the Cabinet, one has independent charge and three are junior ministers. While Brajesh Pathak is one of the two deputy chief ministers of the state, Yogendra Upadhyay and Jitin Prasada, who switched over from the Congress, have been given Cabinet berths. Pratibha Shukla, Rajni Tiwari and Satish Sharma took oaths as junior ministers.

THE THAKURS

Apart from Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, Jaiveer Singh has been made a Cabinet minister. JPS Rathore, Dayashankar Singh, and Dinesh Pratap Singh have been made Ministers of State with independent charges. Brijesh Singh, Mayankeshwaran Singh and Somendra Tomar are junior ministers.

THE VAISHYAS-KAYASTHAS-BHUMIHARS

Three ministers from the Vaishya caste have been made ministers in Yogi Adityanath's second term in office. Of them, Nandgopal Nandi is a Cabinet Minister and Nitin Agarwal and Kapil Dev Agarwal are junior ministers. Suryaprata Shahi and Arvind Kumar Sharma have joined the Cabinet from the Bhumihar community. Arun Kumar Saxena from the Kayastha community has been given independent charge.

THE OTHER BACKWARD CLASSES

Of the 20 ministers from the Other Backward Classes, BJP's allies Apna Dal and the Nishaad Party have been given one Cabinet berth each. BJP's prominent OBC face Keshav Prasad Maurya has been reappointed as a deputy chief minister despite his poll defeat. Swatantra Dev Singh and Rakesh Sachan, both Kurmi leaders, have been given a Cabinet post along with Ashish Patel from Apna Dal, the BJP's ally. In all, eight leaders from the OBC community have been given Cabinet seats. Jat leaders Lakshmi Narayan Chowdhury and Bhupendra Singh Chowdhury are Cabinet ministers, too. Anil Rajbhar from the Rajbhar community, Sanjay Nishad from the Nishad community and Dharampal Singh from the Lodh community are ministers. Six ministers who have been given independent charges are from Other Backward Classes: Sandip Singh from the Lodh community, Narendra Kashyap from the Nishad community, Girish Chandra Yadav from the Yadav community, Sanjay Gangwar from the Kurmi community, Dharambir Prajapati from the Prajapati caste, and Ravindra Jaiswal from the Kalwar caste. Six OBC leaders have been made junior ministers.

THE DALITS

Nine Dalit leaders have been made ministers and only

one - Baby Rani Maurya - has been given a Cabinet position. Maurya, who represents the Jaatav community, is being projected as the BJP's counter to Mayawati in the state. Former Kanpur top cop Asim Arun, who voluntarily retired from his post to join politics, has been given independent charge. Arun, too, is from the Jaatav community.

THE MUSLIM, THE SIKH AND THE PUNJABI

The minority communities have also found places in Yogi Adityanath's Cabinet. Danish Azad Ansari has replaced Mohsin Raza to secure a ministerial post. Baldev Singh Aulakh, representing the Sikhs, has once again been made a junior minister, while Suresh Khanna, a nine-time MLA from Shahjahanpur and representing the Punjabi community, is a Cabinet minister.

The BJP has attempted to not just strike the right caste equation in Uttar Pradesh but also send a political message to the extremely crucial vote bank ahead of the 2024 elections. The party is planning ahead, and its push to the OBC and Dalit communities points to that. Its seat distribution hints at how the party is planning to bring the OBC-Dalit and the Jaatav votes into its fold on one hand, while on the other, to sway the Muslim vote bank with a ministerial post to a leader of the community. The party also has a hack to cut into the influence of farmers' leader Rakesh Tikait and the Rashtriya Lok Dal on the Jats: leaders of the community have been assigned plum positions.

Holds first meeting of Council of Ministers in Lucknow

After taking oath as the Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh for the second consecutive term on Friday in Lucknow, Yogi Adityanath held the first meeting of the council of ministers in the state's capital city on the same day. The meeting was held at Lok Bhavan after Prime Minister Narendra Modi and other top dignitaries left after attending the grand ceremony at Atal Bihari Vajpayee Ekana Cricket Stadium.

INDIA-CHINA TALKS: BORDER PEACE MUST, JAISHANKAR TO WANG YI

NEW DELHI (TIP)

India and China discussed the border situation as well as Beijing's leaning towards Pakistan during three-hour talks between visiting Chinese Minister Wang Yi and EAM S Jaishankar here on March 25.

Earlier in the day, Wang met NSA Ajit Doval after arriving from Kabul last night for a visit the Chinese side did not want to announce. On being invited to China, Doval told Wang he would do so after immediate issues were resolved.

Jaishankar said progress had been made in resolving issues as regards various friction areas along the LAC and that talks today focused on taking forward the momentum in case of remaining areas. Jaishankar told Wang India found his observations on Kashmir at the OIC ministerial in Islamabad objectionable. "It was a subject discussed at some length. There was a larger context. We hope China will follow an independent foreign policy with respect to India and not allow its policy to be influenced by others," he said.

"Our effort is to sort out the issue in entirety and look at de-escalation. The challenge has been to implement the agreements on the ground. It is a work-in-progress, obviously at a slower pace than desirable. My discussions were aimed at expediting that process," he said.

MISSILE 'MISFIRE': 14 IAF OFFICIALS UNDER LENS

NEW DELHI (TIP)

The Court of Inquiry (CoI) probing the "accidental" firing of a BrahMos missile has examined the role of at least four Indian Air Force (IAF) officials — a Group Captain (Commanding Officer), his seniors and also his juniors.

The initial probe has indicated a "human error", and not a technical fault, led to the missile's launch. Though alleged lapses in handling the missile are being probed, the CoI is looking at multiple angles.

A BrahMos missile was "accidentally" fired around 7 pm on March 9 from a base near Ambala and it landed some 124 km away at Mian Channu in Pakistan's Punjab province.

All missile storage and inspecting protocols have been examined. IAF officials in the chain of command have been questioned to find out why and how the missile was fired. Each data, log and procedure followed by the officials on March 9 has been scrutinised by the CoI. The key question is how the launch codes were fed into the system that enabled the missile to fire. The protocol for firing and storage of BrahMos, a supersonic cruise missile, is such that a series of steps are needed to be completed before actual firing. The missile, which carried no warhead, travelled at Mach2 (some 3,200 km per hour) towards Pakistan.

Calcutta HC orders CBI probe into Birbhum killings case

KOLKATA (TIP)

The Calcutta High Court on Friday, March 25, ordered a CBI investigation into Birbhum violence that claimed eight lives earlier this week.

The court directed an SIT formed by the West Bengal government to hand over case papers and accused persons arrested by it to the central probe agency.

A division bench comprising Chief Justice Prakash Shrivastava and Justice R Bharadwaj directed the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) to file a progress report by April 7, the next date of hearing of the matter.

The bench said that the CBI probe was being ordered in the interest of justice.

Eight people, including two children, were charred to death in Bogtui village of Bengal's Birbhum district in the suspected fallout of a TMC panachayat official's murder.

The bench had suo motu taken up the case of the gruesome incident.

A set of PILs seeking CBI or NIA probe into the incident were also taken up for hearing by the court along with the suo motu petition.

On Thursday, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee visited Bogtui village, where she ensured "speedy justice" to the victims and offered monetary compensation. However, Opposition leaders have accused the Bengal government of a 'cover up' and 'fabrication'.

