WASHINGTON, D.C. (TIP): President Joe Biden sounded an alarm about what he views as extremist threats to the nation's democracy from the restive forces of Trumpism

President Joe Biden sounded an alarm on Thursday, September 1 night about what he views as extremist threats to American democracy from the restive forces of Trumpism. He's aiming to reframe the November elections as part of an unceasing battle for the "soul of the nation."

Nearly two years after he defeated Donald Trump, it's a reprise of Biden's 2020 campaign theme, casting the midterm election stakes in as dire terms as those that sent him to the Oval Office. His prime-time speech at Independence Hall in Philadelphia is laying out what he sees as the risks from those he has dubbed "ultra-MAGA Republicans" to the nation's system of government, its standing abroad and its citizens' way of life.

The explicit effort by Biden to marginalize Trump and his "Make America Great Again" adherents mark a sharp turn for the president, who preached his desire to bring about national unity in his Inaugural address. White House officials said it reflects his mounting concern about Trump allies' ideological proposals and relentless denial of the nation's 2020 election results.

Congress conundrum: On announcement of poll schedule

The organizational polls must stir its workers to life if the party is to survive

Amid turmoil and uncertainty, the Congress has announced the schedule for the election of a new president. Senior leaders are revolting, the party's incumbent president Sonia Gandhi is battling ill health, and her son Rahul Gandhi is unwilling to take on the mantle. The party will be electing a president on October 17, as per the schedule endorsed by the Congress Working Committee. The Congress is also planning a march - nearly 3,500 kilometers across 12 States and two Union Territories over 150 days, billed as the Bharat Jodo Yatra, or Unite India march - to be led by Mr. Gandhi whose future role in the party remains vague. The party has also called a rally in Delhi on September 4 against price rise. To be fair, the Gandhi family finds itself in a spot - it will be ridiculed if one of them ends up as president, and if none of them is at the helm, new dynamics with unpredictable consequences could be triggered in the party. If the Gandhis are seen as backing a particular horse in the

race, that will cast a shadow over the entire election process. All told, the best course for the party and the family is to facilitate an election process that is as fair as possible and use it as an opportunity to open an honest conversation on revamping the party. The party is in decline, and the old strategy of waiting out the periods out of power will not work this time. It is at a crossroads or a dead end, depending on what the Congress decides to do now.

Some pointers to what ails the Congress can be found in the resignation letter written by Ghulam Nabi Azad, who was a key figure in the party for decades. The lack of grace and gratitude stands out in the letter, but Mr. Azad's career itself is proof of the validity of the charges that he makes against the party. With little popularity and no accountability, he remained a key decision maker in the party, became Union Minister for several terms, the Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir once, and a member of Rajya

Sabha for five terms, totaling 30 years. Only 11 people have had such a long innings in the Rajya Sabha. When he says that the party is being run by a coterie, he surely knows what he is talking about. In fact, rootless managers who masqueraded as leaders ensured that mass leaders were humiliated and driven out of the party. The list of such people who could not remain in the Congress is long - from Mamata Banerjee to Sharad Pawar to Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy. The capture of the Congress party by a self-serving cabal had begun long before Mr. Gandhi came on the scene. No other party allows people who are incapable of mobilizing the masses and winning elections to flourish like the Congress does. The organizational election must stir ordinary party workers and grassroot leaders to claim the party for themselves and show power brokers their place.

China in the dock: UN report establishes crimes against Uyghurs

The long-awaited United Nations report that accuses Beijing of serious human rights violations in its mass detention of Uyghurs and other predominantly Muslim groups in the far-western region of Xinjiang is a powerful indictment of the suppression of ethnic minorities. While it chips away at China's insistence of being a responsible member on the world stage, the embarrassment caused by the damning findings may not lead to any alteration of policy. China has already upped the ante by calling itself a victim of a smear campaign led by the West, and the likelihood of any concrete change would depend on the appetite of the global community to seek accountability. Given

the indifferent response and curious silence over the years of even Muslim nations, including Pakistan, on the targeting of Uyghurs, any credible action on that front, too, looks remote.

The significance of the report - published after repeated delays attributed to China's pushback tactics and denial of any ground access - lies in the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights officially recognizing that horrific crimes are occurring. The recommendation of releasing individuals who have been arbitrarily deprived of their liberty on the pretext of containing terrorism and radicalism would, in all probability, go unheeded. However, the rights groups see the report

as a wake-up call for international action. China has summarily dismissed the findings but can no longer deny the existence of extrajudicial camps.

Any move toward further investigation, as called for in the report, would need approval from UN member states in a body where China holds considerable sway. Throughout the past four years, there has been a deadlock on agreeing to any formal call for a more detailed investigation into the crimes against humanity. This has heightened the importance of the report, the release of which presents a challenge to Beijing. The whole truth may not be out, but the lies have been thoroughly exposed.

FIA creates History ; Enters Guinness Book of World Records

Earlier in the day, FIA created history by entering 2 Guinness World Records for the number of different flags flown simultaneously and the largest ensemble of

Damru (ancient musical instrument associated with Hinduism and Buddhism).

Indian American Maryland University professor built 'surveillance machine' for Chinese big tech

WASHINGTON, D.C. (TIP): An Indian American professor at University of Maryland (UMD) allegedly built a machine-learning software "useful for surveillance" as part of a six-figure research grant from Chinese tech giant Alibaba, according to a media report.

Alibaba provided \$125,000 in funding to a research team led by Dinesh Manocha, a professor of computer science at UMD College Park, to develop an urban surveillance software.

The software can "classify the personality of each pedestrian and identify other biometric features," the news site said citing research grant documents obtained by it via public records request. "These capabilities will be used to predict the behavior of each pedestrian and are useful for surveillance," the document read.

Manocha is a decorated scholar in the AI and robotics field who has earned awards and accolades from Google, IBM, and many others the report noted.

He was paid \$355,000 in salaries in 2021, it said citing government watchdog Open the Books. The US military also signed a \$68 million agreement with Manocha's lab to research military applications of AI technologies.

In January 2018, the University of Maryland and Alibaba signed an 18-month research contract funding Manocha's research team.

In the grant document obtained by The Daily Beast, Manocha's team pledged to "work closely with Alibaba researchers" to develop an urban surveillance software that can identify pedestrians based on their unique gait signatures.

The algorithm would then use the gait signatures to

classify pedestrians as "aggressive," "shy," "impulsive," and other personalities. The grant required UMD researchers to test the algorithm on videos provided by Alibaba and present their findings in person at Alibaba labs in China.

The scholars also had to provide the C++ codebase for the software and the raw dataset as deliverables to Alibaba.

The software's "clear implication is to proactively predict demonstrations and protests so that they might be quelled," Ryan Fedasiuk, an associate fellow at the Center for New American Security, said in a correspondence to media.

"The bottom line is that Alibaba financed US academic research that was tailor-made for China's surveillance state," he was quoted as saying.

UMD declined to comment on The Daily Beast story. Manocha also did not reply to multiple requests for

comments, it said.

In January 2019-back when the Alibaba grant was still active-Manocha secured a \$321,000 Defense Department grant for his research team, according to the report.

The two grants funded very similar research projects. The Alibaba award was titled "large-scale behavioral learning for dense crowds," it said. Meanwhile, the DoD grant funded research into "efficient computational models for simulating large-scale heterogeneous crowds."

Unsurprisingly, the research outputs produced by the two grants had significant overlap. Between 2019 and 2021, Manocha published multiple articles in the AI and machine-learning field that cited both the Alibaba and DoD grant.

There is no evidence that Manocha broke the law by double-dipping from US and Chinese funding sources to fund similar research projects, the report acknowledged.

Nevertheless, the case still raises "serious questions about ethics in machine learning research," Fedasiuk said. Manocha's ties to China extend beyond his work with Alibaba. Between 2014 and 2016, the professor worked as a Thousand Talents Scholar, a Chinese program considered a national security threat by the US government. In 2018, Baidu, another Chinese tech giant, brought on Manocha as a senior consultant for its research arm.

The professor has continued to work with Chinese counterparts even after the Alibaba grant expired in June 2019, co-writing a paper with Chinese academics affiliated with the Chinese military-industrial complex in 2020, according to the report.

Indian American Wayfair CEO Niraj Shah lays off 870 people

NEW YORK (TIP): E-commerce company Wayfair CEO Niraj Shah has fired 870 people, or 5 per cent of the company's global workforce, as the growth he anticipated has not materialized this year. In a memo, Shah said that the US-based company was "seeing the tailwinds of the pandemic accelerate the adoption of ecommerce shopping, and I personally pushed hard to hire a strong team to support that growth."

"This year, that growth has not materialized as we had anticipated. Our team is too large for the environment we are now in, and unfortunately, we need to adjust," he wrote.

In a filing with the US Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) late on Friday, the online furniture provider said that on August 19, 2022, "Wayfair announced a workforce reduction involving approximately 870 employees in connection with its previously announced plans to manage operating expenses and realign investment priorities".

NEW YORK (TIP): A leading Indian American neurosurgeon Dr. Anil Nanda has returned to Rutgers University after an investigation by an outside law firm found insufficient evidence to prove allegations of 'ghost surgeries.'

He was placed on paid administrative leave last November in the wake of so-called "ghost surgery" allegations that he was not present during critical portions of two medical procedures he had scheduled, a newspaper reported.

At the same time, though, that investigation raised questions about the length of time that Nanda had actually been in the operating room, and whether his actions made it appear that "he was not prioritizing his patients."

The investigative report commissioned by Rutgers was released by the university on Aug 16. But it declined comment beyond a statement citing a threatened lawsuit, the newspaper said.

Hailing from Buttaran village near Bhogpur here, he has created a history abroad as in Canada, no one can even get a driving license at this age. The report has brought excitement across the entire Punjabi diaspora there.

Japgobind Singh reportedly started his pilot training in British Columbia and after training in Alberta and Ontario, his final training was completed in Quebec.

His father Gurlal Singh is the former general secretary of the Punjabi Press Club of BC and is now a resident of Ottawa. He had moved to Canada about 20 years ago. Gurlal's younger brother Hardial Singh Buttar is a farm activist here.

Japgobind's paternal aunt Charanjit Kaur Buttar said that Japgobind had been an all-rounder since childhood. "He has been doing good in academics and competing in science and mathematics competitions. He did his graduation from St. Michael's High School. He also had an offer of scholarship in Aero Space Engineering by the University of Ottawa."

She said, "Japgobind's mother Rajinder Kaur ensured that her son remained attached with Punjabi culture and Sikh traditions. So, he learnt gatka, kirtan and tabla. Besides, he was in the school soccer team." But now with his new achievement, the teenager has made everyone in Canada and back home proud of him.

Indian Americans in key positions in Biden administration number over 130

WASHINGTON, D.C. (TIP): US President Joe Biden has appointed more than 130 Indian Americans to key positions in his administration so far, the best representation from the community that makes up around one per cent of the American population.

In doing so he has not only fulfilled his promise to the community that he had made as a presidential candidate in 2020, but also shattered the record of his predecessor Donald Trump who had appointed more than 80 Indian-Americans and his previous boss Barack Obama, who had appointed over 60 Indian-Americans to key positions during his eight years of presidency.

More than 40 Indian-Americans have been elected at various state and federal levels including four in the US House of Representatives. Not to miss the more than 20 Indian-Americans leading top US companies.

While the first-ever presidential appointment was done during the time of Ronald Reagan, this time Biden has appointed Indian-Americans to almost all departments and agencies of his administration.

"Indian-Americans have been imbued with the sense of seva (service) and this is reflected in their enthusiasm to pursue positions in public service instead of the private sector," Silicon Valley-based entrepreneur, philanthropist and venture capitalist MR Rangaswami told the media.

"The Biden administration has now

appointed or nominated the largest group to date and needless to say we are proud of our people and their accomplishments for the United States," Rangaswami said.

Rangaswami is founder and head of Indiaspora, a US-based global organization for Indian-origin leaders. Indiaspora keeps a track of Indian-origin leaders.

Biden, who has maintained a close relationship with the community since his Senator days, often jokes around about his Indian relationship. He made history in 2020 by selecting Indian-origin Kamala Harris as his running mate.

The list of Indian-Americans in the White House as compiled by Indiaspora reflects that there would be only a few meetings inside the White House or in Biden's Oval Office that would not have an Indian-American presence.

His speech writer is Vinay Reddy,

while his main advisor on covid-19 is Dr Ashish Jha, his advisor on climate policy is Sonia Aggarwal, special assistant on criminal justice is Chiraag Bains, Kiran Ahuja heads the Office of Personnel Management, Neera Tanden is his senior advisor, and Rahul Gupta is his drug czar.

Two weeks ago, when India's Ambassador to the US, Tarunjit Singh Sandhu, hosted a reception at India House on the occasion of Independence Day, Indian-Americans from his administration were representing almost all major branches of the US government.

Young Vedant Patel is now the Deputy Spokesperson at the Department of State, while Garima Verma is the Digital Director in the Office of the First Lady. Biden has also nominated several Indian-Americans to key ambassadorial positions.

According to the list prepared by Indiaspora, more than 40 Indian-Americans have been elected to various offices across the country. Four are in the House of Representatives -- Dr Ami Bera, Ro Khanna, Raja Krishnamoorthi and Pramila Jayapal. This includes four mayors.

Led by Indian-Americans Sunder Pichai of Google and Satya Nadella of Microsoft, there are over two dozen Indian-Americans heading US companies. These include Shantanu Narayen of Adobe, Vivek Lall of General Atomics, Punit Renjen of Deloitte and Raj Subramaniam of FedEx.

WASHINGTON, D.C. (TIP): US President Joe Biden has announced his intent to appoint Indian-Americans Manu Asthana and Madhu Beriwal to his National Infrastructure Advisory Council.

The President's National Infrastructure Advisory Council (NIAC) advises the White House on how to reduce physical and cyber risks and improve security and resilience of the nation's critical infrastructure sectors.

The 26 individuals announced Wednesday to the NIAC are leading senior executives with deep experience across a broad range of sectors, including banking and finance, transportation, energy, water, dams, defense, communications, information technology, healthcare services, food and agriculture, government facilities, emergency services, and higher education.

Asthana oversees the largest power grid in North America and one of the largest electricity markets in the world as the CEO and president of PJM.

"Under his leadership, PJM has established a clear path for defining the grid operator's role in the transition to a cleaner, more efficient grid while maintaining reliable electric service," the White House said.

