**NEW YORK (TIP):** Even though the election results are many hours away yet, the trends do give an indication of the possible outcome.

The SEC alleged that the bribery scheme was orchestrated to enable renewable energy companies Adani Green and Azure Power to capitalize on a multi-billion-dollar solar energy project awarded by the Indian government. ## Crimes against humanity: Key U.N. committee adopts resolution paving way for first-ever treaty

**NOVEMBER 23, 2024**

**UNITED NATIONS (TIP):** A key United Nations (U.N.) General Assembly committee adopted a resolution on Friday, November 22, 2024, paving way for negotiations on a first-ever treaty on preventing and punishing crimes against humanity after Russia dropped amendments that would have derailed the effort.

The resolution was approved by consensus by the assembly's legal committee, which includes all 193-member U.N. nations, after tense last-minute negotiations between its supporters and Russia that dragged through the day.

There was a loud applause when the chairman of the committee gavelled the resolution's approval. It is virtually

certain to be adopted when the General Assembly puts it to a final vote on December 4. "Today's agreement to start up negotiations on a much-needed international treaty is an historic achievement that was a long time coming," Richard Dicker, Human Rights

# The Adani Saga: A Tale of Alleged Corruption, Political Patronage, and Global Embarrassment

In recent years, the Adani Group, helmed by billionaire Gautam Adani, has repeatedly found itself at the center of allegations involving corruption, regulatory violations, and financial misconduct. Once hailed as a symbol of India's economic resurgence, the group is now under the scanner for alleged business malpractice and crony capitalism. The implications of these accusations are far-reaching, casting a shadow on India's governance and tarnishing its global reputation.

For years, critics and independent watchdogs have accused the Adani Group of circumventing business norms. The conglomerate, which spans infrastructure, power, mining, and logistics, has often been accused of exploiting regulatory loopholes and leveraging its political connections to gain an unfair advantage. Allegations have ranged from tax evasion to environmental violations, and more recently, to bribery for securing contracts.

The tipping point came in January 2023, when the U.S.-based financial research firm Hindenburg Research published a damning report accusing the Adani Group of stock manipulation, accounting fraud, and operating through shell companies in tax havens. The report, which sent Adani Group shares into a freefall, claimed the conglomerate had inflated its stock values to raise funds and sustain its operations. Hindenburg's findings raised alarms about corporate governance and transparency within one of India's largest business houses.

The latest blow to the Adani Group's credibility comes from the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). The SEC has reportedly indicted Adani and his associates for allegedly using funds raised from American investors to bribe Indian state governments for lucrative contracts. This marks a significant development, as it places the Adani Group under U.S. jurisdiction due to the involvement of American shareholders.

The allegations highlight not just the misuse of foreign investments but also the complicity of Indian state governments in enabling such practices. The SEC's indictment underscores the

global dimensions of the Adani controversy, suggesting that the conglomerate's operations have far-reaching implications beyond Indian borders.

In India, the revelations have led to a growing demand for a thorough investigation into the Adani Group. Opposition parties, activists, and civil society organizations have called on the Modi government to probe the allegations, arguing that the credibility of India's regulatory framework is at stake. However, the government's response has been conspicuously muted.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's perceived closeness to Gautam Adani has added fuel to the fire. Critics argue that Adani's rapid rise to become India's richest man coincided with Modi's ascent to national power. Reports suggest that Adani's financial support was instrumental in Modi's political campaigns, both as Chief Minister of Gujarat and later as Prime Minister. This symbiotic relationship has led to widespread allegations of crony capitalism, with Modi accused of shielding Adani from scrutiny.

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI), the country's financial regulator, has also come under fire for its handling of the Adani case. SEBI Chairperson Madhabi Puri Buch has faced accusations of financial irregularities and favoritism, further eroding public confidence in the institution. Critics argue that SEBI's inability to act decisively against the Adani Group reflects broader systemic issues, where regulatory agencies are compromised by political interference.

The Adani controversy is not an isolated case. Over the years, the Modi government has been accused of protecting individuals and entities close to the ruling party. From allegations of corruption involving party leaders to irregularities in awarding contracts, the pattern of shielding wrongdoers has

become a recurring theme. These actions undermine Modi's claims of providing a "clean administration" and have led to a growing perception that the government prioritizes loyalty over accountability.

The fallout from the Adani controversy extends beyond India's borders. The SEC's involvement has brought international attention to India's regulatory lapses and political favoritism. For Indians abroad, particularly in countries like the United States, the scandal has become a source of embarrassment. Diaspora communities now face uncomfortable questions about the state of governance and corruption in their homeland, tarnishing India's image as an emerging global power.

The Adani controversy underscores the urgent need for institutional reforms in India. Regulatory agencies like SEBI must be empowered to operate independently, free from political interference. Transparency and accountability must be prioritized to restore public trust in governance.

The Modi government must also address the growing perception of cronyism. Failure to do so risks not only its political credibility but also the nation's economic stability. A government that claims to be committed to the welfare of its citizens cannot afford to turn a blind eye to allegations of corruption, especially when they implicate some of the country's most powerful individuals and institutions.

The allegations against the Adani Group are more than just a corporate scandal; they are a test of India's democracy and its ability to uphold the rule of law. The government's unwillingness to act decisively sends a troubling message: that wealth and political connections can place individuals above accountability.

As the global spotlight continues to shine on the Adani controversy, India must confront the uncomfortable truths about its governance and regulatory systems. For a nation aspiring to be a global leader, the price of inaction is too high. It is time for India to clean house, not just for its own sake, but to restore its standing on the world stage.

# Red alert on the Adani front

ACTION BY US AUTHORITIES CALLS INTO QUESTION INDIA'S CAPITAL MARKET REGULATION

The Adani Group, one of India's most influential and high-profile conglomerates, finds itself in the crosshairs of an international controversy. In a damning indictment, the US Department of Justice (Eastern District, New York) and the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) have, in a joint action, filed civil and criminal charges, accusing the group of bribery, fraud, obstruction of justice and violations under the stringent Foreign Corrupt Practices Act (FCPA).


This scandal has laid bare challenges that India can no longer afford to ignore if it wants to maintain its position as an attractive investment destination and be seen as an economic powerhouse.

The alleged bribery scheme centers on a \$6-billion contract awarded to Adani Green Energy Ltd by Solar Energy Corporation of India (SECI) in 2020. This was touted as a game-changer for India's renewable energy ambitions. However, the indictment claims that the project faced viability issues due to a lack of interest among state electricity utilities to buy the expensive power it generated. The group allegedly resorted to bribing officials of various state electricity utilities (Andhra Pradesh, Odisha, Tamil Nadu, Chhattisgarh and Jammu & Kashmir) to buy power from the SECI. In doing so, it violated the declarations made under the FCPA and indulged in a series of misrepresentations to cover its tracks and also attempted to derail the investigation.

The 54-page indictment by the US Justice Department details how and why the FCPA is applicable in this case and directly links Gautam Adani, his nephew Sagar Adani and key officials of the group in the payment of over Rs 2,000 crore as bribes in India. Arrest warrants against Gautam and Sagar have also been handed over to foreign law enforcement agencies. A statement from the White House that it is aware of the action signifies the seriousness of the matter.

Although the Adani Group has denied the allegations, terming them baseless, it is less credible this time because of the revelations in the indictment by the Justice Department. The scandal has sent shockwaves across global markets and the impact on the group has been on multiple levels. It has also raised critical questions about how Indian businesses are run, the role of our market regulator and the extent to which political clout shapes economic outcomes.

Stock prices of all Adani Group companies fell, while some key group energy stocks crashed by 10-22 per cent and fell further on November 21, when the broader market went up ferociously.

The impact on business has also been significant. Another immediate fallout was that Adani Green Energy Ltd had to postpone a \$600-million bond offering. GQG Partners, an investment management company listed in Australia, which made significant investments in the group even after the Hindenburg Research disclosures, informed the stock exchange that it was reviewing the situation with regard to its portfolios after the US action.

The next-level impact will be seen in the group's global businesses, which have attracted controversy in many countries. Kenyan President William Ruto was the first to respond by cancelling airport and energy deals of over \$2.5 billion. The airport project was the subject of enormous controversy, public protests, senate hearings and litigation. We are likely to see similar action in other jurisdictions where Adani projects have attracted protests or controversy.

In 2022, there were allegations that the Indian government pressured Sri Lanka

over handing a renewable energy project to the Adani Group. The Adani power project which supplies 10 per cent of the electricity to Bangladesh is already mired in controversy, and the group has been cutting power supply in a bid to recover payments. The Bangladesh High Court has ordered a high-level probe into the power deal with the group. The group has also been facing massive public protests over its coal mines in Australia.

Given the group's enormous and open influence over the NDA government and proximity to the Prime Minister himself, this case will not be viewed as just another instance of corporate wrongdoing. As the legal process unfolds, it will not only test the group but also India's broader corporate governance and regulatory framework. Under US laws, the charges themselves can be settled by negotiating a payment, without admitting or denying guilt, but it will be a hard bargain with many geopolitical implications in view of the global spread of the Adani empire and influence over India's ruling

establishment.

The US action calls into question our capital market regulation. It is embarrassing that the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has drawn a blank in its investigations despite enormous public scrutiny and an unprecedented Supreme Court-appointed committee. It is also hard to believe that despite being a member of the International Organization of Securities Commissions and having a bilateral agreement with the US SEC under an MoU on cooperation, consultation and technical assistance dating back to 1998, SEBI reportedly sought information from the US only after the SEC and the Justice Department went public with their action.

Logically, the US action ought to open a broad, multi-agency investigation in India over diverse charges levelled against it over its corporate acquisitions across sectors and states. A failure to do so will lead to long-term reputational damage to India's flawed business ecosystem. Going forward, companies seeking global capital are bound to face greater scrutiny and higher skepticism.

# Violence, militia & leadership crisis in Manipur

**MANIPUR'S UNENDING CRISIS CONTINUES TO TORMENT THE STATE, WITH THE RECENT VIOLENCE SHATTERING THE UNEASY CALM BETWEEN THE PEOPLE OF THE IMPHAL VALLEY AND A SECTION OF THE HILL COMMUNITIES IN THE UPLANDS**

Manipur's unending crisis continues to torment the state, with the recent violence shattering the uneasy calm between the people of the Imphal valley and a section of the hill communities in the uplands. For a brief period, public attention shifted to Shillong, capital of Meghalaya, where Chief Minister Conrad Sangma announced the withdrawal of his National Peoples Party's (NPP) support to the state government.

The NPP, with seven MLAs, is the second largest group in the 60-member Assembly. The Assembly is dominated by the BJP, which holds a comfortable majority on its own with 37 MLAs and a coalition with smaller parties, including the JD(U) with six and the Naga Peoples Front with five. In a sharp denunciation of Chief Minister Biren Singh - the NPP remains in the NDA led by the BJP at the Centre - Sangma, who also heads the NPP, declared that "there was no confidence in our party in the current leadership of Biren Singh."

Though he pledged to work for peace, the party clarified that it would rejoin the government only if Singh was removed.

However, removing Singh is easier said than done. While it has been a demand of the Kuki groups, which have felt deeply aggrieved, the latest massacre of a Meitei family of six - three women and three children - triggered angry attacks on the homes of MLAs and ministers in the Imphal valley. The majority Meitei population lives in the valley. Among the main driving forces of the Meitei campaign is the COCOMI (Coordinating Committee on Manipur Integrity), an NGO representing the valley.

While the Centre has been silent on the demand for Singh's removal, interviews with people on both sides of the divide indicate that the main challenge before the BJP and the Centre is to find a replacement who is strong enough to handle Manipur's complex politics. This would include not just holding the balance with allies but also controlling civil society, dealing with insurgent groups, managing the media and keeping

dissident MLAs in check. Until May 2023, when the ethnic eruption began, this cash-strapped state was seen as a place of promise and growth.

If anything, Singh has been a survivor. Over the years, he has honed his skills, besting rivals and rebels several times. In 2022, he led the BJP to a majority in the Assembly elections, crushing the Congress. A few weeks ago, much noise was made about a purported letter signed by 19 party MLAs critical of the CM, but it fizzled out.

In June last year, barely two months into the internecine conflict, Singh set out for Raj Bhavan with a resignation letter in hand for the Governor. A large crowd stopped the convoy, snatched the letter and tore it up in a theatrical, well-publicized display of support.

But Singh continues to face huge internal challenges. On November 21, 10 MLAs from the Kuki tribe, including seven from the BJP, attacked the state government, accusing it of favoring the majority Meiteis.