Congress leader Adhir Chowdhary, whose car was allegedly stopped more than once before reaching Bogtui, alleged that several bodies had disappeared from the site of violence. He said, "She (CM) alleged a big conspiracy

behind this incident and that is why she has instructed the police to take strict action. The bodies of two children have gone missing. The CM is trying to suppress the facts."

Meanwhile, after local residents complained to CM that local Trinamool Congress block president Anarul Hussain had hatched the conspiracy to set the houses ablaze, she ordered the DGP to arrest him. However, Leader of Opposition Suvendu Adhikari tweeted, "Can someone instruct an investigating agency to fabricate a case? Rather than directing the investigating agency to conduct a fair investigation and gather

evidence that incriminates the real perpetrators, @MamataOfficial is pronouncing & dictating who are at fault. (sic)".

'Mamata govt fabricating case': BJP

The BJP on Thursday slammed the Mamata Banerjee-led Trinamool Congress (TMC) government in West Bengal for allegedly "fabricating a case" over the Birbhum killings.

The statement came after the police arrested TMC's Rampurhat block president Anarul Hossain in connection with the case at the instruction of Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee.

Punjab cabinet: Bhagwant Mann keeps home, Cheema gets finance

Punjab chief minister Bhagwant Mann on Monday, March 21, allocated portfolios to his 10 ministers, retaining home and justice, and giving the charge of finance and taxation to his seniormost cabinet colleague Harpal Singh Cheema.

The portfolios were announced by the new chief minister two days after the 10 cabinet ministers took the oath of office and secrecy here. All the ministers, except Cheema and Gurmeet Singh Meet Hayer, are first-time legislators.

Besides home, Mann, who was elected from Dhuri assembly segment, has kept 26 departments in his portfolio, including local government, industries and commerce, agriculture and farmers' welfare, according to an official release.

Cheema, who represents Dirba (reserved) seat, has got the portfolios of finance, excise and taxation, planning, programme implementation and cooperation. He was the leader of the opposition in the previous assembly.

Dr Baljit Kaur, MLA from Malout (reserved) who is the lone woman in the cabinet, has been made the in-charge of social justice, empowerment and minorities, and social security, women and child development. Harbhajan Singh, who represents Jandiala (reserved), has been given the charge of public works and power.

Mansa MLA Dr Vijay Singla has got the portfolios of health and family welfare, and medical education and research. A dentist, he is among 13 doctors who have made it to the state assembly this time. Lal Chand Kataruchak, who got elected from Bhoa (reserved), is the minister for food, civil supplies and consumer affairs, forests and wildlife.

Gurmeet Singh Meet Hayer, MLA from Barnala, has been allotted the departments of school education, sports and youth services, and higher education. The 32-year-old minister has a BTech degree.

Kuldeep Singh Dhaliwal, MLA from Ajnala, has been allotted the portfolios of rural development and panchayats among others. Laljit Singh Bhullar, MLA from Patti, is the new transport and hospitality minister. Bram Shanker, who got elected from Hoshiarpur, has got the charge of revenue, rehabilitation and disaster management besides water and sanitation.

Harjot Singh Bains, who got elected from Anandpur Sahib, has been allocated legal and legislative affairs, and jails among other departments. An advocate by profession, the 31-year-old first-time MLA is the youngest member of the state cabinet. The portfolio, if any, not allotted to any of the ministers will vest with the chief minister, said the official spokesperson.

Kultar Sandhwan unanimously elected Speaker of Punjab Vidhan Sabha

Kultar Singh Sandhwan, 46, was unanimously elected Punjab assembly Speaker in Chandigarh on Monday, March 21. Chief minister Bhagwant Mann proposed Kotkapura Aam Aadmi Party MLA Sandhwan's name for the post and he was unanimously elected. Mann and cabinet minister Harpal Singh Cheema escorted Sandhwan to the Speaker's chair.






Randeep Hooda to play Veer Savarkar in Mahesh Manjrekar film

Things get sinister as Geoffrey's face seems to be pasted on every man in the village she encounters, including the priest, who wonders aloud whether she is not to blame for her husband's death. If only she had apologised, he would still be alive. Even the cop is Kinnear, and a young boy (Garland has used deep fake to achieve that, and the effect is clearly unfinished). The idea is that the society is so skewed towards men that everybody blames her for a tragedy she



had no part in.

Men looks like a typical Garland film, albeit with horror elements. In other words, an utter delight. The Biblical imagery, clever use of vocals and sound design, visuals that are both pretty and

unnerving, and a small but strong cast — both Buckley and Kinnear have proven themselves to be striking performers. We cannot wait.

Men releases on May 20.

AUSTRALIA SET TO ROLL OUT FOURTH COVID SHOT AHEAD OF WINTER

SYDNEY (TIP): Australia will roll out a fourth dose of Covid vaccines to its most vulnerable population starting next month, authorities said on March 25, as the country looks to limit fresh outbreaks ahead of winter.

The decision comes amid a steady rise in cases fuelled by the highly contagious BA.2 sub-variant of the Omicron strain and concerns of co-circulation of Covid and flu viruses during colder months as most social distancing restrictions end.

A second booster shot will be offered from April 4 to people who had their previous booster shot at least four months ago and are over 65 years, Indigenous Australians over 50, people with disability or severely immunocompromised, Health Minister Greg Hunt said during a media briefing. — Reuters

BLACK BOX OF CRASHED CHINESE PLANE FOUND



BEIJING (TIP): One of the two black boxes of the crashed China Eastern Airlines plane was found on March 23 in a "severely damaged" condition by rescuers combing the site in vast forest mountainous area in southern China, amid fears that none of the 132 persons on board survived.

Two days on, distressing videos have emerged showing the Boeing 737-800 on a domestic flight nose-dived into the mountains on Monday crashing with an explosion leaving its debris in a vast forested area, making rescue efforts difficult. A black box, which officials said is believed to be the cockpit recorder of the crashed passenger plane, was recovered by rescuers on Wednesday. Mao Yanfeng, head of the aviation accident investigation centre of the Civil Aviation Administration of China, told the media that the black box was "severely damaged". — PTI

PUTIN WANTS 'UNFRIENDLY COUNTRIES' TO PAY RUBLES FOR GAS

MOSCOW (TIP): President Vladimir Putin announced Wednesday that Russia will demand that "unfriendly" countries pay for Russian natural gas exports only in rubles from now on. Putin told a meeting with government officials that "a number of Western countries made illegitimate decisions on the so-called freezing of the Russian assets, effectively drawing a line over reliability of their currencies, undermining the trust for those currencies." (AP)

North Korea fires suspected missile into sea

SEOUL (TIP): North Korea fired at least one suspected ballistic missile towards the sea on March 24, its neighbours' militaries said, apparently extending its barrage of weapons tests that may culminate with a flight of its biggest-yet intercontinental ballistic missile.

South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff didn't immediately say whether the weapon involved in the launch was ballistic or how far it flew.

Japan's Prime Minister's Office Defence Ministry said the North fired a possible ballistic missile.

It was North Korea's 12th round of weapon launches this year and came after it fired suspected artillery pieces into the sea on Sunday.

Experts say the North's unusually fast pace in testing activity underscore its dual goal of advancing its weaponry and applying pressure on Washington, over a deepening freeze in nuclear negotiations.

The North has also tested a variety of new missiles, including a purported hypersonic weapon and its first launch since 2017 of an intermediate range missile potentially capable of reaching Guam, a key US military hub in the Pacific.