Asthana has extensive leadership experience in the energy industry in the areas of power generation operations, optimization and dispatch, competitive retail electricity, electricity and natural gas trading, and risk management. He is a member of the Electricity Subsector Coordinating Council and serves on the Board of Trustees of Texas Children's Hospital, the White House added.

"He also serves on the Board of Directors of the Chamber of Commerce for Greater Philadelphia. Asthana earned a Bachelor of Science in economics from The Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania, where he was a Benjamin Franklin Scholar and a Joseph Wharton Scholar," it said.

Indian American teenager invents software tool to spot elephant poachers

NEW YORK (TIP): An Indian American teenager has invented a low-cost tool to spot elephant poachers with machine-learning-driven software that analyzes movement patterns in thermal infrared videos of humans and elephants.

Anika Puri, the 17-year-old wildlife lover, from Chappaqua, New York, thought of doing something when during a visit to India with her family four years ago, she came across a market in Mumbai filled with rows of ivory jewelry and statues.

Globally, ivory trade has been illegal for more than 30 years, and elephant hunting has been prohibited in India since the 1970s.

"I was quite taken aback," Puri told media. "Because I always thought, 'well, poaching is illegal, how come it really is still such a big issue?'"

Curious, Puri did some research and discovered a shocking statistic: Africa's Forest elephant population had declined by about 62 percent between 2002 and

2011. Years later, the numbers continue to drop.

Drones are currently used to detect and capture images of poachers, and they aren't that accurate, Puri explains.

But after watching videos of elephants and humans, she saw how the two differed vastly in the way they move--their speed, their turning patterns and other motions, the report wrote.

"I realized that we could use this disparity between these two movement patterns in order to actually increase the detection accuracy of potential

poachers," she was quoted as saying.

Over the course of two years, Puri created ElSa (short for elephant savior), a low-cost prototype of a machine-learning-driven software that analyzes movement patterns in thermal infrared videos of humans and elephants.

Puri told the Smithsonian the software is four times more accurate than existing state-of-the-art detection methods. It also eliminates the need for expensive high-resolution thermal cameras, which can cost in the thousands, she says.

ElSa uses a \$250 FLIR ONE Pro thermal camera with 206x156 pixel resolution that plugs into an off-the-shelf iPhone 6. The camera and iPhone are then attached to a drone, and the system produces real-time inferences as it flies over parks as to whether objects below are human or elephant.

Puri submitted her project to this year's Regeneron International Science and Engineering Fair, the world's largest international pre-college STEM competition.

Governor Hochul announces \$6.5 million to support Insurance innovation for climate technology solutions

SEPTEMBER 1, 2022

NEW YORK (TIP): Governor Kathy Hochul, on September 1, announced \$6.5 million to support Insurance Innovation for Climate-Technology Solutions, a new program focused on the research and development of new insurance policies and products that will promote the adoption of clean technologies across New York State. The program will provide funding for products that manage the financial risk associated with climate change, supporting the State's nation-leading Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act goal of reducing carbon emissions 85 percent by 2050.

"New York State is leaving no stone unturned in our fight against climate change, and that includes investing in industries that will develop and advance clean, green technologies," Governor Hochul said. "By promoting innovative policies that will create more sustainable climate technology, we are taking bold action to meet the challenges of climate change. My administration remains laser focused on supporting key initiatives that will benefit both businesses and consumers while contributing to our State's nation-leading climate efforts."

The New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) will select a program administrator to develop this new initiative, manage operations, leverage industry expertise, and boost research and development to establish new risk models. The program administrator will also select innovative insurance ideas, products, and services, such as insurance for residential and commercial renewable energy projects, that will develop new business models to enable future climate technology

solutions. The program administrator will be awarded up to \$1.5 million to work with Managing General Underwriters (MGUs) and Managing General Agents (MGAs) that can research, develop, and test new insurance products, and it will award up to \$5 million in competitive grants which are anticipated to be announced in 2023.

New York State Energy Research and Development Authority President and CEO Doreen M. Harris said, "Addressing the financial risks from climate change through the research, development and advancement of insurance innovation for clean, efficient technologies is a win-win for New York businesses and consumers alike. The availability of this important R&D funding will ultimately support new business models that seek to overcome barriers for bringing new products to

market and build on Governor Hochul's all-encompassing approach to achieving a carbon-neutral economy by mid-century."

NYSERDA will accept applications from qualified organizations through October 12, 2022 and competitively select a program administrator. Applicants should demonstrate economic benefits and implementation in the State of New York. A scoring committee will evaluate all proposals based on the published criteria. Each applicant must show how they can promote the research and development needed to bring new insurance products and services to market to meet the State's climate and clean energy goals. This includes soliciting new insurance ideas, managing the development and growth of the program, and reducing risk for climate technology solutions and services.

State Senator Kevin Parker said, "Though many may fail to realize the price tag on climate change, the occurrence of floods, droughts, wildfires and hurricanes, which are amplified because of it, cost our country trillions of dollars. When Hurricane Sandy slammed New York, roughly 8 billion dollars of damage resulted due to human-caused sea level rise. The cost of climate change is further exacerbated by the lack of adequate preparedness for extreme weather patterns which have now become more common than rare. Investments such as this- NYSERDA's \$6.5 Million into the management of financial risks associated with Climate-are necessities. I commend NYSERDA for taking action and helping develop insurance policies AND the technology to insure against climate change risk."

Long Island faces severe drought

Dry summer has made drought conditions worse across the Island

LONG ISLAND, NY (TIP): Drought conditions in New York keep getting worse, and now all of Long Island has been classified as being in a severe drought, according to new data released Thursday, September 1.

Last week, the entire South Shore was classified as being in a severe drought. But the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), which tracks drought conditions across the country, has upgraded the entire Island to severe drought status. Over the past month, data from the NOAA shows that New York has gone from 47.5 percent of the state being abnormally dry to 76.1 percent. More than 6 percent of the state is now in a severe drought - Long Island, New York City and parts of the Hudson Valley. The NOAA says that 14.5 million people in the state are now affected by drought conditions.

According to the NOAA, July 2022 was the 16th driest July on record for Nassau County, and the 6th driest for Suffolk. The records go back 128 years.

Below-average rainfall has led to less groundwater available. Groundwater levels have been declining for the past few months, and the shortage of rain means they are not likely to improve in the immediate future.

The National Weather Service outlook for the remainder of the summer predicts above-normal temperatures and below-normal precipitation. The NOAA predicts that drought conditions may worsen for Long Island in the next month.



Droughts can cause many different problems for the area. Drier ground means that wildfires can be more likely and can spread more easily. It can also affect the crops of farmers in Suffolk County, and can negatively impact air quality.

The Suffolk County Water Authority has been pleading with residents on the East End to use less water. On Aug. 1, the water authority declared a Stage 1 water emergency alert due to the prolonged hot and dry weather in the towns of Southampton, Southold, East Hampton, and Shelter Island.

During the water emergency, residents there must restrict their water usage. That includes reducing shower times and when lawns are watered, and stopping non-essential water usage. But residents on the East End of the Island have largely ignored the restrictions.

Ignoring water restrictions could lead to emergencies, like firefighters not having enough water to battle a blaze. And with drier conditions, fires are more likely.

THE STATE IS ENCOURAGING HOMEOWNERS TO TAKE SOME STEPS TO HELP CONSERVE WATER:

- Water lawns only when necessary, choose watering methods that avoid waste, and water in the early morning to reduce evaporation and maximize soil hydration
- Reuse water collected in rain barrels, dehumidifiers or air conditioners to water plants
- Raise lawn mower cutting heights. Longer grass is healthier with stronger roots and needs less water
- Use a broom, not a hose, to clean driveways and sidewalks
- Fix leaking pipes, hoses, and faucets



The birth anniversary of Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan, the first vice president of India who was also a teacher and philosopher, is celebrated as Teachers' Day in India.

5th September is celebrated as Teachers' Day in India, meant to celebrate the bond shared by the students and the teachers or mentors. It is celebrated every year on fifth September. On this day students express their gratitude towards the teachers for fruitful learning and make them feel very special. It marks the birth anniversary of Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan, the first vice president of India who was also a teacher and philosopher. Not many know why we celebrate Teachers' Day.

When Dr. Radhakrishnan was appointed as the second president of India in 1962, the students wanted to celebrate his birthday as a special day and asked for his permission. However, he stated that the day should be celebrated as a teacher's day honoring their contribution towards educating the society. Since then, 5th September has been celebrated as teachers' day all across the country.

The first vice president of India, Bharat Ratna recipient, and highly respected teacher-philosopher, Dr. Radhakrishnan was born on September 5, 1888. He also went on to become the second president of India. Talking about his early life, Radhakrishnan was an incredible student and became teacher extraordinaire. He dedicated his life to educating children. He had his own unique way of teaching and was a favorite among students during his teaching career. He was Vice Chancellor of Andhra University and Benares Hindu University where he preached his beliefs about education. He also inspired numerous students as well as teachers with his beliefs. One of the greatest sayings of Radhakrishnan is "true teachers are those who help us think for ourselves".

My mentor, Dr. Rollin Arthur Burn, a famous ophthalmologist in London used to say "there are three solutions for every problem. First is education; second is education and third is

education."

How is teachers' day celebrated today? Teachers' day is celebrated widely in schools, colleges, and universities where students put up programs for the teachers to pay respect to them. The programs include dance, singing, dramas, and recitation to name a few. To make the day more special students also give gifts to the teachers.

For Dr. Radhakrishnan everything: psychology, epistemology, metaphysics, ethics, education, politics, economics, science, and religion converges and culminates in spirit. He was a philosopher by temperament, teacher by vocation, a statesman by choice, an administrator by discipline and he had demonstrated that versatile potentiality of the human mind suffused with the spirit of service.

Among the many outstanding books written by Dr. Radhakrishnan, the book titled, "Eastern Religions and Western Thought" stands out. He devoted a chapter in this book, called the meeting of the religions. He says that different religions have come together.

And if they are not to continue in a state of conflict or competition, they must develop a spirit of comprehension which will break down prejudice and misunderstanding and bind them together as varied expressions of a single truth such a spirit characterizes the development of Hinduism which has not been interrupted for nearly 50 centuries or more.

It is truly significant that he had been able to offer masterly interpretation of the philosophy of Tagore and the ideology of Mahatma Gandhi, even as he had given a lucid exposition of gospel of action enshrined in the Bhagavat Gita, and the doctrine of nonviolence preached by Gautama Buddha.

There was a time when Indian

philosophy and literature were looked down upon by the West. McCauley, an English historian had this to say in his minute on Indian education. "It is, I believe no exaggeration to say that all the historical information which has been collected from all the books written in Sanskrit language is less valuable than what may be found in the most paltry abridgement used at preparatory schools in England." But Dr. Radhakrishnan successfully demolished the profound ignorance of the West. He said "there are narrow minded people all over the world who think that their religion is the greatest and other people should accept. That has not been the tradition of this country. Our culture has spread in different directions in the east and west." After Swami Vivekananda, his concern was to present to the West the richness of the eastern thought. It is not an uncommon saying that Indian philosophy begins where western philosophy ends. It is true from his works that East is East, and West is West; but it cannot be denied that East plus West is the best.

Plato's concept of "philosophy king" and the Indian idea of "Rajarishi" have a striking similarity. This idea was realized in Marcus Aurelius, Janaka, Ashoka and Akbar. In modern times, Dr Radhakrishnan exemplified this concept when he was elected President of India in 1962. In 1964 the Pope conferred with Dr. Radhakrishnan in Mumbai the decoration of one of the chiefs of golden army of angels. He passed away in 1975. Dr. Radhakrishnan started as a teacher and spent almost all of his life as a teacher.

In Dr. Radhakrishnan's life there is a message of fulfillment. His journey from a village was neither easy nor fast but it was accomplished by sheer ability and faith. There is an extraordinary reassuring message of self-confidence and determination. He said "all that we have to do is to develop the solidarity about country. That is very essential." How 'being in news' is an advantage to Trump

"THESE DEVELOPMENTS HAVE COME AS AN UNEXPECTED BONANZA, ALLOWING TRUMP TO DOMINATE THE 'SCREEN NEAR YOU.' IF TRUMP IS INDICTED, THE CONGRESSIONAL 'REFERRED' TO THE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT WOULD ALLOW HIM TO LINGER ON THE 'SCREEN', MAKING THE ATTORNEY-GENERAL'S POSITION UNCOMFORTABLE AS HE IS EXPECTED TO BE NON-PARTISAN. ALSO, THE LONG PROCESS, INCLUDING 'ARRAIGNMENT, PLEADING, PRETRIAL MOTIONS AND TRIAL', COULD BE AS 'BIG A NEWS STORY AS A PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION' AND MIGHT DRAG ON."

As the November 2022 mid-term elections are approaching, there is a growing fear in America that the FBI's search of 'Mar-a-Lago' ('sea to lake', in Spanish), former President Donald Trump's residence, on August 8 might be to the Republican Party's political advantage. The US National Public Radio (NPR) has said that it would result in Trump looming all over the USA like "Thanksgiving's pumpkins."

This, together with the US House Select Committee's public hearings to investigate into the violent attack on the Capitol on January 6, 2021, might help Trump keep the "pot boiling." Along with the New York probe into his tax statements, these developments might "define the ambience" during the November elections when 435 seats in the House and 35 seats in the Senate will go for polling.

Currently, the Democrats have only a narrow majority - 220-211 - even in the House of Representatives. In the Senate, it is 50-50. Democrats have only 48, supported by two independents against 50 of the Republicans. This wafer-thin majority is with the help of Democrat Chairman Vice-President Kamala Harris.

Admittedly, Trump was legally culpable in carting away to his Florida home 'Mar-a-Lago' many confidential documents, including those related to some of the most secret intelligence operations.

However, Trump was an unconventional President. He did not feel the need to follow any settled constitutional procedures or conventions.

In a 2018 Twitter post, he had reportedly claimed that he had the right to pardon himself under Article II of the US Constitution. He had seriously thought of issuing pardon to himself and his family after the Capitol Hill riots on January 6, 2021. After the National Archives found that the papers were confidential, his lawyers said that as President, he had the "privilege" to keep such papers.

Certain other factors have helped Trump to claim "victimhood" and cry "political vendetta." The August 8 FBI "search" was unprecedented in US history. This was the first time a former US President's residence was searched. It was also the first time that the US Justice Department (DOJ), which supervises the FBI, was undertaking such a search in its 152-year history. That

helped Trump to say that it was an "assault" which "could only take place in broken Third World countries."