"The CM has mismanaged the situation from the start," said Yumnam Joykumar Singh, national vice-president of the NPP and a former deputy chief minister in Biren Singh's first term. "He says he is protecting the territorial integrity of Manipur, but where is this integrity? We cannot even travel to Jiribam or Moreh."

Even as talk swirls around the imposition of President's rule without the dissolution of the state legislature, the CM is unfazed. There is also growing criticism that he has no role in the security architecture, known as the

the slightest provocation.

The identity of the protagonist or antagonist often depends upon the perception of the viewer. In one incident, 10 Kuki men who were killed when fired upon by a CRPF unit, have been described variously as insurgents or village guards, depending on who is speaking. The precise circumstances which provoked the shooting remain unclear, as do many situations in Manipur.

A person with knowledge of the situation said that the Kukis had automatic weapons and had been trained by rebel cadres who sometimes led them there and elsewhere.

Revenge is also a factor. In the latest burst of violence in Jiribam, the ill-fated family members of a relief camp, were walking to a market when an armed group took them captive. The group was reportedly seeking to avenge the death of a young Hmar woman allegedly killed by a Meitei vigilante group. The Hmars, while listed as a Scheduled Tribe, are part of the larger Kuki-Chin-Mizo group of tribes.

There are economic issues, too. Jiribam is a major entry point from Assam. It has a mixed population of Bengali-speaking Muslims, Meiteis and Hmars while a railhead, the earliest in Manipur, and a major highway have made it a commercial center. Different political groups as well as competing non-state armed groups have long vied for control here. It is in such complex frameworks that the ongoing conflict needs to be understood.

The impact of Manipur's tragedy appears limited to the Northeast. It has not become a live election or political issue across India. While warranting a few sentences in political campaigns across the country and rousing talks by opposition lawmakers in Parliament when issues conflagrate, it draws the occasional scathing editorial, commentary and news report in the media. Top officials and political leaders in Delhi remain occasionally engaged and deeply concerned, but the lack of a long-term strategy is visible.

# To protect US democracy from tyrants, we must protect the truly free press

**R**eliable and independent sources of news are now threatened by growing alliances of oligarchs and authoritarians.

The mainstream media doesn't use the term "oligarchy" to describe the billionaires who are using their wealth to enlarge their political power around the world, but that is what is happening.

During the US presidential campaign, legacy mainstream media - who mostly answer to corporate or billionaire ownership - refrained from reporting how incoherent and bizarre Donald Trump was becoming, normalizing and "sanewashing" his increasingly wild utterances even as it reported every minor slip by Joe Biden.

The New York Times headlined its report on the September 2024 presidential debate between the president-elect and Kamala Harris - in which Trump issued conspiracy theories about stolen elections, crowd sizes, and Haitian immigrants eating pet cats and dogs - as: Harris and Trump bet on their own sharply contrasting views of America.

Trump also used virulent rhetoric towards journalists. He has called the free press "scum" and the "enemy within". During his campaign, he called for revoking the licenses of television networks and jailing journalists who won't reveal their anonymous sources.

Come 20 January, Trump and his toadies - including billionaires such as Elon Musk and Vivek Ramaswamy - will have total control over the executive branch of the United States government. Trump's Maga Republicans will be in charge of both chambers of Congress as well.

Most members of the US supreme court, some of whom have been beneficiaries of billionaire gifts, have already signaled their willingness to consolidate even more power in Trump's hands, immunize him from criminal liability for anything he does, and further open the floodgates of big money into US politics.

All of this is sending a message from the United States that liberalism's core tenets, including the rule of law and freedom of the press, are up for grabs.

Elsewhere around the world, alliances of economic elites and authoritarians similarly threaten public access to the truth, without which democracy cannot thrive.

It's a vicious cycle: citizens have grown cynical about democracy

because decision-making has become dominated by economic elites, and that cynicism has ushered in authoritarians who are even more solicitous of such elites.

Trump and his lapdogs have lionized Victor Orbán and Hungary's Fidesz party, which transformed a once-vibrant democracy into a one-party state, muzzling the media and rewarding the wealthy.

Trump's success will likely encourage other authoritarians, such as Marine Le Pen and her National Rally party in France; Alternative in Germany, or AfD; Italy's far-right Giorgia Meloni; and radical rightwing parties in the Netherlands and Austria.

Trump's triumph will embolden Russia's Vladimir Putin - the world's most dangerous authoritarian oligarch - not only in Ukraine and potentially eastern Europe but also in his worldwide campaign of disinformation seeking to undermine democracies.

Evidence is mounting that Russia and other foreign agents used Musk's X platform to disrupt the US presidential campaign in favor of Trump. Musk did little to stop them.

During the campaign, Musk himself reposted to his 200 million followers a faked version of Harris's first campaign video with an altered voice track sounding like the vice-president and saying she "does not know the first

thing about running the country" and is the "ultimate diversity hire". Musk tagged the video "amazing". It received hundreds of millions of views.

According to a report from the Center for Countering Digital Hate, Musk posted at least 50 false election claims on X, which garnered a total of at least 1.2bn views. None had a "community note" from X's supposed fact-checking system.

Rupert Murdoch, another oligarch who champions authoritarianism, has turned his Fox News, Wall Street Journal, and New York Post into outlets of rightwing propaganda, which have amplified Trump's lies.

Jeff Bezos, the billionaire owner of the Washington Post, prohibited the newspaper from endorsing Kamala Harris. Evidently, he didn't want to raise Trump's ire because Bezos's other businesses depend on government contracts and his largest - Amazon - is already the target of a federal antitrust suit.

Bezos's decision demonstrated that even the possibility of a Trump presidency could force what had been one of the most courageous newspapers in the US to censor itself. Marty Baron, former editor of the Post, called the move "cowardice, with democracy as its casualty".

Citizens concerned about democracy must monitor those in power, act as watchdogs against abuses of power, challenge those abuses, organize and litigate, and sound the alarm about wrongdoing and wrongful policies.

But not even the most responsible of citizens can do these things without reliable sources of information. The public doesn't know what stories have been censored, muted, judged out of bounds, or preemptively not covered by journalists who'd rather not take the risk.

In the final weeks before the election, the billionaire owner of the Los Angeles Times, Patrick Soon-Shiong, blocked his newspaper's planned endorsement of Harris, prompting the head of the paper's editorial board to resign. Mariel Garza said she was "not OK with us being silent", adding: "In dangerous times, honest people need to stand up."

Honest people standing up is precisely what resisting authoritarianism and protecting democracy require. Americans and the citizens of other countries must have access to the truth if we have any hope of standing up to tyranny.

based philanthropist of Rajasthani heritage.

Since its inception in 2005, TRF claims to have been focused on a mission to raise funds for charitable causes and has supported special needs educational institutes like Sona Manovikas Kendra (SMK) in Bhilwara and Navjoti Manovikas Kendra (NMK) in Jodhpur.

## British Indian peer Karan Bilimoria appointed chair of key UK industry body

**LONDON (TIP):** Prominent British Indian peer Lord Karan Bilimoria has been appointed chair of the influential International Chamber of Commerce United Kingdom (ICCUK) and welcomed the British government's relaunch of Free Trade Agreement (FTA) talks as part of his new role. Bilimoria, founder of Cobra Beer, will take the reins at ICCUK in the new year when the India-UK FTA negotiations are expected to resume in the wake of a meeting between Prime Ministers Keir Starmer and Narendra Modi at the G20 Summit in Brazil earlier this week.

As a champion of closer India-UK trade ties, the businessman welcomed the renewed "committed and concerted effort" to the FTA and called on both governments to set a deadline for completion.

"There are huge benefits for both

countries in goods, investments, and services. India is the fastest growing major economy in the world and Indian companies are already significant investors in the UK," said Bilimoria in a statement following the announcement of his new ICCUK role this week.

"An FTA will turbo-charge the special relationship between both countries and unleash significant untapped potential going forward. Both Prime Ministers should set a deadline, for example, June 30, 2025, by which to complete the deal, and the completion should be celebrated by the biggest prime ministerial-led delegations to both countries," he said.

India's Commerce and Industry Ministry Piyush Goyal said both sides would resume the "progress achieved previously and seek to bridge the gaps for expeditiously closing the trade deal".

Business and industry chambers within the India-UK corridor have welcomed movement towards restarting the talks, which were stalled due to general elections in both countries earlier this year.

The International Chamber of Commerce (ICC) is the world's largest business organization representing 45 million companies with 1 billion employees in over 170 countries. The ICCUK is the chamber's representative voice in the UK.

## Indian American tech founder Daksh Gupta faces death threats over work culture posts on X



**SAN FRANCISCO (TIP) :** Indian American tech founder Daksh Gupta received backlash after his social media post on startup culture and work-life balance on Nov. 9 went viral. Gupta, co-founder and CEO of San Francisco-based AI startup Greptile, found himself posting on X about the current hiring practices, which included being upfront about 14-hour workdays and grueling work environment at his early-stage startup to see if other founders did the same.

Gupta said: "Recently I started telling candidates right in the first interview that greptile offers no work-life balance, typical workdays start at 9am and end at 11pm, often later, and we work Saturdays, sometimes also Sundays. I emphasize the environment is high stress, and there is no tolerance for poor work."

It felt wrong to do this at first, but I'm convinced now that the transparency is good, and I'd much rather people know this from the get-go rather than find out on their first day. Curious if other people do this and if there's some obvious pitfall I'm missing." The X post which now has 1.6 million views and over 2,000 likes, received both good and bad criticism from viewers. The post has reportedly been shared on Reddit sparking discussion on the social platform.

The American Bazaar reached out to

Gupta to ask what his thoughts were behind the post and he said, "It was a pretty casual tweet aimed at my typical small audience. I had less than 3,000 followers at the time and my tweets were only read by a few hundred people."

Gupta added in his email response that "startup people know the first few people at a startup must push exceptionally hard to reach escape velocity. I didn't want to hire someone who wants work-life balance and force them to work in this intense environment. To avoid that, I started telling people upfront (in the job posting as well as the first interview), that as an early-stage startup, the environment is extremely intense and doesn't offer any work-life balance."

Calling the prevailing ideas structurally untenable, such as the use of an exterior ramp that was larger than the pyramid or a complex interior tunnel ramp, Mr Hooda's 'L Notch Ramp' is built like a cut-out notch within the footprint of each layer of stones. He theorizes that the pyramid was constructed like a "layer cake," comprising of 210 layers of stones. As he explains, "when the lowest layer of stones was completed, a small portion in one corner was left incomplete to create a small rising ramp from the ground to the top of the first layer-a height of 4.5 feet. This ramp was now used to transport stones needed to build the second layer. Like before, a small part of the second layer was left incomplete to extend the existing ramp from the top of the first layer to the top of the second layer of stones.







## 10 Naxals killed in Chhattisgarh encounter

Ten Naxalites, three of them women, were gunned down in an encounter with security personnel in Chhattisgarh's Sukma district on Friday, November 22, a senior police official said.

CM Vishnu Deo Sai hailed the security forces and said the era of peace and progress had returned to the Bastar region.

The gunfight broke out in the morning in a forest near Bhandarpadar village in the jurisdiction of the Bhejji police station, where a joint team of security personnel was out on an anti-Naxalite operation, said Sundarraj P, IGP (Bastar range).

He said personnel of the District Reserve Guard (DRG) and CRPF launched the operation based on inputs about the presence of Maoists from the Konta and Kistaram area committees on forested hills of Korajguda, Dantespuram, Nagaram and Bhandarpadar villages.

"Bodies of 10 Naxalites, including three women, clad in 'uniform', have been recovered from the spot," he said. Besides, 12 weapons, including an INSAS rifle, an AK-47 rifle, a self-loading rifle (SLR) and Barrel Grenade Launchers (BGLs), were also seized, he said. Two of the deceased have been identified as Madkam Masa (42), military in-charge of the south Bastar division of Maoists, and Lakhma Madvi, an area committee member, the IG said, adding that they were carrying a bounty of Rs 8 lakh and Rs 5 lakh, respectively.

## Rape case: SC notice to govt on Asaram plea seeking suspension of sentence

The Supreme Court on Friday sought response from Gujarat government on a plea filed by jailed self-styled godman Asaram seeking suspension of life sentence awarded to him by a trial court in a 2013 rape case.

A bench of Justices M M Sundresh and Aravind Kumar told the counsel appearing for Asaram that it will examine the issue only if there are medical grounds.

"We will issue notice, but we will consider only on medical conditions," the bench said while posting the matter for hearing on December 13.