It also conducted two medium-range tests from near its capital area in recent weeks that the US and South Korean militaries later assessed as involving



components of the North's largest ICBM, the Hwasong-17, which they said could be tested at full range soon.

North Korea's official media insisted that those two tests were aimed at developing cameras and other systems for a spy satellite.

Analysts say the North is clearly attempting to simultaneously resume ICBM testing and acquire some level of space-based reconnaissance capability under the pretence of a space launch, to reduce international backlash to those moves. The launch may possibly come

around as a major political anniversary in April, the birthday of state founder Kim Il Sung, the late grandfather of current leader Kim Jong-Un.

The North's previous ICBMs demonstrated potential range to reach the American homeland during the three flight tests in 2017.

Its development of the larger Hwasong-17, which was first revealed in a military parade in October 2020, possibly indicates an aim to arm it with multiple warheads to overwhelm missile defences, experts say. (AP)

Saudi Aramco storage facility targeted by Houthi attack causing fire

RIYADH (TIP): Yemen's Houthis said they launched attacks on Saudi energy facilities on March 25 and the Saudi-led coalition said oil giant Aramco's petroleum products distribution station in Jeddah was hit, causing a fire in two tanks but no casualties.

A huge plume of black smoke could be seen rising over the Red Sea city where the Saudi Arabian Grand Prix is taking place this weekend, an eyewitness said.

Unverified videos shared on social media showed fire raging in oil tanks in an Aramco facility on the outskirts of Jeddah.

There was no immediate comment from Aramco or the energy ministry when contacted by Reuters.

The Iran-aligned Houthi movement that has been battling a coalition led by Saudi Arabia for seven years launched missiles on Aramco's facilities in Jeddah and drones at Ras Tanura and Rabigh refineries, the group's military spokesman said. He said they also targeted "vital facilities" in the capital Riyadh.

Saudi state media had earlier reported



that a string of drone and rocket attacks by the Houthis was foiled by the coalition.

Saudi air defences also intercepted and destroyed a ballistic rocket launched towards the port city of Jazan, which caused a "limited" fire to break out at an electricity distribution plant, state media reported.

Saudi Arabia, the world's largest oil exporter, said earlier this week it would not bear responsibility for any oil supply disruptions to global markets as a result of Houthi attacks that have intensified in the past three weeks. - Reuters



Julian Assange weds fiancée in prison ceremony

LONDON (TIP): WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange has wed his fiancée at a ceremony in the London prison where he is held. Supporters said Assange and Stella Moris were allowed four guests and two witnesses in attendance for March 23 ceremony. Moris posed for photos with her and Assange's two sons as they arrived outside the prison. She wore a dress and veil embroidered with messages from friends. PTI

Zelenskyy appeals to NATO for more weapons

LVIV (TIP): Ukraine's president has pleaded with NATO to provide his embattled nation with military assistance.

In a video address to the NATO summit March 24, Volodymyr Zelenskyy said Ukraine needs "military assistance without limitations", as Russia is "using its entire arsenal" against the country.

Zelenskyy urged NATO to provide Ukraine with "1% of all your planes, 1% of all your tanks". "We can't just buy those," Zelenskyy said. "When we will have all this, it will give us, just like you, 100% security." Ukraine is also in dire need of multiple launch rocket systems, anti-ship weapons and air defense systems, Zelenskyy said. "Is it possible to survive in such a war without this?" he asked.

Zelenskyy said Russia used phosphorous bombs on Thursday morning, killing both adults and children. He reminded NATO leaders that thousands of Ukrainians have died in the past month, 10 million people have left their homes, and urged NATO to give "clear answers".

"It feels like we're in a gray area, between the West and Russia, defending our common values," Zelenskyy said emotionally. "This is the scariest thing during a war—not to have clear answers to requests for help." Zelenskyy did not reiterate his request for a no-fly zone or ask to join NATO, according to a



senior Biden administration official.

Germany says it has sent about 10,000 metric tons of essential aid to Ukraine using a recently created "rail bridge" of trains shuttling back and forth between the two countries.

Transport minister Volker Wissing told the Funke media group in an interview published Thursday that the rail link was established two weeks ago to bring much-needed food, drink and hygiene products from Germany to Ukraine. Speaking at a Berlin cargo terminal Thursday, Wissing said many

of the goods being sent to Ukraine by train had been donated.

"We hope this war is over soon and will do everything to ease the suffering," he said.

German rail company Deutsche Bahn has separately organised additional trains to bring refugees from the Polish-Ukrainian border to Germany.

The Czech Republic's Parliament has approved a plan to deploy up to 650 Czech service members to Slovakia as part of an multinational NATO force set up in response to Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

Parliament's lower house approved the deployment Thursday after the upper house gave the green light last week.

The United States, Germany, the Netherlands, Poland and Slovenia will also contribute troops to the unit, expected to include up to 2,100 soldiers.

The plan is part of the NATO initiative to reassure member countries on the alliance's eastern flank.

The alliance stationed troops in the Baltic countries - Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania - and Poland after the 2014 annexation of Ukraine's Crimean Peninsula by Russia. After Russia attacked Ukraine, NATO decided to boost its presence along the entire eastern flank by deploying forces in Bulgaria, Romania, Hungary and Slovakia. AP

UKRAINE CLAIMS RUSSIA IS PREPARING CHEMICAL ATTACKS

KIEV (TIP): The Centre for Counteracting Disinformation of the National Security and Defence Council of Ukraine has warned of possible chemical attacks being prepared by the Russian forces.

"Russian channels tell their audience daily about mythical laboratories that allegedly create chemical weapons in Ukraine." "This is how the enemy 'grooms' the population of the Russian Federation regarding the use of chemical weapons by 'nationalists against the civilian population'. We emphasise that there are no such laboratories in Ukraine," the Council said, Ukrayinska Pravda reported.

Earlier, experts from the Russian Armed Forces have revealed new evidence of the involvement of the US Department of Defense in the development of biological weapons in Ukraine.

This was stated at a briefing by the official representative of the Russian Defense Ministry Igor Konashenkov.

Experts from the Russian troops of radiation, chemical and biological protection, in the course of studying documents, revealed new facts proving the direct involvement of the US Department of Defense in the development of biological weapons components in Ukraine, he said, RT reported.

According to Konashenkov, in the near future the Ministry of Defense will publish original documents that demonstrate that the Pentagon developed and approved the U-Pi-2 biological project.

It is noted that the main goal of this project was to conduct a molecular analysis of especially dangerous infections that are endemic to Ukraine.

"This work involved sampling the pathogen in old cattle burial grounds in order to obtain new strains of anthrax," a Russian defence official said. -IANS

7,000 TO 15,000 RUSSIAN TROOPS DEAD IN UKRAINE: NATO

KYIV (TIP): NATO estimated on March 24 that 7,000 to 15,000 Russian soldiers have been killed in four weeks of war in Ukraine, where fierce resistance has denied Moscow the lightning victory it sought.

Putin has warned the West that an attempt to introduce a no-fly zone over Ukraine would draw it into a conflict with Russia. Western nations have said they would not create a no-fly zone to protect Ukraine.

Zelenskyy appealed to Western countries to stay united in the face of Russia's efforts to "lobby its interests" with "some partners" to bring them over to its side, and noted during his national address that Ukraine has not received the fighter jets or modern air-defence systems it requested. He said Ukraine also needs tanks and anti-ship systems.

"It has been a month of defending ourselves from attempts to destroy us, wipe us off the face of the earth," he said.