Soon after the "raid", Republican Party leaders alleged political witch-hunt. They said that the DOJ was being "weaponized" to prevent Trump from running for President in 2024. They warned Biden appointee Attorney-General Merrick B Garland of "payback" if they gained majority in the Congress in the November 2022 elections. "Attorney-General Garland, preserve your documents and clear your calendar," they said.

Resembling our Opposition-ruled states' derecognition of the CBI's investigation in their states, a Florida State Republican legislator, Anthony Sabatini, urged his State Assembly to call an emergency session to legally derecognize the jurisdiction of the DOJ and arrest the FBI agents who were operating in their state.


These incidents have emboldened Trump supporters to wrest leadership of the Republican Party from dissidents and turn him into an election mascot. In February, the Republican National Convention (RNC) had overwhelmingly censured Representatives Liz Cheney of Wyoming and Adam Kinzinger of Illinois for "crossing the line" by joining the US House Select Committee which is conducting public hearings on the January 6 incidents.

On August 16, Liz Cheney was defeated in her Wyoming Republican primary. Trump gleefully said that it was a "wonderful result for America, and a complete rebuke of the Unselect Committee of political Hacks and Thugs." The NPR said that more than 120 Republicans, who had supported Trump's statement that he was "cheated" during the 2020 Presidential elections, had won the Republican primaries for different offices and would be contesting for different positions.

These developments have come as an unexpected bonanza, allowing Trump to dominate the "screen near you." If Trump is indicted, the Congressional "referral" to the Justice Department would allow him to linger on the "screen", making the position of Attorney-General Merrick B Garland uncomfortable as he is expected to be non-partisan under the 1789 Judiciary Act.

Also, the long process, including "arraignment,

Dr Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan: A portrait of a teacher par excellence

Teachers' Day in India is celebrated on September 5 on the birth anniversary of former President Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan

Teachers' Day in India is celebrated on 5th September to commemorate the birth anniversary of Dr Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan. He was a renowned scholar, recipient of Bharat Ratna, first Vice-President, and second President of independent India. He was born on 5 September, 1888. As an educationist, he was an advocate of edification and was a distinguished envoy, academician, and above all a great teacher.

A great philosopher and a statesman, Dr Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan played a vital role in enhancing India's educational system.

Born in 1888, in a town called Tirutani in Andhra Pradesh, his father wanted him to take on the role of a priest. But his talents brought him to join schools in Tirupati and Vellore and he eventually joined prestigious Christian College, Madras, in order to study philosophy. He believed that the study of Indian philosophy and its interpretation in western terms would cast off imperial inferiority complex and give countrymen a new sense of esteem. His popularity among students was at the peak at the Presidency College in Madras and the University of Calcutta, where he served as a professor.

He later served as the Vice Chancellor of both Andhra University and Banaras Hindu University and was recognised by Oxford University when he was called to fill the Chair of Spalding Professor of Eastern Religions. In 1939, he was elected Fellow of the British Academy. Dr Radhakrishnan was ambassador to the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR) from 1949 to 1952 and became Vice President of India from 1952 and in 1962, he chosen as the second President of India. Also, in order to celebrate his esteemed position, his students suggested that his birthday to be celebrated as 'Radhakrishnan Day'. However, he declined this move and suggested that "Instead of celebrating my birthday, it would be my proud privilege if September 5 is observed as Teachers' Day." "He has served his country in many capacities. But above all, he is a great teacher from whom all of us have learnt much and will continue to learn. It is India's peculiar privilege to have a great philosopher, a great educationist and a great humanist as her President," Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru once said on Radhakrishnan.

Professional Life

In 1918, Doctor Radhakrishnan was appointed as the Professor of Philosophy, in the University of Mysore. Three years later, he was appointed as a Professor to King George V Chair of Mental and Moral Science in the University of Calcutta. Dr. Radhakrishnan even represented the University of Calcutta at the Congress of the Universities of the British Empire in June 1926 and the International Congress of Philosophy at the Harvard University in September 1926. In 1929, Dr. Radhakrishnan was invited to take the post vacated by Principal J. Estin Carpenter, in Manchester College, Oxford. In Oxford, Dr. Radhakrishnan lectured the students on Comparative Religion. From 1936-39, he served as the Spalding Professor of Eastern Religions and Ethics at Oxford University. In 1939, he was elected Fellow of the British Academy. From 1939-48, he was the Vice-Chancellor of the Banaras Hindu University. He later held offices that dealt with India's national and international affairs. He was the leader of the Indian delegation to UNESCO during 1946-52. Dr. Radhakrishnan served as the Ambassador of India to U.S.S.R. during 1949-52. He was also a member of the Constituent Assembly of India.

His Works

Dr. Radhakrishnan penned down a number of books

during his lifetime, some of which are like The Hindu View of Life, The Idealist View of Life, Religion and Society, Eastern Religions and Western Thought and A Source Book in Indian Philosophy. He had also written for some of the most reputed international journals.

Presidency of India

Dr. Radhakrishnan was the Vice-President of India from 1952 to 1962 and the President, General Conference of UNESCO, from 1952 to 1954. He held the office of the Chancellor, University of Delhi, from 1953-62. In May 1962, Dr. Radhakrishnan became the President of India, a post he served till May 1967. He was honored with Bharat Ratna in 1954. He was also knighted by the British government in the year 1931, but, he used only his academic title 'Doctor' throughout his life.

Contribution towards Indian Education: Just after Independence Dr. Radhakrishnan Chaired the University Education Commission in 1948-49. As Erich Fromm told "Education makes machines which act like men and produces men who act like machines," he realized that our Education system does not appear to fulfill the true aim of education. He said, "The three things- vital dynamism, intellectual efficiency and spiritual direction together constitute the proper aim of education. Moral and spiritual training is an essential part of education.

Enfranchisement of the mind, freedom from prejudice and fanaticism, and courage are essential. What we need today is the education of the whole man- physical, vital, mental, intellectual and spiritual. If education is to help us to meet the moral challenge of the age and play its part in the life of the community, it should be liberating and life giving. It must give a basic meaning to personality and existence and equip us with the power to overcome spiritual inertia and foster spiritual sensitivity. Seat of learning should produce men and women who will move together to develop common ideals and purposes, love each other and co-exist to create a co-operative common wealth."

Radhakrishnan had also strongly recommended the

teaching of spiritual and ethical aspects of the religions as it is evident in the report of the University education commission of which he was the Chairman. The report maintained that: "Unless morality is taken in a larger sense it is not enough. If we exclude the spiritual training in our institutions, we would have to be untrue to our whole historical development. To be secular is not to be religiously illiterate. It is to be deeply spiritual and not narrowly religious." To enable students to become enlightened civilized citizen, he used to lay stress on the need of ethical teaching while addressing them.

Significance of celebrating Teachers' Day

The Radhakrishnan Commission's suggestions helped mould the education system for India's needs. Dr Radhakrishnan believed that "teachers should be the best minds in the country". Teachers Day is the only occasion when we remember the time spent with our teacher, what they taught and what we are today. Teacher guides us towards the success in every aspect of life. Teachers are the prime movers who commit their whole life to the welfare of the youth; hence they are the greatest builders of a society or a nation. If we are proud of our country, our progress, our wealth and power, then we should be proud of our teachers.

When Dr APJ Abdul Kalam became President of India, he located his centenarian class VIII science teacher Siva Subramania Iyer (who had changed his life with a lesson on how birds fly) in Tamil Nadu and put him on stage with him to share his honour. Dr Kalam said, "The launch of the rocket is most crucial. If it is given the right take-off, it can reach the moon. The teacher is the launching pad of every great person who reaches for the sky." Dr. Manmohan Singh said, "Through teachers, flow the values and culture of a nation and its people."

On this day, we gratefully remember the great educationist, apart from honoring all the teachers that have made our life much more knowledgeable and fulfilled, as serving as our beacons of light.

29-Year-old Indian American woman hiker swept away by flash flood in Utah found dead

SACRAMENTO (TIP): A 29-year-old Indian-American woman hiker, who got swept away in a flash flood last week at the Zion National Park in the US state of Utah, has been found dead, according to a senior official from the park.

Jetal Agnihotri of Tucson, Arizona, went missing on August 19 when flash floods swept multiple hikers off their feet, forcing park rangers and officials to launch rescue operations, the media reported on Tuesday, August 23.

Agnihotri's body was found on Tuesday, August 23 in the Zion national park's Virgin River after a thorough rescue operation by the rangers, park superintendent Jeff Bradybaugh said in a statement.

"Our deepest sympathy goes out to the friends and family of Jetal Agnihotri," the statement said.

Zion National Park is among the United States' most visited recreation areas even though it frequently becomes hazardous and is put under flood warnings by the National Weather Service, the report said.

Floods can create danger for experienced hikers and climbers as well as the many novices who have flocked to the park since the pandemic bolstered an outdoor recreation boom.

Despite warnings, flash flooding routinely traps people in the park's slot canyons, which are as narrow as windows in some spots and hundreds of feet deep, the report said.

Indian American racially abused by compatriot in California

SACRAMENTO (TIP): An Indian American man has been racially abused by a compatriot in the US state of California who hurled racist slurs that he is a "dirty Hindu" and a "disgusting dog," days after another hate crime was reported against four women from the community in Texas.

Krishnan Jayaraman was verbally attacked by Tejinder Singh (37) in the Taco Bell at Grimmer Boulevard in Fremont, California, on August 21, media reported on Wednesday, August 31.

Tejinder of Union City was charged with a hate crime in

violation of civil rights, assault and disturbing the peace by offensive language, the Fremont Police Department said. Jayaraman recorded the tirade, which lasted over eight minutes, on his phone. Tejinder appeared to spit at Jayaraman twice in the video.

The Fremont police are still investigating. Police chief Sean Washington addressed the community on social media. He wrote: "We take hate incidents and hate crimes seriously and understand the significant impact they have. These incidents are despicable. We are here to protect all community members, regardless of their gender, race, nationality, religion, and other differences."

CENTRE APPROVES TEJAS MARK-2 COMBAT AIRCRAFT DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) has approved the development of Tejas Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) Mark 2 fighter aircraft. It would be a replacement for the Mirage 2000, Jaguar and MiG-29 combat aircraft in the Indian Air Force.

"LCA Mark 2 fighter aircraft development project has been cleared by the government. This would pave the way for designers to develop an advanced 17.5-tonne single-engine aircraft," said Aeronautical Development Agency chief Girish Deodhare.

Speaking about the project, Girish Deodhare said that the development of the new aircraft is scheduled to be completed by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) by 2027.

He further said that the aircraft would be the advanced replacement for the MiG-29, Mirage 2000 and Jaguar fighter jets.

"This decision will give a tremendous boost to the indigenous design and development of our next-generation fighter aircraft. It'll further 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' initiative in the domain of aircraft manufacturing," IAF chief Air Chief Marshal VR Chaudhari told ANI on the LCA Mark 2 fighter aircraft development project.

The Indian Air Force (IAF) currently operates one squadron of the 16 'Mark 1' baseline Tejas variants at its airbase in Sulur, Coimbatore.

AAP WINS TRUST VOTE IN DELHI ASSEMBLY AS BJP MLAs WALK OUT

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), led by Arvind Kejriwal, on Thursday won a motion of trust that was tabled in the Delhi Assembly. Kejriwal had announced the trust vote on August 29 to prove that the BJP's 'Operation Lotus' targeting AAP MLAs had failed.

AAP, which has 62 of the 70 assembly seats in Delhi, won the election with 58 votes in its favour.

Three BJP MLAs -- Vijender Gupta, Abhay Verma and Mohan Singh Bisht -- were marshalled out as they "argued" with deputy speaker Rakhi Birla, while the remaining saffron camp legislators walked out in protest soon after. Kejriwal has alleged the BJP tried to buy his party's MLAs but none of them accepted the offer.

In the Assembly, Kejriwal said in the upcoming Gujarat Assembly elections his party's vote share in that state has increased by four per cent after the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) raids against his deputy Manish Sisodia in the excise policy case.

JHARKHAND POLITICAL CRISIS

'How is selective info leaked to media?' MLAs ask governor

RANCHI (TIP)

MLAs of Jharkhand's ruling United Progressive Alliance on Thursday, September 1, asked Governor Ramesh Bais how selective information was being leaked to the media, ANI reported.

The legislators met Bais amid uncertainty about Chief Minister Hemant Soren continuing in his post and alleged attempts of the Bharatiya Janata Party to destabilise the Jharkhand government.

Bandhu Tirkey, working president of the Congress' Jharkhand unit, on Thursday said Soren will not resign. He also said that the governor has assured them that information is not being leaked from his office. "The governor is seeking legal opinion and has assured the situation will be made clear within two days," Tirkey added.

A political crisis has been looming over Jharkhand since last week after reports on

August 25 said that the Election Commission has sought Soren's disqualification as an MLA.

The chief minister is facing allegations against him in an office-of-profit case. The case is based on a complaint filed by the Bharatiya Janata Party alleging that Soren allotted a mining lease in his own name. Soren also holds the mining portfolio in

Jharkhand. The Election Commission had informed the governor about its decision in a sealed cover, the reports said last week. However, Soren maintained that he did not receive any communication either from the Election Commission or the governor.

On August 27, the Jharkhand Mukti Morcha and its allies began moving its legislators out of Ranchi amid fears of poaching. In the 81-member Jharkhand Assembly, the Soren-led Jharkhand Mukti Morcha is the largest party with 30 MLAs. The Congress has 18 legislators, while the Rashtriya Janata Dal has one. The main opposition BJP has 26 MLAs in the House.

If the governor announces Soren's disqualification, then he will have to resign as an MLA. Soren, however, can get re-elected within six months. He can also continue to remain the chief minister if legislators of the ruling United Progressive Alliance name him as the leader of the coalition.

Whoever becomes Cong chief will have to be Rahul Gandhi's slave: Azad

NEW DELHI (TIP)

Ghulam Nabi Azad's explosion, on a day when it finalized the schedule for the party's presidential polls, has rattled the Congress. After much delay, the polls will now be held on October 17.

The Congress hit back at the veteran leader, saying he revolted only because he wanted a Rajya Sabha seat and wanted to retain the bungalow in South Avenue, in the heart of the national capital.

Azad, who is now working on his tell-all autobiography, told News18.com: "Around 90% of the Congress is not Congressi. Some are picked up from colleges, some clerks of the CM have been given positions. I can't argue with people who have no idea of their own history. I wrote a letter as the Leader of Opposition to Mrs Gandhi even before the G-23. What did they do? They told me to coordinate with KC Venugopal. I told them he was in school when I was the general secretary. Then someone from the family said then speak to Randeep Surjewala. I told them, by the way, when I was the general secretary, Randeep's father was part of the PCC. He worked under me. How can I discuss the party with his son? What are you saying, Rahul Gandhi?"