The Gujarat High Court on August 29 had rejected Asaram's plea for the suspension of life imprisonment in the case by a Gandhinagar court in 2023. Refusing to suspend the sentence and grant him bail, the high court had observed that no case for relief was made out. The sessions court in January 2023 convicted Asaram in 2013 rape case.

## India and Japan bolster defence ties, explore air domain cooperation

### VIENTIANE (LAOS), (TIP)

India and Japan on Friday agreed to explore new areas of cooperation in the air domain as Defence Minister Rajnath Singh wrapped up his productive three-day visit to Laos by holding two significant meetings with his Japanese and the Philippines counterparts on the sidelines of the 11th ASEAN Defence Ministers' Meeting-Plus (ADMM-Plus) forum. In the first meeting, Singh and Japanese Minister of Defence General Nakatani hailed the increasing cooperation and collaboration between the two countries while recalling the "milestone event" of signing of the Memorandum of Implementation for transfer of the Unified Complex Radio Antenna (UNICORN) in Tokyo on November 15.

The UNICORN is a mast with Integrated Communication systems which will help improve the stealth characteristics of Naval Platforms. The Indian Navy is pursuing the induction of these advanced systems which will be co-developed by Bharat Electronics Limited in India with Japanese collaboration. When implemented, this would be the first case of co-development/co-production of Defence Equipment between India and Japan.

In their meeting on Friday, November 22, both defence ministers reiterated the importance of defence industry and technology cooperation between the two countries while agreeing on enhanced cooperation in co-production and co-development in the defence manufacturing sector. "The two ministers affirmed the importance of multilateral defence cooperation and exchanges in the security environment which is growing its severeness, and concurred on working together widely with countries which share fundamental values such as democracy and the rule of law," read a statement issued by the Japanese Defence Ministry after the meeting.

"The two ministers concurred on developing defence cooperation and exchanges to continue deepening further bilateral relationship, and sending messages that unilateral attempts to change the status quo by force or coercion cannot be tolerated," it added. According to the Indian Defence Ministry, both ministers also discussed the Reciprocal Provision of Supply and Services Agreement between the two countries and participation of militaries in various bilateral and multilateral exercises to further improve interoperability between the Indian and Japanese forces.

## 'Democracy first': In Guyana, PM Modi says never moved forward with expansionist vision

### NEW DELHI (TIP)

India is doing its duty as a 'Vishwa Bandhu' for global brotherhood, in the spirit of 'democracy first, humanity first', Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi said on Thursday, Nov 21, in Guyana on the last-leg of his three-country trip.

Modi added that humanity guides India's decision-making and that it has never moved forward with "selfishness, expansionist vision, nor harboured any feeling of seizing resources".

He said India had shown that democracy is in our DNA, vision, and acts.

Speaking at the special session of Parliament of Guyana, the PM said that India does not view island nations as small countries "but as large ocean countries". "Bharat says every nation matters," he added, inviting them to visit India.

Talking about development partnership, he gave the slogan of 'collaborate globally, act locally'.

Modi said India-Guyana ties were of 'mitti' (soil) and full of cordiality. He talked about his visit twenty-four years ago, when he had visited the island nation as a "curious person to learn about culture and heritage of this beautiful country".

Modi began his three-nation trip on Sunday from Nigeria — the first visit by an Indian PM in 17 years.

His next stop was Brazil to attend the G20 Summit, where he met top international leaders such as US President Joe



Biden, French President Emmanuel Macron, and British PM Keir Starmer.

Guyana and Dominica conferred top awards on Modi for his contribution during the Covid-19 pandemic. The Indian PM became only the fourth foreign leader to be awarded 'The Order of Excellence' by Guyana.

In another ceremony, Dominican President Sylviane Burton conferred the 'Dominica Award of Honour' upon the PM.

India had sent 70,000 AstraZeneca vaccines to the Caribbean nation in 2021.

# Manipur violence: 90 additional companies of Central Armed Forces deployed

NEW DELHI (TIP)

The Centre has deployed 90 additional companies, or nearly 9,000 personnel, of the Central Armed Police Force in Manipur since August, state Security Adviser Kuldip Singh said on Friday, November 22, reported *The Hindu*.

Presently, 288 Central Armed Police Force companies, which comes to around 29,000 personnel, were deployed in the conflict-ridden state, Singh said at a press conference in Imphal. Apart from this, personnel from the state police, the Army and the Assam Rifles were also present in Manipur.

Singh also said that the number of persons, including suspected militants, killed in the state since the clashes broke out between the Meiteis and Kuki-Zo-Hmars in May 2023 had risen to 258.

Singh's statements came amid an uptick in ethnic violence in Manipur over the past two weeks.

On November 11, the state police said that 10 suspected Kuki militants were killed in a gunfight with security forces in Jiribam district.

However, Kuki-Zo-Hmar organisations claimed that the persons killed in the gunfight were village volunteers. The term "village



"volunteers" has been used for armed civilians guarding villages since the ethnic clashes broke out between the two communities in 2023.

After the gunfight, three women and three children, including an infant, from the Meitei community were abducted allegedly by Kuki militants. Their bodies were found floating on the Barak and Jiri rivers over the past week.

The abduction led to protests on November 16, with mobs storming and

vandalising the homes of MLAs, including chief minister's son-in-law Rajkumar Imo Singh. Mobs also ransacked the offices of the BJP and the Congress.

At the press conference on Friday, Singh said that the police will look into the claims that the Meitei family was abducted in the presence of security forces, according to *The Hindu*.

"Whether they were SoO [Suspension of Operations] militants or not, will be verified by police," he

added.

The Suspension of Operations agreement was signed between the Centre, the Manipur government and two conglomerates of Kuki militant outfits – the Kuki National Organisations and United Peoples Front – in 2008.

Under the agreement, the security forces as well as the militant groups are prohibited from launching operations. The militant groups must abide by the laws of the land and are also confined to designated camps identified by the Central government.

Earlier this year, the state government withdrew from the pact when it came up for annual extension.

Singh said that 32 persons had been arrested for incidents of arson and vandalism at the homes and properties of legislators, *The Hindu* reported. A meeting to review security measures was also held in Imphal and combing operations were being conducted in the state, he added.

On Friday, Nov 22, the last rites were performed in Jiribam for nine persons who had died since November 11, which included the six persons abducted and killed, two others who were burned to death and one person who was shot by the police, according to *The Hindu*.

## India cancels more consular camps in Canada, says 'minimum security' not being provided

The Consulate General of India in Toronto announced on Thursday, Nov 21, that it had cancelled more consular camps due to the "continued inability" of Canadian authorities to provide "minimum security against heightened threats".

Consular camps are routinely organised by the Indian diplomatic missions in Canada, including the High Commission in Ottawa and the consulates in Vancouver and Toronto, to assist citizens of Indian origin with documentation services.

On November 3, protests by pro-Khalistan groups erupted during a consular camp organised by the Indian High Commission in partnership with the Hindu Sabha Temple in Brampton.

Since then, several such camps have been cancelled due to security concerns.

On Thursday, Nov 21, the Consulate General of India said it has had to cancel more camps, including one that was supposed to be held at a police facility.

"Consulate is fully sensitive to the difficulties faced by close to 4,000 elderly members of the diaspora in the Greater Toronto Area – both Indian and Canadian nationals – who have been deprived of an essential consular service," it said.

Videos of the November 3 incident in Brampton circulating on social media showed men and women attacking temple visitors with sticks.

## Waqf House panel chief says draft report ready, Opposition seeks extension

NEW DELHI (TIP)

With Opposition members saying that they will meet Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla on Monday to seek an extension to submit a report of the Joint Committee of Parliament on the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, the panel's Chairman Jagdambika Pal said Thursday, Nov 21, that the "draft report is ready" and that "he hopes that members of the committee can reach a consensus" on the Bill.

Speaking to mediapersons after a meeting of the committee on Thursday, Pal said: "We had called the Ministry of Minority Affairs for today's (Thursday) meeting. The meeting lasted six hours. They gave a detailed explanation on the 44 amendments to the Waqf Bill. Before this, the Minority Affairs Ministry had deposed before the committee on 22nd (August) for 6.15 hours, and for 6.15 hours on October 15. On October 21, they deposed for seven hours. On October 29, they deposed for 3.15 hours. This way, in these sittings, our committee members have had the opportunity to ask questions as per each clause... The Ministry has answered them."

"Over five days for 29 hours, they got the chance to ask questions. After detailed deliberations, a good report will be prepared. I hope that all members of the committee will together hold discussions on clauses and we can reach an agreement. After the agreement, we hope to submit a good report in Parliament," he said, adding that there will be more meetings. The deadline to submit the report is November 29.

Responding to the Opposition members seeking an



extension, Pal said: "The Opposition was saying that here also. They have the right to meet the Speaker. But I feel the JPC worked, we are prepared. This Bill was referred to us by the Speaker and the Speaker's decision will be followed."

He added that 25 meetings have been held with various stakeholders like former judges, Islamic scholars, vice-chancellors, AIMPLB, Zakaat Foundation, and Bharat First since its formation in August. The first meeting was held on August 22.

An Opposition member said the submission of the report on November 29 "will be against principles of democracy". "If the committee Chairman decides to submit the report, it will go against the idea of the committee. Recently, a study tour was cancelled. More deliberations and conversation need to be held before we can submit the report. Also, if the report is submitted on Friday, when will members of the PAC get a chance to read it and raise issues," the member said.







# Thanksgiving- A Time to Share And Celebrate

**T**hanksgiving Day, one of the United States' most celebrated holidays, is here (November 28, 2024). Celebrated annually on the fourth Thursday of November, this day is dedicated to the harvest and other blessings of the past year. The day, associated with fun, food, and football, is mostly celebrated in the United States and Canada. On Thanksgiving Day, traditionally, the farmers thanked God for their autumn harvest.

The 16th President of the United States, Abraham Lincoln, who guided the nation through the Civil War, originally declared Thanksgiving a holiday and a day off for employees in 1863. Christmas shopping also starts on Thanksgiving Day, which comes before Black Friday.

Families and friends gather for a meal and play games and have fun on Thanksgiving Day. Pumpkin pie, cranberry sauce, potatoes, stuffing, and roast turkey are all staples. Families spend time together while playing a game or watching football.

## Thanksgiving at Plymouth

In September 1620, a small ship called the Mayflower left Plymouth, England, carrying 102 passengers—an assortment of religious separatists seeking a new home where they could freely practice their faith and other individuals lured by the promise of prosperity and land ownership in the "New World." After a treacherous and uncomfortable crossing that lasted 66 days, they dropped anchor near the tip of Cape Cod, far north of their intended destination at the mouth of the Hudson River. One month later, the Mayflower crossed Massachusetts Bay, where the Pilgrims, as they are now commonly known, began the work of establishing a village at Plymouth.

Throughout that first brutal winter, most of the colonists remained on board the ship, where they suffered from exposure, scurvy and outbreaks of contagious disease. Only half of the Mayflower's original passengers and crew lived to see their first New England spring. In March, the remaining settlers moved ashore, where they received an astonishing visit from a member of the Abenaki tribe who greeted them in English.

Several days later, he returned with another Native American, Squanto, a member of the Pawtuxet tribe who had been kidnapped by an English sea captain and sold into slavery before escaping to London and returning to his homeland on an exploratory expedition. Squanto taught the Pilgrims, weakened by malnutrition and illness, how to cultivate corn, extract sap from maple trees, catch fish in the rivers and avoid poisonous



plants. He also helped the settlers forge an alliance with the Wampanoag, a local tribe, which endured for more than 50 years and remains one of the few examples of harmony between European colonists and Native Americans.

## When Was the First Thanksgiving?

In November 1621, after the Pilgrims' first corn harvest proved successful, Governor William Bradford organized a celebratory feast and invited a group of the fledgling colony's Native American allies, including the Wampanoag chief Massasoit. Now remembered as America's "first Thanksgiving"—although the Pilgrims themselves may not have used the term at the time—the festival lasted for three days. While no record exists of the first Thanksgiving's exact menu, much of what we know about what happened at the first Thanksgiving comes from Pilgrim chronicler Edward Winslow, who wrote:

*"Our harvest being gotten in, our governor sent four men on fowling, that so we might after a special manner rejoice together; after we had gathered the fruits of our labors; they four in one day killed as much fowl, as with a little help beside, served the Company almost a week, at which time amongst other recreations, we exercised our arms, many of the Indians coming amongst us, and amongst the rest their greatest king Massasoit, with some ninety men, whom for three days we entertained and feasted, and they went out and killed five deer, which they brought to the plantation and bestowed on our governor, and upon the captain and others. And although it be not always so plentiful, as it was at this time with us, yet by the goodness of God, we are so far*

from want, that we often wish you partakers of our plenty."