In Kyiv, where near-constant shelling and gunfire shook the city on Wednesday as the two sides battled for control of multiple suburbs, Mayor Vitali Klitschko said at least 264 civilians have been killed since the war broke out. The independent Russian news outlet The Insider said Russian journalist Oksana Baulina had been killed by shelling in a Kyiv neighbourhood on Wednesday. (AP)

Ukraine president pleads for worldwide show of support

KYIV (TIP): Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskyy called on people worldwide to gather in public on March 24 to show support for his embattled country on the one-month anniversary of the Russian invasion that he said breaks the heart of "every free person on the planet."

Zelenskyy — whose video messages have repeatedly riveted the world's attention — also said he would speak to NATO members by video to ask the alliance to provide "effective and unrestricted" support to Ukraine, including any weapons the country needs to fend off the Russian onslaught.

"Come to your squares, your streets. Make yourselves visible and heard," Zelenskyy said in English during an emotional video address late on Wednesday that was recorded in the dark near the presidential offices in Kyiv. "Say that people matter. Freedom matters. Peace matters. Ukraine matters."

When Russia unleashed its invasion on February 24 in Europe's biggest offensive since World War II, a swift toppling of Ukraine's government seemed likely.

But with Wednesday marking four full weeks of fighting, Moscow is bogged down

in a grinding military campaign.

NATO estimated that 7,000 to 15,000 Russian soldiers have been killed in four weeks of war in Ukraine, where fierce resistance has denied Moscow the lightning victory it sought.

By way of comparison, Russia lost about 15,000 troops over 10 years in Afghanistan.

A senior NATO military official said the alliance's estimate was based on information from Ukrainian authorities, what Russia has released — intentionally or not — and intelligence gathered from open sources.

The official spoke on condition of anonymity under ground rules set by NATO.

In its last update, Russia said on March 2 that nearly 500 soldiers had been killed and almost 1,600 wounded.

Ukraine has released little information about its own military losses, and the West has not given an estimate, but Zelenskyy said nearly two weeks ago that about 1,300 Ukrainian servicemen had been killed.

Ukraine also claims to have killed six Russian generals. However, Russia acknowledges just one dead general.

- Let the yogurt sit in your hair for 30 minutes to an hour.
- Rinse it out with lukewarm water.

Aloe Vera

- Cut an aloe vera leaf and extract about 1/2 a cup or

more gel (depending on the length of your hair) with a spoon.

- Blend the gel until it gets to a smooth consistency.
- Wash your hair with shampoo. Skip conditioning.
- While your hair is still damp, start applying the aloe vera gel to your hair from the roots to the tips.
- Let the gel sit in your hair for about 30 minutes.
- Rinse your hair out with lukewarm water.

Mayonnaise And Egg

- Mix half a cup of mayonnaise with 1 egg and 1 tablespoon of olive oil in a bowl. You may double the ingredients if your hair is very long.
- Shampoo your hair and skip conditioning.
- Once your hair is almost dry, section it and start applying the mixture from the roots to the tips.
- Put your hair up in a bun and cover it with a shower cap or a moist hot towel.
- Keep the pack on for 20-30 minutes and then rinse it off with shampoo and lukewarm water. Skip conditioning if you have oily hair.

Honey

- Honey can be used in combination with various ingredients for conditioning your hair. Below are three deep conditioning recipes that contain honey.

Honey And Avocado

- Mash one ripe avocado and add 2 tablespoons of raw honey to it. Ensure that there are no lumps.
- Mix it until it gets to a smooth consistency.
- Wash your hair with shampoo and skip conditioning. Let your hair air dry.
- Once your hair is dry, start applying the honey-avocado mixture from the roots to the tips of your hair.
- Let it sit for 30 minutes to an hour.
- Wash it off with shampoo and condition.

Honey And Olive Oil

- Take 2 tablespoons of raw honey and mix it with 2 tablespoons of olive oil.
- Wash your hair with shampoo and skip conditioning. Let it air dry.
- Once your hair is completely dry, start applying the honey-olive oil mixture to it from the roots to the tips.
- Put your hair up in a bun, or in braids, and wait for 30 minutes to an hour.
- Wash with shampoo and condition.

Mozzarella Sticks

INGREDIENTS

300 gm mozzarella
1/2 cup chickpeas flour
1 cup sunflower oil
1/2 cup all purpose flour
1/2 cup crushed breadcrumbs

Method

Cut the cheese into 1/2-1 inch sticks and keep aside.
Mix the maida and besan flour in a bowl. Add enough water and mix to a thick batter.
Spread the breadcrumbs on a plate. Dip the cheese sticks in the batter and roll them in the breadcrumbs.
Place them on a parchment paper and keep it in the fridge for 2 to 3 hours or overnight.
This is to ensure the cheese does not melt while frying and it has a crispy coating.
Heat oil in a deep frying pan. Fry the mozzarella sticks until light golden brown.
Remove and drain excess oil. Serve with a dipping sauce of choice.

Egg Fried Rice

Ingredients

Basmati Rice - 2 cups, Eggs - 10, Onions - 2 Spring, Onions - 1 bunch, Beans - 10, Carrot - 2, Capsicum - 2, Cabbage - 100 gms, Pepper Powder - 1/2 tblsp, Green Chillies - 2, Tomato Puree - 2 to 3 tblsp (or as required), Ajinomoto - 3 tsp (optional), Soy Sauce - 4 tblsp, Salt as per taste, Oil - 3 tblsp, Coriander Leaves

Method

■ Pressure cook the rice until 1 whistle and remove.
■ Chop all the vegetables finely and keep aside.
■ Grind together the green chillies and mix well 2 tblsp water. Heat oil in a pan. Sauté the onions for a minute.
■ Add the chopped vegetables one by one and cook for a minute or two.
■ Add the green chilli paste and tomato puree.
■ Add salt and ajinomoto. Mix well and add soy sauce.
■ Break the eggs into the pan and stir-fry for 3 to 4 minutes.
■ Add the cooked rice and mix until all ingredients are combined. Garnish with coriander leaves.



Simple diet tips to lower cholesterol

Your body needs some cholesterol to work properly. But if you have too much in your blood, it can stick to the walls of your arteries and narrow or even block them. This puts you at risk for coronary artery disease and other heart diseases. Cholesterol travels through the blood on proteins called lipoproteins. One type, LDL, is sometimes called the "bad" cholesterol. A high LDL level leads to a buildup of cholesterol in your arteries. Another type, HDL, is sometimes called the "good" cholesterol. It carries cholesterol from other parts of your body back to your liver. Then your liver removes the cholesterol from your body.

Choose healthier fats

You should limit both total fat and saturated fat. No more than 25 to 35% of your daily calories should come from dietary fats, and less than 7% of your daily calories should come from saturated fat.



Eat lots of fruits and vegetables

A diet rich in fruits and vegetables can increase important cholesterol-lowering compounds in your diet. These compounds, called plant stanols or sterols, work like soluble fiber.

Eat fish high in omega-3 fatty acids

These acids won't lower your LDL level, but they may help raise your HDL level. They may also protect your heart from blood clots and inflammation and reduce your risk of heart attack. Fish that are a good source of omega-3 fatty acids include salmon, tuna (canned or fresh), and mackerel. Try to eat these fish two times a week.