Azad's anger and bitterness is directed more at Rahul Gandhi. As to whether Rahul Gandhi should be the party president? "If he does not, whoever becomes the party president will have to be his slave and carry his files. Ask them how much time they give to the party? They don't have time for the party and question my timing? We used to give over 20 hours even when we were his age."

He burst out when he was reminded that when Rahul Gandhi resigned as the president, he had accused the seniors of not supporting him. "What cooperation? Over what? He said why didn't you say 'chowkidar chor hai'? I told him this may be your language, not mine. Even Indira Gandhi never told us to say this to Atal Bihari Vajpayee. Rajiv Gandhi told us to go to homes of Opposition leaders. We can't talk like this. We are not brought up like this."

Church vandalised in Punjab, pastor's car set afire; probe on

TARN TARAN (TIP)

Four unidentified men allegedly broke into a church and desecrated statues of Jesus Christ and Mary in Punjab's Tarn Taran district, police said on Wednesday, August 31, adding that chief minister Bhagwant Mann has ordered a probe into the "highly condemnable" incident.

The incident comes two days after a group of nihangs and their supporters disrupted an event organised by Christian missionaries at Daduana village in the border district of Amritsar.

According to the Tarn Taran police, four armed men barged into the Catholic Church at Thakkarpura village near Patti town late on Tuesday night. The intruders pointed a pistol at the security guard's head and tied his hands in the incident that took place around 12.30 am and was caught on CCTV cameras installed at the church. They desecrated the statues of Jesus Christ and Mary, located at the front side of the church, with an axe and escaped with the heads, according to a senior police officer from Sadar police station, Patti, where a case has been registered based on the complaint from the church authority.

"The CCTV footage showed two of the masked men vandalising the idols," the officer said, requesting anonymity. "They also set ablaze a car parked on the church premises while fleeing."

Father Thomas P, the priest of the church, told the police that the vandals remained inside the church campus for around 25 minutes. Soon after the incident, a police team led by Tarn Taran's senior superintendent of police (SSP) Ranjit Singh Dhillon reached the spot. A large number of police personnel were deployed in the area.

"It is a conspiracy by some mischievous elements who wanted to disturb the peace in the state," the SSP told reporters. "We have taken stock of the situation and are investigating the matter. We will soon catch those behind this incident." A case has been registered under sections 295A (deliberate and malicious acts intended to outrage religious feelings), 452 (house trespass), 427 (mischief causing damage) and 34 (Acts done by several persons in furtherance of common intention) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC). NATIONAL INVESTIGATION AGENCY ANNOUNCES RS 25 LAKH REWARD ON DAWOOD IBRAHIM

The National Investigation Agency has announced a cash reward of Rs 25 lakh for any information leading to the arrest of fugitive underworld don Dawood Ibrahim, a key accused in the 1993 Mumbai serial blasts, an official said on Thursday, September 1.

The probe agency has also announced a cash reward of Rs 20 lakh on Ibrahim's close aide Shakeel Shaikh alias Chhota Shakeel, and Rs 15 lakh each on associates Haji Anees alias Anees Ibrahim Shaikh, Javed Patel alias Javed Chikna and Ibrahim Mushtaq Abdul Razzak Memon alias Tiger Memon, he said.

All of them are wanted accused in the case of 1993 Mumbai serial bomb blasts. The official said the NIA had sought information about them which could lead to their arrest.

The agency had in February registered a case against the 'D company'.

Dawood Ibrahim Kaskar, designated a global terrorist by the United Nations, runs an international terrorist network, namely D-Company, with his close associates like Anees Ibrahim Shaikh, Chhota Shakeel, Javed Chikna and Tiger Memon, among others, the NIA said in a statement.

They are involved in various terrorism-criminal activities such as arms smuggling, narco-terrorism, underworld criminal syndicate, money-laundering, circulation of FICN, unauthorised possession/acquisition of key assets for raising terror funds and working in active collaboration with international terrorist organisations, including Lashkar-e-Taiba, Jaish-e-Mohammad and Al Qaeda, the statement said.

NEW DELHI (TIP)

India on Thursday, September 1, unveiled the first indigenous quadrivalent human papillomavirus vaccine (qHPV) as a primary prevention tool for cervical cancer, the second most common cancer affecting young women, after cancers of the breast.

Cancer of the cervix is the second leading cancer among women aged 15 to 44 after breast cancers with 90 per cent mortality due to this cancer reported in low- and middle-income countries.

A third major example of public-private partnership in vaccine development -- after the development of rota virus and covid vaccines -- the qHPV shot has been developed in collaboration between the Department of Biotechnology under the government and the Serum Institute of India, Pune.

With market authorisation granted by the Drug Controller General of India in July this year, the shot will be launched into the national programme in a few months, MoS Science and Technology Jitendra Singh said, adding that today's announcement of the vaccine was meant as a celebration of the scientific effort that went into developing the shot.

"We are here to celebrate the script writers of this wonderful story of scientific discovery and self-reliant India. Once the vaccine hits the markets for use, manufacturers will get all the credit and rightly so. By then it will be too late to recall the script writers," Singh said praising DBT secretary Rajesh Gokhale and his team for the work.

Speaking about the vaccine, AIIMS

obstetrics and gynaecology professor Neerja Bhatla said the vaccine is safe and effective although one would have to wait longer for around a decade to see if it reduces cancer.

"Evidence from the UK and Nordic countries has shown fast reductions in cancers with vaccines even though these are slowly reducing cancers. The shot is reliable, safe, affordable and the good thing is we now have a solution for a very deadly disease," Bhatla said, calling for the shot to be administered to young boys also to prevent other cancers caused by HPV and also to address the problem of genital warts and raise herd immunity.

Speaking on the occasion, Adar Poonawalla, CEO, SII, termed the achievement remarkable.

"This is a testament of what we can achieve together. Hope we can work

together to develop more vaccines and drugs. This is not a launch. We will launch in a few months. This is to celebrate science and a momentous milestone," Adar said. The minister for his part said the government was working in mission mode on cancer prevention. "This is the first indigenous vaccine for HPV. It is affordable and adds to the esteem of common Indians. We are already working on preventive healthcare in the cancer sector. We have of late started a process of opening cancer sub centres. Five years ago, we began one in Guwahati which is now running a DM on oncology medicine course and an MCH in oncology surgery. Tata memorial cancer hospitals have been set up in Bihar, Uttarakhand, Varanasi and recently in Mohali," Singh said.

Delhi Police invoke UAPA against gangsters, including Moosewala murder accused Lawrence Bishnoi and Goldy Brar

The Delhi Police have invoked stringent anti-terror provision of the law--Unlawful Activities (Prevention)



Act (UAPA)--against several of gangsters, including those allegedly involved in the killing of Punjabi singer Sidhu Moosewala, sources said.

The move came after a direction was given by the Union Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) to take strict action against the gangsters, who were in touch with several proscribed terror

organisations and possibility of them executing targeted killings in the country, said the sources, adding that the Delhi Police officials were in touch with their counterparts in the NIA and co-ordinating with them in such cases.

It was learnt that the Delhi Police have invoked the UAPA against Moosewala murder case accused Lawrence Bishnoi, Goldy Brar and Vikram Brar, and also members of their rival gangs – Davinder Bambha, Kaushal Chaudhary, Neeraj Bawana, Sunil alias Tillu Tajpuriya, Dilpreet and Sukhpreet alias Budha.

The list also included absconding terrorist Harvinder Rinda.

Earlier, the Delhi Police's Special Cell had received inputs that members of both gangs were procuring illegal weapons from outside the country to execute targeted killings in Delhi and other parts of the country.

The sources said that the police have registered two FIRs under various Sections of the UAPA and the IPC. Two ACP-rank officers are the investigation

officers in the cases.

The first FIR was registered on the basis of inputs received by the Special Cell from sources, informing them about Bishnoi and his associates – Goldy Brar, Vikram Brar, Kala Jathedi, Jasdeep Singh alias Jaggu Bhagwanpuria, Sachin Thapan, Anmol Bishnoi and Lakhbir Singh Landa – running their operations from different jails in India as well as from Canada, Dubai and Pakistan.

The other FIR was registered against Bishnoi's rival gang and mentions Armenia-based gangster Gaurav Padial alias Lucky Padial, who led the Davinder Bambha gang since latter's death in a police encounter in 2016.

It also names Amit Dagar and Kaushal Chaudhary, the alleged conspirators behind the murder of Youth Akali Dal leader Vikramjit Singh Middukhera in Mohali on August 7, 2021.

Others named in the FIR include Baba Dhala alias Gurvinder, Bhupi Rana, Neeraj Bawaria and Sunil alias Tillu Tajapuriya, the sources said.

Death toll from Pakistan floods reaches 1,186

ISLAMABAD (TIP): The death toll from flash floods triggered by record monsoon rains across much of Pakistan reached 1,186 on September 1, as authorities scrambled to provide relief materials to tens of thousands of affected people.

Record monsoon rains in the last three decades triggered floods which inundated one third of the country, including most of Balochistan and Sindh provinces.

"So far 1,186 people have died and 4,896 injured while 5,063 kms of roads damaged, 1,172,549 houses partially or completely destroyed and 733,488 livestock killed," said the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), the main body dealing with calamities.

On Thursday, the army said that some 50,000 people have been evacuated since rescue efforts began.

Foreign Office spokesperson Asim Iftikhar Ahmed said that more than 33 million people have been affected due to "colossal scale of devastation".

During a media briefing here, he said Pakistan mounted coordinated rescue and relief operations mobilising all possible resources but the sheer scale of the calamity "stretched our resources and capacities to the limit, thus necessitating support from the international community".

The cash-strapped Pakistan government on Tuesday teamed up with the United Nations to issue a flash appeal for USD 160 million to deal with the disaster in the country that has become the "ground zero" of global warming.

"The Flash Appeal launch was well attended by Member States both in Islamabad and Geneva, Heads of UN agencies in Pakistan, representatives of international organizations, among



others. Participants offered condolences and expressions of solidarity, and assured continued support for Pakistan," the spokesman said.

He also said that Pakistan faced a "climate-induced calamity" because the monsoons were not ordinary, "as the UNSG termed them 'monsoons on steroid'." UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres will be visiting Pakistan on September 9-10 on an important visit to "express solidarity and international community's support for Pakistan at this difficult time," he said.

Talking about the outpouring of relief supplies, he said till last night, Pakistan received flood relief goods through 21 flights notably from Turkey, UAE and China.

He said a large number of countries and international organisations pledged to support and are extending cash or in-kind assistance including Australia, Azerbaijan, Canada, China, EU, France, Iran, Japan, Kazakhstan, Kuwait, New

Zealand, Norway, Palestine, Qatar, South Korea, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, Turkiye, the UAE, United Kingdom, the United States, Uzbekistan, along with various international organisations including World Bank, Asian Development Bank and other UN Agencies.

He said Pakistan on Wednesday signed the Green Framework Engagement Agreement with Denmark in Copenhagen, which marks the first step in creating stronger collaboration in areas such as climate change mitigation and adaptation, and a just and sustainable green transition.

Separately, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif while addressing lawmakers of his Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz asked them to visit the flood victims with relief goods.

The prime minister said that he had never seen such a calamity before. "Water has wreaked havoc everywhere," he said.

He also asked Finance Minister Miftah

Ismail to devise a plan to give relief to the flood-affected people with electricity bills.

Army chief General Qamar Javed Bajwa visited the Rohjan area of Punjab and met flood victims whom he assured that the Pakistan Army will help them to overcome their problems in these difficult times, the army said.

He also directed ground troops to "take this responsibility as a noble cause and spare no effort to lessen the burden of flood-affected brothers and sisters".

Advisor to the Prime Minister on Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan Affairs Qamar Zaman Kaira said that Prime Minister Sharif would visit Gilgit-Baltistan on Friday and announce a relief package for the flood victims.

Separately, the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (Unicef) said in a statement that more than three million children were in need of humanitarian assistance in Pakistan and at increased risk of waterborne diseases, drowning and malnutrition due to flooding.

"These floods have already taken a devastating toll on children and families, and the situation could become even worse," the statement quoted Unicef representative in Pakistan Abdullah Fadil as saying.

To add to worries, the Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) has forecast more rain in September, saying that La Nina conditions — responsible for recent spells of flood-triggering deluge in the country — would persist in September but become less intense.

"Tendency for normal to above normal precipitation is likely over the country during September," the Met Office said, predicting above-normal rainfall in northeastern Punjab and Sindh. (PTI)

Ex-Sri Lankan president Gotabaya Rajapaksa likely to return on September 3: Reports

COLOMBO (TIP): Former Sri Lankan president Gotabaya Rajapaksa, who fled the country following an uprising against his government over the island-nation's worst-ever economic crisis, may return to the country from Thailand on September 3, according to media reports on September 1.

Rajapaksa, 73, fled the country on July 13 after months-long mass public demonstrations demanding his immediate resignation on July 9 gained momentum after protesters stormed the President's House in Colombo and several other state buildings in the capital.

Rajapaksa will return back to the country on Saturday, a source close to him was quoted as saying by the Daily Mirror news portal.

Having gone to the Maldives on a Sri Lanka Airforce plane, the former

president proceeded to Singapore from where he sent in his resignation on July 13.

Later, he flew to Thailand, seeking temporary shelter. Thailand's foreign minister Don Pramudwinai has said that Rajapaksa can stay in the country for 90 days because he is still a diplomatic passport holder.

However, Rajapaksa will not be allowed to engage in political activities in Thailand. He is also reportedly confined to a hotel and surrounded by security personnel.

After Rajapaksa was ousted, Sri Lanka's parliament elected then-Acting President and six-time former Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe as the new Head of State. He had the backing of Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna (SLPP), the largest bloc in the 225-member parliament.

Media reports say President Wickremesinghe has made

arrangements for his return after the SLPP led by the Rajapaksas made a request to him.

On August 19, the SLPP General Secretary Sagara Kariyawasam said that the request was made at a meeting held with President Wickremesinghe.

Kariyawasam had said that they asked the president to facilitate his (Rajapaksa's) return and ensure security and necessary facilities.

Sri Lanka is going through its worst economic crisis since its independence in 1948 which was triggered by a severe paucity of foreign exchange reserves.