Historians have suggested that many of the dishes were likely prepared using traditional Native American spices and cooking methods. Because the Pilgrims had no oven and the Mayflower's sugar supply had dwindled by the fall of 1621, the meal did not feature pies, cakes or other desserts, which have become a hallmark of contemporary celebrations.

## Origins of Thanksgiving National Holiday

Pilgrims held their second Thanksgiving celebration in 1623 to mark the end of a long drought that had threatened the year's harvest and prompted Governor Bradford to call for



a religious fast. Days of fasting and thanksgiving on an annual or occasional basis became common

practice in other New England settlements as well.

During the American Revolution, the Continental Congress designated one or more days of thanksgiving a year, and in 1789 George Washington issued the first Thanksgiving proclamation by the national government of the United States; in it, he called upon Americans to express their gratitude for the happy conclusion to the country's war of independence and the successful ratification of the U.S. Constitution. His successors John Adams and James Madison also designated days of thanks during their presidencies.

In 1817, New York became the first of several states to officially adopt an annual Thanksgiving holiday; each celebrated it on a different day, however, and the American South remained largely unfamiliar with the tradition.

In 1827, the noted magazine editor and prolific writer Sarah Josepha Hale—author, among countless other things, of the nursery rhyme “Mary Had a Little Lamb”—launched a campaign to establish Thanksgiving as a national holiday. For 36 years, she published numerous editorials and sent scores of letters to governors, senators, presidents and other politicians, earning her the nickname the “Mother of Thanksgiving.”

Abraham Lincoln finally heeded her request in 1863, at the height of the Civil War, in a proclamation entreating all Americans to ask God to “commend to his tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife” and to “heal the wounds of the nation.”

He scheduled Thanksgiving for the final Thursday in November, and it was celebrated on that day every year until 1939 when Franklin D. Roosevelt moved the holiday up a week in an attempt to spur retail sales during the Great Depression. Roosevelt’s plan, known derisively as Franksiving, was met with passionate opposition, and in 1941 the president reluctantly signed a bill making Thanksgiving the fourth Thursday in November.

#### Thanksgiving Food

In many American households, the Thanksgiving celebration has lost much of its original religious significance; instead, it now centers on cooking and sharing a bountiful meal with family and friends. Turkey, a Thanksgiving staple so ubiquitous it has become all but synonymous with the holiday, may or may not have been on offer when the Pilgrims hosted the inaugural feast in 1621.

Today, however, nearly 90 percent of Americans eat the bird—whether roasted, baked or deep-fried—on Thanksgiving, according to the National Turkey Federation. Other traditional foods include stuffing, mashed potatoes, cranberry sauce and pumpkin pie. Volunteering is a common Thanksgiving Day activity, and communities often hold food drives and host free dinners for the less fortunate.

Parades have also become an integral part of the holiday in cities and towns across the United States. Presented by Macy's department store since 1924, New York City's Thanksgiving Day parade is the largest and most famous, attracting more than 3 million spectators along its 2.5-mile route and

drawing an enormous television audience. It typically features marching bands, performers, elaborate floats conveying various celebrities and giant balloons shaped like cartoon characters.

Beginning in the mid-20th century and perhaps even earlier, the president

of the United States has “pardoned” one or two Thanksgiving turkeys each year, sparing the birds from slaughter and sending them to a farm for retirement. A number of U.S. governors also perform the annual turkey pardoning ritual.

#### Thanksgiving Controversies

For some scholars, the jury is still out on whether the feast at Plymouth really constituted the first Thanksgiving in the United States. Indeed, historians have recorded other ceremonies of thanks among European settlers in North America that predate the Pilgrims' celebration.

In 1565, for instance, the Spanish explorer Pedro Menéndez de Avilé invited members of the local Timucua tribe to a dinner in St. Augustine, Florida, after holding a mass to thank God for his crew's safe arrival. On December 4, 1619, when 38 British settlers reached a site known as Berkeley Hundred on the banks of Virginia's James River, they read a proclamation designating the date as “a day of thanksgiving to Almighty God.”

Some Native Americans and many others take issue with how the Thanksgiving story is presented to the American public, and especially to schoolchildren. In their view, the traditional narrative paints a deceptively sunny portrait of relations between the Pilgrims and the Wampanoag people, masking the long and bloody history of conflict between Native Americans and European settlers that resulted in the deaths of tens of thousands. Since 1970, protesters have gathered on the day designated as Thanksgiving at the top of Cole's Hill, which overlooks Plymouth Rock, to commemorate a “National Day of Mourning.” Similar events are held in other parts of the country.

#### Thanksgiving's Ancient Origins

Although the American concept of Thanksgiving developed in the colonies of New England, its roots can be traced both to Native Americans, as well as back to the other side of the Atlantic.

Both the Separatists who came over on the Mayflower and the Puritans who arrived soon after brought with them a tradition of providential holidays—days of fasting during difficult or pivotal moments and days of feasting and celebration to thank God in times of plenty.

As an annual celebration of the harvest and its bounty, moreover, Thanksgiving falls under a category of festivals that spans cultures, continents and millennia. In ancient times, the Egyptians, Greeks and Romans feasted and paid tribute to their gods after the fall harvest. Thanksgiving also bears a resemblance to the ancient Jewish harvest festival of Sukkot.

Finally, historians have noted that Native Americans had a rich tradition of commemorating the fall harvest with feasting and merrymaking long before Europeans set foot on America's shores.

## PUTIN 'GIFTS' LION, COCKATOOS AND BROWN BEARS TO NORTH KOREA ZOO

NOVEMBER 23, 2024

PYONGYANG (TIP): Russian President Vladimir Putin has gifted over 70 animals, including an African lion, brown bears, and cockatoos, to North Korea, highlighting the growing ties between the two nations. This unusual diplomatic gesture symbolises the strengthening relationship between Russia and North Korea in recent months.

The animals, which also included two yaks, were transported from the Moscow Zoo to the Pyongyang Central Zoo by air, accompanied by a team of veterinarians. The animals transferred were "a gift from Vladimir Putin to the Korean people", the Russian Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment said.

The gift comes weeks after the US and South Korea revealed that North Korea had sent thousands of troops to fight alongside Russia in Ukraine.

Russian Minister of Natural Resources, Alexander Kozlov, who oversaw the relocation of the animals, said, "Cooperation between Russia and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea is not only about economics, trade and industry. It also encompasses numerous nature conservation projects. Now, the friendship between the Moscow and Pyongyang Zoos has been added to this list."

In addition to the yaks, the animals sent to North Korea included an African lion, two brown bears, five white cockatoos, 25 species of pheasants, and 40 mandarin ducks, all destined for the Pyongyang Central Zoo.

Svetlana Akulova, General Director of Moscow Zoo, noted that the animal exchange is part of a broader effort to foster scientific and educational cooperation between the two countries. "With the support of the Moscow government, we plan to expand collaboration with our North Korean colleagues on joint scientific and educational initiatives, as well as the exchange of expertise and information on caring for rare species," Akulova stated.

This exchange is not unprecedented. In April, Russia sent over 40 animals, including eagles, parrots, and pythons, to Pyongyang Zoo, according to the Russian news agency TASS. In return, North Korean leader Kim Jong Un gifted Putin two rare Pungsan hunting dogs in June 2024, ahead of Putin's planned visit to Pyongyang.

In June, Russia and North Korea revived a Cold War-era mutual defence pact. According to the Pentagon, over 10,000 North Korean troops have since been deployed to Russia's Kursk region, where intense battles with Ukrainian forces have been ongoing since August, reported The New York Times. # NATO and Ukraine to hold emergency talks after Russian hypersonic missile strike

NOVEMBER 23, 2024

KYIV (TIP): NATO and Ukraine will convene emergency talks on Tuesday after Russia escalated the nearly 33-month war by attacking the Ukrainian city of Dnipro with a new hypersonic missile. The missile, named Oreshnik, represents an experimental weapon that Russia claims is beyond the reach of current air defense systems.

The strike, which targeted a military facility in Dnipro, marked a significant escalation in the conflict. Ukrainian officials reported that the missile, traveling at Mach 11, carried six non-nuclear warheads that dispersed into multiple submunitions upon impact. While no fatalities were reported, the attack forced Ukraine's parliament to cancel a session and heightened security across Kyiv.

Russian President Vladimir Putin described the strike as retaliation for Ukraine's use of Western-provided longer-range missiles capable of hitting Russian territory. In a televised address, Putin warned that the Oreshnik missile is "so powerful that its conventional use could rival the effects of a nuclear strike."

The missile was launched from the Kapustin Yar test range in Russia's Astrakhan region, according to Ukraine's intelligence agency. The Pentagon confirmed the missile's experimental nature, linking it to the RS-26 Rubezh intercontinental ballistic missile program.

Dnipro, Ukraine's fourth-largest city and a critical hub for military logistics



and humanitarian aid, was the focal point of the attack. The missile struck the Pivdenmash plant, a former Soviet facility that once produced intercontinental ballistic missiles.

NATO and Western leaders have condemned the attack, with Czech Foreign Minister Jan Lipavský calling it an "escalatory step" aimed at intimidating Ukraine and Europe. Lipavský expressed support for increasing air defense aid to Ukraine, emphasizing the need to counter such "heinous attacks."

Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orbán, however, echoed Kremlin rhetoric, suggesting that the use of advanced US weapons in Ukraine implies direct American involvement. Orbán also warned against dismissing Russia's nuclear rhetoric as a bluff.

Polish Prime Minister Donald Tusk

said the war is entering a "decisive phase," with dramatic developments highlighting the urgency of NATO's unified response.

## BROADER IMPACTS OF THE ATTACK

Russia's move has drawn sharp criticism for its use of advanced hypersonic technology in active conflict. The Oreshnik missile, which Putin claims is unmatched globally, is still undergoing testing. Russian officials confirmed plans to produce and deploy the missile depending on security threats.

Elsewhere in Ukraine, Russian drone strikes killed two people and injured 13 in Sumy, according to local officials. The drones, reportedly packed with shrapnel, targeted residential areas, underscoring the ongoing civilian toll of the conflict.

# Norwegian student arrested on espionage charges for Russia and Iran

NOVEMBER 22, 2024

NORWEGIAN (TIP): A Norwegian student in his 20s has been arrested on suspicion of spying for Russia and Iran while working as a security guard at the US Embassy in Oslo, Norwegian authorities announced Friday.

The man, whose identity has not been disclosed, was detained at his home on Wednesday. Norway's domestic intelligence agency, PST, stated that he is accused of engaging in intelligence-related activities that could harm national security.

According to a court order cited by Norwegian broadcaster NRK, evidence includes records of his communications with a contact allegedly guiding his espionage activities. The man reportedly admitted to collecting and sharing information with Russian and Iranian



authorities but denies the espionage charges, his attorney, John Christian Elden, confirmed.

"He is accused of obtaining information that could jeopardize the security of third countries," Elden said.

The suspect co-runs a security company with a dual national of Norway and an Eastern European country.

Authorities are now reviewing the company's operating license.

The arrested man is also studying security and preparedness at Norway's Arctic University (UiT), marking the second espionage case linked to the university. In 2022, a UiT guest researcher arrested for espionage was later revealed to be a Russian intelligence officer posing as a Brazilian academic.

Norway, which shares a 198-kilometer border with Russia, has tightened restrictions on Russian nationals since the war in Ukraine began in 2022. The government is considering building a border fence to further bolster security.

Investigations into the current case are ongoing, with PST confirming no additional suspects at this time.

# Canada removes extra screening for passengers travelling to India days after implementation

NOVEMBER 22, 2024

OTTAWA (TIP): The Canadian government has lifted the enhanced security measures for passengers flying to India.

The office of Transport Minister Anita Anand confirmed to CBC News on Thursday that the additional measures had been “removed.”

Although the measures appeared to have been in place since at least last weekend, Anand stated on Monday that the extra security screening was being conducted for passengers travelling to India “out of an abundance of caution.”

According to reports, Air Canada in a notification informed passengers heading to Indian destinations over the weekend that due to heightened security mandates by Transport Canada, security wait times were expected to be longer than usual for their upcoming flights.

On Monday, an Air Canada spokesperson confirmed the development in an email, stating, “Transport Canada has introduced additional requirements for travellers to India, and Air Canada, like other carriers, is complying with these.”