Limit salt

You should try to limit the amount of sodium (salt) that you eat to no more than 2,300 milligrams (about 1

teaspoon of salt) a day. That includes all the sodium you eat, whether it was added in cooking or at the table, or already present in food products. Limiting salt won't lower your cholesterol, but it can lower your risk of heart diseases by helping to lower your blood pressure. You can reduce your sodium by instead choosing low-salt and "no added salt" foods and seasonings at the table or while cooking.

Limit alcohol

Alcohol adds extra calories, which can lead to weight gain. Being overweight can raise your LDL level and lower your HDL level. Too much alcohol can also increase your risk of heart diseases because it can raise your blood pressure and triglyceride level.

Organs from Covid positive fatalities are safe, says study

Evidence is mounting to show that organ donation from dying donors testing positive for SARS-CoV-2 appears to be safe and does not cause Covid-19 in the patient receiving the donated organ, according to a study.

The Covid pandemic exacerbated the shortage of abdominal organs for donation by increasing organ discard rates, due to the unclear risks of using organs from Covid-19 infected donors.


A team from Duke University in the US analysed six abdominal organ transplants performed (2 livers, 2 kidneys/pancreas transplanted together) in four recipients using organs procured from four donors who tested positive for Covid and died.

The donor evaluation protocol included additional review of organ quality, with all four donors undergoing macroscopic and/or microscopic biopsy review to confirm organ suitability.

Donors were assessed by considering organ type, the duration and severity of Covid-19 illness, whether any signs of hypercoagulable disease were present (meaning potentially increased clotting in the donated organ or vessels) as well as careful overall inspection at the time of organ procurement.

Further, if the organ to be donated was lung or intestine, it would only be considered if the donor last tested positive for Covid more than 20 days ago, a timeline consistent with infection control practices of the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

And if the virus was found in the base of the lungs, the lungs were deemed unsuitable for transplantation, but other organs could still be transplanted safely,



provided the donor was not dying from severe hyperinflammatory Covid-19 or showed signs of excessive clotting, the team explained.

Even after passing through all these barriers, doctors must still consider the ultimate cause of death for a donor and weigh up whether that is likely to negatively impact organ quality and/or surgical risk, they said.

Further, to reduce the transplant risk, recipients are now strongly encouraged to be fully Covid-19 vaccinated prior to surgery.

Scientists can now read whole genome sequencing of IVF embryo

In a significant breakthrough, scientists at a US-based gene analytics firm claimed that they can decode almost all the DNA of days-old embryos created via in vitro fertilisation (IVF), the Science reported.

According to MyOme, full sequence of both parents' DNA and resulting "reconstruction" of an embryo's genome with the help of the data, could make it possible to forecast risk for common diseases including heart conditions, autoimmune diseases, cancer, that can develop later in life. The advance is currently available only for adults.

In a paper, published in the journal Nature Medicine, the MyOme team described creating such scores by first sequencing the genomes of 10 pairs of parents who had already undergone IVF and had babies.

The researchers then used data collected during the IVF process: The couples' embryos, 110 in all, had undergone limited genetic testing at that time, a sort of spot sequencing of cells, called microarray measurements.

Such analysis can test for an abnormal number of chromosomes, certain genetic diseases, and rearrangements of large chunks of DNA. By combining these patchy embryo data with the more complete parental genome sequences, and applying statistical and population genomics techniques, the researchers could account for the gene shuffling that occurs during reproduction and calculate which chromosomes each parent had passed down to each embryo. In this way, they could predict much of that embryo's DNA, the report said.

The researchers collected cheek swab samples from the babies and sequenced their full genome, just as they'd done with the parents. They then compared that "true sequence" with the reconstructed genome for the embryo from which the child originated.

The comparison revealed, essentially, a match: For a 3-day-old embryo, at least 96 per cent of the reconstructed genome aligned with the inherited gene variants in the corresponding baby; for a 5-day-old embryo, it was at least 98 per cent, the report said.

Apple's Shazam App to suggest nearby concerts

Shazam, the music recognition platform acquired by Apple for reportedly \$400 million in 2018, has gained a new feature designed to make it easier for users to locate and explore upcoming live music shows. Shazam's new concert feature is now available on iOS and Android.

"Shazam has a long history of innovation in music discovery and connecting artists and fans," Apple VP for Apple Music and Beats Oliver Schusser said.

"With the reemergence of live music, we're excited to give Shazam users access to concerts and bring even more discoverability to artists." The platform has been also updated to version 15.0, with the app now able to spend more time listening to songs that are tough to recognise.

Available as an update via the App Store, Shazam version 15.0's update notes explain that the milestone update adds in a change to the way the feature functions. The app is free to download from the App Store, is compatible with all iPhones and iPads running iOS 13.0 and iPadOS 13.0 or later and weighs in at 34.2MB in size.

Massive dust cloud spotted by NASA's Spitzer telescope could give insights into planet formation

A group of astronomers made over 100 routine observations of a distant ten-million-year-old star called HD166191 using NASA's Spitzer Space Telescope and combined that with knowledge about the star's brightness and size to arrive at information that will help scientists test theories about how planets are formed and how they grow. Their findings are published in *The Astrophysical Journal*.

The Spitzer Space Telescope was an infrared space telescope that was launched by NASA in 2003 and continued operating for sixteen years before it was finally decommissioned in 2019.

Most rocky planets, satellites and other celestial objects in the solar system, including the Moon and the Earth, were formed by massive collisions early in the early history of the solar system. Terrestrial bodies accumulate more material and increase in size with these collisions. They can also break apart into many smaller bodies this way.

The astronomers, led by Kate Su of the University of Arizona, began making observations for HD 166191 in 2015. Around the star's early life, dust left over from its formation has clumped together to form small rocky bodies called 'planetesimals', which are potentially seeds for future planets.

After the gas that had previously filled the space between these objects dispersed, catastrophic collisions between them became more frequent. The scientists began making these observations using Spitzer between 2015 and 2019, anticipating that they might be able to gather evidence of such collisions.

Even though the planetesimals themselves were too small to be captured by the telescope, their smashups produce large amounts of dust. As an infrared light telescope, Spitzer was uniquely suited to detecting the dust and debris created by these collisions.

Astronomers are able to record these observations by detecting when the debris cloud from one of these bodies passes in front of a star and briefly blocks light. This is called a transit.

In mid-2018, the HD 166191 system became significantly brighter for the Spitzer telescope, which suggests an increase in debris production. During the time, the telescope also detected a transit, or a debris cloud blocking the star.

The astronomers' work suggests that this cloud is highly elongated with a minimum area estimated to be at least three times that of the star. However, the amount of infrared brightening detected probably means that only a small portion of the cloud passed in front of the star and that the debris from this event could even cover an area hundred times larger than that of the star.

The variable refresh rate allows the monitor refresh rate to synchronise with the game frame rate to avoid lag. This update to Chrome OS will bring a better experience to the game.


Google recently announced an early access programme called Chrome OS Flex that will bring its operating system to existing Windows and Macs.

The new version of Chrome OS, designed for businesses and schools and can be installed within minutes.

Devices running Chrome OS Flex will also have the ability to be managed with the same setup and licensing as enterprise and education Chromebooks without any differences in the process.

Chrome OS Flex is basically an upgraded version of CloudReady, which has the same functionality. CloudReady was developed by Neverware, which Google acquired in 2020. The company's free CloudReady installer can make it easy to transform an old Windows PC into a Chrome device.

Tesla named 'most trusted' brand developing fully-autonomous vehicles

Elon Musk-owned electric vehicle company Tesla was recently named the "most-trusted" brand in the pursuit of fully-autonomous vehicles, according to a new study.

