Harmeet K. Dhillon is an Indian-born Sikh-American attorney who has emerged as a prominent conservative legal voice in the United States. Appointed U.S. Assistant Attorney General for the Civil Rights Division in 2025, she previously served as vice chair of the California Republican Party and Republican National Committeewoman for California. Founder of Dhillon Law Group and the Center for American Liberty, she has argued high-profile constitutional and free speech cases. Born in Chandigarh, she represents a notable Indian-American presence in U.S. law and public service.

Dr. Rajwant Singh has dedicated his career to advancing Sikh values through environmental stewardship, interfaith dialogue, and community service.