On Sunday, Toronto Pearson Airport posted on X, stating, “Departing



passengers may experience longer than usual wait times at international pre-board screening at Toronto Pearson this evening. If travelling, please check with your airline and leave plenty of time to catch your flight.”

It was unclear whether this was linked to the enhanced security measures that had been implemented.

The enhanced screenings, implemented by the Canadian Air Transport Security Authority (CATSA), involved comprehensive checks of both

passengers and their baggage before they could enter restricted areas at airports.

These measures were reportedly introduced in response to rising diplomatic tensions between Canada and India, which escalated following allegations by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) linking Indian government agents to various criminal activities in Canada, including murder and extortion. Canada also expelled six Indian diplomats, leading to a reciprocal move by India. (AP)

## Brazil's former president Jair Bolsonaro charged with plotting coup

NOVEMBER 22, 2024

BRAZIL (TIP): Brazil's federal police have indicted former President Jair Bolsonaro and 36 others for allegedly attempting to orchestrate a coup to keep him in power following his defeat in the 2022 elections.

The findings, submitted to Brazil's Supreme Court on Thursday which termed it a coordinated attempt to “violently dismantle the constitutional state”, will now await a decision on whether Prosecutor-General Paulo Gonet will formally press charges or dismiss the case.

Bolsonaro, a right-wing leader, has denied any attempts to cling to office after narrowly losing to his rival, leftist President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva. Since then, he has faced multiple legal challenges.

The federal police released a brief statement confirming that the Supreme Court had approved the disclosure of all 37 names implicated “to avoid the dissemination of incorrect news.” Supreme Court Justice Alexandre de Moraes noted that the extensive 700-page document would require several days to



review.

Among those indicted are prominent allies of Bolsonaro, including his 2022 running mate Gen. Walter Braga Netto, former Army commander Gen. Paulo Sérgio Nogueira de Oliveira, Valdemar Costa Neto, chairman of Bolsonaro's Liberal Party, and longtime adviser Gen. Augusto Heleno.

The investigation, launched last year, led to the arrests on Tuesday of four military officials and a federal police officer accused of plotting to overthrow the government, including alleged plans to assassinate President Lula and other

top officials.

Other ongoing inquiries involve Bolsonaro's alleged smuggling of diamond jewellery into Brazil without proper declaration and accusations that he instructed subordinates to falsify COVID-19 vaccination records. Bolsonaro has denied involvement in these cases.

A separate probe concluded that Bolsonaro abused his authority to undermine confidence in Brazil's voting system, leading to a judicial ruling barring him from running for office until 2030. (Reuters)

**'IT WILL HAVE NO CONSEQUENCES': HUNGARY PM DEFIES ICC ARREST WARRANT, INVITES BENJAMIN NETANYAHU**

NOVEMBER 22, 2024

HUNGARY (TIP): Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orbán on Friday (November 22) extended an invitation to Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu to visit Hungary, openly defying an arrest warrant issued by the International Criminal Court (ICC). Speaking on state radio, Orbán accused the ICC of “interfering in an ongoing conflict for political purposes.”

Netanyahu responded by thanking Orbán for his “moral clarity” on the matter, stating that Hungary stood firmly “by the side of justice and truth.”

The ICC had issued arrest warrants on Thursday for Netanyahu and former Israeli Defence Minister Yoav Gallant, accusing them of using “starvation as a method of warfare.” The move was swiftly criticised by allies such as the US, Austria, and Argentina. However, Hungary went further by formally inviting Netanyahu.

Orbán described the ICC’s actions as “outrageously impudent” and “cynical,” vowing to “defy this decision, and it will have no consequences for him.”

“There is no choice here, we have to defy this decision ... I will guarantee Mr Netanyahu, if he comes, that the judgment will have no effect in Hungary and that we will not follow its terms,” he said on Friday.

It is worth noting that ICC member states are obligated to enforce arrest warrants and detain suspects upon their arrival. However, the court lacks mechanisms to directly enforce its rulings.

The UK and EU have both indicated they are bound by the ICC charter and suggested that Netanyahu would be detained if he entered their territories.

“The UK will always comply with its legal obligations as set out by domestic and international law,” Downing Street stated. The EU reiterated this stance, with Foreign Policy Chief Josep Borrell emphasising that the warrants are binding.

“This decision is binding on all states, all state parties of the court, including all members of the European Union,” Borrell said.

Israel has denounced the ICC’s move, labelling it “antisemitic” in an official statement. (AP)

## 10 GUNNED DOWN AT SUFI SHRINE IN AFGHANISTAN

KABUL (TIP): At least 10 people were killed in Afghanistan's Baghlan province when a gunman opened fire on Sufis participating in a weekly ritual at a local shrine, the country's interior ministry said on November 22.

It was not immediately clear who was behind the attack. The incident took place in Afghanistan's remote Nahrin district.

After taking control in 2021, the Taliban had vowed to restore security to the war-torn nation. Attacks have continued, many of them claimed by the local arm of the militant Islamic State (IS) group.

In September, 14 people were killed and six others injured in an attack claimed by Daesh in central Afghanistan. (Agencies)

## HOURS AFTER BAIL, PAK COURT SENDS IMRAN TO 5-DAY POLICE REMAND

ISLAMABAD (TIP): An anti-terrorism court in Pakistan on November 21 granted a five-day police remand of former prime minister Imran Khan, who was arrested formally by police hours after his bail in a corruption case was accepted.

Khan, 72, was arrested by Rawalpindi police in the New Town police station case on Wednesday night after securing bail in the second Toshakhana case and was produced before the Anti-Terrorism Court in Adiala Jail.

The police prosecution team sought a 15-day police remand but the court granted the five-day remand and ordered to continue the investigation inside the jail. (PTI)

## DENGUE DEATHS CROSS 400 MARK IN BANGLADESH



Dhaka (TIP): Bangladesh is battling its worst outbreak of dengue in years, with more than 400 deaths as rising temperatures and a longer monsoon season drive a surge in infections, leaving hospitals struggling to cope, particularly in urban areas.

At least 407 people have died from related complications in 2024, with 78,595 patients admitted to hospital nationwide, the latest official figures show. Kabirul Bashar, a zoology professor blamed shifting weather patterns due to climate change for the crises. (PTI)

# Militants kill 50, mostly Shiites, in Pakistan's KP

NOV 22, 2024

PAKHTUNKHWA (TIP): At least 50 people were killed and 20 others injured when several vehicles carrying passengers were targeted by militants in northwest Pakistan on November 21, officials said.

The militants ambushed the vehicles in the Kurram district of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province bordering Afghanistan.

The vehicles were travelling in a convoy from Parachinar to Peshawar, the capital of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa when gunmen opened fire, the officials said.

Rescue authorities said 50 people, including eight women and five children, and 20 others were killed in the attack.

Most of the victims belonged to the Shia community, they said.

The vehicles were ambushed in areas dominated by the Taliban, a local journalist said.

According to local media, there were over 200 vehicles in the convoy.

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Khan Gandapur strongly condemned the attack and directed a delegation comprising the provincial law minister, lawmakers from the region,



and the chief secretary to immediately visit Kurram to assess the situation and submit a comprehensive report.

He also instructed relevant authorities to work on establishing a Provincial Highways Police unit to secure all roads in the volatile province.

Gandapur extended condolences to the

bereaved families and announced financial assistance for the families of the victims.

"Targeting innocent civilians is extremely tragic and condemnable. Those involved in this incident will not escape the grip of the law," he said. (PTI)

# Sri Lanka Prez opts for smaller Cabinet with fresh faces

COLOMBO (TIP): Sri Lankan President Anura Kumara Dissanayaka on November 18 appointed a 21-member Cabinet in the new NPP government, keeping with his pre-election promise to streamline the governance system and ease the burden on taxpayers.

The National People's Power (NPP) has been advocating a smaller government to reduce costs for the public. Since the NPP won the presidential election in September, the government functioned with just three ministers, including the President.

As per the island nation's Constitution, there is a provision for appointing a 30-member Cabinet.

Dissanayaka retained the finance and defence portfolios, while appointing 12 new parliament members to key positions and entrusting eight veteran members, who have served since 2000, with significant responsibilities.

Among the fresh faces in the Cabinet are five professors. Prime Minister Harini Amarasuriya, who holds the education portfolio, and Saroja Savithri Paulraj, who has the women and child affairs portfolio, are the two women members in the Cabinet. Paulraj, a minority Tamil from the Sinhala majority south, was involved in the party's long struggle.



A significant feature of the swearing-in ceremony was Fisheries Minister Ramalingam Chandrasekaran, who took his oath in Tamil, highlighting the representation of the minority community in the new government.

The new parliament will convene on Thursday.

The NPP, led by Dissanayake, swept the parliamentary elections held on Thursday by winning a two-thirds majority. It also dominated the Jaffna electoral district — the heartland of the nation's Tamil minority. The NPP won a

near 62 per cent of the vote, 2/3rd majority of 159 seats in the 225-member Assembly.

"It is believed that vitamin B12 supplement plays a crucial role in energy metabolism and nervous system function," said Dr Aniket Mule, consultant internal medicine, Wockhardt Hospitals.

Cyanide is a toxic, carbon-nitrogen chemical compound that is lethal and exists in many forms, including gas, liquid, or solid.

Dr Vichar Nigam, consultant, internal medicine,



Manipal Hospital, Kharadi, Pune, contended that cyanocobalamin is "safe" for long-term use. "There are two commonly used vitamin B12 supplements: cyanocobalamin and methylcobalamin. Cyanocobalamin is a synthetic form that is absorbed better than methylcobalamin, though it doesn't stay in the body as long. This makes it helpful for conditions where vitamin B12 absorption is low, like pernicious anaemia," said Dr Nigam. Source: *The Indian Express*



# Excessive screen time may raise risk of early puberty

As children are increasingly exposed to screens from a young age, a new study in rats suggests that long-term exposure to blue light emitted from devices like smartphones and tablets may lead to early puberty.

The research, presented at the 62nd Annual European Society for Paediatric Endocrinology Meeting in Liverpool, is the first to explore the connection between blue light exposure, bone growth, and pubertal development.

The study found that prolonged exposure to blue light accelerates bone growth and increases bone age, potentially triggering early puberty.

"This is the first study to show how blue light could potentially influence physical growth and development, prompting further research into the effects of modern screen exposure on children's growth," said lead researcher Dr. Aylin Kilinc Ugurlu, from Gazi University in Turkey.

While the study was conducted on rats, Dr. Ugurlu cautioned that "we cannot be sure that these findings would be replicated in children. However, our data suggest that prolonged exposure to blue light accelerates both physical growth and the maturation of the growth plate, leading to early puberty."

During normal growth, children develop long bones, such as the femur, which progressively elongate at each end before solidifying, halting growth in height. Girls typically reach their maximum height between ages 14 and 16, while boys finish growing between ages 16 and 18.

However, recent studies have shown an increase in early puberty among both girls and boys. Research suggests that while children may grow quickly at first, they often stop growing earlier than expected. One potential factor is the increased use of blue light-emitting devices, Ugurlu explained.

For the study, 18 male and 18 female rats, each 21 days old, were divided into three groups of six. The rats were exposed to either a normal light cycle, six hours of blue light, or 12 hours of blue light until the first signs of puberty appeared.


# NASA unveils underwater robots for exploring Jupiter's moons

To investigate the enigmatic underwater seas of Jupiter's moons, including Europa and Enceladus, NASA has unveiled cutting-edge underwater robots. Sensing With Independent Micro-swimmers (SWIM) is a project that includes these robots, which were developed by the Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL). Measuring just over two kilograms and standing 16.5 inches tall, these small, autonomous robots are capable of identifying temperature and chemical cues that may point to the existence of life. Currently being tested in pools, the robots will be a component of NASA's trips to these frigid worlds if they are approved and funded. These developments have the potential to completely transform our understanding of far-off moons and their capacity to support life.

These robots are part of a larger effort to find life beneath the ice surfaces of Jupiter's moons, including NASA's Europa Clipper and the ESA's Jupiter Ice Moons Explorer (JUICE), both of which are scheduled to launch in the early 2030s. The Dragonfly mission NASA will investigate Titan, Saturn's moon, which is likewise thought to feature a subterranean ocean. These initiatives are a reflection of the increased curiosity about the possibility of extrasolar life.

### What's the Mission?

NASA's Europa Clipper, set to reach Europa in 2030, will conduct flybys to study whether the moon's vast subsurface ocean could sustain life. But scientists are already thinking ahead with the SWIM (Sensing With Independent Micro-swimmers) project. This mission envisions a swarm of cellphone-sized swimming robots that



would be delivered to Europa's ocean by a cryobot — a device capable of melting through the ice.