The study surveyed consumer perception regarding fully-autonomous vehicle technology, reports Teslarati.

Fifty-six total automotive brands were options for consumers to pick in the study, a release from AutoPacific, who performed the study, said.

Tesla topped the list, earning 32 per cent of the votes, beating out Toyota with 19 per cent and BMW with 18 per cent.

"With 32 per cent of consumers, Tesla claims the crown for being the most trusted brand for developing safe and reliable fully-autonomous vehicles," the study said.

"This likely can be credited to much more 'buzz' surrounding the automaker's pricey and controversial Full-Self Driving driver assistance tech in which current Tesla owners are able to sign up as volunteers and help demo the Level 2 semi-autonomous hands-free capability for Tesla's own R&D efforts," it added.

FITCH CUTS INDIA'S GROWTH FORECAST TO 8.5% ON HIGH OIL PRICES, INFLATION

Rating agency Fitch on Tuesday, March 22, slashed India's growth forecast for the next fiscal to 8.5% from 10.3%, citing soaring energy prices and rising inflation on account of the Russia-Ukraine war.

It has revised upwards the GDP growth forecast for the current fiscal by 0.6 percentage points to 8.7%.

"However, we have lowered our growth forecast for FY 2022-2023 to 8.5% (-1.8 pp) on sharply higher energy prices," Fitch said. For 2023-24, it is estimated at 7%.

In its Global Economic Outlook-March 2022, Fitch said the post-Covid pandemic recovery is being hit by a potentially huge global supply shock that will reduce growth and push up inflation.

"The war in Ukraine and economic sanctions on Russia has put global energy supplies at risk. Sanctions seem unlikely to be rescinded any time soon," the agency said.

Last week, another global rating agency Moody's had slashed India's growth estimate for the 2022 calendar year to 9.1% from 9.5% earlier, saying high fuel and fertiliser import bill could limit capital expenditure.

Russia supplies around 10% of the world's energy, including 17% of its natural gas and 12% of oil.

ANZ BECOMES FIRST AUSTRALIAN BANK TO MINT STABLECOIN

Australia and New Zealand Banking Group said on Thursday it carried out an Australian dollar stablecoin payment, in a landmark transaction to become the first Australian lender to mint a digital asset linked to the country's currency.

A stablecoin is a kind of digital asset that is devised to keep its value stable in relation to another asset, and are frequently used as a portal to other cryptocurrencies or to generate income in decentralised financial systems. ANZ said it has delivered the Australian dollar stablecoin, which it calls A\$DC, to a private wealth management firm for digital assets - Victor Smorgan Group - through digital asset investment platform Zerocap.

The company's move to mint digital assets linked to the Australian dollar comes after the Reserve Bank of Australia (RBA) said last year the growth of digital wallets could allow the exchange of tokens or digital forms of money that could be backed by the RBA, even as the central bank remains sceptical of the digital currency.

India crosses \$ 400 bn milestone in exports

NEW DELHI (TIP)

The country's exports for the first time crossed the USD 400 billion mark in a fiscal on healthy performance by sectors such as petroleum products, engineering, gems and jewellery, and chemicals, according to the commerce ministry's data released on Wednesday, March 23.

The merchandise exports rose by 37 per cent to USD 400.8 billion in 2021-22 until March 21 against USD 292 billion in 2020-21. Previously, the outbound shipments had touched a record of USD 330.07 billion in 2018-19.

Imports during the period stood at USD 589 billion, leaving a trade deficit of about USD 189 billion.


Hailing the country's success in achieving its goods export target, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that this is a key milestone in India's 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat' journey.

The highest ever goods export target was achieved nine days ahead of the March 31 deadline.

"India set an ambitious target of USD 400 billion of goods exports and achieves this target for the first time ever. I congratulate our farmers, weavers, MSMEs, manufacturers, exporters for this success. This is a key milestone in our Aatmanirbhar Bharat journey. #LocalGoesGlobal," Modi tweeted.

Briefing media, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said that despite all adversities including Covid-19 pandemic, and Russia-Ukraine war, India has achieved this milestone.

"First time in history, India has crossed USD 400 billion in merchandise



exports if this was a movie like The Kashmir Files, it would be called a Make in India blockbuster," Goyal told reporters here.

He added that closer interaction with states and districts; engagement with exporters; faster resolution of their issues; actively engaging with different export promotion councils, industry associations and other stakeholders have helped in reaching this milestone.

On average, goods worth about USD 33 billion were shipped every month and about USD 1 billion every day.

The key export sectors, which contributed to record healthy growth include petroleum products, engineering, gems and jewellery, chemicals and pharmaceuticals. The top

five export destinations are the US, the UAE, China, Bangladesh, and the Netherlands.

Director General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) Santosh Kumar Sarangi said that going by the trend, "we would be adding USD 10-12 billion in the remaining nine days", taking the exports by end of 2021-22 to over USD 410 billion.

Commenting on the data, Federation of Indian Export Organisations (FIEO) Director General Ajay Sahai said crossing USD 400 billion is a remarkable achievement as exporters have added over USD 110 billion in one year to reach here despite huge logistics challenges, including container shortage, skyrocketing freight and liquidity constraints.

Asian shares struggle, oil edges lower as Ukraine worries linger

BEIJING (TIP)

Asian shares were volatile on Thursday, March 23, and oil prices turned lower as the latest developments in the Ukraine war and more hawkish comments from U.S. Federal Reserve officials left investors uneasy.

MSCI's broadest index of Asia-Pacific shares outside Japan recouped some of its earlier losses to be off 0.34%, on the day, with Chinese stocks leading the declines.

Hong Kong's Hang Seng Index fell 0.3% while the mainland's blue-chip index slid 0.6%.

Japan's Nikkei, however, reversed losses to gain 0.25% and end the session at a nine-week high, buoyed by a retreat in crude oil and buying into the end of Japan's fiscal year this month.

"It is still a relatively volatile market, (which) suggests that these rippling moves in stocks ought to be treated with caution," said Kyle Rodda, an analyst at IG markets.

European markets are set for a stronger open, as indicated by early futures trading. The pan-region Euro Stoxx 50 futures were up 0.29%, German DAX futures rose 0.25% and FTSE futures were up 0.2%.

E-mini futures for the S&P 500 rose 0.4%.

Driving some of the volatility, Federal Reserve policymakers on Wednesday signaled they stood ready to take more aggressive action to bring down runaway inflation, including a possible half-percentage-point interest rate hike at the next policy meeting in May.

March 25

March 25, 1807 - The British Parliament abolished the slave trade following a long campaign against it by Quakers and others.

March 25, 1911 - A raging fire erupted inside a garment factory in New York City killing 123 young women employed as low-paid seamstresses, along with 23 men. The fast-spreading flames engulfed the 8th and 9th floors of the Triangle Shirtwaist Company in lower Manhattan in just a few minutes. About 50 of the victims had jumped to their deaths rather than perish from the flames. The sensational tragedy spurred national interest concerning the rights of mostly-immigrant women workers of the New York garment industry who labored long hours six or seven days a week in cramped, dangerous conditions for about \$5 weekly pay.