The IMF on Thursday announced that it will provide Sri Lanka with a loan of about USD 2.9 billion over four years under a preliminary agreement to help the bankrupt island nation tide over its worst economic crisis and protect the livelihoods of the people. (PTI)

MALAYSIA'S FORMER FIRST LADY ROSMAH SENTENCED TO 10 YEARS IN JAIL FOR GRAFT

KUALA LUMPUR (TIP): A Malaysian court on September 1 sentenced Rosmah Mansor, the wife of former Prime Minister Najib Razak, to a decade in prison for seeking and receiving bribes in exchange for government contracts, just days after her husband was jailed for corruption.

Rosmah will also have to pay a fine of 970 million ringgit (\$216.45 million) over three bribery charges, Kuala Lumpur High Court Judge Mohamed Zaini Mazlan said, adding that the prosecution proved their case beyond a reasonable doubt.

The judge granted her a stay of sentence, so Rosmah will not go to the jail on Thursday. She can appeal the decision in two higher courts.

On the momentous occasion of India's 75th year of Independence, the night's concert was a tribute to Mahatma Gandhi and to his message of non-violence. Gandhi insisted that "Each of us must be the change we wish to see in this world." Resonating with that ethos, the artists tonight musically seek to convey that we should all work together to recreate and be soulfully motivated by his enthralling symphony of Truth, Love, Non-Violence, and Peace.

A wonderful and strange mystery of Indian classical music is the fact that one can spend a lifetime trying to obtain knowledge and perfection and still feel that one has only touched a mere drop of an ocean. The learning never stops along the Journey of searching and discovering.

Indian Classical music has indeed had a very spiritual and scientific development and growth. This was a phenomenon that existed from Vedic times. The tradition of classical music dates back to the Sam Veda period. The earliest version of classical music was the Vedic chants. Interestingly, the effect of all the twelve notes on our body, mind and soul are very scientific. Various permutations and combinations give the scales a shape of a raga. However, a raga is much more and beyond. It's not just a mere scale. A raga has to be invoked, understood, and cared for like a living entity.

The first half of the night's concert was divided in two segments, The concert started with a duet by Amaan Ali Bangash and Ayaan Ali Bangash (older-younger sons of Amjad Ali Khan), both well-known sarod virtuosos. They presented a traditional raga of Indian Classical music set to various rhythmic time cycles. This was followed by a solo solo by Sarod Grand Master Amjad Ali Khan. Amit Kavthekar and Ojas Adhiya, two brilliant tabla (Indian two-piece drums) players, provided accompaniment for this segment.

An interesting aspect of Indian Classical music is that here you have five people on stage who don't know what the other is going to do, and yet have to perform like a rehearsed orchestra! Therefore, the role as performers is really that of three people, i.e., the performer, the composer and the conductor. Three in one! Along with the Sarods and the Tablas, there was a drone box tuned to the true tonic.

After intermission, Samaagam - Concerto for 3 Sarods, conducted by Lidiya Yankovskaya, was played by the Refugee Orchestra Project. Samaagam comes from a Sanskrit word meaning 'confluence or flowing together.' Amjad Ali Khan aimed to preserve the essence of both Indian and Western traditions so that they can flow into each other without artistic compromise. He uses the orchestration of Indian ensemble music in the pre-Bollywood era as inspiration and has also looked back to the ancient (i.e., pre-equal temperament) Western tradition incorporating elements which, because of their antiquity, do not violate the rules of Indian music. The aim is through this process to joyfully explore the common musical "DNA" of both traditions. In Samaagam, twelve different ragas were presented. Some will make only a fleeting appearance; others will be explored for longer. To learn about each artist, visit iaac.us

MIKHAIL GORBACHEV: CHAMPION OF 'GLASNOST', 'PERESTROIKA' DIES AT 91

RUSSIA (TIP): Mikhail Gorbachev, the man whose attempt at reforming the Soviet system spun out of control with tragic consequences for the communism-socialism movements all over the world, died in Moscow after a long illness. He was 91.

In six tumultuous years in power as General Secretary of the Soviet Communist Party, Gorbachev presided over landmark events, from the withdrawal of troops from Afghanistan, the fall of the Berlin Wall, a coup attempt and finally the chaotic disintegration of the Soviet Union into 15 independent states whose reverberations we feel today in the Russia-Ukraine conflict. Perestroika (restructuring) and glasnost (openness) were the catch words for the Communists the world over. As Cuban leader Fidel Castro was to warn in early 1988, neither concept ended well for them.

Born in a peasant family as most Soviet politicians, he initially drove combine harvesters for a living. We will never get to know the qualities that made him a member of the Politburo at 48 though he is credited with overseeing a major irrigation project as a regional party boss. Opportunism may have been one of them in the unremitting struggle for power in the corridors of the Kremlin.

Gorbachev saw an opportunity of a lifetime when Konstantin Chernenko died. He moved quickly to convene a Politburo meeting while two supporters of his opponent were not in Moscow. When a tie emerged among the available members, Gorbachev voted in his favour as General Secretary of the Soviet Communist Party. Journalist Vladimir Pozner in his account of the unravelling of the Soviet Union writes: "American conservatives love to take credit. What a self-indulging understanding of history. One vote, one single change, would have changed the world. There would have been no Gorbachev as head of USSR!"

But Gorbachev did become the top leader of the Soviet Union when Soviet-US ties were at their nadir. It is reckoned that the Chernobyl disaster in 1986 was when he was convinced that things had to change in the Soviet Union. Contrary to popular impression, he did make one last effort to pull back matters from the brink. (TNS)

Argentine Vice President Cristina Fernández has a narrow escape as man tries to assassinate her

BUENOS AIRES (TIP): A man has been detained after he aimed a handgun at point-blank range at Argentina's politically powerful Vice President Cristina Fernández.

President Alberto Fernández said the assassination attempt failed because the gun did not fire.

"A man (on September 1 night) pointed a firearm at her head and pulled the trigger," the president said in a national broadcast.

He called it "the most serious incident since we recovered democracy" in 1983 and urged political leaders, and society at large, to repudiate the incident.

Supporters of the vice president have been gathering in the streets surrounding her home since last week, when a prosecutor called for a 12-year sentence for Fernández as well as a life-long prohibition in holding public office as part of a case involving alleged corruption in public works during her 2007-2015 presidency.

Fernández, who is not related to the current president, has denied all charges.

The president spoke shortly after video from the scene broadcast on local television channels showed Fernández exiting her vehicle surrounded by supporters outside her home when a man could be seen extending his hand with what looked like a pistol.



The vice president ducked as supporters surrounding the person appeared shocked at what was happening amid the commotion in the Recoleta neighbourhood of Argentina's capital.

The man, whose identity was not released by authorities, was detained seconds into the incident.

The president said the firearm had five bullets "and didn't fire even though the trigger was pulled".

There was no indication that the vice president suffered any harm. Her whereabouts were unknown.

"A person who was identified by those who were close to him who had a gun was detained by (the vice president's) security personnel," Security Minister Aníbal Fernández told local cable news

channel C5N.

The minister said he wanted to be careful in providing details until the investigation learned more.

Unverified video posted on social media shows the pistol almost touched Fernández's face.

State-run news agency Télam identified the alleged gunman as Fernando Andrés Zabak, a Brazilian citizen. Officials had not confirmed the information.

Government officials were quick to describe the incident as an assassination attempt.

"When hate and violence are imposed over the debate of ideas, societies are destroyed and generate situations like the one seen today: an assassination attempt," Economy Minister Sergio Massa said.

Ministers in President Alberto Fernández's government issued a news release saying they "energetically condemn the attempted homicide" of the vice president.

"What happened tonight is of extreme gravity and threatens democracy, institutions and the rule of law," reads the release.

Former President Mauricio Macri also repudiated the attack. "This very serious event demands an immediate and profound clarification by the judiciary and security forces," Macri wrote on Twitter. (AP)

Marriages in China decline to lowest numbers since 1986

BEIJING (TIP): The number of marriages in China has hit a 36-year low with registrations of married couples dropped below eight million in 2021, the lowest since 1986, the latest official data revealed, adding to the concerns of the dwindling low birth rates and declining population which may touch negative growth by 2025.

Only 7.64 million couples registered to get married across China, the world's most populous nation, in 2021, the lowest since 1986, according to the latest Statistical Bulletin on the Development of Civil Affairs in 2021.

Compared to 2020, the number of couples who got married in 2021 dropped by 6.1 per cent. The data showed that the number of marriages fell for the eighth consecutive year.

Among the married population last year, people aged between 25 and 29 accounted for 35.3 per cent, up 0.4 percentage points from 2020, making it the group with the highest proportion among all age groups to get married for the ninth year in a row.

Late marriages which have become a trend in China would affect the policy to permit three children which further poses a challenge to the population problem, state-run Global Times quoted Chinese experts as saying.

China permitted all couples to have two children in 2016, scrapping the draconian decades-old one-child policy which policymakers blame for the current demographic crisis.

Last year China passed a revised Population and Family Planning Law allowing Chinese couples to have three children in an apparent attempt to address the reluctance of couples to have more kids due to mounting costs.

The decision to permit the third child came after the once-in-a-decade census in 2020 showed that China's population grew at its slowest pace to 1.412 billion.

Experts have attributed the phenomena of fewer marriages and late marriages to the prolonged schooling years, the increasing pressure of life and work, and young people's changing concepts and attitudes toward marriage.

Yang Jinrui, a senior official at the National Health Commission, said earlier that the post-90s and later generations, who are the main groups at prime marriage age and childbearing age, mostly grew up and worked in cities and towns, and they have more years of education and face greater employment pressure.

In the past decade, marriage, in general, has been delayed for several years, which means more and more people who are marriageable pushed back their marriages, said Zhai Zhenwu, chairman of the standing council of the China Population Association.

Zhai warned that late marriage would lead to fewer births, thus affecting the third-child policy.

In June this year a senior health official warned that China's dwindling population will touch negative growth by 2025 and may continue to shrink for more than a century.

The growth rate of China's total population has slowed significantly and is expected to enter a negative growth during the current 14th Five-Year Plan period (2021-25), Yang Wenzhuang, head of population and family affairs at the National Health Commission, told the Annual Conference of China Population Association held in June. Russia launches war games with China amid tensions with US

MOSCOW (TIP): Russia on September 1 launched weeklong war games involving forces from China and other nations in a show of growing defence cooperation between Moscow and Beijing, as they both face tensions with the United States.

The maneuvers are also intended to demonstrate that Moscow has sufficient military might for massive drills even as its troops are engaged in military action in Ukraine. The Russian Defence Ministry said that the Vostok 2022 (East 2022) exercise will be held until September 7 at seven firing ranges in Russia's Far East and the Sea of Japan and involve more than 50,000 troops and over 5,000 weapons units, including 140 aircraft and 60 warships. Russian General Staff chief, Gen. Valery Gerasimov, will personally oversee the drills involving troops from several ex-Soviet nations, China, India, Laos, Mongolia, Nicaragua and Syria.

The Defence Ministry noted that as part of the maneuvers, the Russian and Chinese navies in the Sea of Japan will "practice joint action to protect sea communications, areas of marine economic activity and support for ground troops in littoral areas." Beijing sent more than 2,000 troops along with more than 300 military vehicles, 21 combat aircraft and three warships to take part in the drills, Chinese news reports said.

China's Global Times newspaper noted that the maneuvers marked the first time that China has sent forces from three branches of its military to take part in a single Russian drill, in what it described as a show of the breadth and depth of China-Russia military cooperation and mutual trust. The drills showcase increasing defense ties between Moscow and Beijing, which have grown stronger



since Russian President Vladimir Putin sent his troops into Ukraine on February 24.

China has pointedly refused to criticize Russia's actions, blaming the US and NATO for provoking Moscow, and has blasted the punishing sanctions imposed on Moscow. Russia, in turn, has strongly backed China amid the tensions with the US that followed a recent visit to Taiwan by US House Speaker Nancy Pelosi.

Alexander Gabuyev, a political analyst who closely follows Russia-China ties, noted that "it's very important for Beijing to show to the US that it has levers to pressure America and its global interests." "The joint maneuvers with Moscow, including the naval drills, are intended to signal that if the pressure on Beijing continues it will have no other choice but to strengthen the military partnership with Russia," Gabuyev said.

"It will have a direct impact on the interests of the US and its allies, including Japan." He noted that the

Kremlin, for its part, wants to show that the country's military is powerful enough to flex its muscle elsewhere despite the campaign in Ukraine. "The Russian leadership demonstrates that everything goes according to plan and the country and its military have resources to conduct the maneuvers along with the special military operation," Gabuyev said.

The exercise continues a series of joint war games by Russia and China in recent years, including naval drills and patrols by long-range bombers over the Sea of Japan and the East China Sea. Last year, Russian troops for the first time deployed to Chinese territory for joint maneuvers.

China's participation in the drills "aims to deepen pragmatic and friendly cooperation between the militaries of the participating countries, enhance the level of strategic cooperation among all participating parties, and enhance the ability to jointly respond to various security threats," Chinese Defence Ministry spokesperson Col. Tan Kefei said

JAPAN PM KISHIDA APOLOGISES FOR HIS PARTY'S LINKS WITH UNIFICATION CHURCH, VOWS TO CUT TIES

TOKYO (TIP): Amid sliding approval ratings, Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida apologised for his party's links with the controversial Unification Church, vowing to win back public trust by severing such ties and tightening vigilance over political activities.

Revelations of long-running links between some lawmakers of the ruling Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) and the church have become a headache for Kishida. Not only has his popularity slumped, they have fanned opposition to a state funeral planned for slain former premier Shinzo Abe, a one-time Kishida mentor.

Abe's suspected assassin bore a grudge against the church, officially called the Family Federation for World Peace and Unification, alleging it bankrupted his mother, and blamed Abe for promoting it, according to his social media posts and news reports.

Appearing at his first in-person news conference as he emerged from COVID-19 quarantine, Kishida said politicians had a duty to be mindful about their relationship with "problematic" organisations.

While members of his cabinet had previously pledged to examine their own relationship with the Unification Church, Kishida said on Wednesday the LDP would go a step further to make it "party policy" to end such ties and step up compliance.

"There are still many people who are concerned and suspicious of strong ties ... due to a number of media reports on the matter," Kishida told a news conference.

"For this, I offer my sincere apologies as the president of the LDP."

Kishida reshuffled his cabinet on Aug. 10 and removed some cabinet members with ties to the church in an attempt to bolster support - to little avail so far. An Asahi newspaper poll at the weekend showed support for the cabinet at 47%, down 10 points from July.

The Unification Church, founded in South Korea in the 1950s and known for its mass weddings, has over the years faced questions over how it solicits donations.