### How Do These Robots Work?

Each robot in the SWIM swarm would autonomously search for signs of life by detecting chemical signals and temperature changes. Engineers at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) have created prototypes to test the concept. These palm-sized robots, equipped with propellers and steering fins, performed well in pool trials, demonstrating the ability to navigate, correct their course, and even perform search patterns — all without direct human control.

### Big Ideas in Tiny Packages

The robots used in tests are about 16.5 inches long, but the final space-ready versions would be much smaller, around 5 inches. Despite their size, they pack advanced sensors to measure ocean conditions like temperature, pressure, and chemical

makeup. Cutting-edge acoustic communication technology would allow the robots to share data and coordinate movements in the alien environment.

### From Pools to Space

Pool tests showed that the robots could operate efficiently, and computer simulations mimicked conditions on Europa. These simulations helped fine-tune the robots' design, ensuring they can work in extreme conditions while balancing battery life and exploration range.

### Why It Matters

The SWIM robots are still years away from being ready for a space mission. However, their potential is enormous, not only for exploring distant moons but also for studying Earth's oceans or monitoring polar ice conditions. By developing these tiny, autonomous explorers, NASA is taking a significant step toward uncovering the secrets of water worlds beyond our planet.

## Hackers are spreading malware using fake AI video tools

**W**ith Artificial Intelligence powered tools available on the internet, threat actors are using the opportunity to infect Windows and macOS-powered machines. These malware not only steal your cryptocurrency wallet credentials but also target your passwords and browsing history.

According to a recent report by Bleeping Computer, threat actors are spreading malware via fake websites that impersonate an AI video and image generator named EditPro.

In the image below, you can see that the new AI video tools are being spread via posts on X, claiming that users do not need any 'special skills' and can use the AI video generators for free. The report states that clicking on the images redirects you to a fake website offering the EditProAI tool, with '.pro' and '.org' domains used to spread Windows and macOS malware respectively.

As it turns out, these fake websites look real and even



have a cookie banner on the bottom, which adds to the legitimacy. When users tap on the 'Get now' button,

your system will start downloading a file called "EditProAI-Setup-newest\_release.exe" for Windows and "EditProAI\_v4.36.dmg" for macOS.

When cybersecurity experts analyzed the '.exe' file, they noticed that the AI tool setup was laced with the Lumma Stealer malware. In case you accidentally downloaded the program, we recommend you change your saved passwords as your accounts may have been compromised.

To give you a quick recap, Lummar Stealer is a Windows malware while AMOS infects devices running macOS. However, both malware are designed to steal cryptocurrency wallets, login credentials and browsing history from popular browsers like Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox and Microsoft Edge. The data collected is then sent back to the hacker, who can then use it for future attacks or sell it on the dark web.

## Strong US dollar, domestic sell-off push rupee to all time low of 84.50

Indian rupee depreciated eight paise on Thursday, November 21, to settle at an all-time low of 84.50 against the US dollar. The currency was dragged down by a massive sell-off in domestic equity markets and rising crude oil prices amid geopolitical uncertainty.

At the exchanges, the rupee opened at 84.41 and touched its lowest-ever level of 84.51 against the US dollar during the intraday. The session ended at 84.50 against the dollar, surpassing its all-time low of 84.46 on November 14, news agency PTI reported.

Forex traders said the US dollar strengthened as global investors continue to buy the currency in search of a safe haven amid escalating tension between Russia and Ukraine. The continuous outflow of foreign funds also added to the woes of the Indian rupee.

"We expect the rupee to trade around 84.5 against the dollar by the end of December. A strong dollar continues to create a depreciating bias for currencies globally and is likely to sustain FPI outflows from Indian markets in the near-term. However, interventions by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), supported by India's healthy foreign exchange reserves, should help keep rupee volatility in check," Rajani Sinha, Chief Economist, CareEdge Ratings, told PTI. The Foreign Portfolio Investors (FPI) pulled out approximately USD 4 billion from Indian markets in November, following a record USD 11 billion outflow in October.

**B**itcoin is nearing the \$100,000 mark as crypto enthusiasts bet that United States President-elect Donald Trump will usher in a more welcoming regulatory environment for digital assets.

The world's most popular digital currency rose as high as \$99,073 on Thursday, November 21, extending its surge since Trump's re-election on November 5. The commodity has risen more than 60 percent since election day as investors anticipate Trump's incoming administration to ease regulatory and legal hurdles to its use.

Trump, who called the asset a "scam" during his first term, accepted campaign donations in cryptocurrency, and has pledged to make the US "the crypto capital of the planet" and accumulate a national bitcoin reserve.

Trump and his three sons in September also announced the launch of their own crypto business, World Liberty Financial, which investors have taken as

## Adani Group could find funding harder after US indictment

**G**autam Adani's conglomerate could find it harder to get funding following a U.S. arrest warrant for its billionaire founder, with some banks considering halting fresh credit to the Indian group due to an alleged \$265 million bribery scheme.

Some global banks are considering temporarily halting fresh credit to the Adani Group after the U.S. indictment but maintaining existing loans, sources told Reuters.

Ratings agency S&P warned in a statement that the group will need regular access to equity and debt markets given its large growth plans, but it might find fewer takers.

"We believe domestic, as well as some international banks and bond market investors, look at Adani entities as a group, and could set group limits on their exposure," it said.

However, S&P added that the rated entities have "no immediate and lumpy" debt maturities.

Senior executives at two of Adani's global lenders said that they have had multiple calls within their respective banks to discuss exposure to the group and what the impact of the indictment would be on its financial position.

Research firm CreditSights highlighted refinancing for the conglomerate's green energy business, which is at the centre of the allegations, as its biggest near-term concern.

Bonds issued by the Adani Group dropped sharply for a second day on Friday and although the shares of some Adani firms clawed back some of Thursday's losses, the overall market value of all 10 stocks has dropped by \$27.9 billion over two sessions.

Adani Green Energy, which is at the centre of the U.S. allegations, has lost nearly \$7 billion of its value.

U.S. authorities have charged Adani and seven other people with agreeing to pay bribes to Indian government officials to obtain contracts that could yield \$2 billion of profit over 20 years as well as to develop India's largest solar power project.


Adani Group has said the accusations as well as those levelled by the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission in a parallel civil case are "baseless and denied" and that it will seek "all possible legal recourse".

Some analysts said the fallout was unlikely to be limited to the Adani group of companies.

"India's renewable energy sector, a critical pillar for global climate goals, may face reduced international investment as a result of this controversy," said Nimish Maheshwari, an independent analyst who publishes on Smartkarma.

"Investors may demand greater transparency and due diligence, slowing down the pace of project financing."

The Securities and Exchange Board of India, the country's



market regulator, is making preliminary checks to see if disclosures made by Adani entities were inadequate and if they breached local market regulations, a SEBI official told Reuters.

SEBI did not respond to a request for comment.

The regulator has completed a separate investigation into the group, but not yet issued orders, after Hindenburg Research in January 2023 alleged improper use of tax havens and stock manipulation, which the group has denied.

Falls in Adani dollar bond prices on Friday included a 2.5c drop on the dollar for 2029 Adani Ports and Special Economic Zone bonds. At 87.8c, they are down more than 5c over the two sessions.

Longer-dated maturities have fallen around 5c in two days and trade just below 80c.

Adani Transmission and Adani Electricity Mumbai bond prices had similar declines.

Investors are also watching to see if more Adani deals could be scuttled after Kenya cancelled a procurement process worth nearly \$2 billion that had been widely expected to award control of the country's main airport to the group.

It also nixed a 30-year, \$736-million public-private partnership deal that an Adani Group firm signed with the energy ministry last month to construct power transmission lines.

Adani Green also cancelled a scheduled \$600 million U.S. bond sale.

U.S. prosecutors say Adani, his nephew Sagar Adani and others bribed Indian officials to gain business advantages in renewable energy projects in India that benefited Adani Green and a company called Azure Power, which was listed on the New York Stock Exchange until late 2023.

## Bitcoin nears \$100,000 as investors bet on crypto-friendly Trump policies

In another bullish signal for the sector on Thursday, United States Securities

and Exchange Commission (SEC) chair, Gary Gensler, who was widely disliked among crypto investors for his aggressive enforcement actions

Trump had pledged to fire Gensler on "day one" of his administration, though the president does not have the authority to remove the SEC chair before the end of his or her term.

While viewed by supporters as a ticket to big returns and financial freedom, Bitcoin and other cryptocurrencies are known for their volatility and have faced government crackdowns in several parts of the world.

After climbing to a record high of \$69,000 in late 2021, Bitcoin plunged to less than \$16,000 over the following year.

The commodity burst past its previous peak in March after gaining more than 300 percent since November 2022.

The custody of the shrine had fallen in the hands of Minas, Prithi Chand's descendants, who were staunch enemies of the Sikh Gurus and their families. On hearing of the arrival of Guru Tegh Bahadur in Amritsar, the occupants closed the doors of the shrine and refused to admit the Guru and his party into the Gurudwara. Guru Tegh bahadur with his followers camped under a tree only a few meters to the north of Akal Takhat. This place was later known as Thara Sahib abd a gurudwara was built at the site. A Few days later, on the full moon light, Makhan Shah and his men, who had accompanied the Guru to Amritsar, managed to get admittance into Harmandir Sahib. Guru Tegh Bahadur went in and offered his prayers.

1693 Aurangzeb issued orders that read: "News from Sirhind, Gobind declares himself to be Guru Nanak. Faujdars ordered to prevent him from assembling his forces." When these orders did not produce much effect, "a general order was issued for their massacre."


1818 Maharaja Ranjit Singh's forces conquered Peshwar.

## 24th November



1271 Bhagat Nam Dev Ji was born at Nursi Bahamani, district Sitara (Maharashtra). His verses have been included in Sri Guru Granth Sahib. He died in 1349 at Pandarpur.

Nam Dev was a celebrated saint whose name was a household word for the people of Maharashtra. They chanted his hymns amidst their families.

He was born in the village of Narsi Bamni in the Satara District of Maharashtra. His father was Dam Seti and mother Gona Bai. He was inspired to bhakti by his father and later became a disciple of Vishoba Khechar. They say that once, when his maternal grandfather was to go out somewhere, he instructed Nam Dev to offer milk to God. Following the instructions literally, he placed a cup of milk before the image of the Lord. With a child's unquestioning faith and unflattering devotion he created such an atmosphere that God drank the proffered milk. Another time, when Nam Dev was absorbed in meditation, the proud Brahmins, jealous of his spiritual attainments, threw him out of the temple, saying that being a Shudra, he had no business to be in a holy place. Nam Dev bore the humiliation calmly and sat outside the back wall of the temple and plunged into deep meditation. Moved by his love and devotion, God performed a miracle and the temple gate moved to where Nam Dev was sitting. Seeing this, the Brahmins recognized his greatness and besought him for forgiveness.

1598 Akbar visted Guru Arjan Dev Ji at Goindwal. Guru Arjan's perception of the times to come was not withstanding Akbar's high regards for him. According to the Court historian, Abdul Fazal's Akbar Namah, Guru Arjan accorded a produse reception to Akbar on this day at Goindwal. Akbar was really impressed by Guru Arjan's bewitching and handsome appearance, sweet and melodious voice and fascinating and charming manners, his princely style of living, his warm reception and his singing of hymns in praise of God. At Guru Arjan's instance, Akbar issued orders to remit the revenue by one-sixth.

1675 Martyrdom, Ninth Patshah, Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji.

1969 Fateh Singh announced another fast unto death for transfer of Chandigarh to Punjab. The fast was to begin on Jan. 26, 1970, to be followed by self-immolation on Feb. 1, 1970.

1979 "Maerath Morcha" announced on behalf of All India Sikh Student Federation.

## 25th November

1710 Sikhs successfully attacked and killed RustamDil Khan near Sadorae.

1888 The final straw, causing a breakup among Singh and Arya Samaj, came at the Lahore Arya Samaj anniversary celebrations. Here Lala Guru Datt Arora in a speech sharply criticised Sikhism. Pertinently, he said that is Swami Daynand called Guru nanak a fraud, what

did that matter? Swamiji had the sum of the Vedas in his hands! He continued that "Guru Gobind Singh was not even a hundredth part like our Maharishi Sawami Dayanand Saraswati and it is difficult to say whether the Sikhs have any religion or not, but surely they have no knowledge of any kind." Other Arya speakers, speciafically Pandit Lekh Ram and Lala Murli Dhar rose to second Lala Guru Datt's comments and added ctheir own words of sarcasm to the criticism of Sikh religion.