March 28



Birthday - Vincent Van Gogh (1853-1890) was born in Groot Zundert, Holland. He was a Postimpressionist painter,







Papmochani Ekadashi Worship

Lord Vishnu is worshiped with full dedication on the day of Papmochani Ekadashi. The person observing the fast should wake up at sunrise and take a bath. A small idol of Lord Vishnu is placed at the place of worship and devotees offer sandalwood paste, sesame seeds, fruits, lamps and incense to the Lord. It is considered auspicious to recite 'Vishnu Sahasranama' and 'Narayan Stotra' on this day.

On the day of Dwadashi, after feeding Brahmins, send them off and then eat food.

Fruits of Worship and Significance of Papmochani Ekadashi Vrat

The importance of Papmochani Ekadashi fast has been described in 'Bhavishyottara Purana' and 'Harivasara Purana'. It is said that Papmochani Vrat liberates one from the effects of all sins. By observing Papmochani Ekadashi fast, learning at Hindu pilgrimage places is more virtuous than donating cows. Those who observe this auspicious fast enjoy all the worldly pleasures and eventually find a place in 'Vaikuntha', the heavenly kingdom of Lord Vishnu.

Ukraine and Russia Closer to Ending War as Understanding Reached in Four Areas: Erdogan

Newsweek said it has contacted the ministries of foreign affairs of both Russia and Ukraine for comment on the peace talks.

Turkey has been in contact with the negotiating teams from the two countries. The NATO member shares a maritime border with Ukraine and Russia in the Black Sea and has a strong relationship with both states. Although it has imposed some sanctions on Moscow since the war started on February 24, it has also offered to mediate the conflict.

Erdogan was speaking at a press conference following the extraordinary summit of NATO leaders on Thursday and Friday.

"We will continue our talks with both Mr. Putin and Mr. Zelensky from now on as well," Erdogan said, according to a statement from his office. "All our efforts aim to create an atmosphere of peace by bringing together the two leaders."

"As is known, there is almost a consensus regarding such issues as NATO, disarmament, collective security and using Russian as official language in the technical infrastructure works during the ongoing process in Belarus," Erdogan added. "However, there is the issue of Crimea and Donbas, which is impossible for Ukraine to consent to."

The Turkish leader called Ukrainian leader Volodymyr Zelensky's move on Monday to declare that Ukrainian compromises with Russia will be decided on by a referendum was "wise leadership."

"Turkey's strong support for Ukraine's territorial integrity and sovereignty since 2014 is known by everyone. We have stated at every opportunity that we never have and never will recognize Crimea's annexation, and we continue to do so," Erdogan said.

"The destruction and humanitarian tragedy caused by the war are evident. The war-torn cities, hospitals, schools and houses that have nearly turned into wrecks, and weeping refugees, who packed all their assets in one suitcase, have all reminded us once again of the bitter face of wars."

Erdogan is due to tell Russian President Vladimir Putin: "Make an honorable exit in Ukraine and become an architect of peace," Soylu reported.

The Turkish president met with U.S. counterpart Joe Biden and other NATO leaders in Brussels on Thursday to discuss further sanctions on Russia and bolstering the alliance's eastern flank. Biden will travel to a Polish town near the border of Ukraine later on Friday to show solidarity and show Western resolve against the Russian invasion. (Source: Newsweek)

Yogi Adityanath takes oath as Uttar Pradesh CM; 52 ministers also sworn in

While the party has retained top OBC leader Keshav Prasad Maurya despite him losing his seat, several big names, including Deputy CM Dinesh Sharma and cabinet ministers Shrikant Sharma and Sidharth Nath Singh, were dropped.

Shrikant Sharma's name is, however, doing the rounds for the post of UP state president. The buzz is that after party president JP Nadda completes his term, some names from UP may figure in the organization headed by the new chief.

PM's close confidante and former bureaucrat AK Sharma has also made it as the UP Cabinet. The inclusion of AK Sharma, an MLC, is an acknowledgement of his handling of the second wave of Covid-19 in Varanasi/Purvanchal region.

Among the new ministers are former Uttarakhand Governor Baby Rani Maurya and Jitin Prasad, Brahmin leader who quit the Congress last year. Former police officer Aseem Arun and Kalyan Singh's grandson Sandeep Singh have been included as ministers of state (independent charge).

Foreign Secretary Shringla calls for alignment between UN, League of Arab States

However, Mr. Shringla's visit to New York amidst the ongoing war in Ukraine has fueled speculation that he would also take part in the discussions at the United Nations about the way forward in the crisis.

At the UNSC meeting on the LAS, Mr. Shringla called for greater policy alignment between the U.N. and the LAS, fostered by regular and frequent consultations. He also suggested comprehensive coordination at the field level and emphasized post-conflict peace building via reconstruction and economic development. Mr. Shringla suggested that all efforts ensure regional stability with a special focus on the welfare of women and minorities.

"Both organizations must take concerted efforts to support the reactivation of the Middle East [West Asia] peace process in line with a two-state solution based on the internationally agreed framework and previous agreements between the parties," Mr. Shringla said. "India welcomes the agreement for normalization of relations between countries in the region, which we believe will contribute to greater peace and stability in the region."

The UAE, along with several other Arab countries, began normalizing its relations with Israel, particularly with the signing of the Abraham Accords - a trilateral agreement among the U.S., the UAE and Israel, signed in 2020, during the administration of (former) U.S. President Donald Trump.

Even as the UNSC meeting was underway on Wednesday, a parallel session of

the UNGA (a resumption of the Emergency Special Session from earlier in March) began. Ukraine introduced a draft resolution, proposed by France and Mexico, "Human Consequences of the Aggression Against Ukraine", which holds Russia responsible for the crisis in Ukraine. Another draft UNGA resolution, sponsored by South Africa, a BRICS member-country, calls for "an immediate cessation of hostilities by all parties in the conflict", without naming Russia.

New Delhi has received a large number of foreign leaders and delegations over the past week, and more are expected to follow, mostly from countries that are part of the sanctions regime against Russia, seeking to shift India's position on the Russia-Ukraine issue. The Modi government has refused to support any resolution at the U.N. bodies that criticizes Russia and has suggested that it is considering a Russian offer of more oil at discounted prices.

Diplomatic sources confirmed that the surge in the number of visitors to Delhi by European and U.S. allies was mainly aimed at trying to ensure that the Modi government shifts its position on the Ukraine issue. NATO and the E.U. countries hope that New Delhi will consider voting in favor of at least one or both of the resolutions on the humanitarian situation before the UNGA.

"A vote in favor of one of the resolutions would be a sign that New Delhi is willing to shift its position," said a diplomat, speaking on the condition of anonymity, adding that if India remains committed to the U.N. charter, territorial sovereignty principles and a need for a stop to the violence, it must also hold Russia to account for "being the aggressor".

A third resolution, sponsored by Russia, is in the works at the UNSC and faces widespread opposition for not referring to its invasion of Ukraine. (Source: The Hindu)

First woman US secretary of state Madeleine Albright dies at 84

died on Wednesday of cancer, her family said.

A lifelong Democrat who nonetheless worked to bring Republicans into her orbit, Albright was chosen in 1996 by President Bill Clinton to be America's top diplomat, elevating her from the US ambassador to the United Nations, where she had been only the second woman to hold that job.

As secretary of the state, Albright was the highest-ranking woman in the history of the US government. She was not in the line of succession to the presidency, however, because she was born in what was then Czechoslovakia. Still, she was universally admired for breaking a glass ceiling, even by her political detractors.

"We have lost a loving mother, grandmother, sister, aunt and friend," her family said in a statement.