Kishida also faces persistent opposition to the planned taxpayer-funded state funeral for Abe, but defended the decision given the late ex-premier's standing both domestically and internationally. Though Japan's longest-serving prime minister, Abe divided opinions deeply. The funeral, to be held on Sept. 27 at Tokyo's Nippon Budokan hall, will cost about 250 million yen (\$1.8 million) excluding outlays for security and the reception of overseas dignitaries, the government has said. (Reuters)

Body of missing German found on Swiss glacier after over 30 years



Germany who had been missing since 1990 was found on a glacier near Zermatt in Switzerland, police said.

Mountaineers discovered the mortal remains and equipment of the man from Baden-Wurttemberg state on the Stockji glacier at the end of July, dpa news reported citing the police as saying on August 30.

According to officials, a DNA comparison showed that it was the missing man from the German town of Nurtingen.

He was 27 when he went missing.

In August 1990, the deceased was on a multi-day mountain tour in the Valais Alps from Chamonix, France, to Domodossola, Italy.

When he did not arrive at his destination, rescue efforts were initiated, but he was not found.

German police assume that he died in an accident.

According to Swiss police, the fact that the man has now been found is related to retreating glaciers.

Amidst retreating ice, the mortal remains of people have come to light, some of whom had been missing for decades. IANS

By using tools like Google Image Search, you can determine whether the photographs he or she provides you are false.

Chilli Garlic Noodles



Ingredients

Noodles - 1/2 cup, cooked, Onions - 1/2 cup, chopped, Carrot - 1/2 cup, grated, Ginger Garlic Paste - 1 tbsp, Chilli Paste - 1/2 tbsp, Coriander Leaves - handful, chopped, Oil - 2 tbsp, Salt - as per taste

Method

- Heat oil in a pan over moderate flame.
- Add the onions, carrot, ginger garlic paste, salt and chilli paste.
- Stir to mix well.
- Add the noodles and mix well to combine all ingredients.
- Garnish with coriander leaves.
- Serve warm.

Kale Pakoda Chaat

Ingredients

Kale leaf 400gms, Mint chutney 50gms, Saunth chutney 50gms, Yoghurt 50gms, Sugar syrup 20 ml, Red chili powder 5 gms, Chat masala 5gms, Besan (Chickpea flour) 100gms, Rice flour 50gms, Corn flour 25gms, Salt to taste, Pomegranate seeds 20gms, Sev 10gms, Green coriander to garnish, Ajwain 5gms, Turmeric powder 5gms, Refined oil for fry

Method

- Batter - Add besan, rice flour and corn flour in a bowl and mix well. After mixing, add salt, turmeric powder, red chili powder and ajwain. Add water and make a smooth batter of the mixture.
- Blanch the kale leaves, cool it in ice water and then dry with paper towel. Heat oil in a frying pan. Fry the leaves with batter till it becomes crispy and golden brown. Mix yogurt with sugar syrup, to make the yogurt sweet.
- Chaat - Keep the fried kale leaves in a serving plate. Pour mint chutney, tamarind chutney and sweet yoghurt on top. Sprinkle chaat masala.

Lack of sleep can make a person selfish: Study

Humans help one another; it is one of the pillars of civilised society. However, a new study conducted by scientists at the University of California, Berkeley, reveals that a lack of sleep impairs this fundamental human trait, with real-world consequences.

Sleep deprivation has been linked to an increased risk of cardiovascular disease, depression, diabetes, hypertension, and overall mortality. These new findings, however, show that a lack of sleep also impairs our basic social conscience, causing us to withdraw our desire and willingness to help others.

In one section of the new study, the researchers found that charitable giving dropped by 10% in the week following the start of Daylight Saving Time, when residents in most states "spring forward" and lose one hour of their day—a drop not seen in states that do not change their clocks or when states return to standard time in the fall.

The study, led by UC Berkeley research scientist Eti Ben Simon and Matthew Walker, a UC Berkeley professor of psychology, adds to a growing body of evidence demonstrating that insufficient sleep not only harms an individual's mental and physical well-being but also jeopardises interpersonal bonds and even the altruistic sentiment of an entire nation.

"We have discovered a very intimate link between our sleep health and our mental health over the last 20 years."

"We haven't found a single major psychiatric condition in which sleep is normal," Walker said. "However, this new research shows that a lack of sleep not only harms an individual's health, but also degrades social interactions between individuals and, ultimately, the fabric of human society itself." How we function as a social species—and we are a social species—appears to be profoundly dependent on how much sleep we get."

"We're seeing more and more studies, including this one, where the effects of sleep deprivation don't just stop at the individual, but spread to those around us,"



Ben Simon said. "Not getting enough sleep not only harms your own well-being, but it also harms the well-being of your entire social circle, including strangers."

Ben Simon, Walker, and their colleagues Raphael Vallat and Aubrey Rossi will publish their findings in the open access journal PLOS Biology on August 23. Walker is the Center for Human Sleep Science's director. He and Ben Simon are both members of UC Berkeley's Helen Wills Neuroscience Institute.

Sleeplessness dampens the theory of mind network.

The new report describes three separate studies that looked at how sleep deprivation affects people's willingness to help others. In the first study, the researchers scanned the brains of 24 healthy volunteers using a functional magnetic resonance imager (fMRI) after eight hours of sleep and after a night of no sleep. They discovered that after a sleepless night, areas of the brain that form the theory of mind network, which is engaged when people empathise with others or try to understand other people's wants and needs, were less active.

Sitting for long periods may increase risk of dementia

According to a recent study, individuals aged 60 and more who sit for a long period of time watching TV or engaging in other passive, sedentary behaviours may be at an increased risk of developing dementia.

The study also showed that the risk is lower for those who are active while sitting, such as when they read or use computers.

The study was published in the journal Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences. It also revealed that the link between sedentary behaviour and dementia risk persisted even among participants who were physically active.

"It isn't the time spent sitting, per se, but the type of sedentary activity performed during leisure time that impacts dementia risk," said study author David Raichlen, professor of biological sciences and anthropology at the USC Dornsife College of Letters, Arts and Sciences.

"We know from past studies that watching TV involves low levels of muscle activity and energy use compared with using a computer or reading," he said. "And while research has shown that uninterrupted sitting for long periods is linked with reduced blood flow in the brain, the relatively greater intellectual stimulation that occurs during computer use may counteract the negative effects of sitting."

Researchers used self-reported data from the UK Biobank, a large-scale biomedical database of more than 5,00,000 participants across the United Kingdom, to investigate possible correlations between sedentary leisure activity and dementia in older adults.

More than 1,45,000 participants aged 60 and older—all



of whom did not have a diagnosis of dementia at the start of the project—used touchscreen questionnaires to self-report information about their levels of sedentary behaviour during the 2006-2010 baseline examination period.

After an average of nearly 12 years of follow-up, the researchers used hospital inpatient records to determine dementia diagnosis. They found 3,507 positive cases.

Then, the team adjusted for certain demographics (e.g., age, sex, race/ethnicity, employment type) and lifestyle characteristics (e.g., exercise, smoking and alcohol use, time spent sleeping and engaging in social contact) that could affect brain health. Source: ANI



Smoking also leads to thicker, weaker heart, warns new study

It is well known that smoking causes blocked arteries, leading to coronary heart disease and stroke. A new study on Thursday warned that smoking also leads to thicker, weaker hearts.

The researchers found that the more people smoked, the worse their heart function became. Some function was restored when people kicked the habit.

"It means that smokers have a smaller volume of blood in the left heart chamber and less power to pump it out to the rest of the body. The more you smoke, the worse your heart function becomes," The heart can recuperate to some degree with smoking cessation, so it is never too late to quit," study author Dr Eva Holt of Herlev and Gentofte Hospital, Copenhagen, Denmark.

The heart can recuperate to some degree with smoking cessation, so it is never too late to quit, Holt added in a paper presented at ESC Congress 2022.

According to the World Health Organisation (WHO), tobacco kills more than eight million people each year.

Cigarette smoking is responsible for 50 per cent of all avoidable deaths in smokers, with half of these due to atherosclerotic cardiovascular diseases such as heart attack and stroke.

The detrimental effects of smoking on the arteries and arterial diseases such as heart attack and stroke are well established.

The new study explored whether smoking was related to changes in the structure and function of the heart in people without cardiovascular disease, and the effect of changing smoking habits.

The study analysed data of a total of 3,874 participants aged 20 to 99 years without heart disease.

The average age of participants was 56 years and 43 per cent were women.

Compared to never smokers, current smokers had thicker, weaker and heavier hearts.

"We found that current smoking and accumulated pack-years were associated with worsening of the structure and function of the left heart chamber -- the most important part of the heart," said Holt.

Increasing pack-years were associated with pumping less blood.

Instagram testing improved content recommendation controls

Instagram is introducing changes to its application to enable users to inform the service about posts that are recommended to them. In a move that appears to be aimed at improving the algorithm used to serve users with customised content based on their actions and activity on Instagram, the company says it will make it easier for users teach the service to recognise posts that they aren't interested in seeing in various sections of the app that serve personalised content.

The Meta-owned service announced in a blog post on Tuesday that it has begun testing the ability to allow users to select multiple posts in the Explore tab, and to inform the service that they are not interested in those posts. Until now, Instagram users would have to open (or long press) a post and indicate that they were not interested in the post, which could be a tedious process when the Explore feed is filled with irrelevant posts. Instagram is also working on allowing users to filter out strangers' posts containing specific hashtags and emoji, preventing them from showing up in their feed, the company explained in the post.

Back in March, the photo and video sharing service introduced the ability for users to view posts from accounts they follow in a chronological order, with two new feeds — Following and Favourites. With Following, users will see 30 days of posts in chronological order without suggested posts, while Favourites will let them choose to see posts from up to 50 accounts they follow.

Users can also 'snooze' suggested posts for a month at a time, by tapping the X on the top right corner and selecting Snooze all suggested posts in feed for 30 days. Users can also adjust their Sensitive Content Control settings on Instagram to customise the types of content they see on the service.

WhatsApp features in development: Companion mode, avatars, status reactions

Over the past few weeks, we have already seen WhatsApp launching several new features like emoji reactions for messages, the ability to transfer chats between iOS and Android, and muting specific participants on voice calls. But that's not all. WhatsApp is also developing a handful of exciting features that may make their way to iOS and Android smartphones soon. It's worth keeping in mind that these features are currently in development and are yet to be officially announced by WhatsApp.

View past group participants

WhatsApp is working on the ability to view past participants in groups. As of today, you can only see a list of current members of a WhatsApp group. But soon, you might be able to discover the list of people who exited the group — or were removed in the last 60 days. This list will be visible to everyone in the group, which means it won't be limited to group admins.

Status reactions

You may soon be able to react to a WhatsApp Status, just like Instagram and Facebook. You will be able to choose from any of the available emojis and your reaction will be sent as a message.

WhatsApp chat updates

Another useful feature that has been spotted in development is an official "chat" from WhatsApp where the company could announce new features coming to the app, share tips and tricks, and provide information about the app's features.

WhatsApp Avatars

Instagram and Facebook have already rolled out a Facebook Avatars feature that allows you to create your own personalised 3D cartoon image and use it in chats and Stories. Now WhatsApp could soon add support for the same Facebook Avatars on the app. You might be able to use an avatar as a mask while placing a video call and as a sticker.

Hide online status

You might feel the need to hide your online status if you don't want to be disturbed when you're online on



WhatsApp. This is an important privacy feature that users have been requesting for years. WhatsApp has been spotted working on a feature that could let you hide your online status. You may get two new options: "Everyone" and "Same as Last Seen", which will let you choose who can see you when you are online.

Admin delete

Another notable feature that WhatsApp is currently working on is Admin delete. This feature is said to allow group admins to delete any message in a group. If this feature is released then admins will finally have more control over their groups. They can choose to delete any message sent by a member, which will remove the message for all existing group members.

Companion mode

WhatsApp is also expected to launch a new Companion mode. This is another highly demanded feature. Currently, you can only use your WhatsApp account on one phone and PC, but with the Companion mode, which is currently in development, you may be able to access your WhatsApp account on multiple devices, including your tablets, phones and PC. You won't have to log out of one phone to use WhatsApp on another phone, and you may also be able to link a secondary mobile device to your existing WhatsApp account.

Take 2: NASA aims for Saturday launch of new moon rocket

NASA will try again on Saturday to launch its new moon rocket on a test flight, after engine trouble halted the first countdown this week.

Managers said on Tuesday they are changing fueling procedures to deal with the issue. A bad sensor also could be to blame for Monday's scrapped launch, they noted.

The 322-foot rocket — the most powerful ever built by NASA — remains on its pad at Kennedy Space Center with an empty crew capsule on top.

The Space Launch System rocket will attempt to send the capsule around the moon and back. No one will be aboard, just three test dummies. If successful, it will be the first capsule to fly to the moon since NASA's Apollo programme 50



years ago.

Proceeding toward a Saturday launch will provide additional insight, even if the problem reappears and the countdown is halted again, said NASA's rocket program manager, John Honeycutt. That's better "than us sitting around scratching our heads, was it

good enough or not."

"Based on what I've heard from the technical team today, what we need to do is continue to pore over the data and polish up our plan on putting the flight rationale together," he said.

During Monday's launch attempt, readings showed that one of the four main engines in the rocket's core stage could not be chilled sufficiently prior to the planned ignition at liftoff. It appeared to be as much as 40 degrees Fahrenheit (5 degrees Celsius) warmer than the desired minus-420 degrees Fahrenheit (minus-250 degrees Celsius), the temperature of the hydrogen fuel, according to Honeycutt. The three other engines came up just a little short.

Apple users can now store over 150 different types of health data from Apple Watch, iPhone, and connected third-party apps and devices. They can also choose to share certain types of this health data with loved ones.

These features, available in nearly 200 countries and territories, provide users with high-quality data gathered throughout the day and night, said the company.

As pandemic show us the importance of being fit and healthy, Apple is creating devices and services packed with "science-based technology" that equips people with even more information and acts as an intelligent guardian for their health, "so they are no longer passengers on their own health journey", according to Jeff Williams, Chief Operating Officer at Apple.



ADANI WORLD'S THIRD RICHEST, FIRST FROM ASIA

Adani Group's chairman Gautam Adani is now the world's third-richest person after overtaking France's Bernard Arnault according to Bloomberg Billionaires Index.

With a total net worth of \$137.4 billion, 60-year-old Adani has surpassed the wealth of Louis Vuitton chairman Arnault and is now just behind business magnate Elon Musk and Jeff Bezos in the ranking.