1967 Lachhman Singh Gill became the Chief Minister of Punjab.

## 26th November



1708 Baba Gurbakhsh Singh (Banda Bahadur) stromed Samana Town, leaving 10,000 dead, followed up by routing Faujadars of Kapuri and Mustabadi. Samana was a center of traditional Sikh hatred. The executor of Guru Tegh Bahadur belonged to this place; his son had beheaded the two younger sons of Guru GObind Singh; evacuation of Anandpur Sahib was made by the Guru on strength of false promises made by Ali Husain of Samana. The Khalsa army punished the tyrants and their associates. Later, the city of the "Jallads" (executioners) was placved under the charge of Fateh Singh, one of the five Councillors.

1871 Giani Rattan Singh Namdhari and his assitant Rattan Singh were hanged ouside Ludhiana jail in open public view.

1949 The Sikhs rejected the new Constitution of India. The Sikh members refused to sign it.

1972 The first Gurdwara service was held at the Guru Ram Das Ashram in Los Angeles, California.

1973 A young Navy enlisted man was ordered to report for captain's mast at Miramar Naval Air Station at San diego to explain the uniform he wore. When he reported for duty on this day, he was told that White turbans are defintely non-regulation.

## 27th November

1502 Guru Amar Das married Bibi Mansa Devi of village Sankhetra, district Sialkot, daughter of Baba Devi Chand of Behl Clan. After the marriage, Bibi Mansa Devi was renamed as Bibi Ram Kaur. They had their first child in 1519, a daughter Bibi Dani, when Guru Amar Das was 40 years old. Other children from this marriage were Baba Mohan born in 1521, Baba Mohri born in 1522, and Bibi Bhani born in 1534.

1914 Sikhs unsuccessfully attempted to attack Ferozepur Fort. Bhai Sahib Randhir Singh, a stalwart of the Ghadr movement, took part in this attack and was consequently arrested on May 9, 1915 and galoed for a long term of imprisonment til Oct. 4, 1930 under section 121 (a) of the Indian Penal Code in the Second Lahore Conspiracy Case.

Kaal Bhairav Jayanti, also known as Kala-Bhairav Ashtami or Bhairav Jayanti that falls on the eighth lunar day (Ashtami) in the fortnight of the Krishna paksha (waning phase of the moon) of every month in the Hindu calendar. This year, the festival falls on 22 November. Hindu devotees celebrate this auspicious festival to worship Lord Bhairav ("terrible") a fearsome and wrathful manifestation of Lord Shiva. Different stories from Shiv Purana describe that Kaal Bhairav is the supreme Lord of ghosts, goblins, zombies, mutants, witches, and other magical creatures. Kaal Bhairav Jayanti is celebrated throughout India, Nepal, and Sri Lanka. This day is considered more auspicious if it falls on a Tuesday or a Sunday. Chanting of mantras and reciting Kaal Bhairav Katha (story) on this day, leads to success, develops a spiritual mind, and destroys enemies like anger, greed, and lust. One of the oldest and holy cities of India, Varanasi, celebrates a grand ceremony on the day of Bhairav Jayanti. Millions of pilgrims visit the temple of Lord Bhairav which is believed to be re-structured and build in the mid-17th century AD. Though Lord Kaal Bhairav appears as a fearsome and wrathful manifestation in many scriptures and Vedic textbooks, He is a highly benevolent form of Lord Shiva. Thus, pleasing Kaal Bhairav is very easy and can be easily done by chanting the Kaal Bhairav mantra with a pure heart.

#### Kaal Bhairav Puja Vidhi

The most appropriate and auspicious time to worship Kaal Bhairav is during the evening hours of a Sunday or a Tuesday. Hindu devotees visit a temple while carrying sacred materials such as coconut, flowers, sindoor, mustard oil, black sesame, etc to worship Kaal Bhairav.

- Devotees take an early morning bath and then start performing the puja.
- Most of the devotees visit a temple in the evening to worship all the three deities- Goddess Parvati, Lord Shiva, and Lord Kaal Bhairav.
- They offer flowers. Diyas, sweets, and fruits to the deities.
- After this, people worship Lord Kaal Bhairav with mantras and prayers.
- Once the puja is completed, devotees recite the Kaal Bhairav Katha (story).
- Devotees stay up all night to listen to the stories of Lord Shiva and Lord Kaal Bhairav from a priest or an eminent speaker
- Devotees perform the Kaal Bhairav aarti during midnights with some traditional music along with conchs, bells, and drums.
- Devotees observe a full day fast and break the fast only after the midnight aarti with some fruits and Prasad
- As per teachings of sacred texts, Lord Kaal Bhairav rides on a dog. So, some devotees serve sweets and milk to the dogs.

Followings are few things that must be considered on this auspicious day -

#### Do's:

- Wake up before sunrise and take a holy bath.
- Do not hurt dogs, instead offer them milk, sweets, and other foods.
- Visit a temple of Kaal Bhairav or Lord Shiva.

#### Don'ts:

- Do not sleep during the daytime, you may incur financial losses.
- Avoid eating any type of food (other than fruits) during a fast on Kalashami.
- As per expert's opinion, it is a sin to worship Kaal Bhairav for the destruction of your enemies.

#### Mantras to chant during the puja

A devotee should chant Kaalbhairava Ashtakam on this day to please Lord Bhairav. By chanting this Ashtakam one can realize the true meaning of life and can free himself from grief (shoka), attachment and delusion (moha, maya), poverty (garibi), greed (lobha),

anger (kopa), and sufferings (pida).

## Aru Village & Valley



## Surprises galore in Assembly elections and by polls

to retain power in Maharashtra, and winning nine seats so far and was leading in 217 of the 288 Assembly seats, as per the latest figures of the counting process in the November 20 elections.

After the certainty of the poll outcome, the focus has now shifted to BJP leader Devendra Fadnavis, the architect of his party's stunning victory. Political circles are abuzz with reports that the state's second Brahmin to become the CM will don the post for the third time.

As per the latest figures from the Election Commission, the BJP has so far won nine seats and is leading in 125, the Shiv Sena has won three and is ahead in 53 seats, while the NCP has won two and is leading in 37 seats.

In the MVA, the Nationalist Congress Party (Sharadchandra Pawar) candidates were leading in 11 seats, Congress in 20 and Shiv Sena (Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray) in 19 seats.

The opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi has suffered a crushing defeat, with its candidates leading in just 50 seats, a far cry from the boasts - till this morning - by many of its senior leaders that the combine will trounce the Mahayuti.

In Jharkhand, Hemant Soren's JMM-led alliance was all set to retain Jharkhand as it was leading in at least 50 seats in the 81-member state Assembly on Saturday, as per the Election Commission data.

The performance of the BJP-led NDA, which was seen as confident about its prospects in the state after an aggressive campaign, was poorer than its expectations. It was leading in only 29 seats.

The BJP's poll plank was driving out "infiltrators" from the Santhal Parganas region, but it seemed to have fallen flat in front of the 'Adivasi' card played by the JMM, which also sought people's sympathy over the arrest of Chief Minister Hemant Soren.

### BENGAL BYPOLLS

In Bengal Bypolls, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's TMC has taken a massive lead, and the party eyes a clean sweep.

Ruling Trinamool Congress (TMC) candidates have taken an unassailable lead in the bypolls held in the six Assembly constituencies in West Bengal, with counting underway since 8 am on Saturday.

These results are drawing significant attention, especially in light of the ongoing protests related to the RG Kar Medical College incident, which has sparked public outcry in the state.

The bypolls were held in Naihati, Haroa, Medinipur, Taldangra, Sitai (SC), and Madarihat (ST), following the resignation of sitting MLAs who had secured victories in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, thus vacating their assembly seats.

These elections are seen as an important political test for the state's ruling party.

## U.S. court issues arrest warrant for Gautam Adani: report

"Gautam and Sagar Adani knew their renewable energy company was under U.S. investigation for suspected bribery when they sold part of India's largest solar park to France's TotalEnergies," prosecutors alleged in legal documents reviewed by Reuters.

TotalEnergies did not immediately respond to a request for comment on Friday (November 22, 2024) on whether it knew the Adanis were being probed by U.S. authorities over an alleged bribery and fraud scheme when it bought the Khavda solar stake.

U.S. prosecutors on Thursday (November 23, 2024) charged eight people - including Gautam Adani, his nephew Sagar Adani, and the former CEO of Adani Green Energy Limited - with promising and then making improper payments to officials between July 2021 and 2024 to ensure the solar project's success.

In September 2024, TotalEnergies paid \$444 million into a joint venture with Adani Green Energy for a 50% stake in 1.15 gigawatts of solar installations at the Khavda solar park - the project at the heart of the bribery charges.

The French oil and gas company is not named in the criminal case. The Adani Group has called the allegations baseless. It did not immediately respond to an email seeking comments about this story.

According to the U.S. indictment, FBI special agents served Adani Green Energy Executive Director Sagar Adani with a search warrant and grand jury subpoena in March 2023 - more than a year before the sale to TotalEnergies. These documents identified Adani Green Energy, its former CEO Vneet Jaain, and chairman Gautam Adani as under investigation for alleged bribery to obtain business advantages for the firm.

TotalEnergies bought a 20% stake in Adani Green Energy in January 2021 - after the company won what was then the world's largest solar order, and just months before the alleged payments to officials began.

Sangkaran Ratnam, TotalEnergies' country chair for India and the French firm's nominee to the board of directors of Adani Green Energy, did not respond to a request for comment on whether he had been aware of the investigation at the time TotalEnergies bought the stake in the Khavda assets.

## Crimes against humanity: Key U.N. committee adopts resolution paving way for first-ever treaty

Watch's senior legal adviser for advocacy, told The Associated Press. "It sends a crucial message that

impunity for the kinds of crimes inflicted on civilians in Ethiopia, Sudan, Ukraine, southern Israel, Gaza and Myanmar will not go unheeded," he said.

The resolution calls for a time-bound process with preparatory sessions in 2026 and 2027, and three-week negotiating sessions in 2028 and 2029 to finalize a treaty on crimes against humanity.

Mr. Dicker said Russia's proposed amendments left in question whether treaty negotiations would have been completed. Russia's Deputy U.N. Ambassador Maria Zabolotskaya said Russia withdrew the amendments "in a spirit of compromise." But she said Russia "dissociates itself from consensus."

"This, of course, does not mean that we are not ready to work on this crucial convention," Ms. Zabolotskaya told the committee.

The International Criminal Court was established to punish major perpetrators of war crimes, crimes against humanity and genocide and it has 124 countries that are parties to it. The ICC says crimes against humanity are committed as part of a large-scale attack on civilians and it lists 15 forms including murder, rape, imprisonment, enforced disappearances, sexual slavery, torture and deportation. But the ICC does not have jurisdiction over nearly 70 other countries.

There are global treaties that cover war crimes, genocide and torture - but there has been no specific treaty addressing crimes against humanity. And according to sponsors of the resolution, led by Mexico and Gambia and backed by 96 other countries, a new treaty will fill the gap.

Kelly Adams, legal advisor at the Global Justice Center, also called the resolution "a historic breakthrough" after many delays. Pointing to "the proliferation of crimes against humanity around the world," she expressed hope that a treaty will be "strong, progressive and survivor-centric."

Amnesty International's Secretary General Agnes Callamard expressed disappointment that the timeline had been extended until 2029, but said, "What's important is that this process will deliver a viable convention."

"It is long overdue and all the more welcome at a time when too many states are intent on wrecking international law and universal standards," she said. "It is a clear sign that states are ready to reinforce the international justice framework and clamp down on safe havens from investigation and prosecution for perpetrators of these heinous crimes."

After the resolution's adoption, Gambia's Counselor Amadou Jaiteh, who had introduced it hours earlier, called its approval "a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to make a difference," to hope for a world without crimes against humanity, "and a world where voices of victims are heard louder than their perpetrators."

## Wayanad Lok Sabha bypoll: Priyanka's lead surges to 350,000 votes

The Congress-led UDF's candidate from this hill constituency, Priyanka on Saturday extended her lead by close to 3.5 lakh votes after four hours of counting of the ballots in the Wayanad Lok Sabha bypoll, according to the Election Commission.

Reacting to the lead achieved by Priyanka, Congress' ally Indian Union Muslim League and Telangana Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy said she would get more votes than her brother Rahul Gandhi in the Lok Sabha polls in April this year and will win by a record margin.

"An amazing first trend on counting day is the massive early lead for our leader @priyankagandhi ji in Wayanad, Kerala, by-election. People of Wayanad are surely going to record in victory margins today and Priyanka ji will make Parliamentary debut with a grand win," Reddy said in a post on 'X'.