President Joe Biden ordered flags at the White House and other federal buildings and grounds to be flown at half-staff until March 27.

Outpourings of condolences came quickly.

Biden said, "America had no more committed champion of democracy and human rights than Secretary Albright, who knew personally and wrote powerfully of the perils of autocracy."

"When I think of Madeleine," Biden added, "I will always remember her fervent faith that America is the indispensable nation."

Secretary of State Antony Blinken said Albright was "a brilliant diplomat, a visionary leader, a courageous trailblazer, a dedicated mentor, and a great and good person who loved the US deeply and devoted her life to serving it."

Clinton called her "one of the finest Secretaries of State, an outstanding UN Ambassador, a brilliant professor, and an extraordinary human being."

"And through it all," Clinton added, "even until our last conversation just two weeks ago, she never lost her great sense of humor or her determination to go out with her boots on, supporting Ukraine in its fight to preserve freedom and democracy."

Former President George W. Bush said Albright "lived out the American dream and helped others realize it...She served with distinction as a foreign-born foreign minister who understood firsthand the importance of free societies for peace in our world."

Linda Thomas-Greenfield, US envoy to the United Nations, honored Albright as a "trailblazer and a luminary" in remarks on the General Assembly floor.

In 2012, President Barack Obama awarded Albright the Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest civilian honor, saying her life was an inspiration to all Americans.

Albright remained outspoken through the years. After leaving office, she criticized Bush for using "the shock of force" rather than alliances to foster diplomacy and said Bush had driven away moderate Arab leaders and created potential for a dangerous rift with European allies.

As a refugee from Czechoslovakia who saw the horrors of both Nazi Germany and the Iron Curtain, she was not a dove and played a leading role in pressing for the Clinton administration to get militarily involved in the conflict in Kosovo.

She also took a hard line on Cuba, famously saying at the United Nations that the Cuban shootdown of a civilian plane was not "cojones" but rather "cowardice".

Albright advised women "to act in a more confident manner" and "to ask questions when they occur and don't wait to ask".

"It took me quite a long time to develop a voice, and now that I have it, I am not going to be silent," she told HuffPost Living in 2010.



WOMEN'S TENNIS: WORLD NO.1 ASH BARTY ANNOUNCES SHOCK RETIREMENT

The world's top women's tennis player Ashleigh Barty has stunned the sport by announcing her early retirement at the age of just 25.

"Today is difficult and filled with emotion for me as I announce my retirement from tennis," she said in a video posted on Instagram.

The Australian leaves the sport less than two months after becoming the country's first home-grown Australian Open champion in 44 years, and winning a Grand Slam tournament on three different surfaces.

Barty has won 15 titles, including Wimbledon, played on grass, and the French Open, played on clay.

"I know how much work it takes to bring the best out of yourself ... I don't have that in me any more," she said in the video.

"I don't have the physical drive, the emotional want and everything it takes to challenge yourself at the very top level any more. I am spent."

Barty previously walked away from the game as a teenager in late 2014 after becoming disaffected by the Tour.

ITALY FAIL TO QUALIFY FOR 2022 FIFA WC AFTER SHOCK LOSS TO NORTH MACEDONIA

Italy has gone from winning the European Championship to failing to qualify for the World Cup in just eight months.

In a rapid and stunning fall from grace, the Azzurri were upset by North Macedonia in a 1-0 loss that headlined a night of drama in the European qualifying playoffs on Thursday.

Italy will miss out on back-to-back World Cups for the first time in the national team's storied history, having also failed to get to the tournament in 2018.

It was only in July that Roberto Mancini and his players were celebrating winning Euro 2020 at Wembley Stadium, supposedly completing Italian soccer's redemption story.

On Thursday, there were tears of a different kind, and a general feeling of disbelief inside the Stadio Renzo Barbera in Palermo.

"Just as last July was the best thing I experienced at a professional level, this is the greatest disappointment," Mancini said. "Soccer is like that, sometimes incredible things happen."

IPL 2022: MS Dhoni passes CSK baton to Ravindra Jadeja

MUMBAI (TIP)

Twelve seasons, four title triumphs and five runner-up finishes later, the iconic Mahendra Singh Dhoni has decided to hand over the captaincy of Chennai Super Kings to his trusted lieutenant Ravindra Jadeja.

But the 40-year-old will continue to represent the franchise for the "season and beyond", having led one of the most successful IPL sides since the tournament's inception in 2008, barring the two seasons when the team was suspended in the wake of the spot-fixing scandal.

"MS Dhoni has decided to hand over the leadership of Chennai Super Kings and picked Ravindra Jadeja to lead the team. Jadeja, who has been an integral part of Chennai Super Kings since 2012, will only be the third player to lead CSK," said CSK in a statement, adding: "Dhoni will continue to represent Chennai Super Kings this season and beyond."

Dhoni, who will turn 41 in July, had announced his international retirement on August 15, 2020 and yet led CSK to their fourth title last season. CSK play KKR in the first match of IPL-15 here on Saturday.

Feeling good: Jadeja

"Feeling good but at the same time I need to fill in big boots," said Jadeja in a video shared by CSK on Twitter. "Like Mahi bhai has already set a big legacy and we need to carry it forward, so hopefully I will. And I don't need to worry too much because he's here and whatever question I need to ask, I'll definitely go to him. He was my go-to person and he still is today, so I'm not worried too much."

India's World Cup-winning captain

Dhoni has always been his own man when it comes to leaving captaincy or announcing his retirement.

He quit Test captaincy and also the five-day game in the middle of a series in Australia in 2014. And when he was sure Virat Kohli was ready to lead India across formats, Dhoni made the way for him in 2017. Though the inspirational leader carried on to play the IPL after announcing his international retirement in his inimitable style, his decision to hand over the CSK leadership to Jadeja was not entirely surprising.

The 33-year-old Jadeja, who is at the peak of his prowess, is ready for the challenge. The southpaw was CSK's first retention before the auction ahead of Dhoni, Moeen Ali and Ruturaj Gaikwad.

The announcement still took CSK CEO Kasi Viswanathan by surprise, but said: "Whatever decision MS takes it is in the best interest of the team."

It can be safely said that CSK couldn't have become the brand it became without the charismatic Dhoni, who developed a special bond with the team and its fanatical fans.

Hockey Pro League: India to open campaign against New Zealand in new format for 2022-23

BHUBANESWAR, (TIP)

The International Hockey Federation (FIH) on Thursday, March 22, released the new schedule for the fourth edition of FIH Pro League as per which India will take on New Zealand in the opener at home in October 2022.

India will host the first set of matches with the men's team starting its campaign against New Zealand on October 28 and Spain on October 30. They will play their return leg matches against New Zealand and Spain on October 4 and 6, respectively. Both the visitors New Zealand and Spain will also play a double-header against each other on October 29 and November 5.

As per the new format, the schedule will be divided into a series of date blocks, agreed by all parties, to assist with international and domestic competition planning, within which "mini-tournaments" will be played where several teams will gather in one venue to play two matches against each other.

This move will have a major positive impact on players' welfare and the environment, thanks to a substantial reduction in the amount of travel needed for each team and the officials. Another great advantage of this revised format is that it increases the number of dates available for athletes to compete in their domestic leagues and club competitions, the FIH



informed in a release on Thursday.

For the first season with this new schedule, matches will be hosted in the following seven nations -- Australia, Argentina, Belgium, England, India, the Netherlands and New Zealand. The matches will be held between October 28, 2022, to July 5, 2023.