In the latest Bloomberg Billionaires Index, Reliance Industries Chairman Mukesh Ambani is at number 11 with a net worth of \$91.9 billion. This is the first time an Asian person has broken into the top three of the Bloomberg Billionaires Index.

The index is a daily ranking of the world's richest people. Details about the calculations are provided in the net worth analysis on each billionaire's profile page. The figures are updated at the close of every trading day in New York.

The net worth of Elon Musk and Jeff Bezos are currently at \$251 billion and \$153 billion, respectively.

Adani is a first-generation entrepreneur and the Adani Group comprises seven publicly listed entities with businesses spanning energy, ports and logistics, mining and resources, gas, defence and aerospace and airports.

INDIGO, VIRGIN ATLANTIC IN CODESHARE PACT

The country's largest airline IndiGo and British carrier Virgin Atlantic on Wednesday announced a codeshare agreement. Under the pact, Virgin Atlantic will be allowed to sell seats to passengers connecting onto IndiGo flights.

Under the partnership, customers booking a Virgin Atlantic ticket will be able to fly on the airline's London (Heathrow) to Delhi and Mumbai flights and connect to and from seven additional cities in India.

Codesharing allows an airline to book its passengers on its partner carriers and provide seamless travel to destinations where it has no presence.



India's GDP grew at 13.5% in Q1 FY23, fastest in a year

NEW DELHI (TIP)

India's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in the first quarter (April-June) of the fiscal year grew by 13.5 per cent, as against a 20.1 per cent growth seen during the same period last year, data released by the National Statistical Office (NSO) showed on Wednesday, August 31.

Many analysts had projected the Indian economy will expand at a double-digit growth rate due to the base effect.

According to rating agency Icra, the GDP was likely to grow at 13 per cent while the State Bank of India in its report, projected the growth rate at 15.7 per cent for April-June 2022.

Earlier this month, in its monetary policy meeting, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) said that the GDP growth rate is likely to be around 16.2 per cent in the first quarter of this fiscal year.

China registered an economic growth of 0.4 per cent in April-June 2022.

News agency Reuters reported that the pace of growth is seen moderating going forward due to global recession fears and rising borrowing costs. The RBI has raised the benchmark policy rate by 140 basis points in three rates moves since May and has vowed to do more to bring inflation under its 6 per cent target ceiling. "We are seeing signs of waning of the intensity of tailwind generated by economic reopening," Reuters quoted Kunal Kundu, an economist with Societe Generale GSC Pvt, as saying. "Add rising borrowing cost to benign domestic consumption prospects, and business investment could be potentially underwhelming," Kundu added. Meanwhile, private investment during April-June increased 20.1 per cent from a year ago, data show. Government spending rose 1.3 per cent while private consumption was up 25.9 per cent.

Consumption

Private final consumption expenditure is the largest component accounting for 60 per cent of the GDP. Its movement has a huge weightage on the entire GDP number. It grew 1.8 per cent year-on-year in the March 2022 quarter. Government final consumption expenditure in January-March 2022 saw a marginal rise.

Investment and Infrastructure

Gross fixed capital formation (GFCF) is an indicator of



investment activity in the country. A growth in GFCF indicates a jump in investment in the country. Now, that the country witnessed an outflow of foreign portfolio investment during April-June 2022, this data would be closely watched out for in the latest numbers. GFCF witnessed a growth of 5.1 per cent in the March 2022 quarter.

Agriculture Growth

Agriculture is the sector that remained resilient during the pandemic period. It provided positive growth when all other sectors posted negative growth during the lockdown. Now, however, rating agency Icra said the gross value added (GVA) growth in agriculture, forestry and fishing is likely to fall to 1 per cent in Q1FY23, compared with 4.1 per cent in the previous quarter. It said the likely decline is due to heat waves in several parts of the country that adversely affected wheat production in the country. Gross value added is GDP minus net product taxes.

Manufacturing Growth/ Industrial Sector

Manufacturing growth has been hit majorly first during the coronavirus pandemic and then due to the Russia-Ukraine war that led to supply disruptions, which increased commodity prices and thus input costs for companies. The manufacturing sector witnessed a contraction of 0.2 per cent in the March 2022 quarter.

Fed officials see U.S. interest rates rising further

NEW YORK (TIP)

U.S. Federal Reserve officials on Tuesday reiterated their support for further interest-rate hikes to quell inflation, with the influential chief of the New York Fed saying the central bank will likely need to get its policy rate "somewhat above" 3.5% and keep it there through the end of 2023.

"I see us needing to kind of hold a policy stance - pushing inflation down, bringing demand and supply into alignment - it's going to take longer, will continue through next year," New York Fed chief John Williams told the Wall Street Journal. "Based on what I'm seeing in the inflation data, and what I'm seeing in the economy, it's going to take some time before I would expect to see adjustments of rates downward."

The Fed in March embarked on what's become the sharpest round of rate hikes since the 1980s, and Fed

Chair Jerome Powell last week made clear he and fellow monetary policymakers are prepared to raise borrowing costs as high as needed to restrict growth and reduce inflation that's currently running at more than three times the Fed's 2% target.

Doing so, he said, will likely mean a softer labor market and pain for households and businesses; but allowing inflation to remain high would cause even worse damage, he said. Williams, who as vice chair of the Fed's rate-setting panel plays a key role steering monetary policy, said that the central bank's decision on whether to deliver a third straight 75-basis-point rate hike next month or a smaller half-point hike will depend on the incoming data, which includes Friday's monthly jobs report and the consumer price index reading just days before the Sept. 20-21 meeting. But September's decision will also, Williams said, depend on

policymakers' views of where they think interest rates will need to be by the end of the year.

"If based on the data it's clear that we need to get interest rates significantly higher by the end of the year, then obviously that informs a decision at any given meeting," Williams said. "We're going to need to have restrictive policy for some time - this is not something that we're going to do for a very short period of time and then change course; it's really more about getting policies to the right place to get inflation down and keeping it in this position" to achieve the Fed's 2% inflation goal.

The Fed's current target range for the benchmark Fed funds rate is 2.25-2.50%.

In June, the last time the central bank published a summary of policymakers' rate-path expectations, US central bankers saw rates rising to 3.4% by year end. *Source: Reuters*

Ganesh Chaturthi

The festival of Ganesh Chaturthi is celebrated to honor the Hindu god Ganesh. The festival, also known as Vinayaka Chaturthi is observed in the Hindu calendar month of Bhaadrapada, starting on the shukla chaturthi (fourth day of the waxing moon period) and lasts for 10 days, ending on Anant Chaturdashi (fourteenth day of the waxing moon period). People start celebrations by preparing months in advance by making eco-friendly idols, artistic clay models of Lord Ganesha and decorating the idols. The size of these idols vary from inches to feet. Ganesh Chaturthi starts with the installation of these Ganesh statues in colorfully decorated homes and specially erected temporary structures mandapas (pandals) in many localities. The pandals are decorated using decorative items like flower garlands, lights, etc.. Some pandals are made theme based which depict religious themes, events related to Lord Ganesha or sometimes current events. The collective celebrations of Ganesha Chaturthi dates back to early 1890. At that time the society was divided on the basis of caste and religious beliefs. LokManya Bal GangaDhar Tilak decided to bring the divided society into one thread and asked the people to come together and celebrate the festival in collective manners.

During the celebrations, the chanting of mantras invokes the presence of Ganesha. This ritual is the Pranapratishtha. After this, the ritual called as Shhodashopachara (16 ways of paying tribute) follows during which Coconut, jaggery, modaks, durva blades of grass and red flowers are offered. The statue of Lord Ganesha is anointed with red unguent, made of kumkum and sandalwood paste. The festival ends with Ganesha visarjana during which these installed statues of Lord ganesha are immersed into the water bodies sea and river.

Lord Ganesh is considered to be the God who has the ability to bestow wisdom and wealth upon humans. All the new undertakings, whether at place of work or at home, start by reciting the mantra of Lord Ganesha. He is known as the God of good luck and prosperity. Therefore, before any auspicious occasion, Hindus performs the puja of Lord Ganesha, to achieve success in it. Ganesh Chaturthi, the day marking the birth of the Lord, is celebrated in a grand manner in Maharashtra as well as other parts of India. It falls in the Hindu lunar month of Bhadra and lasts over a period of ten days. One of the most loving festivals of India, Ganesh Chaturthi has many legends associated with it. Given below are the legends from Shiv and Skanda Purana.

Legend From Shiv Purana

The most popular legend associated with Lord Ganesha can be found in the Shiv Purana. It says that Lord Ganapati was created out of the dough that Goddess Parvati used for her bath. The Goddess wanted a door-keeper, to prevent the coming of any visitors when she took a bath. So, she created a doll from the dough and breathed life into him. The day she did this came to be known as the birthday of Lord Ganesha, which we today celebrate as Ganesh Chaturthi.

On day, while Goddess Parvati was taking her bath, Lord Shiva happened to visit her. Ganesha did not know him, so he did not allow the Lord to enter the house. This made Lord Shiva angry and he beheaded Ganesha. Later, when he came to know the truth, he fixed the head of an elephant in place of Ganesha's head. With this, the appearance of Lord Ganesha changed and he came to have the head of an elephant.

Legend From Skanda Purana

There is yet another popular legend associated with Ganesh Chaturthi, arising from Skanda Purana. It goes that once Ganesha was invited for a feast in Chandralok. He ate many Ladoos and later, as he got up to walk after the meal, he could not balance himself, because of his huge stomach, and slipped. His stomach burst and all the ladoos came rolling out. Seeing this, the moon could not control himself and began laughing. Ganesha got angry and cursed the moon that it will vanish from the universe.



Because of moon's absence, the whole world began to wane. The gods asked Lord Shiva to get Ganesha to change his mind. The moon also apologized for his misbehavior. Finally, Ganesha modified his curse saying that the moon would be invisible on only one day of a month and would be partially seen on Ganesh Chaturthi. He also added that anyone who watches moon on Ganesh Chaturthi would face a false accusation. This is the reason why, even today, it is considered inauspicious to look at the moon on Ganesh Chaturthi.

Law of worship

On this day, after bathing in the morning, an idol of Ganesha should be worshiped with gold, copper, silver, clay or cow dung. At the time of worship, we offer twenty-one Modakas and should offer twenty-one seedlings of Green Durva to the following ten names -

1. Gatapi, 2. Ghori Suman, 3. Aghanashak, 4. Ekadanta, 5. Ishputra, 6. Sarvasiddhiprada, 7. Vinayaka, 8. Kumar Guru, 9. Inbhakkatraya, 10. Mooshak Vahan Sant.

After that, out of twenty-one laddus, ten laddus should be donated to Brahmins and eleven laddus should be eaten by themselves.

Katha

Goddess Parvati created Ganesha out of sandalwood paste that she used for her bath and breathed life into the idol. She then set him to stand guard at her door while she bathed. When Lord Shiva returned from outside and as Ganesha didn't know him, he didn't allow Lord Shiva to enter. Lord Shiva became enraged and asked his follower Ganas to teach the child some manners. Ganesha being very powerful, defeated everyone and did not allow anyone to enter inside while his

mother was taking bath.

Finally angry Lord Shiva severed the head of the child Ganesha. After seeing this Goddess Parvati became enraged and then Lord Shiva promised Her that the child will be alive again.

The ganas searched for the head of person in North direction, but they could not find any human and instead brought the head of an elephant. Lord Shiva fixed it on the child's body and brought him back to life.

Ahmedabad: Center of Gujarati cultural activities

Founded in the 15th century, Ahmedabad is the largest city in the state of Gujarat. The city is a vibrant business district and rising centre of education, information technology and scientific industries. Divided in two - the old city and the new city; The city offers different moods right from the hustle-bustle of C.G. Road in the heart of Ahmedabad to the quite retreat of the Sabarmati Ashram. Ahmedabad enjoys a thriving cultural tradition, being the centre of Gujarati cultural activities and diverse traditions of different ethnic and religious communities. Popular celebrations and observances include Uttarayan - an annual kite-flying day on 14 January and the nine nights of Navratri - celebrated with people performing Garba - the folk dance of Gujarat - at venues across the city.

Places to see

Sabarmati Riverfront

Sabarmati Riverfront is a waterfront developed on the banks of river Sabarmati in Ahmedabad. Started with an objective for sustainable development and environmental improvement, the pace has now become a major tourist attraction owing to its lush green promenades, beautiful parks and plazas and an all-around soothing ambience.

Dada Hari Vav

Situated in Asarwa, 15 km from Ahmedabad, the Dada Harir Vav, initially known as the Bal Harir Stepwell is among the two famous step-wells of the region. Established during the Mehmud Begda era, this octagonal stepwell designed in sandstone is a remanence of the Solanki style of architecture. It is a space of respite for the locals during the summers.

The seven-levels of the stepwell, which is a great source of water conservation, can also accommodate several visitors at the same time. Located right behind the Dada Hari grave, this unique construction showcases three stairways to the bottom of the well from the first storey. The whole structure of the Dada Harir Vav is a masterpiece of Gujarati design and intricate artistry in stone.

Statue of Unity

Statue of Unity is a memorial to The Iron Man of India, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel. The statue has been erected to propagate Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel's vision of India and to inspire the Citizens of India through his patriotism and freedom struggle. The Bronze statue of the founding father of the Republic of India stands 182 metres tall grabbing the attention of the whole world as the 'Tallest statue in the World'. The statue of Unity is Located in Gujrat, by the banks of River Narmada on the River Island of Sadhu Bet overlooking the Narmada Dam (Sardar Sarovar Dam) from 3.2 km away.

The Statue of Unity will be well connected via expressways, improved rail system and helipads for the convenience of visitors. The surrounding of the statue is proposed to be a haven for clean



Industries, Research facilities and educational institutions to improve the economic integrity in and around the region.

Swaminarayan Temple

Located in the Kalupur area of Ahmedabad, Shri Swaminarayan Temple (also known as Akshardham Temple) is a shrine dedicated to Narayan Dev. This splendid temple was built in the year 1822 on the instructions of Swaminarayan, who was the founder of the Swaminarayan sect of Hinduism.

Embellished with vivid colours and intricate carvings, Swaminarayan temple is a marvellous example of the architecture of the nineteenth century. Inside the sanctum, the deities are decorated with ostentatious ornamentations and beautiful fabrics. The temple attracts a million people on the day after Diwali for darshan.

The personal artefacts of Swami Narayan are also preserved for safekeeping here. The temple is also quite well known for its morning 'Aarti' or

prayer service. The temple complex also has a multi-storey guesthouse and a medical clinic within its compound for the convenience of the visitors. This temple is also the headquarter of the Nar Narayan Gadi, which makes it an even more revered temple among believers. Beautifully carved out of Burma Teak wood, the intricate detailing in the carvings of this temple makes it an engineering masterpiece.