IUML supremo Panakkad Sadiq Ali Shihab Thangal said that going by the trends, Priyanka will get more votes than what Rahul got and the majority she achieves would also be higher than that of her brother.

# History This Week NOV 22 - NOV 28

## NOVEMBER 22

November 22, 1935 - Trans-Pacific airmail service began as the China Clipper, a Pan American flying boat, took off from San Francisco, reaching the Philippines 59 hours later. The following year, commercial passenger service began.



November 22, 1943 - The Cairo Conference occurred as President Franklin D. Roosevelt, British Prime Minister Winston Churchill, and Chinese Nationalist leader Chiang Kai-shek, met to discuss the war in the Pacific against Japan.

November 22, 1963 - At 12:30 p.m., on Elm Street in downtown Dallas, President John F. Kennedy's motorcade slowly approached a triple underpass. Shots rang out. The President was struck in the back, then in the head. He was rushed to Parkland Memorial Hospital where fifteen doctors tried to save him. At 1 p.m., John Fitzgerald Kennedy, 35th President of the United States, was pronounced dead. On board Air Force One, at 2:38 p.m., Lyndon B. Johnson was sworn in as the 36th President.

November 22, 1975 - Juan Carlos was sworn in as King of Spain, following the death of General Francisco Franco who had ruled as dictator since 1939.

November 22, 1990 - British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher announced she would resign after 11 years in office, the longest term of any British Prime Minister in the 20th century.

Birthday - Charles De Gaulle (1890-1970) was born in Lille, France. He led the Free French against the Nazis during World War II and later became President of France, serving from 1958-69.


Birthday - Barnstorming aviator Wiley Post (1898-1935) was born in Grand Plain, Texas. He was a self-taught pilot who became an international celebrity in the 1930s and co-authored Around the World in Eight Days. In 1935, Post and his friend Will Rogers began a flight to the Orient, however, the plane crashed near Point Barrow, Alaska, killing both of them.

Birthday - British composer Benjamin Britten (1913-1976) was born in Lowestoft, Suffolk, England. Best known for his operas including Peter Grimes and his choral works A Ceremony of Carols and War Requiem.

## NOVEMBER 23


Birthday - Wild West outlaw Billy the Kid (1859-1881) was born in New York City (probably as Henry McCarty, better known as William H. Bonney). He was a

ruthless killer who escaped from jail and a sentence of hanging at age 21. He was recaptured at Stinking Springs, New Mexico, but escaped again. At Fort Sumner, on the night of July 14, 1881, he reportedly asked, "Who's there?" only to be shot twice through the heart by Sheriff Pat Garrett.



Birthday - Horror film actor Boris Karloff (1887-1969) was born in London (as William Henry Pratt). Best known for appearing in the title role in Frankenstein and The Bride of Frankenstein.

## NOVEMBER 24



November 24, 1969 - The U.S. Army announced that Lt. William L. Calley had been charged with premeditated murder in the massacre of civilians in the Vietnamese village of My Lai in March of 1968. Calley was ordered to stand trial by court martial and was later convicted and sentenced to life in prison. However, his sentence was later commuted to three years of house arrest by President Richard Nixon.

November 24, 1989 - In Czechoslovakia, mass demonstrations resulted in the resignation of the entire presidium and secretariat of the Czechoslovak Communist Party.

November 24, 1992 - The U.S. military departed the Philippines after nearly a century of military presence. In 1991, the Philippine Senate had voted to reject a renewal of the lease for the American military base.

November 24, 1998 - Britain's Queen Elizabeth II opened a new session of Parliament by announcing a bill to do away with the centuries-old right of aristocrats to sit in the House of Lords, thereby taking membership and voting rights away from 759 Dukes, Earls and other hereditary nobles with titles dating

as far back as the Middle Ages.

Birthday - German Field Marshal Erich von Manstein (1887-1973) was born in Berlin. His plan for the German invasion of France in 1940 involved staging a surprise attack through the Ardennes Forest, and was a stunning success. He went on to achieve several important victories over the Russians in the East, but was dismissed by Hitler in 1944 following a series of arguments over military strategy.

Birthday - Motivational lecturer Dale Carnegie (1888-1955) was born in Maryville, Missouri. Best known for his 1936 book How to Win Friends and Influence People which sold millions of copies and was translated into 29 languages.

## NOVEMBER 25


November 25, 1936 - Nazi Germany and Imperial Japan signed the Anti-Comintern Pact, an agreement to collaborate in opposing the spread of Communism.

November 25, 1963 - Three days after his assassination, John F. Kennedy was buried with full military honors at Arlington National Cemetery.

November 25, 1974 - Britain outlawed the IRA (Irish Republican Army) following the deaths of 21 persons in a pub bombing in Birmingham.

November 25, 1992 - The parliament in Czechoslovakia voted to divide the country into separate Czech and Slovak republics.

November 25, 1995 - By a margin of less than one percent, Ireland voted to legalize divorce, the closest vote in the nation's history.



Birthday - American financier Andrew Carnegie (1835-1919) was born in Dunfermline, Scotland. He emigrated to America, made his fortune in steel, then became a major philanthropist. Among his gifts; over 2,500 libraries, Carnegie Hall, Carnegie Foundation, and the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace. He once wrote, "The man who dies rich dies disgraced."

Birthday - American temperance leader Carry Nation (1846-1911) was born in Garrard County, Kentucky. She was famed as a hatchet-wielding smasher of saloons.

Birthday - Pope John XXIII (1881-1963) was born in Sotte il Monte, Italy (as Angelo Roncalli). He became the 261st Pope of the Roman Catholic Church in 1958 and served until his death in June of 1963. During his reign, he convened the Second Vatican Council which modernized the mass and increased openness to other religions and denominations.

Birthday - Chilean military leader

Augusto Pinochet (1915-2006) was born in Valparaiso, Chile. He overthrew President Salvador Allende in 1973 and remained in power until he lost the elections in 1990.

## NOVEMBER 26



November 26, 1922 - In Egypt, Howard Carter and Lord Carnarvon first went inside the tomb of King Tutankhamen.

November 26, 1940 - During the Holocaust, Nazis began walling off the Jewish Ghetto in Warsaw, sealing in 400,000 inhabitants while denying them adequate food, sanitation and housing.

November 26, 1979 - After an absence of 21 years, the International Olympic Committee voted to re-admit China

November 26, 1992 - British Prime Minister John Major announced Queen Elizabeth II had agreed to pay taxes on her personal income.

November 26, 1998 - In Dublin, Tony Blair became the first British Prime Minister to appear before the Irish Parliament, which had been created 80 years earlier in defiance of the British government.

## NOVEMBER 27



Birthday - Israeli statesman Chaim Weizmann (1874-1952) was born near Pinsk, Byelorussia. He helped bring about the British government's Balfour Declaration, which called for the establishment of a national home for Jews in Palestine.

Birthday - Czech leader Alexander Dubcek (1921-1992) was born in Uhrovec, Slovakia. In 1968, as first secretary of the Czechoslovak Communist Party, he attempted to achieve "socialism with a human face" and loosen Soviet Russia's control of his country. This resulted in a military invasion by the Russians.

## NOVEMBER 28

November 28, 1905 - Irish political party Sinn Fein was founded in Dublin by Arthur Griffith.



November 28, 1919 - Lady Nancy Astor was elected as the first female in the British House of Commons.

Prakash Kumar, with dialogues and screenplay crafted by the acclaimed Ritesh Shah.

According to The Hollywood Reporter, plot details for the untitled film are being kept under wraps, but sources suggest that the setting is not contemporary. It is also unclear whether the movie will take place in the past or the future.

Christopher Nolan wrote the script and is directing the film, which will be distributed by Universal Pictures.

The filmmaker is also backing the project alongside producing partner and wife, Emma Thomas, for their Syncopy banner.

Universal Pictures has set a release date of July 17, 2026, for the movie.

## Messi's Argentina likely to play in Kerala in 2025

Lionel Messi is likely to come to India. Again. Not to Kolkata this time but Kerala.

Kerala's sports minister V Abdurahiman said on Wednesday that the Argentina national football team, including its talismanic skipper, is expected to visit the state and play an international friendly next year.

The statement was made following discussions between the state's sports ministry led by Abdurahiman and the Argentine Football Association (AFA) in Madrid last September. Kerala chief minister Pinayari Vijayan also made a similar announcement through a Facebook post.

"The world's number 1 football team Argentina including Lionel Messi will visit Kerala next year. The match will be held under the complete supervision of the state government. The state's traders have promised to provide financial assistance to conduct the match," Abdurahiman told reporters.

The minister said the AFA officials will visit Kerala in the next one-and-a half months to hold further talks. Asked when the team including Messi are likely to visit and who they will play against, the minister said: "Those details will be chalked out later. The match will have to be conducted as per the FIFA window for international friendlies." Kochi is one of the options to host the match, Abdurahiman said.

# Border-Gavaskar Trophy: Bumrah gets fifer as Australia bowled out for 104

### PERTH (TIP)

India captain Jasprit Bumrah deservedly got his 11th five-wicket haul while debutant Harshit Rana bowled a fiery opening spell as Australia were bowled out for 104 at the stroke of lunch despite a stiff last-wicket resistance from Mitchell Starc and Josh Hazlewood on the second day of the opening Test here on Saturday, November 23.

The Indian team would be a touch disappointed that they couldn't get a handy lead, which seemed to be on the cards once Australia were reduced to 79 for 9. But Starc (26 off 113 balls) shielded Hazlewood (7 not out off 31 balls) admirably during their 25-run last-wicket stand that lasted 18 overs and got the lead below 50 (46 runs), making it a contest of who bats better in the second innings.

The day began on a bright note as Bumrah (5/30 in 18 overs), bowling the second over of the day, got one to rear up from back of the length and Carey's edge carried at a good height to Rishabh Pant behind stumps.

The skipper's celebration was understated as he purposefully strode back to his bowling mark even before Nathan Lyon had arrived.

At the other end, Bumrah started the day with burly Harshit Rana (3/48 in 15.2 overs) carrying on from where he had left off on the opening day.

Unlike on the opening day, the rookie speedster used more short balls, and one such well-directed delivery accounted for Lyon, who



was pouched at gully by KL Rahul.

With 71 runs behind India's first-innings score of 150, one had expected the visitors to get rid of the last pair. But the short-ball tactic didn't work well against Starc, who chuckled while reminding his former KKR teammate, "I have a long memory Harshit".

Starc showed good defensive qualities before taking his chances

now and then with some aerial hits. Harshit was replaced with Nitish Reddy for three overs but, with the ball being 40-plus overs old and the seam suppressed, there was not much incisiveness to his wicket-to-wicket bowling.

Finally, Harshit, coming for his second spell of the day, had Starc trying to slog and the skier was taken by Pant.

## India beat China, defend Women's Asian Champions Trophy

The Indian women managed to overcome the disappointment of a pedestrian semifinal performance and upped their game when it mattered most, registering a 1-0 win against China in the final to successfully defend the Asian Champions Trophy at the Rajgir Sports Complex here on Wednesday, November 20.

The scoreline may indicate it was a close contest and for the first half, it was so before the Indians, like in every game, shifted gears in the third quarter and took control. And while China deserved credit for not making it any easier for India, the host was not troubled much once they went ahead. Deservedly, it was Deepika -- who topped the tables with 11 goals through the tournament and was named Player of the Tournament -- who scored the lone goal of the match for India. Unlike previously, it was a cautious start by India, aware that the Chinese would come hard, come fast and create chances early on. They did and for the first few minutes, India had to fight hard to survive the

Chinese onslaught before slowly settling down, getting better at ball control. A penalty corner for China in the 18th minute saw Lalremsiami -- adjudged player of the match -- rush out quickly before Bichu Devi went full stretch to clear the rebound with her stick. India's constant push resulted in four quick penalty corners in the 20th minute but India's poor form with PCs continued, a mix of off-target shots, ineffective variations and some good saves by the Chinese goalkeeper. China managed a 2nd PC three minutes later but to no avail. But the Indians were slowly growing in the game and within seconds of resumption in the 3rd quarter, India earned its 5th PC.

The injection was not stopped cleanly but the ball was kept in play, dragged in and then Deepika unleashed a controlled reverse hit that the Chinese defence and goalkeeper had no answer to. The Indian attack was impressive even when it did not result in a goal. Sangita Kumari was a delight with her nippy runs and amazing ball control, repeatedly entering the Chinese circle.