Sabarmati Ashram

Once the residence of Mahatma Gandhi and his wife Kasturba, Sabarmati Ashram is the site where Gandhiji started the famous Dandi March from. Situated in the 5km north of Ahmedabad's centre, it is located on the tranquil and serene stretch of Sabarmati River. Also referred to as the 'Gandhi Ashram', 'Mahatma Gandhi Ashram' and most importantly, 'Satyagraha Ashram', it is believed that Mahatma Gandhi chose this site for it is located between a prison and a cemetery and a Satyagrahi is likely to end up in one of these.



In gratitude of the substantial impact Dandi march had on the Indian independence movement, the Indian government has recognised the Sabarmati Ashram as a national monument. The Mahatma Gandhi Ashram has a number of other establishments within its bounds. The most famous among them is the museum 'Gandhi Smarak Sangrahalaya' which has some of Gandhi's personal letters and photographs on display.

Biden warns Trumpism is a threat...

"MAGA forces are determined to take this country backwards," Biden is saying, according to prepared remarks released by the White House. "Backwards to an America where there is no right to choose, no right to privacy, no right to contraception, no right to marry who you love."

"For a long time, we've reassured ourselves that American democracy is guaranteed. But it is not," Biden says. "We have to defend it. Protect it. Stand up for it. Each and every one of us."

Biden, who largely avoided even referring to "the former guy" by name during his first year in office, has grown increasingly vocal in calling out Trump personally. Now, emboldened by his party's recent legislative wins and wary of Trump's return to the headlines, Biden is sharpening his attacks.

Trump plans a rally this weekend in Scranton, Pennsylvania, Biden's birthplace.

At a Democratic fundraiser last week, Biden likened the "MAGA philosophy" to "semi-fascism."

In Philadelphia, White House officials said, Biden intended to hark back to the 2017 white supremacist protest in Charlottesville, Virginia, which he says brought him out of political retirement to challenge Trump. Biden argues that the country faces a similar crossroads in the coming months.

Biden allies stress that he is not rejecting the entirety of the GOP and is calling on traditional Republicans to join him in condemning Trump and his followers. It's a balancing act, given that more than 74 million people voted for Trump in 2020.

"I respect conservative Republicans," Biden said last week. "I don't respect these MAGA Republicans."

Delivering a preemptive rebuttal from Scranton Thursday evening, House Republican leader Kevin McCarthy accused Biden of trying to divide Americans, and blasted the Democrats' record in Washington, pointing to rising inflation, crime and government spending.

"In the past two years, Joe Biden has launched an assault on the soul of America, on its people, on its laws, on its most sacred values," he said. "He has launched an assault on our democracy. His policies have severely wounded America's soul, diminished America's spirit and betrayed America's trust."

Asked about McCarthy's criticism, White House press secretary Karine Jean-Pierre said "we understand we hit a nerve" with the GOP leader and quoted the Republican's prior statements saying Trump bore responsibility for the Jan. 6, 2021, attack on the U.S. Capitol.

Larry Diamond, an expert on democracy and senior fellow at the Hoover Institution at Stanford University, said calling Trump out for attacks on democracy "can be manipulated or framed as being partisan. And if you don't call it out, you are shrinking from an important challenge in the defense of democracy."

Even this week, Trump was posting on his beleaguered social media platform about overturning the 2020 election results and holding a new presidential election, which would violate the Constitution.

Timothy Naftali, a presidential historian at New York University, said it's not unusual for there to be tension between a president and his successor, but it's "unprecedented for a former president to be actively trying to undermine the U.S. Constitution."

"The challenge that President Biden faces is to get on with his agenda while still doing what he needs to uphold the Constitution," Naftali said. "That's not easy."

The White House has tried to keep Biden removed from the legal and political maelstrom surrounding the Department of Justice's discovery of classified documents in Trump's Florida home. Still, Biden has taken advantage of some Republicans' quick condemnation of federal law enforcement.

"You can't be pro-law enforcement and pro-insurrection," Biden said Tuesday in Wilkes Barre, Pennsylvania.

Biden's appearance Thursday night was promoted as an official, taxpayer-funded event, a mark of how the president views defeating the Trump agenda as much as a policy aim as a political one. The major broadcast television networks were not expected to carry the address live.

Biden's trip to Philadelphia is just one of his three to the state within a week, a sign of Pennsylvania's importance in the midterms, with competitive Senate and governor's races. However, neither Lt. Gov. John Fetterman, the Democrats' Senate nominee, nor Attorney General Josh Shapiro, their pick for governor, was expected to attend Thursday night.

The White House intended the speech to unite familiar themes: holding out bipartisan legislative wins on guns and infrastructure as evidence that democracies "can deliver," pushing back on GOP policies on guns and abortion that Biden says are out of step with most people's views and rejecting efforts to undermine confidence in the nation's election or diminish its standing abroad.

The challenges have only increased since the tumult surrounding the 2020 election and the Capitol attack.

Lies surrounding that presidential race have triggered harassment and death threats against state and local election officials and new restrictions on mail voting in Republican-dominated states. County election officials have faced pressure to ban the use of voting equipment, efforts generated by conspiracy theories that voting machines were somehow manipulated to steal the election.

Candidates who dispute Trump's loss have been inspired to run for state and local election posts, promising to restore integrity to a system that has been undermined by false claims.

There is no evidence of any widespread fraud or manipulation of voting machines. Judges, including ones appointed by Trump, dismissed dozens of lawsuits filed after the election, and Trump's own attorney general called the claims bogus. Yet Associated Press-NORC Center for Public Affairs Research polling has shown about two-thirds of Republicans say they do not think Biden was legitimately elected president.

This year, election officials face not only the continuing threat of foreign interference but also ransomware, politically motivated hackers and insider threats. Over the past year, security breaches have been reported at a small number of local election offices in which authorities are investigating whether office staff improperly accessed or provided improper access to sensitive voting technology.

Supreme Court questions Gujarat...

"Suppose we give her interim bail and let the matter be taken up [by the Gujarat High Court] on September 19?" the apex court queried.

The court is hearing a plea for bail filed by Ms. Setalvad, who is accused of forgery and fabrication of evidence in connection with the 2002 riots cases.

"There is no offence here against her which comes with a rider, nothing like POTA or UAPA in which bail should not be granted... There is no such thing. These are normal IPC [Indian Penal Code] offences. Under Section 437 of the CrPC a lady is entitled to favorable treatment," Chief Justice of India U. U. Lalit, heading a three-judge Special Bench, asked Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for Gujarat.

Held on June 25 by the Gujarat Anti-Terrorist Squad

She was arrested in Mumbai on June 25 by the Gujarat Anti-Terrorist Squad (ATS), a day after the Supreme Court, in a judgment, dismissed allegations of "larger conspiracy" levelled by Zakia Jafri, widow of Congress leader Ehsan Jafri who was killed in the 2002 Gujarat riots, against former Chief Minister Narendra Modi and over 60 senior State officials. In its judgment in the Jafri case, the apex court had snubbed Ms. Setalvad, who had fought the case on behalf of Ms. Jafri for decades

The Supreme Court on Wednesday said it was "actually struck" by the fact that Ms. Setalvad was detained by the Gujarat Police on June 24 and kept in custody for over two months on the basis of a complaint which merely "recites" the adverse remarks made by the court against her.

"What actually struck us is that your complaint does not recite anything more than what the Supreme Court said... The judgment is out on June 24. The complaint is filed on June 25, within just a day... Obviously the author of this complaint was not privy to anything more than what the Supreme Court said..." Chief Justice Lalit observed orally.

Chief Justice Lalit, speaking for the Bench of Justices S. Ravindra Bhat and Sudhanshu Dhulia, challenged the State to produce on record at least one case in which the bail application filed by a woman was listed, after issuing notice to the State, for hearing again after six whole weeks.

The Gujarat High Court, which issued notice to the State on Ms. Setalvad's bail plea on August 3, chose to list the case on September 19. Bail jurisdiction normally requires the court to hear and decide pleas as quickly as possible as the personal liberty of a person is at stake.

Chief Justice Lalit asked Mr. Mehta whether this was the "standard practice in the Gujarat High Court".

The court asked the State whether it had collected any additional material during the custodial interrogation of the activist in the past two months.

"As things stand today, the FIR is nothing but what has happened in the Supreme Court... in the last two months, have you filed a chargesheet or is the investigation still on," Chief Justice Lalit asked.

COURT'S REMINDER : The court reminded the State about Section 167 of the Code which provides a 60 to 90-day deadline for completion of investigation after which the accused was entitled to bail.

"These are not offences like Sections 302 or 307 [murder, attempt to murder]... These offences are particularly based on documents... and this happens to be the case of a lady," the CJI pointed out.

OLYMPICS ATHLETE FAILS DOPE TEST, BLAMES 'CHICKEN WITH HORMONES'

Solomon Bockarie, who is a part of Netherlands 4x100m relay, has made a bizarre claim after testing positive for doping. The athlete had tested positive for growth hormone GHRP-2 during an out-of-competition check last month and in a recent interaction with local media he denied consuming any of the banned substance.

"I don't know how this product got into my body," Bockarie was quoted by the Netherlands public broadcaster, NOS. "I only know one thing for sure. And that is that I have not used doping. If anyone is vehemently against using banned stimulants, it's me."

"I have a lot of questions about this check and the results," said Bockarie. "Let me emphasize that an athlete is at all times responsible for the substances found in his body. But in this case, so much is unclear that I would like some clarification," he added.

In fact NOS in a report mentioned that Bockarie's spokesperson Robbin Pieterman pointed fingers at the chicken the athlete bought in the market in The Hague.

"It could be that this chicken had been treated with hormones and that he got this hormone in his body from eating this chicken," the report quoted Pieterman as saying.

Rohit surpasses Virat Kohli, becomes India's 2nd most successful T20I captain

DUBAI (TIP)

Rohit Sharma has surpassed Virat Kohli as India's second most successful captain in the T20I format after registering a comprehensive 40-run win against Hong Kong in the Asia Cup here on Wednesday, August 31.

Sharma, who had taken up T20I captaincy after Kohli stepped down, has won 31 matches in the 37 outing while Kohli achieved 30 wins in 50 T20I matches.

Former captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni, who has helped India win 41 T20I matches under his captaincy from 72 matches, is still on top of the list.

On Wednesday, Suryakumar Yadav's fireworks in the last seven overs sealed India's Super Four spot in Asia Cup 2022 with a 40-run win over Hong Kong in a Group A match.

At 94/2 in 13 overs, when KL Rahul's struggle ended at 36 off 39 balls, Suryakumar walked in and completely changed the complexion of India's innings. With his drives, slashes, scoops and sweeps apart from audacious wrist play sending the ball all over the park, he remained unbeaten on 68 off 26 balls, hitting six fours and as many sixes. 60 of his 68 runs came off boundaries, scored at a strike-rate of 261.53.

His belligerent stroke-play made other batters in the Indian side look as if they were batting on a very different pitch. While Suryakumar hit 12 boundaries in his 26-ball knock, all other Indian batters managed to hit nine boundaries collectively in 96 balls.

Suryakumar also shared a 98-run stand off just 42 balls with Virat Kohli, who made 59 in 44 balls, hitting four and three sixes in his 31st T20I fifty and brought out some shots in the end as India fetched 78 runs in the last five overs to score a

daunting 192-2, something which was a far possibility at the half-way mark score of 70-1.

Asked to review the match, Rohit was pleased with the batting show, especially in the back end of the innings. But he felt that bowling could have been better.

Spinners Yuzvendra Chahal and Ravindra Jadeja conceded just 48 runs overall to make up for the 97 runs leaked collectively by young pacers Avesh Khan and Arshdeep Singh to reduce Hong Kong to 152-5 in their 20 overs.

"We batted pretty well to start with, got to a very good score. Came out and bowled reasonably well, we could have done slightly better with the ball."

Hong Kong cricket team on Wednesday sent star Indian batter Virat Kohli a heartfelt message and gifted him a team jersey.

Suryakumar Yadav's blistering 68*, Virat Kohli's 59* and Ravindra Jadeja's quick fielding helped India secure direct qualification to the Super Four phase of the ongoing Asia Cup 2022 after beating Hong Kong by 40 runs here at the Dubai International Cricket Stadium on Wednesday.

The message on the jersey read: "Virat, Thank you for inspiring a generation. We stand with you! There are many incredible days ahead. With strength. With love. Team Hong Kong."

The star batter was delighted by the gift and took to Instagram to thank the Hong Kong team for their gesture.

Pakistani hockey legend Manzoor Junior passes away at 65

World of hockey has lost a stalwart. Olympian and Pakistan hockey legend Manzoor Hussain is no more. Also known as Manzoor Junior, he died of a heart attack in Lahore on Monday, August 29. He was 65.

Manzoor Jr, who remained associated with Pakistan Hockey Federation in different capacities, suffered a heart attack before he was taken to a hospital. All efforts of the doctors to revive him were unsuccessful. They even put three stents in but it was little too late.

Manzoor Jr is survived by his widow, three sons and a daughter.

Manzoor Hussain led Pakistan in its triumph in the

Junior World Cup in 1979. That was the only time Pakistan won the Junior World Cup.

Manzoor Hussain was an outstanding forward and a lethal striker. He dominated the world hockey scene between 1975 and 1984 and was capped 175 times with 86 goals to his credit. He was part of the Pakistan team that won the Bronze Medal in the 1976 Olympics in Montreal.


Eight years later, he was the captain of the Pakistan team that won the Gold Medal at the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles. Manzoor Hussain was also a member of the Pakistan team that won World Cups in 1978 and 1982. He was known for his exceptional stick work, and one of its remarkable

displays was in the 1982 World Cup final where he scored the crucial match deciding goal by dodging six German defenders.

His recognition as the hero of the 1982 World Cup final would never be forgotten. In Pakistan he was honoured with the Presidential Medal.

Interestingly, Manzoor Hussain and his two brothers, Maqsood Hussain and Mahmood Hussain, represented Pakistan in the 1984 men's Hockey Champions Trophy in Karachi in a match.

Manzoor Jr was also popular as a down to earth, humble and soft spoken, player with superb stick work. He was a perfectionist master of the game. He was passionate about the sport and

served it in various capacities after retiring from competitive sports.

When the end came, he was still the Chairman of the national selection committee.

His death has been consoled by Hockey Olympians, officials and others.




